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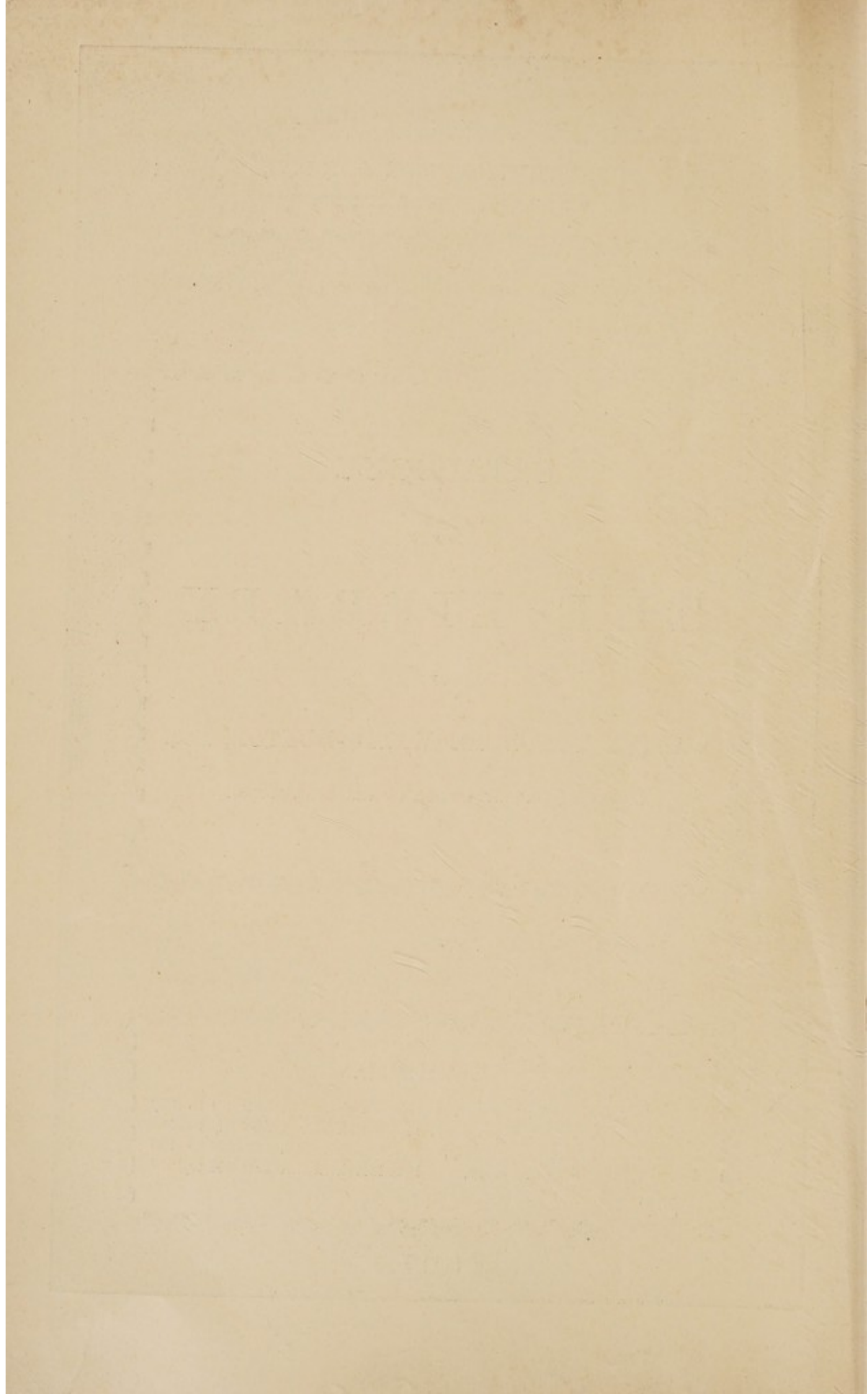

Though he admits that :

Only a man of some moral vigour, subtlety, learning and pliable norm (?) of intellect, could have undertaken or carried through the merest sketch or tentative suggestion of such a work [as *Sordello*], etc.

Most of the essay, however, is written in that style of ornate vituperation in which Swinburne excels, though he is careful to put on record the principle on which he justified his denunciation :

. . . It is useless to charge criticism with going hungrily into things and paltry questions of verbal or metrical quibbling. Upon these things depends the form of a poem : and upon the form depends the spirit : and upon these two depends the value of a man's work.

