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

KIYOMITSU (TORII), 1735-1785.

- SAWAMURA SÖJÜRÖ II as Kiyö no Jirö, a man looking at two frogs and a mirage issuing from a clam; and Josan no Miya, a Court Lady looking at a cat; both hoso-ye; signed Torii Kiyomitsu (2)
- 2 ICHIMURA UZAYEMON VIII as Soga no Jurō Sukenari pretending to play music on a broom, with Segawa Kikunojō II as Ōiso no Tora standing beside him with a samisen; and Ichikawa Daigorō as Izumo no Kuni, the temple dancer who founded the popular theatre; both hoso-ye; signed Torii Kiyomitsu (2)
- 3 Segawa Kikunojō II as O Wase, the sister of Oyamada Tarō, beating a drum; and Watonai or Kokusen-ya, the great pirate with his foot on a tiger; both hoso-ye; signed Torii Kiyomitsu (2)
- 4 SAKAKIYAMA SANGORŌ as Kosho Kichisa, the lover of O Shichi, standing holding a doll; and Onove Matsusuke as the girl Midori maru holding a sword in a wrap; both hoso-ye; signed Torii Kiyomitsu (2)

KIYOHIRO (TORII), 1708-1772.

5 NAKAMURA SUKEGORŌ I as Onishirō seated with brush and ink stone beside NAKAMURA KIYOSABURŌ as the courtezan Sumaura with a samisen; and A GIRL standing under a budding willow; both hose-ye; signed Torii Kiyohiro (2)

KIYOTSUNE (TORH), 1735-1785.

- 6 Segawa Kikunojō II as the Lady Kawoyo holding up the helmet of Nitta Yoshisada in a Chūshingura play at Nakamura-za, dated Meiwa 5 = 1768; and Nakamura Tomijūrō III as a woman standing by the open shōji of a house; both hoso-ye; signed Torii Kiyotsune and Kiyotsune (2)
- 7 NAKAMURA TOMIJŪRŌ III as Kiyotaki Gozen, standing before a view of Fuji; the same actor as a female firewood gatherer beside a stream; and Yoshizawa Sakinosuke as Inue no Tsubone, a Court lady beside a horse; all hoso-ye; signed Kiyotsune (3)

HARUNOBU (SUZUKI), d. 1770.

- 8 Three Tea House Beauties, trimming a lamp, reading, and watching rice cultivation; single page illustrations from Seirō Bijin Awase; unsigned (3)
- 9 THREE TEA HOUSE BEAUTIES, with samisen, fan, and incense implements; from the same book as the foregoing; unsigned (3)

KORYŪSAI (ISODA), 1720-c. 1782.

- 10 SAYOGINU OF YOTSUMI-VA arranging a branch of peach blossom in a vase, her two kamuro kneeling and looking on; full size, upright, one of the series *Hinagata Wakana no Hatsumoyo*, "New designs for young people"; signed *Koryūsai*
- 11 MITSUHARU OF DAIMONJI-YA on parade with her two kamuro; full size, upright, from the same set as the foregoing; signed Koryūsai
- Two Oiran, one seated and one standing, in conversation; medium size, almost square, one of the set Fūryū Nankai Hakkei, this for "Homing Geese"; signed Koryū
- 13 The New Year, an Oiran seated in front of a house watching her kamuro trying to get her shuttlecock out of the Kado-matsu; small size, almost square, one of the set *Hokurō Jū-ni Setsu*, signed *Koryū*; and another New Year Print, signed *Koryū* (2)

TOYOMASA (ISHIKAWA), worked 1770-80.

14 FÜRYÜ JÜ-NI GETSU: Five out of the twelve views of the Amusements of Children, for the 1st, 2nd, 5th, 8th and 9th months; medium size, almost square; signed Ishikawa Toyomasa (5)

TOYOHARU (UTAGAWA), 1733-1814.

15 YAYOI, "The Awakening of Nature," and HINA MATSURI, "Festival of Dolls," two diagonal Views for the Third Month; from the very rare set of The Twelve Months, by Shunshō, Shigemasa, and Toyoharu; this signed *Utagawa Toyoharu*

SHUNSHÖ (KATSUKAWA), 1724-1793.

