- 1 A Staffordshire cylindrical mug, modelled with a ship in a medallion, inscribed "Villa de Paris," and with figures of naval officers on either side, on black ground,  $6\frac{1}{4}$ in. high.
- 2 Another, printed with Masonic inscriptions and symbolic figures on yellow ground, and with silver lustre borders,  $4\frac{1}{4}$ in. high.
- 3 A Lambeth Delft wine bottle, inscribed "Claret 1651" in blue, 7in. high.
- 4 A Leeds cream ware cylindrical mug, printed with "The Butchers Arms" in colours, 5in. high.
- 5 A Turner cylindrical mug, modelled with The Death in white on blue ground, 5in. high.
- 6 Two others, similar,  $4\frac{1}{4}$ in. and 5in. high.
- 7 A white salt glaze tea poy, modelled with conventional designs,  $3\frac{1}{2}$ in. high.
- 8 A white salt glaze teapot and cover, diamond shape, modelled with shells and key pattern,  $5\frac{3}{4}$ in. high.
- 9 Three Creil octagonal plates, printed with views of Paris, the borders with vines,  $7\frac{3}{4}$ in. wide.
- 10 A pair of Creil octagonal plates, printed with portraits of Alexander of Russia and the Dowager Duchess of Orleans, the borders with military trophies, 9in. wide.



- 11 A Rhodian circular dish, painted with hyacinths and other flowers,  $10\frac{1}{4}$ in. diam., and another, with flowers,  $10\frac{1}{4}$ in. diam.
- 12 A Persian circular dish, painted with a medallion and flower sprays in blue,  $9\frac{1}{4}$ in. diam.
- 13 A Wedgwood jug, printed with the Founding of Providence, Rhode Island, by Roger Williams, 1636,  $7\frac{1}{2}$ in. high.
- 14 A pair of Staffordshire circular plaques, modelled with heads of saints, and with copper lustre borders,  $6\frac{3}{4}$ in. diam.
- 15 A Staffordshire bust of Napoleon, on marbled square base, 10in. high.
- 16 A Staffordshire bust of Alexander of Russia, in imitation of bronze, the back inscribed "Moscow burnt, Europe preserved, 1812," by WOOD & CALDWELL,  $11\frac{1}{4}$ in. high.
- 17 A Staffordshire figure of a lion passant, on marbled oblong base,  $9\frac{1}{4}$ in. high.
- 18 Another, different model, 7in. high.
- 19 A set of five Lambeth Delft pharmacy jars, painted with inscriptions in cartouches, bordered with amorini, masks and shells, in blue,  $7\frac{1}{4}$ in. high.
- 20 A pair of Delft octagonal vases, bottle shape, painted with birds and flowering plants in the Chinese taste, in blue,  $14\frac{1}{2}$ in. high.
- 21 A pair of French faience models of shoes, painted with flowers in the manner of Chinese *famille rose*, 7in. long.
- 22 A Staffordshire group, The Tithe Pig, 9in. high.
- 23 A pair of Wedgwood cream ware ice pails, covers and liners, painted with borders of vine branches,  $8\frac{1}{4}$ in. high.
- 24 A Cauldon large vase, printed with landscapes, figures and buildings in blue,  $21\frac{1}{4}$ in. high.
- 25 A Bristol Delft bowl, the interior painted with a ship in blue, inscribed "Success to the Owners of the Love of Whit Haven Joseph Haile master," the exterior with flowers in colours,  $9\frac{1}{4}$ in. diam.
- 26 A pair of Staffordshire granitic obelisks, on square pedestals modelled with pateræ on blue ground, 14in. high.
- 27 A Lambeth Delft jug, painted with coats of arms and scroll mantling in blue, 7in. high.

- 28 A Ralph Wood Toby jug, seated figure of a man wearing brown coat, breeches and waistcoat, and holding a jug, inscribed on a cartouche at the side "It is all out then fill him again," 10in. *high*.
- 29 A Whieldon Toby jug, seated figure of a man, mottled green, brown and cream, holding a brown jug, 9 $\frac{3}{4}$ in. *high*.
- 30 A Nottingham stoneware puzzle jug, inscribed "Come gentlemen and try your skill, etc.," 8in. *high*.
- 31 Another, inscribed "Now you may take and drink your fill, etc.," 7 $\frac{3}{4}$ in. *high*.
- 32 A Staffordshire jug, head of a satyr, 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ in. *high*.
- 33 Two Spode mugs, modelled with Wellington and other figures in white on stone colour grounds, the handles terminating with masks, 4in. *high*.
- 34 A Staffordshire mug, head of Paul Pry, inscribed "Hope I don't intrude," 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. *high*.
- 35 A Staffordshire tea poy, modelled with "macaroni" figures in colours, 4 $\frac{3}{4}$ in. *high*.
- 36 A Staffordshire jug, printed with "Toby" and The Farmers' Arms, in colours, inscribed "Joseph Astbury, Painleyhill, 1810," 8in. *high*.
- 37 A Staffordshire cylindrical mug, printed with the arms of The Friendly Society of Cordwainers of England, in colours, and with name, Thos. Jackson, 6in. *high*.
- 38 A Staffordshire standing figure of St. Paul, on square base, 14 $\frac{3}{4}$ in. *high*.

