

A fine copy of one of the rarest of the books printed by the Jesuit Missionaries in China. It is printed throughout in Chinese and Latin, in the Chinese manner, on native paper. The characters are cut on wooden blocks, and the work includes ninety pages, the first of which contains a remarkable frontispiece, consisting of a black ground with the design and letters of the title left in white. The design represents a circle of fire enclosing the sacred monogram I.H.S., together with the Cross and the instruments of the Passion together with the Cross and the instruments of the Passion.

Only four other copies of this work appear to be known, two of which are in the Bibliothèque Nationale, Paris, and one in the British Museum.

Brother Juan Garcia Racimo was a Franciscan friar, born in Quintanilla; he took vows in 1651, and soon was sent to the Philippines. In 1668 the Governor General sent him on a mission to Java, whose king received him very well, and sent him as his ambassador to the Court of Madrid. After fulfilling his commission he went back to the Philippines in 1673, and finally returned to Spain in 1674.

In this account of the persecution of the Catholic Missionaries in China between the years 1664 and 1668, the author, himself a Jesuit, refers to the care with which many of the missionaries had approached the Tartar religious conscience through the medium of the intellect. Knowing that they were addicted to the study of astrology, the Padres assiduously cultivated this subject, studied and mastered the Chinese language, and printed more than 150 books on mathematics and a similar number on philosophy, all in Chinese characters, and astonished their persecutors by their learning.

Padre Garcia gives an account of the infamous punishments inflicted on some of the Padres, and a list of the missionaries who appeared before the Judges in Pekin.

There were many difficulties to overcome during this punitive campaign, not the least being the astounding staying power of the natives and the natural conditions which provided plentiful sustenance, as well as other advantages. This Francisco de Tavora was a predecessor and member of the same family as his ill-fated namesake who was a Viceroy of India and eventually tortured to death on a charge of high treason.

Richard Munden in the "Assistance," with three other vessels, the "Castle" Fireship, the "William and Thomas," and the "Mary and Martha," in May, 1673, whilst convoying the outward bound East-India fleet. Three Dutch East-Indiamen, which called at the island, were also captured.

This Manuscript is of great interest and importance for the History of the East India Trade, as at this time the Dutch maritime power was supreme, and they owned a great number of islands and ports in the East Indies.

The Journal starts with a copy of the Royal appointment of the Commissioners by King Charles II to meet with the Commissioners deputed by the States General of the United Provinces, to draw up the terms of a new Marine Treaty, concerning trade with the East Indies.

Full particulars are given with the Minutes of the Meetings of the Commissioners at Fishmonger's Hall, London, between July, 1674, and February, 1675.

At the first meeting of the Commissioners it was decided that they should "first proceed upon the Treaty Marine and then upon the business of the East (Continued over)

Indies and deliver a project of Instructions and alterations to be made in the treaty Marine. . . . In regard to the present Treaty Marine, with the United Provinces, is to determine in or about the month of November next, that in the first place consideration be had of frameing a new one, and in the doeing thereof to avoid those things which are found in the present Treaty to be unequall, inconvenient and impracticable. . . .'

Following these preliminary instructions is a letter from the King appointing Mr. Bedford to be Secretary, and giving a brief outline of what is desired of the Commissioners, after which is a copy of the preliminary terms in Dutch and English, with each article separately discussed.



Salva (No. 3764) mentions, but did not possess this, the first edition, of this work, which describes the missionary's travels from Spain to India and other parts of Asia. His itinerary included Paris, Rome, Venice, Constantinople, Russia, the Caspian Sea, Persia, Afghanistan, India, Malay, the Philippines, and New Spain; whence he returned to Spain, to place his account of all he had witnessed, in the hands of his king, Charles II. He appends a brief statistical account of the Chinese Empire; and there are, in addition, several sonnets addressed to the author.

