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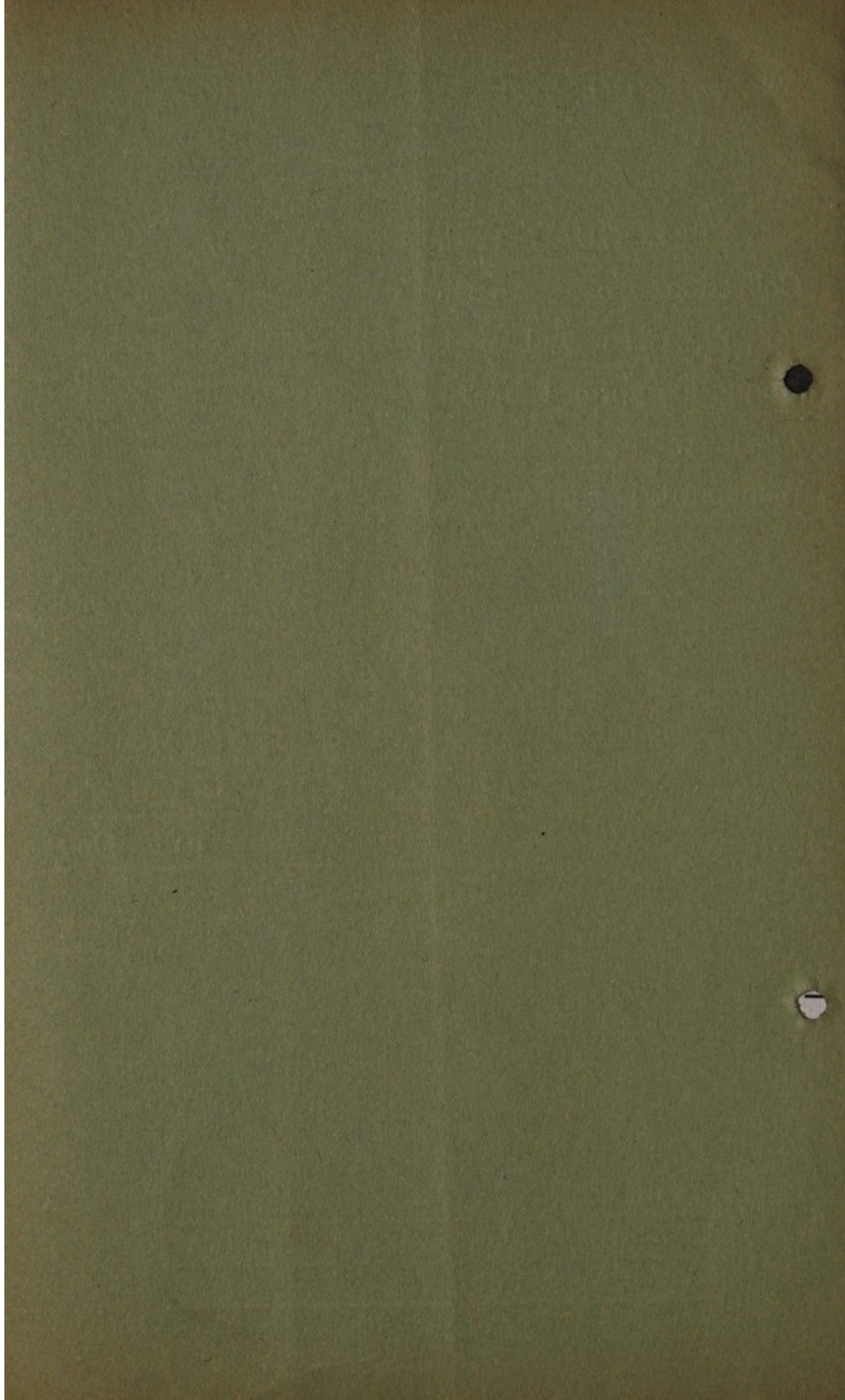

CYPRIAN TERRA COTTA.

Some of Phœnician Origin, chiefly from Cesnola's Excavations at Larnaca, Salamis, etc. (See "Salamina," by A. P. di Cesnola, Trübner, 1882.)

- 1 Nine lamps, *various devices* (two erotic)
- 1A Three very early dish-shaped lamps
- 2 Two very early vessels (in form of a duck and torpedo)
- 3 Four small unguent bottles, with ornamentations of circles and lines
- 4 Six children's toy figures of horses (two with riders)
- 5 Four figures of Aphrodite (the Cyprian Goddess)
- 6 A charcoal foot-warmer or Calidarium, and an odd-shaped wine jug 2
- 7 Twelve various wine or oil vessels, with indented lines (*the earliest ornamentation*) probably Phœnician
- 8 Eight oil vessels, for filling lamps
- 257- 9 Two archaic bottles, ovoid shape, with circular ornamentation

6. 10 Ten odd-shaped bottles, with curious handles, spouts, etc.
- 11 A very fine Phœnician Oinochoë, with raised lines, 12in. high
- 12 Two wine vessels, with circles, 8in. high
- 13 A plain water-bottle, circular body, with stopper, 16in. high
- 14 Two large circular water-bottles, with indented lines (one with flat side and handles and one globular)
- 15 Eleven very early bottles, with plain surfaces, *various sizes*
- 16 A LARGE VASE, 2ft. 9in. high, adorned with chequered patterns and circles, *a beautiful specimen*, on iron stand
- 17 A LARGE NARROW VASE, with pointed end and handles, 3ft. 3in. high, on stand
- 18 ANOTHER, 3ft. high, on stand
- 19 A LARGE VASE, with dark lines and circles, 19in. high, on stand
- 20 Three large Oinochoæ, with circular and geometrical ornamentations, 12in. high
- 21 Six vases, each with two handles, various sizes and ornamentation
- 22 Six small bowls, *various*, with handles and ornamentation
- 23 Three large bowls, with early ornamentations
- 24 Seven wine vessels of various sizes and shapes, with handles and trefoil lips
- 25 A very early drinking vessel, with handle and horn-shaped ornament
- 26 Six wine vessels, plain, with handles
- 27 Four various small vessels, and a plate

- 28 Three pointed jars (two with handles), 9, 10 and 13in. long respectively
5. 29 Five alabaster vases, with narrow necks, 5 to 10in. high
- 30 A large globular wine vessel, with handle, ornamented, 15in. high

RED SAMIAN WARE.

