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





- 94 A sword, the hilt with curved quillons and ball shaped pommel, South German, mid XVIth century.
- 95 A rapier, with swept hilt and straight quillons, English, mid XVIth century.
- 96 A sword with grooved blade, inscribed "Vive le Roy," the straight quillons spirally fluted, and with fluted guard, the grip inlaid with patterns in coloured bone, French, circa 1600.






