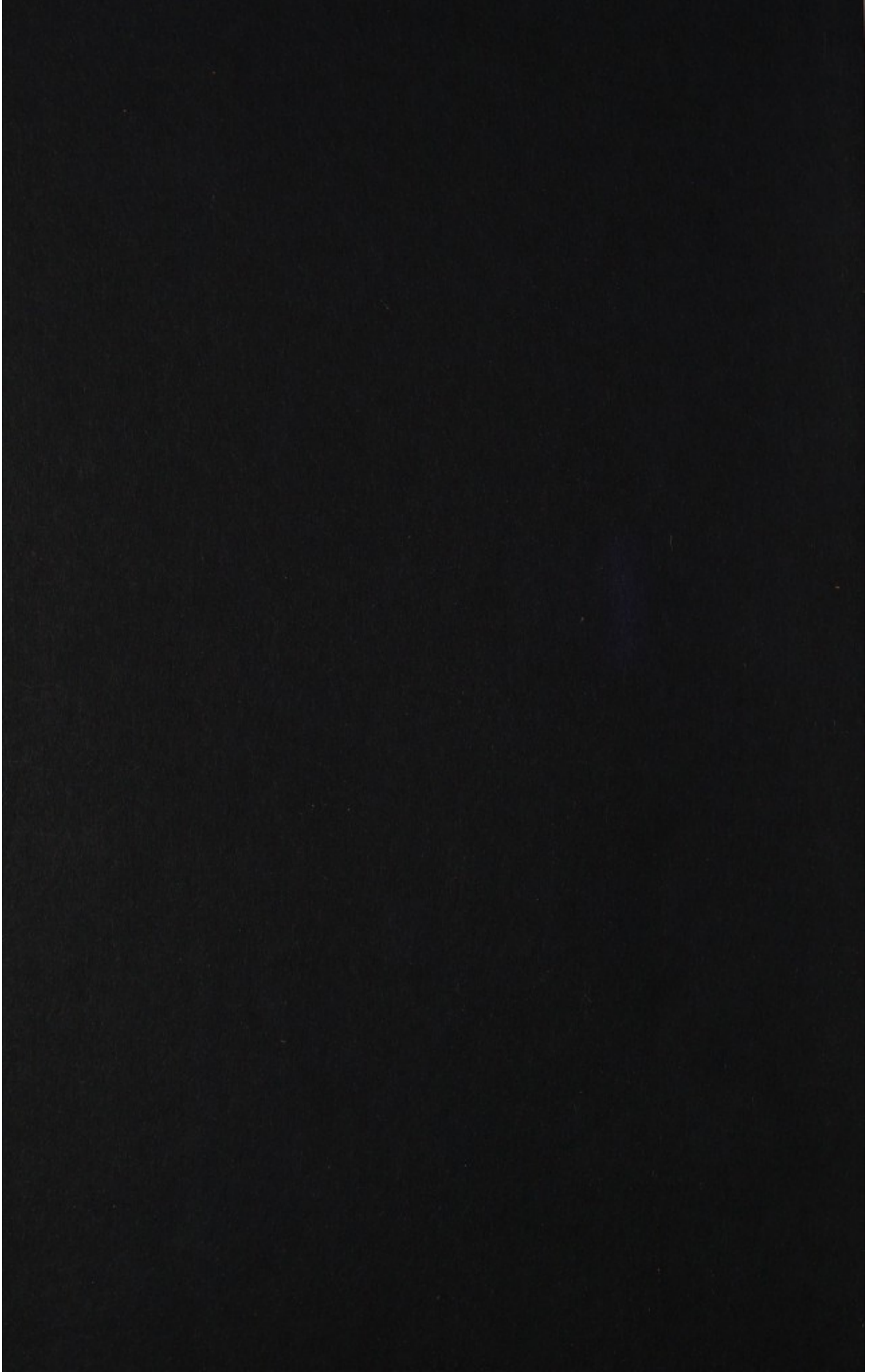

- 32 Another, the guard designed with the Stuart "S," the blade inscribed "Andrea Ferara," circa 1700.

- 33 A Highland officer's broadsword, the hilt chiselled with classical heads, masks and scrolls in medallions, and with double grooved blade, *circa* 1700.
- 34 Another, the brass hilt with pierced panels, and with the mark of the City of Glasgow, and initials R.C. for ROBERT CRAIG, *armourer*, the double grooved blade engraved with the Jacobite rose and inscribed "Andrea Farara," *circa* 1725.
Found in an old house at Prestonpans.
- 35 A French officer's sword, the blade damascened with foliage, the hilt chiselled and gilt with military trophies and trefoils.
Made in Cairo for one of Napoleon's Officers.
- 36 A SWORD, with grooved blade and straight quillons, *French*, *circa* 1280.
From the S. J. Whawell Collection.
Similar to a sword in the musee de l'Armée, Paris.
- 37 A HAND-AND-A-HALF SWORD, with straight quillons, *French*, *circa* 1380.

- 49 A Chinese carved soapstone figure of Kwan-yin seated on rocks, *Ming*, 9in. high.
- 50 A Chinese carved ivory large standing figure of Kwan-yin holding a fan, and wearing bird head-dress, partly in colours, $18\frac{3}{4}$ in. high.
- 51 Another, Kwan-yin holding a fan and a basket of flowers, partly in colours, $13\frac{1}{2}$ in. high, and wood stand.

- 85 A pair of Rockingham seated figures of peasants, inscribed "Foret Noire," 3¾in. high.
- 86 The Music Lesson, a Chelsea group of two youths and a girl seated on rocks, 6¾in. high.
- 87 A Chelsea figure of a youth holding a nest of young birds, on scroll base, 8½in. high.
- 88 A pair of Chelsea figures of a youth and girl standing before may-trees and holding baskets of flowers, on scroll bases, 9¾in. high.
- 89 A pair of Chelsea groups, Venus and Cupid, and Neptune with a dolphin, on circular shaped bases, modelled with shells and seaweed, 10in. high.
- 90 A Rockingham part tea service, painted with foliage in grey and gilt, comprising a teapot and cover, a sugar basin and cover, a bowl, eight cups and eight saucers, *the saucers with griffin mark, the cups of a later date*, 21 pieces.