- The Niken Cha-ya: A man and a girl playing the ken game and another girl looking on in a house looking on to a garden in winter; across the top a view of a temple grounds; medium size, almost square, one of a set Fukagawa Hakkei; signed Katsukawa Shunshō
- 17 Ichikawa Danjūrō V as Soma Masakado standing holding the banner of the Soma; and the same actor as a Samurai holding up a sheathed sword; both hoso-ye; signed Shunshō (2)
- 18 Ichikawa Monnosuke II in female character standing in front of a closed house; and Ichikawa Danjūrō V in male character on one knee, leaning on a go table; both hoso-ye; signed Shunshō (2)
- MATSUMOTO KÖSHIRÖ IV as a Samurai standing in front of a rolled blind holding a pruning knife; and the same actor in male character leaning on a sword; both hoso-ye; signed Shunshö (2)
- 20 Matsumoto Kōshirō IV as a Yamakawa Shiro-sake "white wine" seller standing beside his sakadaru; hoso-ye, signed Shunshō; and Nasu no Yoichi shooting at the fan on the Emperor's boat at the Battle of Yashima, unsigned (2)

SHUNKO (Katsukawa), worked 1765-1790.

- 21 SAKATA HANGORŌ as Amakawa Gihei standing baring his arm in front of the hanging account books of his shop; and Segawa Kikunojō II as a Musume standing holding her paper handkerchiefs; both hoso-ye; signed Shunkō (2)
- 22 Segawa Kirunojō III as a woman standing by a boundary stone drawing a sword, dated *Kwansei* 2=1790; and Ichikawa Danjūrō V as Kiichi Hōgen, standing, holding a makimono on military tactics; both *hoso-ye*; signed *Shunkō* (2)

SHUNYEI (KATSUKAWA), 1767-1819.

- 23 III VODOSHI, a celebrated Wrestler, standing holding a napkin; and NISHIKIGI, another Wrestler, standing wiping his brow; both full size, upright; signed Shunyei (2)
- 24 SAKATA HANGORŌ as a Yamabushi carrying his robe chest on his shakujō; hoso-ye; and Tametomo looking at an oni who is trying to bend his great bow; medium size, almost square; both signed Shunyei (2)

SHUNTEI (KATSUKAWA), 1769-1820.

- 25 Kitsune Tadenobu as a Fox man recovering the drum made of his mother's skin; Sasaki Takatsuna at bay in the fight between Noriyori and Yoshinaka; and Akushichibiove Kagekiyo breaking out of prison; all full size, upright; signed Shuntei (3)
- Abo Hizen no Kami and Akiyama, two warriors fighting, the former on horseback; and a Theatrical Duo: Bandō Hikosaburō III as a man with Nākamura Noshio II as a woman; both full size, upright; signed Shuntei (2)
- 27 Ino Hayata killing the nuye; Yoritomo defeated and retreating at the battle of Ishibashi-yama; and Isohimε killing a demon spider; all full size, upright; signed Shuntei (3)
- THEATRICAL TRIO: Scene from the play KAGEKIYO. Arashi Otokichi as Iwanaga Sayemon in the rear and Onoye Monsaburō as Shichibu Shigetada questioning Ichikawa Dansaburo as the courtezan Akoya as to the hiding place of Kagekiyo; full size, upright; signed Shuntei

KIYONAGA (TORII), 1752-1813.

- 29 A Modern Beauty as Murasaki Shikibu, seated at a writing table on a balcony, brush in hand, looking at the full moon; medium size, almost square; one of a series Wakoku Bijin Ryaku-shū, "An Epitome of the Beauties of Japan"; signed Kiyonaga
- 30 A GROUP OF THREE WOMEN, one standing, one seated, and the third looking through a telescope over the tops of houses at Susaki, at the shipping in Yedo Bay; medium size, almost square; one of a set Yedo Meisho Shū, "Yedo Views"; signed Kiyonaga
- 31 The Ninth Month: A Woman with a Child on her back looking at a chrysanthemum show and two boys beside her after a small tor toise; small size, upright; one of a set Fūzoku Kodomo Asobi Go Sekku, "Customs and Amusements of Children at The Five Fes tivals"; unsigned

SHARAKU (TÖSHÜSAI), c. 1795.

32 Matsumoto Kōshirō IV as Banzuin Chōbei, holding a pipe. A Late issue with recut block

UTAMARO (KITAGAWA), 1754-1806.

