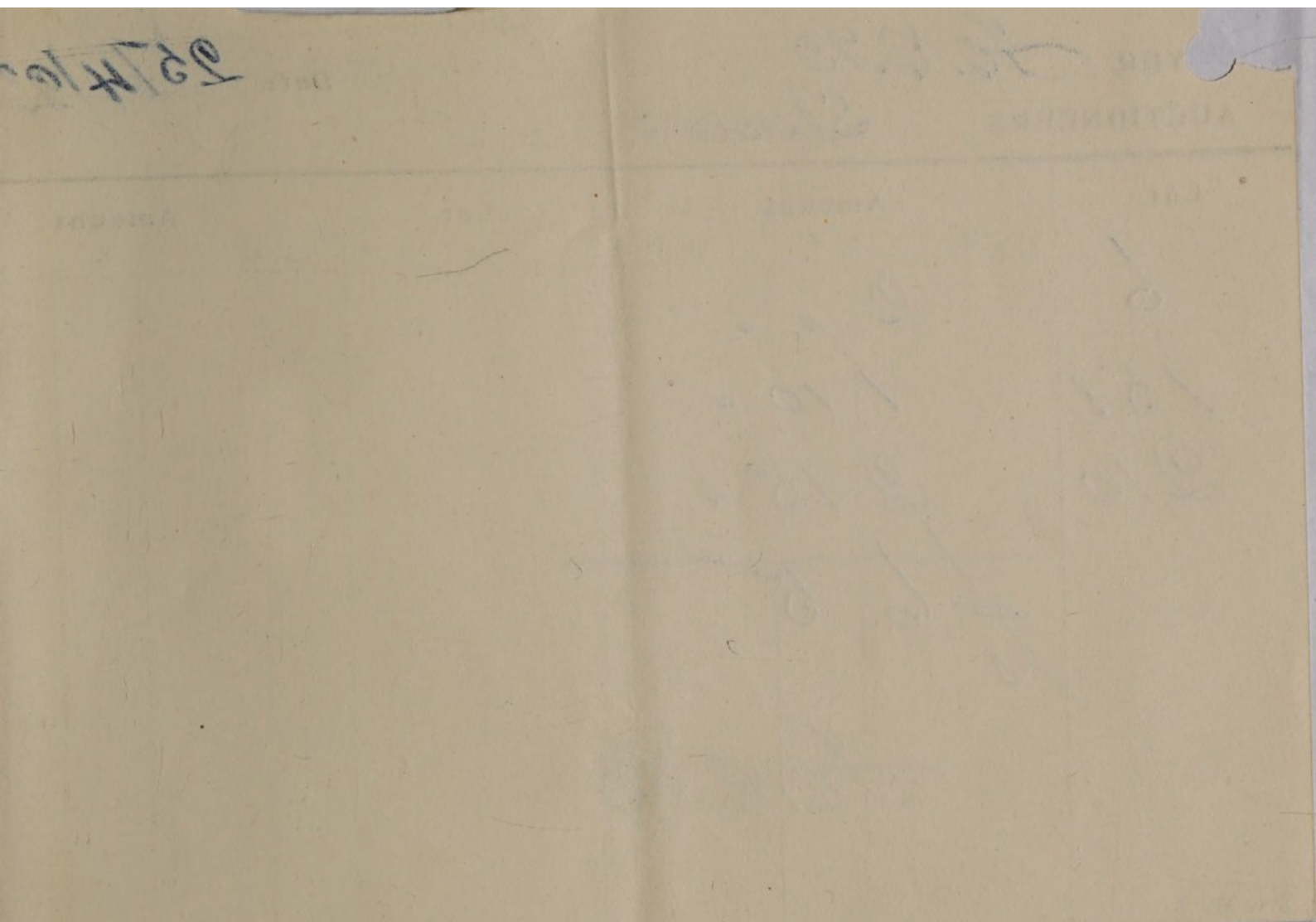

- 2 Four Eighteenth Century Court swords, 2 with gilt hilts
- 3 Two Eighteenth Century rapiers with silver hilts, a rapier with pierced steel guard, and a German hunting knife and sheath
- 4 Two daggers and a *linstock* (reproductions), and 2 pairs spurs
- 5 A Sixteenth Century powder flask, carved stag horn, circular Seventeenth Century powder primer, and another horn primer
- 6 Remarkably carved Eighteenth Century stick, probably Dutch ; a stick cut from whale bone, and sundry swords
- 7 Scotch basket-hilted Claymore, dated 1762
- 8 Two ditto, one of later date

