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


## CONDITIONS OF SALE.

They are remarkable for the accurate delineation of the costume, Ecclesiastical, Civil and Military, Architecture and Domestic Manners and Customs of the period. Many interior Bedroom Scenes, Birth and Death Chambers, etc. are vividly depicted. The Battles of the Israelites, representing men in armour with banners and devices, are very spirited ; and altogether the MS. is of first-rate importance and in fine condition. The MS. finishes with 8 lines of the Epistle of S. James\* [See PLATE].