- 58 A Pinxton oblong jardinière, painted with a vase and cornucopiæ of flowers in circular medallions, the sides with orange ground, 11in. wide.
- 59 A pair of Worcester small oblong baskets and pierced covers, by GRAINGER & CO., painted with flower sprays,  $4\frac{1}{4}$ in. wide.
- 60 An old Crown Derby oval basket, painted with pink roses, and with turquoise ground,  $3\frac{3}{4}$ in. wide.
- 61 Another, painted with flowers, on gilt paw feet,  $3\frac{3}{4}$ in. wide.
- 62 A Rockingham oblong basket, painted with a bouquet of flowers,  $3\frac{1}{2}$ in. wide.
- 63 A Coalport oval basket, painted with exotic birds in panels on turquoise basket pattern ground,  $12\frac{1}{4}$ in. wide.
- 64 A pair of Bloor Derby vases of flowers, dark blue and gilt, on gilt paw feet, 7in. high.
- 65 A Spode oval basket, painted with groups of flowers on dark blue and gilt scale pattern ground,  $10\frac{3}{4}$ in. wide.
- 66 A Rockingham cottage perfume burner and cover, white and gilt, 5in. high.
- 67 A Bloor Derby jardinière of commode form, painted with a group of fruit in panel on dark blue ground, and gilt, 8in. wide.
- 68 A Chamberlain's Worcester letter rack, painted with an exotic bird and flowers on ruby ground,  $6\frac{1}{4}$ in. high.
- 69 A Chelsea coffee cup and saucer, painted with fruit, vegetables and flowers, *the saucer with gold anchor mark.*
- 70 A Chelsea Derby teacup and saucer, painted with groups and sprays of flowers, and with gilt borders, *gold mark.*

- 71 A pair of old Crown Derby sauce tureens, covers and stands, painted with flowers in the Imari taste, and with panels of dark blue and gilt,  $5\frac{1}{2}$ in. diam.
- 72 A pair of Pinxton circular jardinières, painted with groups of flowers,  $5\frac{1}{2}$ in. high.
- 73 A pair of Chelsea vases of scroll form, painted with exotic birds and flowers, and encrusted with flowers, 9in. high.
- 74 An old Crown Derby semi-circular jardinière, painted with pink roses, and with salmon and gilt borders, gilt ram's mask handles, 8in. wide.
- 75 A pair of Chamberlain's Worcester oval sauce tureens, covers and stands, painted with festoons and sprays of flowers in panels outlined with gilt on dark blue ground, square marks,  $5\frac{1}{2}$ in. wide.
- 76 A Worcester beaker, by FLIGHT, BARR & BARR, painted with a basket of flowers in panels, and gilt with oak branches in a band of green,  $4\frac{1}{4}$ in. high.
- 77 A Spode cup, painted with a portrait of Futteh ali Shah, King of Persia, and with his arms, in panels, the ground gilt with foliage, marked *Spode and Copeland*.
- 78 An old Worcester cylindrical mug, transfer printed with a portrait of the King of Prussia, figure of Fame and a military trophy, by ROBERT HANCOCK, signed *R. H. Worcester*,  $4\frac{3}{4}$ in. high.
- 79 Another, similar,  $3\frac{1}{4}$ in. high.
- 80 An old Worcester shaped mug, with similar decoration, signed *R. H. Worcester*,  $4\frac{3}{4}$ in. high.
- 81 An old Worcester jug with similar decoration, signed *R. H. Worcester*,  $7\frac{1}{4}$ in. high.
- 82 An old Worcester beaker, transfer printed with the King of Prussia watching a battle, and with military trophies, by ROBERT HANCOCK, signed *R. H. Worcester*,  $8\frac{1}{4}$ in. high.
- 83 An old Worcester cylindrical mug, transfer printed with ladies fishing, and lovers in a garden, in the manner of Watteau,  $5\frac{3}{4}$ in. high.