Pedro Cubero y Sebastian was born at Fresno, Zaragoza, circa 1640; and, having studied theology and jurisprudence at Salamanca, and philosophy at Saragossa, was elected doctoral prebend of Tarazona. He was authorized by the Congregation of Propaganda Fide to use the title of apostolic preacher, and to preach the gospel in Asia, etc. At the age of twenty-five he became preacher to the Imperial army in Hungary against the Turks; and soon after, set out upon his world tour, which lasted nine years. He was the first traveller to make a journey round the world from West to East, travelling by land whenever possible. He died in 1696.

Robert Knox was a Scotch commander in the East-India Company's Service. In 1657 he sailed with his father to Fort George, and on the return journey was forced by a storm into the harbour of Cottiar Bay, Ceylon, where he, his father, and fourteen others were made prisoners and carried into the interior. He remained a prisoner at large for nearly twenty years, travelling about as a hawker, when a chance came of getting away, and he escaped to the Dutch Settlement of Aripo on the N.-W. Coast, was sent to Batavia and thence to England, where he wrote an account of his adventures. He afterwards had a very successful career in the East India Company's Service. "His book, which is both delightful and trustworthy, is the first account of Ceylon in the English language."

This work contains an historical study of the art of navigation, shipbuilding—"proving that the inventors of ships have been the most famous monarchs, princes and heroes"; a study of the tides throughout the world; winds in general, and those on the Pacific and Atlantic Coasts of America in particular; variations of the compass; and other matters relating to navigation. The folding tables gives particulars of the winds.

This edition was printed at the expense of the King of Spain, to whom the work is dedicated.

The author wrote other geographical, mathematical and nautical works, some of which, however, do not seem to have been published.

Francisco de Seixas, or Seijas y Lobera, was a distinguished Spanish navigator and cosmographer. Born at Mondoñedo, he began his travels at an early age, and studied in particular mathematics, cosmography and languages. About the year 1662 he accompanied the French Ambassador Tavernier on his special mission to the Great Mogol; and visited China two years later; passing the Moluccas, and the Strait of Lemaire from the Pacific to the Atlantic on his way back. He then made a long voyage to China and Siam in a mercantile fleet, and took possession of one vessel as his share of the profits. In command of this vessel, he undertook another commercial tour in Europe and the coast of Guinea; proceeded to Lima in 1697, by way of Costa Rica and Panama, and made a special study of metallurgy for the purpose of increasing the output of precious metal in the mining districts of Peru. He studied with the most learned men of his day, and was much respected for his own learning. He compiled an original atlas with the principal ports in the whole American continent, which he mentions in one of the preliminary leaves in this item, but it was apparently never published.

He spent the latter part of his life in Paris, and died after 1704.

The last paragraphs are entitled "Modo, como van, y vienen las Cartas a este Oriente," in which the Jesuit Father describes the manner, ways, and times, how letters are sent from the Orient to Europe, and from Europe to the Orient. "The advice boat leaves in December, of this year, viz., 1689, from Macao it takes three months to go to Goa, so that it arrives in that city in March. The letters are kept during the whole of the year 1690 in Goa. Thereafter they leave Goa in January, 1691, and arrive in Lisbon in September of the same year, and thence in a month or two they are received in Aragon. So that letters which are written in China here in October, 1689, arrive in Aragon in October, 1691. From Aragon they answer in January or February, 1692; these letters arrive in March in Lisbon, in which month or at the beginning of April the ship for India leaves and arrives in Goa, in the same year, 1692. The letters wait there till April, 1693, when they leave for Macao, and in three months they arrive here. And so, the letters written in Spain, 1692, are received in Macao in August, 1693, and thence they are sent to the Fathers who are in China here. In this manner it is clearly seen that four years are necessary for an answer to be received to a letter, with the provision that in this calculation there may be some slight difference, more or less, depending on the state of the sea and winds. less, depending on the state of the sea and winds.

"This route via Portugal is very roundabout, but as experience has shown,

the safest.

