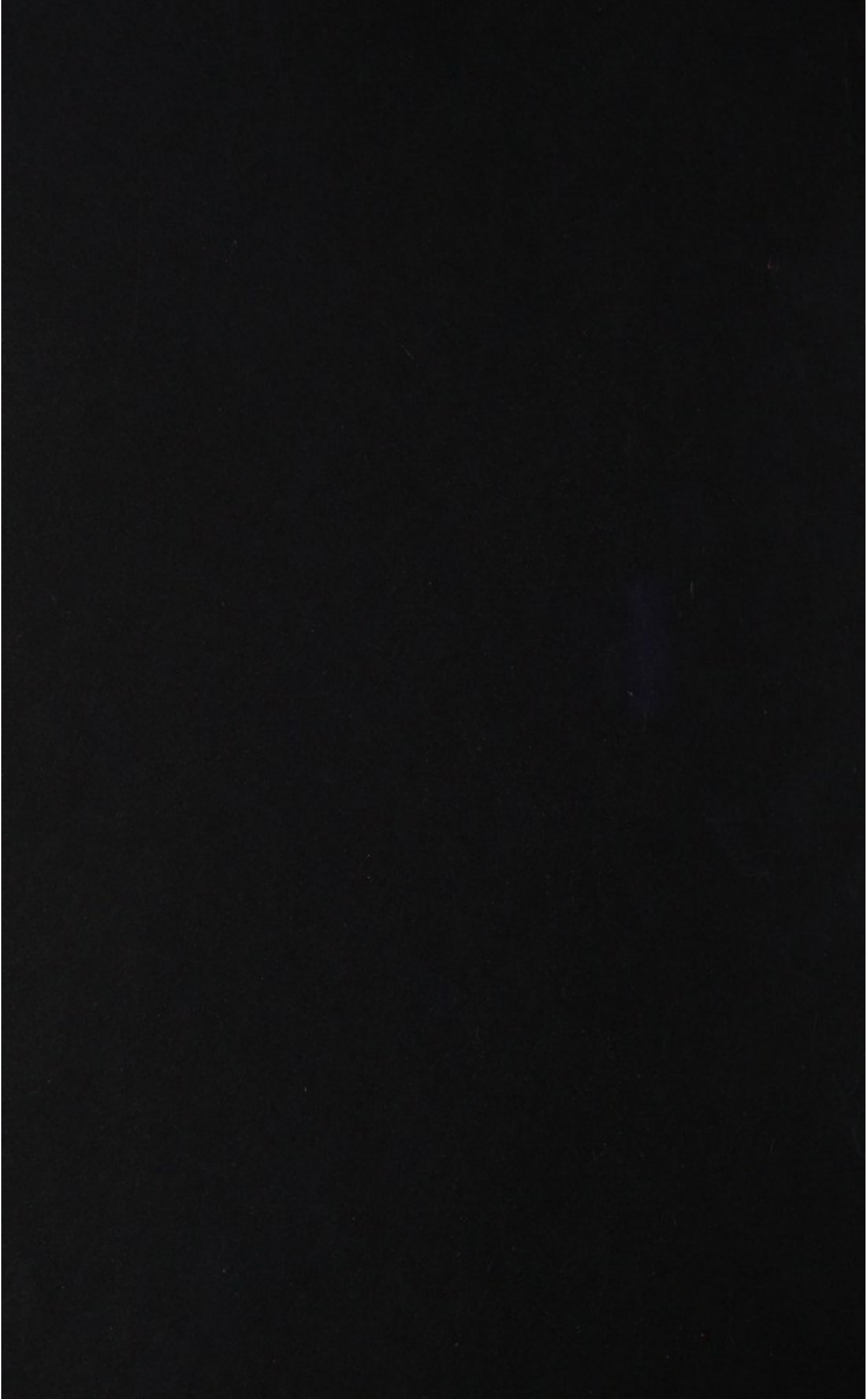

## CONDITIONS OF SALE.

VIII.
