- 178 Another, similar.
- 179 An old French mahogany bureau, of serpentine form, the fall-down front enclosing drawers and cupboard and with three drawers under, the lower part carved with a shell ornament, on hoof feet, 45in. wide.
- 180 A Georgian mahogany bureau, the fall-down front enclosing drawers and pigeon holes, and with four drawers under, 35 $\frac{3}{4}$ in. wide.
- 181 A Georgian oak tallboy chest of eight drawers, with moulded cornice and fluted columns at the sides, 42 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. wide.
- 182 A Georgian mahogany tallboy chest of ten drawers, the sides inlaid with brass, 44in. wide.
- 183 Another, Sheraton, with ten drawers slightly inlaid with satinwood lines, 45in. wide.
- 184 A pair of oak chairs, with square backs and elbows, the back panels and seats of embossed leather, *Flemish, XVIIIth century.*
- 185 A Georgian mahogany bookcase, with moulded cornice and reeded borders, the upper part enclosed by a pair of glass trellis doors, and with cupboard under enclosed by a pair of folding panelled doors, 47in. wide.
- 186 A mahogany settee of Hepplewhite design, with reeded frame and columns at the sides, of fluted circular legs, the stuffed seat and back covered with green velvet, 72in. wide.
- 187 A pair of mahogany elbow chairs of Queen Anne design, with shaped backs and elbows, on cabriole legs and club feet, covered with similar velvet.
- 188 Three Hepplewhite mahogany chairs, the square shaped backs with rail centres, reeded and carved with foliage, on square tapered legs.
- 189 A Sheraton mahogany square folding card table, with round corners, inlaid with satinwood lines and medallions, on square tapered legs, 36in. wide.
- 190 A Dutch walnut marqueterie corner cupboard, inlaid with vases of flowers, enclosed by two pairs of panelled doors, and with shaped cornice, 34in. wide.
- 191 A Sheraton mahogany wardrobe, inlaid with satinwood lines, the upper part enclosed by a pair of folding doors with oval panels and with carved dental cornice, the lower part with four drawers, 51in. wide.
- 192 A Georgian mirror, in shaped mahogany frame, 39in. by 22 $\frac{1}{2}$ in.

- 193 A Georgian gilt corner bracket, the borders carved with rope pattern and tassels, and with three shelves, 15 $\frac{3}{4}$ in. wide.
- 194 A pair of Hepplewhite mahogany elbow chairs, the square backs with rail centres carved with foliage and pateræ, on fluted square tapered legs.
- 195 A Sheraton mahogany oval folding Pembroke table, the top inlaid with a shell ornament and banded with satinwood, and with drawer, on square tapered legs, 30in. wide.
- 196 A Sheraton mahogany chest of four drawers, inlaid with fan medallions and banded with satinwood, brass drop handles, 36in. wide.
- 197 A Jacobean oak chest of four drawers, with sunk panels and shaped and moulded borders, 37in. wide.
- 198 A Queen Anne walnut bureau, with inlaid borders, the fall down front enclosing small drawers and pigeon holes, and with four drawers under, brass drop handles, 39 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. wide.
- 199 Another, smaller, of Queen Anne design, with inlaid borders, fall down front and four drawers under, 27 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. wide.
- 200 An oak stool on cabriole legs carved with foliage scrolls and with X stretcher, the top covered with needlework designed with flowers and scrolls on black ground, *Flemish*, early XVIIIth century, 20in. wide.
- 201 A Queen Anne walnut cabinet, enclosed by a pair of folding doors and with moulded cornice on stand with two drawers, baluster legs and shaped stretcher, 39in. wide.
- 202 A Normandy oak armoire, carved with flowers and foliage, enclosed by a pair of panelled doors, 50in. wide.
- 203 A Georgian mahogany powder table, with two drawers, on turned columns, and three club feet.
- 204 A Sheraton mahogany secretaire, inlaid with satinwood lines, the centre with fall down front, enclosing drawers and pigeon holes, two short drawers on either side, and with three long drawers under, brass drop handles, 48in. wide.
- 205 A Flemish oak court cupboard the sunk panels with shaped and moulded borders, enclosed by two pairs of folding doors, and with two drawers in the centre, 61in. wide.
- 206 A Sheraton mahogany tallboy chest of eight drawers, with moulded borders and brass drop handles, the cornice inlaid with satinwood lines, 43in. wide.
- 207 A William and Mary walnut wardrobe, the upper part enclosed by a pair of folding doors and with three drawers under, brass drop handles, 53in. wide.
- 208 A Georgian mahogany bureau, the fall down front enclosing drawers and pigeon holes, and with four drawers under, brass drop handles, 33in. wide.
- 209 A Queen Anne walnut chest of six drawers with inlaid herring-bone borders, 41in. wide.