"If only the Portuguese had missionaries in the Orient, letters would come much more quickly. Quite fresh news is received, however, by way of Amsterdam, (Continued over)

London, and Brest; but, as it is necessary to have correspondents to send the letters on, and there are difficulties in the way, this way is most difficult for us. I must not omit to mention the way via Manila, because although the letters are sometimes delayed, others come so quickly, that neither via Goa nor via Batavia. can they arrive any quicker. As an instance, in this very year, 1689, we received the news of the election of our Very Rev. Father Gonzalez, via Portugal, in August, but we had already had the news via Manila, in November of last year." Etc., etc. Actual manuscript letters sent by the early missionaries are of excessive rarity.

The greater number of these manuscripts are original and in the sender's autograph, while some are signed. The first MS. is an extremely interesting original letter, signed by the King of Portugal (Dom Joao V) consisting of twenty pages of instructions to the Marquis de Castello Novo, on his departure for India as Viceroy and Captain General of the Portuguese Dependency. He is instructed to observe the movements of his near neighbours, in order to be prepared against any attack; and is requested to try to re-establish the old friendly relations any attack; and is requested to try to re-establish the old friendly relations between India and Persia, which the late Marquez do Lourical, the former Viceroy, had attempted, "for you must know of its formidable power and about the acquisition of Thammas Kolican with his numerous armies, and the valuable assistance which they can give, with their troops, in favour of the State (India). You must know that recently they have conceived the idea of establishing a Navy, for which they have already bought some ships in Surat, and have ordered others to be built. And undoubtedly, if they should carry out their project it would be most useful to the State to make sure of the Persian squadrons, which in a few years will make themselves respected in these waters."

Instructions are also given with regard to commerce, "and besides all I have referred to with regard to the temporal interests of the State. I must also impress

referred to with regard to the temporal interests of the State, I must also impress upon you the need for equal efforts on behalf of the Religious interests, the Christian communities and Missions of those vast dominions of which God has constituted me Protector." The letter is dated from Lisbon, 25th March, 1744. (This Viceroy arrived in India in September).

There are also Reports of arms, munitions, supplies, etc., sent to India between the years 1732-1745; documents relating to the Royal Treasury and revenue of India; distributions by the prize courts; the Marattas in India; the forts at Mozambique; conditions for the surrender of the ports of Senna, Sofala, and the south coast; and several original documents on the government of India. Amongst the interesting transcripts is that of a Royal Decree, ordering the Viceroy to establish an archive to serve as a Torre de Tombo in the city of Goa, where all the official documents should be kept, and that facilities should be given where all the official documents should be kept, and that facilities should be given to Dom Diogo de Couto to gain access to these papers to assist him in the writing of his history of India. There is also a chronological record of the Portuguese Viceroys, from the year 1622 (when Dom Francisco da Gama, Conde da Vidigueira, officiated for the second time as Viceroy) to the year 1732; and a transcript of another early paper is that of the report on the commerce of Mozambique, from 1672 to 1739.

The documents are bound together in one volume, and form a valuable and interesting record of the Portuguese administration in the Far East during the

Padre Jerome or Girolamo Merolla was an Italian Capuchin priest and missionary who was born in Sorrento, circa 1650, and went out to Africa to preach the Gospel in 1682. His book, which comments upon the influence of the Portuguese in the Congo, describes in detail the life of the people and the natural resources there. Amongst the interesting plates is one, depicting a palm from which the natives obtained both oil and wine; and another, illustrating the use of tobacco, depicts a native man and woman in the act of smoking.

This book was translated into English and French and published in London in 1744 and Paris in 1746.

#### NOTICE

The significance of the Islamic book in its many aspects, calligraphy, miniatures, illumination, ornamentation, binding and so forth bas long ago been established. It must be recognised nevertheless that publications dealing with this subject have been either general works on Islamic art, or else when they have dealt with the Islamic book the authors have been compelled to omit the early period before the thirteenth century on account of the small amount of material at their disposal. This difficulty was marked particularly in the case of Islamic illumination because the earliest known miniatures can rarely be dated earlier than the thirteenth century.

