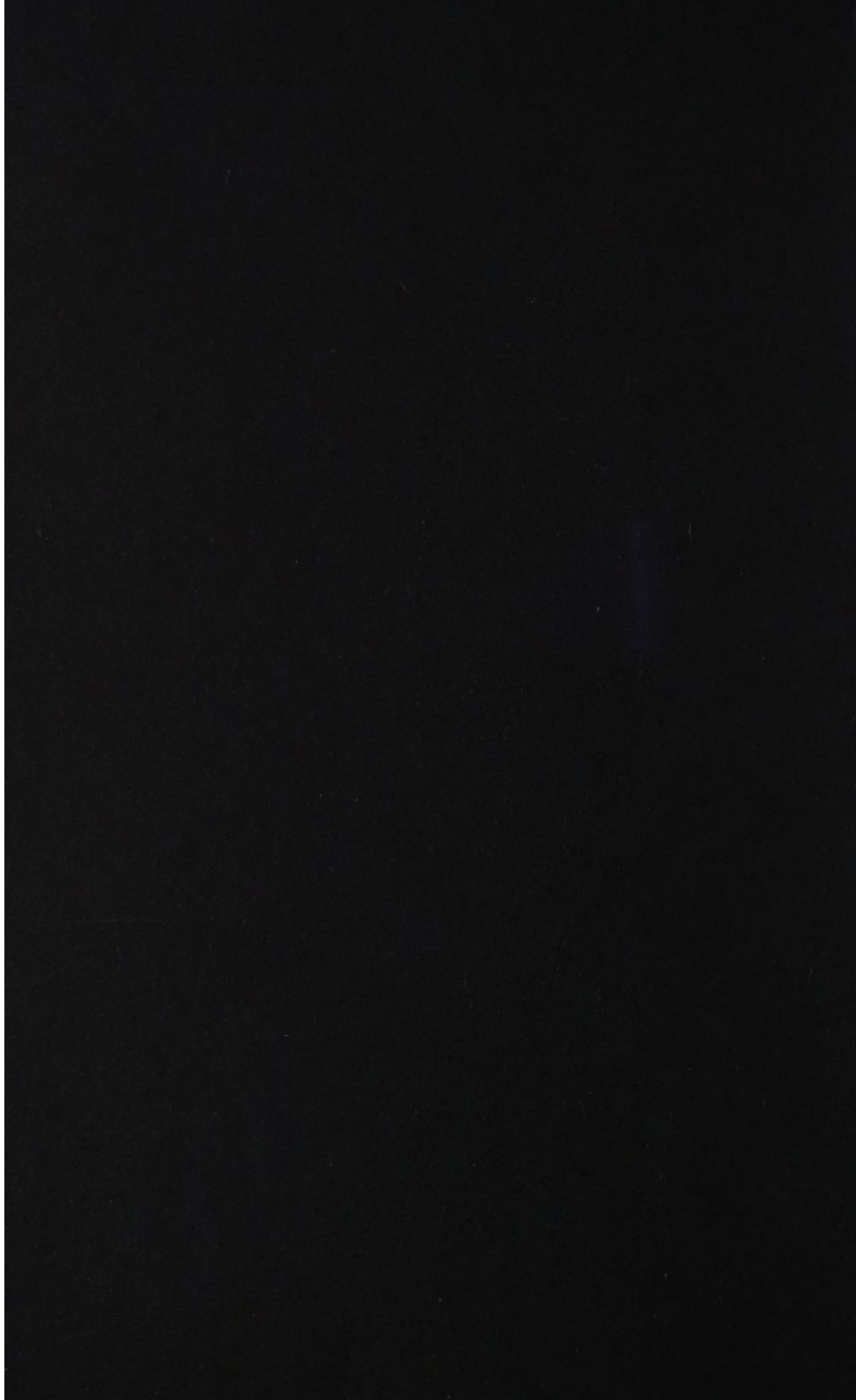

- 1 A miniature portrait of Napoleon, wearing uniform and orders, in the manner of Isabey, in blue velvet frame with chased ormolu mounts, *early XIXth century*.
- 2 An old English enamel oval plaque, The Calling of Samuel, after REYNOLDS, WM. ARTEUS *fecit* 1782, $4\frac{1}{4}$ in. by $3\frac{3}{4}$ in.

- 4 Another, of General Lambert, wearing armour and a curled wig, the back inscribed General Lambert, Anno 1659, in silver filigree frame.
- 5 Another, of a man, wearing powdered wig, blue coat, gold brocade waistcoat and white cravat, NOAH SEAMAN *pinx*, in oval gold locket frame, *XVIIIth century*.
- 6 Another, of Francis Bindon of Limerick, wearing powdered wig, crimson coat and white cravat, in oval gold frame, *XVIIIth century*.
- 7 Three Battersea enamel wine labels, Whisky, Gin and Cognac, and a Bilston patch box, the cover painted with birds and flowers.
- 8 A Battersea enamel bodkin case, painted with river scenes and buildings, in panels with white scroll outline, on lavender ground, $5\frac{1}{4}$ in. high.
- 9 A Battersea enamel oval plaque, painted with a lady carrying a basket of fruit, 3in. by $2\frac{1}{4}$ in.
- 10 A Louis XVI. mantel clock, in ormolu drum shape case, supported by white marble columns and surmounted by a vase, 15in. high.
- 11 A set of four old English ormolu wall candelabra, with scroll branches for three lights, and chased with flowers and foliage.

- 36 A Bow standing figure of a girl playing a triangle, on scroll base, *marked A in blue*, $8\frac{1}{4}$ in. high, and a standing figure of a monk, in white, $6\frac{3}{4}$ in. high.
- 37 A Bloor Derby vase, gilt with Chinese landscapes and figures on dark blue ground, on square base, 9in. high, and a Worcester vase, by GRAINGER, LEE & CO., painted with a view of Wick, near Bath, on maroon ground, $4\frac{3}{4}$ in. high.
- 38 A pair of old Derby figures of Milton and Shakespeare, leaning on pedestals, on octagonal bases, $10\frac{1}{4}$ in. high.
- 39 A Staffordshire figure of Mrs. Nickleby, $8\frac{3}{4}$ in. high, a small cup and saucer of striped orange and gilt, and a Chamberlain's Worcester jug, painted with flowers in the Japanese taste, 6in. high.