- 31 Ten Amphoræ of various kinds, with handles and black lines
- 32 Four Samian-ware bowls, with black lines, two with handles
- 33 Eight vessels of Samian ware, *various shapes*

PERUVIAN.

7. 34 Fourteen grotesque figures or idols
7. 35 Three large vessels, embossed with grotesque figures, 13in. to 16in. high
8. 36 Thirteen very curious and rare "Huacas" vessels and figures of animals found in the Incas Burial Ground, near the Temple del Sol Cuzeo, in 1878 by the late Dr. Don Pedro Jose Vildia and certified by his Executor, J. A. Hoyle, as having been found by him and sold to C. E. Lester, Esq. (*certificate dated Oct. 1st, 1883*)
- 27 37 Two vessels with human heads and a double cup in light clay, with figure 3
- || 38 Two double and one single cups, *in various devices*, two ornaments of Snakes, and a small jug 6

- 41 A two-handled bowl and cover, and another bowl and cover, with embossed head medallions (*mended*), from Chiusi 2
- 42 Two Lekythi, with handles
- 43 A jewel stand, and a pint measure 2
- 44 Thirteen domestic utensils, consisting of five saucers, four small bowls, three jugs (*small*), and a spoon
- 45 A two-handled vase, a small bowl and cover, and an Oinochoë (*lip damaged*)
- 46 A CINERARY URN, with female figures and snakes in two rows, with bird on summit, and ornamented with archaic figures of men and animals (*see photo*)

- 47 AN ETRUSCAN STONE SARCOPHAGUS, 19in. by 10in. by 18in. high, with sculptured procession and recumbent figure on lid, with part of original colouring

- 48 A CINERARY URN, with handles, decorated with various devices, with cover surmounted by a bird, *a magnificent specimen, 2ft. 6in. high, in perfect condition*

- 49 A LARGE OINOCHOË, with trefoil lip, handle and ear-pieces, with figures of men on horseback, embossed, *15in. high*
- 50 A PAIR OF OINOCHOË, with trefoil lips and embossed ornaments, *10in. high*
- 51 An Oinochoë, with cover and incised lines (*lip broken*)
- 52 A bowl, with handle, and a two-handled vase, with incised lines, *from Orvieto*
- 53 Five bowls, three with handles
- 54 Three high-stem bowls, one with beautiful figures in procession
- 55 A LARGE TAZZA, painted in red on black, with a lady seated, a man on one side holding a fillet, and on the other a female with a casket and tazza, a winged genius flying above, two handles projecting above the rim, *16in. diameter*
- 56 A GREEK VASE, with handle over the top, plain body, with simple scroll on the top, *9½in. high*
- 57 A CANDELABRUM, painted on the foot with a genius and females holding a bird, speculum, wreath and necklace, *RARE, 10in. high*
- 58 A LEKYTHOS, with a woman holding a wreath in one hand and a casket in the other, approaching a table, acanthus leaf at the back, *a fine and perfect specimen*
- 59 An Oinochoë, the lower part in form of a female head
- 60 Another, with boy playing with a ball

- 61 An Askos, painted with a griffin and a swan, and another, plain 2
- 62 A LEKYTHOS, with head of Victory
- 63 A LEKYTHOS, with figure of a bird
- 64 A SKYPHOS, painted on each side with a female seated between two sacred eyes, and another, with the sacred eyes 2
- 65 An OLPE, painted with an Amazon, fully accoutred, holding a battle-axe and shield, and a woman approaching with a jug
- 66 A small bottle, with figure of a bird
- 67 A GRAND KELEBE (19in. *high*), the painted feast representing three male figures reclining on a triclinium, and two attendant females (one playing the double Lydian pipes and the other a crater), with lyre and garland suspended above. On the *rev.* three draped figures on a black ground

- 68 A PAIR OF BEAUTIFUL KANTHARI, finely painted, on pedestal, under shades

- 75 A MAGNIFICENT VASE, with ornamental handles, decorated with figure of a female under a canopy, 30in. high

- 102 A Karchesion, with cover and two upright handles, decorated with female figures and ornaments in red on black, 8in. high
- 103 Three small Oinochoæ (one painted in black)
- 104 A vase, with two female heads and handles
- 105 A three-handled vase of choice design, 12in. high (defective)
- 106 A Chytra, with two female figures in red on a black ground, 7in. diameter
- 107 A very fine Greek head, with handle, and a candlestick on top
- 108 A pair of Oinochoæ, with classical figures, in red on black
- 109 An Aryballos, and a small vase for unguents 2
- 110 A pair of two-handled vases, black glaze, another vase, and three other pieces
- 111 Two Cyprian double-handled vases
- 112 A large Etruscan Amphora, with Homeric warriors

- 113 A Pelike, with three draped figures in red on black, and two other pieces 3

- 114 A PAIR OF CARVED WOOD GOTHIC FIGURES OF SAINTS, holding candlesticks, *fifteenth century*, 2ft. high, from Nuremburg