Examples of illumination of an earlier period bave been brought to light only comparatively recently by discoveries of papyri in Egypt. It has been the special endeavour of Professor A. Grohmann in the University of Prague, as it were, to rediscover them here and to bring them together in a definitive synthesis. Part I of the present publication embraces therefore the early period from the twelfth to thirteenth century and deals with miniatures, pen-drawings, book-ornamentation, single leaf prints and bindings. Sir Thomas W. Arnold has dealt with the later period from the thirteenth to the eighteenth century. The first part, divided into three chapters, provides the basis necessary for the appreciation of the evolution of the art of book decoration and bookbinding. The second part, forming seven chapters, constitutes a bistory of book-illumination beginning

with the remnants of Persian painting through the Mogul and Timurid period up to the work of Bihzad and his school and to Rizah Abbasi and the decay of Persian painting. The last three chapters deal with Islamic painting in India and Turkey as well as with the craft of book-making in recent times.

The Islamic Book therefore constitutes the first exhaustive work on the art of the Islamic book throughout twelve centuries and it gives the subject the historic background from which the craft emanated. The wealth of documentary sources, a great part of which is published here for the first time, adds enormously to the value of the text which is supported by a magnificent set of plates of which many are also published for the first time. The very greatest care has been bestowed upon the reproductions and ten plates are printed in colour to convey the splendour of the originals.

Every library and museum, every collector and every student of Islamic painting and illumination and of the art of the book in general will find this book a necessary asset. It will hardly be possible to find another book which deals so exhaustively with the subject and in a manner so readily intelligible. The plates make this work even more indispensable as they bring together valuable and scattered material of which an appreciable portion is published for the first time in this limited and numbered edition.

The Jesuit Missionaries allowed their converts to pay these honours, finding that the practice need not in any way be detrimental to their Christianity; the other Missionaries, however, mostly Dominicans and Franciscans, utterly forbad the practice. A hundred and twenty years of dispute followed, and Rome finally decided against the custom because of its tendency to idolatry. From that time Christianity declined and practically ceased to exist among the higher classes. idolatry. From that time among the higher classes.

At the time of the publication of this work the Jesuits were in favour with the Great Emperor, Kam-Hi, or K'ang-hi, particularly on account of their scientific attainments, and many of the great Princes and Mandarins at his court

Maillard de Tournon was the Papal Legate to India and China. He issued a decree in Pondicherry forbidding the missionaries to allow the further practice of the Malabar rites; he also issued another decree at Nanking in 1707 obliging the missionaries under pain of excommunication to abolish the Chinese rites practiced by the Christian communities there. These rites consisted chiefly in offering small sacrifices to Confucius and their ancestors, and in the use of the Chinese terms "heaven" and "supreme emperor" for God. On his attempt to abolish these essentially Chinese customs, Emperor Kang hi ordered Tournon to be imprisoned at Macao, and sent Jesuits to Rome to protest against the decree. Tournon died in prison shortly afterwards, in 1710. Upon the announcement of his death, in Rome, Clement XI praised his courage and loyalty, and approved his Decrees. This work contains an account of all these matters. The whole incident was of considerable importance, and was the basis of much ill-feeling towards the Jesuits.

The vessel managed to reach St. Helena Bay, where the six remaining healthy members of the crew set out overland for a Dutch Settlement, one managing to reach Saldanha Bay. A vessel was despatched from the Cape. On arrival at St. Helena Bay she found the "Golden Buss" and took on board her cargo of gold, but her crew were all dead. The vessel itself sank shortly afterwards. One of the remaining land party managed, with native help, to regain the Bay, and was taken on board the rescue ship, but the other four never returned. The relief vessel was wrecked on her return in Saldanha Bay, but the survivor of the "Golden Buss" was rescued by the natives and reached the Cape safely and there joined his companion. 

A most interesting and well written account of the author's shipwreck and subsequent adventures in Madagascar, in the year 1701. Admiral Benbow's son was fourth Mate of the "Degrave." On arriving at Bengal the Captain and first mate died, so Benbow was second mate on the homeward journey. The "Degrave" sprung a leak but reached Mauritius safely. The captain, without making any repairs, decided to sail to the Cape, but a storm coming on he was obliged to run the vessel ashore off the south of Madagascar. Benbow and three others managed to escape capture by the natives and were rescued by a Dutch ship. The rest of the crew, with the exception of a boy, Robert Drury, thirteen years of age, were killed by the inhabitants.