- 33 A CHILD DREAMING of Mikoshi Nyūdō a bald headed ghost, and Rokurokubi, a ghost with a whirling neck, and the mother lifting the mosquito curtain to see what is the matter; full size, upright; signed *Utamaro*
- 34 Someyama of Matsuba-ya on parade under peach blossom, looking down at her kamuro who is carrying a doll for the Girls Birthday Festival; full size, upright, on a yellow ground; signed *Utamaro*
- 35 OKIKU AND KOSUKE, two celebrated Lovers, he standing looking down at Okiku who is pleading to him and holding his girdle; full size, upright; one of the series Jitsu Kioi iro-no-mina-Kami, "Emulation in the Source of True Love"; signed Utamaro
- 36 Chūshingura Act V: A small boy attacking another and trying to take his charm bag from him; inset Sadakurō's attack on Yōichibei; medium size, upright; signed *Utamaro*
- 37 A LARGE HEAD PORTRAIT of a Beauty holding a sake cup, printed in two blues only; medium size, upright; signed *Utamaro*. A modern production

HIDEMARO (Kitagawa), worked c. 1804-1817.

38 HALF-LENGTH PORTRAIT of a Woman, name not given; full size, upright, one of a set Komei Kinkwa no Ike, title on a vase; signed Hidemaro

YEISHI (HOSODA), 1756-1829.

- 39 Four Beauties of Tama-ya on parade, passing to the right, their names from right to left: Utahana, Matsumoto, Miyato and Kokonoye; small size, upright; signed Yeishi
- 40 Hanaögi of Ögi-ya, seated at a table, about to write a poem on a fan, on a pale yellow ground; one of a set Seirō Bijin Rok'kwasen, "Beautiful Women of the Tea-houses as Six Flowers," this being for Peony; signed Yeishi
- 41 Kiseigawa of Matsuba-ya seated, looking at a partly unrolled makimono showing Ariwara no Narihara; one of the same set as the foregoing, this being for Sazanka, or Camellia; signed Yeishi

- 42 Tea-house Scene overlooking the Sumida river, right-hand sheet of of a triptych. A woman seated playing the samisen, and an oiran standing talking to her, while a boy points out something to a third woman; full size, upright; signed Yeishi
- YOSOI OF MATSUBA-YA on parade passing to the left with one kamuro on her far side and another in the rear waving her hand; full size, upright; signed Yeishi

SHUCHÖ (Tamagawa), worked 1790-1800.

44 Teasing Baby: A young woman holding up a stalk of bamboo with charms of the Tanabata festival upon it, and a child reaching after them; full size, upright; signed Tamagawa Shuchō

HOKUSAI (KATSUSHIKA), 1760-1849.

- 45 FUJIMI HARA, No. 4; SUWA KO, No. 13, and KANAGAWA, the Great Wave, No. 20 of the Views of Fuji; all reproductions (3)
- 46 KIRIFURI NO TAKI, "The falling mist Fall" in the Kurokami Mountains, Province of Shimotsuke. No. 1 of The Famous Waterfall Series. First Edition
- 47 ROBEN NO TAKI, "Roben Fall," Oyama, Province of Sagami. No. 7 of The Famous Waterfalls. First Edition
- 48 FOUR WATERFALLS: Ono, No. 2; Yoshitsune uma, No. 4; Aoi ga oka No. 6, and Yoro, No. 8; all reproductions (4)
- BUNCHŌ AND KOBUSHI, one of the small Flower and Bird sets, a late issue; and Two Views, double-page illustrations from Yehon Azuma Asobi, both signed Hokusai (3)

TAITO (Katsushika), worked 1816-1853.

50 Birds and Flowers, two of the large size set commonly attributed to *Hokusai* and so signed, but enlarged from Taitō's *Kwachō Gwaden* (2)

HOKUI (Katsushika), c. 1840.

THE VISION OF TAIRA NO KIYOMORI at the Castle of Fukuhara.

Triptych. The ghosts of the dead Minamoto surmounted by Minamoto no Yoshitomo forming a hillock of skulls in his garden; full size, upright; signed Hokusanjin Hokui

MASAYOSHI (KITAO), 1761-1824.

52 The Wrestling Match between Kawazu no Saburō Sukeyasu and Matano no Gorō Kagehisa.—Raiko and his retainers killing the Shutendōji.—The Death of Kiso no Yoshinaka, his horse floundering in a bog; all full size, upright; signed Kitao Masayoshi (3)

TOYOHIRO (UTAGAWA), 1765-1828.