- 10 Early type of matchlock gun (*Serpentine*) ; the stock is roughly inlaid with ivory, smooth bore

- 11 Pair of model suits of miniature armour, mounted on stands
- 12 Closed helmet of Seventeenth Century type, 3 pairs of gauntlets (one pair very good), and pair of tassets
- 13 Pair of upper leg defences in the Maximilian style, 2 gauntlets of the Seventeenth Century, one particularly good, and a pair of tassets
- 14 Two carved Dutch pipe cases, one made for 2 pipes
- 15 Case of small flintlock double pistols (under and over type), and a case of small percussion cap pocket pistols
- 16 Box of sundries, engraved horn powder flask, etc. 20/
- 17 Two Norwegian painted bowls, one dated 1781, a very large marline spike of whalebone, and a fine polished specimen of a double coco-de-mer shell
- 18 *Flemish windlass stirrup cross bow, complete with winder and pulley carrier, Seventeenth Century* 100/
- 19 Two gun-stocked "Pellet" bow guns
- 20 Two Seventeenth Century halberds, and a Venetian gondolier's staff with decorated haft 30/
- 21 Two Seventeenth Century halberds, one of early type, and a rough war flail 35/
- 22 A large 2-handed sword (late), a boarding axe and dagger 40/
- 23 Large processional halberd, and a pole arm made from an old scythe

- 38 Indian incurved sword, decorated with silver; and 2 daggers, *Katar*, with expanding blades (*Alwar*)
- 39 Indian dagger, *Katar*, with pierced shell guard for knuckles; a small axe with decorated head (damaged), and a Malay kris with carved figure hilt
- 40 Two Nepal *Kukries* in sheaths, and a ditto incurved sword (*Kora*), sometimes used for sacrifices

- 42 Three Javan krises, one with fine kingfisher hilt (one hilt damaged), and a small Bornean axe haft
- 43 Silver-mounted dagger (*Jambiya*), from the *Deccan*; an Indian dagger (*Katar*) with expanding blades, and another
- 44 *Fine silver-mounted dagger (Jambiya), sheath and belt, formerly used by the Arab bodyguard of the Nizam of Haidarabad*
- 45 Two Malay krises (one from Bali), and a Burmese knife with carved ivory handle
- 46 *Fine old Indian dagger (Khanjar), jade hilt silver-mounted, also sheath has pierced silver mounts*
- 47 Two Dyak swords (*Parang Ilang*), sheaths not original; a Sumatra knife with carved horn hilt, and 2 others
- 48 Two Cingalese writing sets, stylus, etc., small embossed copper Buddha plaque of fine workmanship, a pen case, and a boar tusk charm

- 86 Three carved wood paddles of later date, from the Benin River, made by the *Jekri* 24/- Goman
- 87 Carved wood staff with rattle, a carved staff with figures, and a whisk with figure carved on handle
- 88 Carved rattle staff, a weaving stick with carved end, and a staff carved with figures 45/-
- 89 Carved wood head, tribal marks and eye pupils inlaid with ebony, recess cut at back of head 7/10/- Beasley
- 90 Three carved and pierced combs, and a small kneeling figure 15/-
- 91 Execution sword, large blade, brass hilt is probably of Eastern manufacture 10/-

- 92 Another, smaller, all quite contemporary *of Gm*
- 93 Bronze leopard mask, and a small ancient ivory armlet carved *95/-* "
- 94 Brass dance sword or wand, handle ornamented with figures, blade of thin engraved brass, these wands are said to have been used by virgins in their dances; and a brass mask with conventionalized mud-fish around base *110/-* "

- 96 Two boxes of wood, in the form of a crocodile or a horned animal's head, 2 human hands seem to be grasping 2 horns *65/-* "

- 102 Carved wood cockerel, with wood projection on top, possibly used as an execution block *£13* "
- 103 WOOD STOOL, STEM CARVED TO REPRESENT 2 INTERLACED SERPENTS, BASE CARVED WITH HUMAN FIGURES, MUD-FISH, TOADS, ETC. HEIGHT 16IN. *10/-* "