Benbow had written some account of Madagascar, the manuscript of which was accidentally burnt in 1714. It had, however, been seen by several, and the hazy recollections of it, together with Drury's story, who had just returned to England, were worked up, not improbably by Daniel Defoe, and published under Drury's name. Drury, after his return, spent the remainder of his life as a porter

in a London warehouse.

The third volume, "Missions of China and Japan," especially is of extreme rarity; very few copies of the work have ever reached Europe. The work possesses an American as well as an Asiatic interest, because of the constant shifting of the missionaries from one to another seat of labour. The names of Mexico, Guatemala, Paraguay, etc., are thickly studded through the pages. Volumes I and II contain the History of the Franciscan Order in the Philippines from their foundation till 1741. It is one of the most important chronicles relating to the Philippines, China, and Japan.

There are also many references to Mexico and other parts of Spanish America scattered throughout the work.

This edition is not mentioned by Innocencio. According to the latter, the name Diogo da Costa is an assumed name, the author's real name is thought to have been André da Luz.

In 1736 the Portuguese were constructing the fortress of Thana, and had been at work there for four years. The long delay caused great discontent in the town, and in addition the workmen were unpaid and unfed, so they invited the Mahrattas to take possession of the Island of Salsette (near Bombay). Salsette and other places were captured from the Portuguese, and the enemy marched on Bassein, which city, after two sieges and terrible assaults, was obliged to capitulate, the Portuguese retiring into Bombay.

This tract is intended to counteract the effect produced by confused and contradictory accounts which had appeared, concerning the three years' warfare in the neighbourhood of "Baçaim" [Bassein], between the Indian enemy Mahrattas and the Portuguese troops, who acquitted themselves with such valour "as to deserve eternal fame"; one of the principal Portuguese heroes being General Martinho da Silveira.

Accounts are also given of the native assault upon the fortresses of Damao, Chaul and Dio; in the province of Salsette, and at Goa; and one chapter describes the naval battle off Mangalore between the Portuguese ship "Vitoria," under the command of Antonio de Brito Freire, and ten smaller vessels under the command of Savaji Angaria, on the 5th March, 1739. The Portuguese vessel gave a very good account of itself against heavy odds, being finally put out of action after inflicting considerable losses on the enemy.

On 5th May, 1746, the Viceroy captured Alorna, for which act he received the title of Marquis of Alorna, and he also subsequently took the fortresses of Tiracol and Neutim, and the stronghold of Rarim. When he handed over the government to his successor the Portuguese power round Goa was far more strong and consolidated than it had been at his arrival, and his government is deservedly looked upon as a brilliant episode of the declining years of Portuguese power in India.

This edition is the first European re-print of the work, which was originally printed (on rice paper) in Manila in 1748, and reprinted in that city, without date.

The book contains a contemporary relation of the persecution of the Dominicans in the province of Fokien, from 1746 to 1748, and a full account of the martyrdom of Friar Pedro Martyr Sanz, Bishop of Mauricastro, Vicar of Fokien, and administrator of the ecclesiastical provinces of Chekiang and Kiang-tse.

The account was written by his successor, Fr. Francisco Serrano, as Bishop and Vicar of Fokien, whilst in prison, under sentence of death. At the end of the book is the text of a discourse "pronounced in the public consistory by Pope

Benedict XIV, in 1748, on the martyrdom of Frai Pedro Martyr Sanz.

Fray Francisco Serrano was a Spanish Dominican who went out as missionary to the Dominican province of the Holy Rosary in the Philippines in 1725, and thence proceeded to China. He was one of the five colleagues of his Order who were eventually beheaded at Fokien; and was martyred on 28th October, 1748. The "Asia" contains the fullest historical account of the voyages and conquests of the Portuguese in the East, including Africa, Brazil, etc. Barros, who is one of the most correct and classical of Portuguese writers, is universally esteemed as a historian. He was born about 1496 and died at the age of 74. He served three Portuguese Kings—Manuel, John III, and Sebastian. Couto was the chronicler and chief Keeper of the Archives of Torre do Tombo at Goa, India, where he died in 1616. The histories of Cabral (the discoverer of Brazil), Vasco de Gama, the Albuquerques, Tristan da Cunha, are all fully treated of by the most competent Portuguese historian, who had all the Archives of the Indies at his disposal.