- 53 HAWKING: A youth holding an eager hawk while he looks at a small bird held in the hand of a young woman.—Two Ladies and a young daimyō pulling at a rope; a sheet of a triptych; both full size, upright; signed Toyohiro (2)
- PROCESSION OF THE COREAN AMBASSADOR. Two sheets of the set of five; small size, upright; unsigned.—The Chidori Tamagawa.

 A lady and her porter watching the flight of the birds; oblong; signed Toyohiro

YEHON FUJIBAKAMA, "Pictorial Biographies of Famous Women." Four double-page illustrations from this work published 1823, unsigned; and a Surimono, sealed Yanagawa (5)

TOYOKUNI (UTAGAWA), 1769-1825.

- THEATRICAL Duo: Iwai Kumesaburō as a woman leading an ox on which Iwai Kiyotaro is seated.—Two Actors in private attire, one helping the other to sake; both full size, upright.—Arashi Sampachi and Onoye Monsaburō, both in male character, hoso-ye; all signed Toyokuni (3)
- 58 SEGAWA ROKŌ as Komume, the wife of Menoyoshibei, standing holding a piece of violet material.—Segawa Rokō as Shizuka Gozen standing beating a drum.—And Iwai Hanshirō IV as a samurai standing holding a hat; all full size, upright; signed Toyokuni (3)
- 59 Chūshingura. A Triptych with the whole of the eleven scenes of the play running into one another as one print; full size, upright; signed Toyokuni (3)

YEIZAN (Kikugawa), worked c. 1800-1829.

- Seirō Jūni Toki, "Twelve Hours at the Tea-houses." Three of the set: Narigimu and Sodegimu of Wakana-ya leaning against the frame of a house at the Dragon hour, 7-9 a.m.—Hanaōgi of Ōgi-ya starting on parade for the Monkey hour, 3-5 p.m.—And Shiraito of Tama-ya standing looking at a man behind the shōji, for the Boar hour, 9-11 p.m.; all signed Kiku Yeizan.—Utaginu of Take-ya on parade; signed Kikugawa Yeizan
- Genji Jūni Jō, "Twelve Parts of Genji": Maboroshi, "A Vision or Trance," a woman standing lost in thought. Hokiji, "A Dangerous Path," a woman holding a crumpled letter; both signed Kikugawa Yeizan.—Fūryū Nana Komachi, two prints from different series, a woman reading, and a woman holding a book; both signed (4)
- 62 Shin Yoshiwara Dōchū, "On the Road, New Yoshiwara": Masaki of Tama-ya passing to the right; and Ōi of Ebi-ya passing to the left.—Fūryū Matsu no Uchi, "Within the Pines," Tsuru-no-o of Tsuru-ya passing to the right; and Nishiki-o of Chōji-ya passing to the left; all full size, upright; signed Yeizan (4)

KUNISADA (UTAGAWA), 1786-1854.

- ORIGINAL DRAWINGS, in ink, tinted: A Woman standing holding the Haori for a male departing guest; and Two Women on a balcony, one looking through a telescope; both full size, upright; unsigned (2)

- 101 UTAMARO: Half-length, of a Woman playing the samisen, and a little boy pulling at her arm; from a Fūryū Shichi Komachi set; signed Utamaro; framed
- UTAMARO: A Chinese Scene. Triptych. The terrace of a palace with distant scenery, behind a grille dividing the terrace on the right, sits a noble lady reading, a lady behind stands shielding her face behind a transparent fan, and another stands holding a lantern; in the centre stands a woman with a hot-wine pot, and two are seated with musical instruments; on the left, a man and woman are playing forfeits, and a woman and child stand behind them; full size, upright; signed Utamaro in Chinese characters; framed, an exceedingly rare and early work, but somewhat worn

- UTAMARO: Gutarabei, "Stupidity." Half-length figure of a girl who has risen late, with her hair all awry, holding things for cleaning her teeth; full size, upright, one of a set, Kyokun Oya no Megane, "Moral Teaching (as seen through the spectacles) of Parents"; signed Utamaro; framed
- UTAMARO: Half-length of a female artist showing a man her drawing of a bird on a screen; full size, upright, one of a set, Fujin Tewaza Jūni Ko, "Women's Handiwork for the twelve Seasons"; signed Utamaro; framed
- UTAMARO: A Night Festival on the Sumida River. Triptych. Two boats athwart one another beside the walled bank of the river, close to the Ryōgoku Bridge, in one a lady about to get on board the other boat, in the centre of the river a man in a small boat letting off fireworks; full size, upright, signed *Utamaro*; framed