- 85 A Chamberlain's Worcester cylindrical mug, painted with flowers in the Hizen taste, in panels divided by bands of dark blue and gilt,  $3\frac{1}{4}$ in. high.
- 86 A Chamberlain's Worcester jug and cover, painted with a view of Worcester in sepia, in an oval panel, the ground spirally fluted and with alternate bands of dark blue and white and gilt, *mark in gold*, 7in. high.
- 87 A Rockingham bowl, the interior painted with a group of flowers in the centre, the ground with spiral bands of grey and white and gilt, *griffin mark*,  $10\frac{1}{2}$ in. diam.
- 88 Another, Spode, painted with groups of flowers, and with panels of lavender and gilt,  $10\frac{1}{2}$ in. diam.

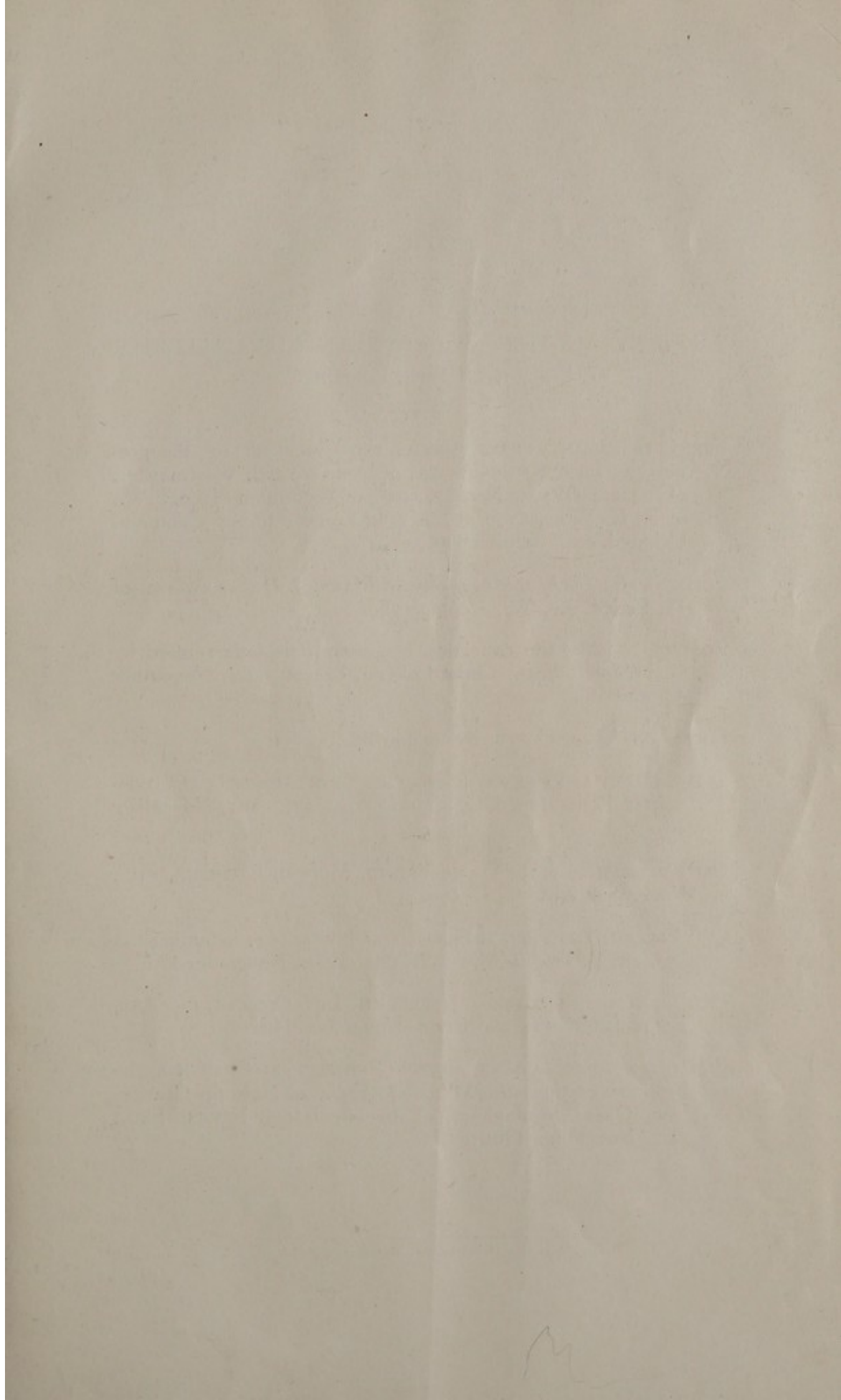