The best he can say for Browning is the following :

He is ingenious, learned, reflective, retentive, acquisitive, and self-reliant : he has a notable gift of confused and rapid jargon, of copious and chaotic fluency. He has an admirable capacity of compressing as with a vice or screw into the limit of some small monodrame or monologue the representative quality or spiritual essence of a period : such at least as he can conceive it to have been. He has some real humour, forcible and subtle in its way, and well under the command of his imaginative faculty. He has some fitful and erratic sense of violent or ignoble passion in its more obvious and theatrical forms. Being receptive and ruminative, he has matter usually at hand on which to exercise his natural vehemence of spirit. He retains, under an outside show of fresh and vigorous speculation, and a manner which gives the idea of depth and subtlety to minds simpler and shallower than his own, a stock of spiritual commonplace, a rag-market of moral old clothes, always on hand, etc.

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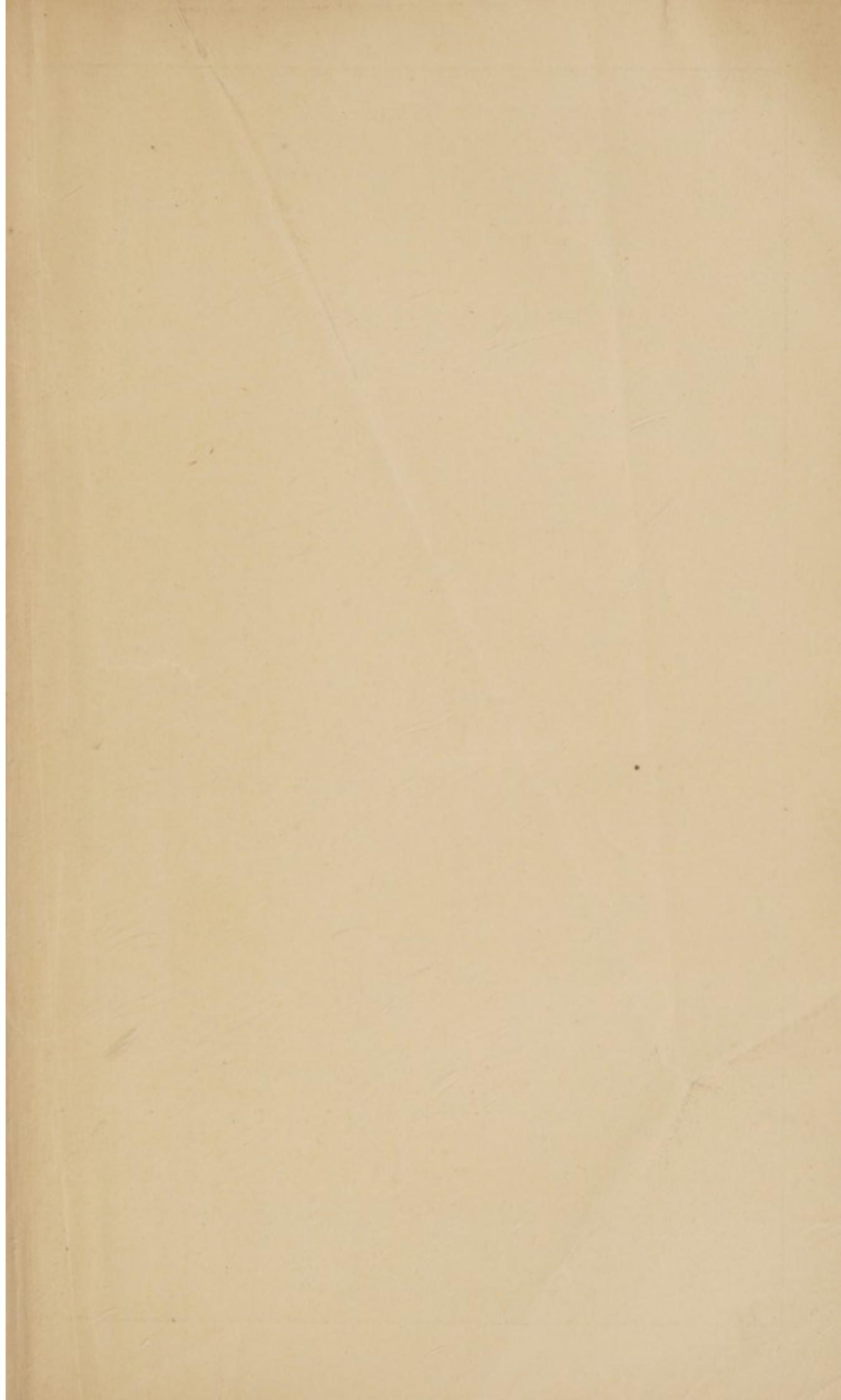
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