- 210 An old English convex mirror, in gilt frame, with beaded border, 24in. diam.
- 211 Another, the gilt frame surmounted by a foliage ornament, 14½in. diam., and a ditto, carved with foliage, 18in. by 14½in.
- 212 A mirror in gilt frame, carved with laurel and bead ornament, 44in. by 35in.
- 213 Another, the frame carved with key-pattern and ribbon ornament, 42in. by 30in.
- 214 A Sheraton mahogany secretaire bookcase, banded with satinwood, the upper part enclosed by a pair of glass trellis doors, the centre with secretaire drawer and writing slide, and with four drawers under, brass drop handles, 39in. wide.
- 215 A Dutch mahogany bookcase, with borders of carved ribbon ornament, the upper part enclosed by a pair of shaped mirror doors, surmounted by an amatory trophy, garlands of flowers and husk pattern, the lower part with four drawers, 54½in. wide.
- 216 An old English oak chest, enclosed by two pairs of doors with raised arcaded panels, and with three drawers under, 55in. wide.
- 217 An old Dutch marqueterie cabinet, inlaid with vases of flowers, and foliage scrolls, and with fall down front, enclosing small drawers, etc., the lower part with four drawers, 49in. wide.
- 218 A Dutch mahogany oval table, inlaid with a fan medallion, and bordered with satinwood, etc., and with drawer, on square tapered legs, 42in. wide.
- 219 A Louis XVI. mahogany small bureau, with ormolu borders and fall-down front enclosing small drawers on fluted circular legs with platform under, the top with marble slab and rail gallery, a screen at the back, 20in. wide.
- 220 A Louis XVI. gilt fire screen, carved with flowers and linked ornaments, surmounted by a medallion head and with scroll feet, mounted with a panel of silk needlework, a vase of flowers, 26½in. wide.
- 221 A Louis XVI. dressing table, the rising top with mirror and slide and with two drawers on square tapered legs, 29½in. wide.
- 222 An old English harpsichord, in green lacquer case, painted and gilt with Chinese river scenes, buildings, boats and figures, the borders with birds and flower branches on red ground, on pierced end standards and stretchers, and with drawer at the side, 80in. long, 32in. wide; and a music stool, similar, on cabriole legs, carved with shell ornament and claw and ball feet.
- 223 A Georgian mahogany oblong folding dining table, on turned legs, 37½in. wide.

- 224 A Japanese wood cabinet, carved with birds, flowers and foliage, enclosed by folding doors, the lacquer panels similarly decorated in mother o' pearl, etc., and with open shelves, on stand, 57in. wide.

- 225 A rug, designed with flowers, medallions, etc., on brown ground, the border with running ornament on cream ground, 6ft. 1in. by 3ft. 9in.

- 232 A Feraghan rug, designed with flowers, foliage and medallions on dark blue ground, the border with panelled decoration on green ground outlined with red, 6ft. 7in. by 4ft. 1in.
- 233 Another, designed with flowers and foliage on light and dark blue grounds, the border with similar decorations outlined with yellow, 6ft. 9in. by 3ft. 10in.
- 234 A rug, designed with three diamond shape panels on striped blue and white ground, the border with medallions and conventional ornament on red and blue ground, 6ft. 6in. by 4ft. 2in.
- 235 A rug, designed with birds, animals and flowers on blue ground, the border with stripes of different colours, 5ft. 10in. by 4ft. 4in.
- 236 Another, Bokhara, designed with trellis pattern on brown ground, the border outlined with white, 4ft. 6in. by 3ft. 4in.
- 237 A corridor rug, designed with conventional ornament in grey panels on crimson ground, 12ft. 1in. by 3ft. 2in.

- 238 A rug, designed with flowers, cones and medallions on blue ground, the border with running ornament on red ground, 6ft. 2in. by 5ft. 6in.
- 239 Another, designed with diamond shape panels on blue ground, the border blue, white and red, 7ft. 4in. by 4ft. 6in.
- 240 A carpet, designed with flour branches and medallions on shaded ruby ground, the border with panelled decoration on blue ground outlined with pink and white, 11ft. 4in. by 7ft. 1in.
- 241 A corridor rug, designed with medallions, figures and animals on blue ground, the border of striped design, outlined with red, 13ft. 6in. by 3ft. 3in.
- 242 A Beluchistan rug, designed with medallions on brown ground, the border with similar decoration, 8ft. 3in. by 4ft. 7in.
- 243 Another, designed with flowers and conventional ornament on crimson ground and with striped border, 3ft. 8in. by 3ft.
- 244 A Meshed carpet, with plain ruby ground, the diamond shape centre panel and triangular corner panels of dark blue, with conventional devices, bordered with bands of buff and shades of blue, 9ft. 9in. by 6ft. 8in.
- 245 A rug, designed with cone pattern and scroll work on blue ground, the border with flowers on white and black grounds, 6ft. 7in. by 3ft. 10in.
- 246 A corridor rug, designed with flower branches on brown ground, the border with similar decoration on brown and white grounds, 8ft. 7in. by 3ft. 6in.
- 247 A Shemakha rug, designed with medallions in trellis panels on red ground, the border of striped design, 6ft. by 5ft. 1in.
- 248 An Afghan saddle cloth, the ends designed with medallions in red and white on blue ground.
- 249 A TABRIZ CARPET, with terra cotta ground, the shaped centre medallion and corners ornamented with flowers, foliage and cones on dark blue ground, the borders with similar decoration in terra cotta, white and blue, 17ft. 8in. by 12ft. 8in.