The "Royal Admiral" was owned by Sir Richard Hotham, cousin by marriage to Capt. Huddart. The captain was a very celebrated hydrographer, and through the introduction of his cousin joined the East India Company, making four Voyages to India in the "Royal Admiral." He retired in 1788, and spent three years surveying the Hebrides. In 1791 he was elected an elder brother of Trinity House and also a F.R.S. Shortly afterwards he entered into business for the manufacture of cordage on an improved principle invented by himself, and made a considerable fortune. He died in 1816. Several memoirs of his life were published, one of which was illustrated by Cruikshank. Hoppner painted his portrait.

This muster book is very interesting, giving details as to the pay of the crew, from £10 monthly for the Captain, to 15/- monthly for various officer's servants. The ordinary A.B.'s received from £1/10/0 to £2/5/0 a month. Details are given as to what happened to the men. A considerable number were impressed by warships, others deserted, a few died, and the remainder were discharged on the ship's return.

An extremely interesting Journal of an expedition sent by the then newlyformed Sierra Leone Company under James Watt from Freetown, Sierra Leone, along the coast northwards to the River Nunez, up that river, and then overland to the inland cities of Labe and Timbo, now situated in French Guinea. The Journal is written in an extremely interesting manner, with minute details and descriptions of all the country passed, and long accounts of the settlements visited, especially of the cities of Labe and Timbo. The writer was the first white man seen in many of the districts, and his account is probably the earliest description of parts of the country traversed. He also describes and names the various headsmen he met.

The expedition was undertaken for a twofold purpose, first of founding trading centres at Labe and Timbo for the Sierra Leone Company, and, secondly, as a means of furthering the suppression of the slave trade, which, of course, was rampant all along that coast, and which was supplied with slaves who had been made prisoners in the inter-tribal warfare up country.

The original Diary referred to in the title was probably long since destroyed, as the Frederick Settle entered to the title was probably long since destroyed,

as the English Settlements were sacked by the French only a few weeks later. This copy was doubtless made for sending to the authorities in England.

The Journal covers the period Jan. 20 to May 3, 1794, and is dated from

The author gives some amusing details of how the French Governor did his best to exaggerate the strength of the Island, and even went so far as to wear the uniform of the dragoons and state that he had been reviewing those troops, whereas the author, Mr. Colpoys, knew that there weren't any dragoons on the Island, and were not any more than about 30 horses to be found there! The manuscript shews that the British Government were even then thinking of a possible conquest of the Island, which however, did not materialize until ing of a possible conquest of the Island, which, however, did not materialize until 1810.

Mr. Paterson writes: "In the note I had the honour of receiving from you, Mr. Paterson writes: "In the note I had the honour of receiving from you, you mention a plan of the Mauritius, by which I conceive my letter to you had been misunderstood. I have no plan, but what I thought of at the time was a report of a Capt. Russell. . . . However, on my arrival here I found in my journal a much more perfect account of these Islands by Capt. Colpoys, then commanding the "Dolphin," and sent there by Sir Robt. Harland in 1772, which is herewith sent. If anything serious be intended against the Mauritius, I know no man fitter to be sent than Capt. Colpoys. . . . He now commands the "Hanibal," is a most excellent officer, and a sensible, intelligent man." Etc.

Capt. Colpoys afterwards became Admiral Sir John Colpoys, and had a distinguished naval career.

It opens with an account of the arrival of Lord Macartney on May 4th, 1797, and closes with his departure on Nov. 20th, 1798.

Accounts are given of the various disputes between the British authorities and the Burgher Senate. Lists of names appear of numerous Boers who had refused to take the Oath of Allegiance to His Britannic Majesty and the means

adopted to compel them to do so are given.

Proclamations on a wide range of subjects are mentioned, viz.:—Against the traffic in Arms and Ammunition, Smuggling, Expeditions against "The Wild Bosjesmen," Caffers, Hottentots, etc., against harbouring deserters from His Majesty's forces, Letters and Reports to and from the Landdrosts of the various districts, Making grounds for Encampments and Building of Huts for the Military.

Several of the entries between Oct. 7th and Nov. 9th, 1797, are taken up with accounts of mutinies among the sailors at Cape Town and the means adopted to deal with the mutineers and to prevent their communicating with and affecting

deal with the mutineers and to prevent their communicating with and affecting the soldiers of the garrison.

Among the Burghers are included many names of historic interest, that of

De Wet occurs several times, also Van Reenan, Du Toit, Brand, Villiers, Kruger,

Mention is also made of the arrival of ships of American, Danish, Prussian, and other nationalities, with the restrictions imposed on them with regard to the landing or embarkation of cargoes.

The volume closes with an interesting declaration by Lord Macartney, in which he says: "I have never accepted nor received, nor expect to receive, any gift, present, benefit, or emolument, except some small articles of fruit, venison, or such trifles as it was out of my power to refuse or elude, all of which I am sure could not exceed the value of from one to two hundred Rix Dollars."

These letters, nearly 750 in number, give a wonderfully interesting picture of the political and social state of the Cape Colony at the time of the first British occupation. They are addressed to members of all classes of the community :-

The Burgher Senate, Landdrosts of the various districts, British Officials, Naval and Military Commanders, Captains of various foreign ships at Cape

Town, Dutch Farmers, etc.

Those addressed to the Burgher Senate and to the Landdrosts throw an interesting light on the strained relations existing between the Dutch population and the British authorities.

In one (dated 3 June, 1798), Lord Macartney says: -

"It is not his intention in future to do the Burgher Senate the honor of consulting them with regard to the use of the Stad House. It is His Order that the Keys be delivered to Brigadier General Vandeleur. He shall not easily forget the difficulties made by the Burgher Senate to facilitate the loyal purpose of celebrating His Majesty's Birthday."

In others he points out the advantages to be derived from the British connection. He also gives instructions for surveys to be made, and makes various suggestions for improvements in Cape Town. He complains of the condition of the streets and avenues, "which are so much broken up and out of repair that in many places they are become almost impassable."

Among the numerous letters to the Landdrosts occurs a long and particularly interesting one to the Landdrost of Graaf Reinet, which is accompanied by a long list of "Instructions" (occupying several pages), and a further list of "Private Instructions," the 7th Article of which orders "For particular reasons and until further orders, the said Landdrost is authorized by these presents to keep watchful eye upon the Correspondence between Graaf Reinet and the Cape, or other districts, and to intercept to open and to examine every suspected letter."

Numerous letters refer to the Oath of Allegiance which many of the farmers refused to take. Persons refusing are to be arrested and conveyed to the Castle.

refused to take. Persons refusing are to be arrested and conveyed to the Castle of Cape Town. Severe restrictions are laid on the Dutch with regard to moving from one district to another, without first obtaining permission. Dissertions from

the Army and Navy appear to have been frequent, and the inhabitants are warned against harbouring deserters, severe penalties being threatened in the event of their doing so.

A Letter to the President and Members of the Court of Justice abolishes Torture and the Punishment of Death by Breaking on the wheel "and other

barbarous modes of execution."

Many of the letters bear on Financial Matters, the Paper Currency, Taxation, Levying of Tolls, Contraband, Smuggling, the Slavery Question, the Natives,

In a long and interesting letter to John Barrow, the celebrated African traveller, he remarks: "In addition to the Political enquiries you are to make, you will direct a particular attention to the following objects: "What Mines of Gold, Silver, Copper, Tin, Iron, Lead and Coal have been discovered, or what appearances of such Mines present themselves to your notice. What Commerce or Intercourse might be carried on with the Hottentots or other savage Nations. . . . Whether the Caffer Country abounds as it is said with Ivory, Gold Dust, and other valuable articles of Trade," etc., etc."




