## PRIVILEGES OF CONTRIBUTORS.

---

**Subscribers of a Guinea** and upwards for more than one year are Governors as long as they maintain their subscriptions. Donors of ten guineas and upwards in one sum are Governors for life. Governors are entitled to send their own domestic servants for free treatment in the Hospital.

**Firms, Clubs, and Hotels** subscribing two guineas annually may send one of their employés for free treatment each year; four guineas, 2; and five guineas, 3 employés.

**No Letters of Admission are issued.** It will be sufficient for contributors to give their names to ensure the free treatment to which their servants or employés may be entitled.

### **The Accommodation is of two kinds, viz.—**

(1) In the wards at a fee of  $3\frac{1}{2}$  guineas for diphtheria, and in other cases £3 3s., both fees payable on or before admission, and these cover the whole period of the patients' stay in the Hospital; which, in scarlet fever cases, is from six to eight weeks; and

(2) In private rooms at a fee of  $5\frac{1}{2}$  guineas a week, payable weekly in advance.

**The Method of admission** is as follows:—If the medical practitioner in attendance on the case will leave at the sufferer's residence a certificate clearly defining the disease the patient is suffering from and the friends then make application to the Secretary at the Hospital either in person, by telegraph, telephone, or post, giving at the same time the name of a person who will pay the fee,\* an ambulance will be sent for the patient's removal as quickly as possible. There is a charge for hire of the ambulance, to be paid in addition to the fee; as well as 2/6 extra for a nurse when required.

N.B.—Disregard of these instructions frequently causes delay and annoyance.

# REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE

FOR THE

Year ended December 31st, 1915.

The Committee present herewith their One Hundred and Fourteenth Report of the Hospital since its foundation in 1802.

THE TOTAL NUMBER OF PATIENTS.—During the year 1915 the total number of patients under treatment was 1,059—being an increase of 113 over the number of last year. Of these, 975 were discharged cured, 17 died, and 67 remained under treatment at the end of the year.

The chief feature in these figures during the past year has been the notable increase of *Measles* and *German Measles* cases, the total number of cases admitted, viz., 486, being in part due to the reception of cases from the training camps.

As showing the relative work of the Hospital [during the past year, it may be noted that the daily average number of patients in the Hospital was 72, as compared with 80 in 1914.

SCARLET FEVER.—The year was marked by a light prevalence of this disease, again not confined, as is usually the case, to the autumnal period of the year, but extending throughout the twelve months. This feature is brought out in the following Table, showing the monthly admissions during the year, as compared with the figures for the previous year.

The total number of cases admitted was thus 301, as compared with 500 cases in 1914, 328 cases in 1913, and 212 cases in 1912. There were 76 cases in the Hospital when the year began, so that the total under treatment was 377, as compared with 577 in 1914, 352 in 1913, and 246 cases in 1912.

Of these, 338 were discharged cured, 34 remained in the Hospital at the end of the year, and 5 died—a death-rate of 1.3 per cent. All the cases which died were of a very severe character.

The Hospital records show the following diminution in the death-rate of the disease in the cases (over 22,000) admitted since 1860.

**MORBILLI ("ENGLISH MEASLES").**—This disease has been more prevalent during the past year, under which circumstances it is fortunate for the Hospital that no large demand was made on its accommodation for Scarlet Fever cases.

The number of cases admitted was 208, as compared with 70 in the preceding year; 7 cases were in Hospital at the beginning of the year; the total under treatment was 215, as compared with 73 in the preceding year. Of these, 207 cases were discharged recovered, 1 remained in Hospital at the end of the year, and 7 died—a death-rate of 3.3 per cent.

**RUBELLA ("GERMAN MEASLES").**—This disease was also more prevalent during the year than in the preceding year. The number of cases admitted was 278, as against 77 in the preceding year.

One case was in Hospital at the commencement of the year, so that the total under treatment was 279 cases, 269 of whom were discharged recovered, 10 remaining in Hospital at the end of the year.

**DIPHTHERIA.**—The number of cases of this disease admitted during the year remained high. The number was 109 cases, as compared with 123 cases in 1914, 75 cases in 1913, and 71 in 1912.

Twenty-five cases were under treatment at the commencement of the year, so that the total under treatment was 134 cases.

Of these, 114 were discharged cured, 17 remained in Hospital at the end of the year, and 3 died—a death-rate of 2.24 per cent. The fatal cases were of a very severe character.

The following Table shows the death-rate of cases of diphtheria admitted into the Hospital since the year 1880.

**TYPHOID FEVER.**—The number of cases admitted during the year was 6. One was in Hospital at the beginning of the year, so that the total under treatment was 7. Of these, 6 were discharged cured. One remained in Hospital. None died.

MUMPS.—Only 8 cases of this disease were admitted during the year, as compared with 35 in the preceding year.

VARICELLA ("CHICKEN POX").—Seven cases were admitted, as compared with 12 in the preceding year.

ERYSIPELAS.—Four cases were admitted, as compared with 7 in the previous year.

CEREBROSPINAL FEVER.—Six cases were admitted, there were 2 deaths.

OTHER DISEASES.—In addition to the foregoing, 22 other cases of various diseases were admitted during the year. The character of these is detailed in the accompanying Table X., which, with the other Tables, has been prepared by the Resident Medical Officers.

STAFF.—Of the members of the Staff of the Institution—1 Resident Medical Officer contracted Scarlet Fever and 1 Morbilli; 7 Nurses contracted Scarlet Fever, 3 Tonsillitis, 2 Rubella, 1 Diphtheria, 1 Influenza, 1 suffered from Heart Disease, and 1 from Whitlow—all recovered. One wardmaid developed Scarlet Fever, 1 Rubella, 1 Diphtheria, 1 Rheumatism and 1 Varicella, all of whom recovered. One male employé contracted Tonsillitis.

CHANGES IN THE STAFF.—Of the Visiting Staff, Dr. Hunter departed as Colonel-in-Charge of a Special Sanitary Mission to Servia in February, 1915. He is still away on war service. Dr. Maynard Smith, the surgeon, left for Flanders early in the year. Dr. Charles Box and Sir John Broadbent, having Territorial Commissions at home remained in charge of the wards :

In May, 1915, Dr. Garrow the Resident Medical Officer was given temporary leave of absence and took a Commission in the Royal Army Medical Service. He is still abroad. Dr. Lund, the Assistant Medical Officer had already resigned to accompany Dr. Hunter. The Committee were fortunate in securing the able services of Dr. T. G. Nicholson as Resident Medical Officer. For the greater part of the year Dr. Woo acted as Assistant Medical Officer, a post now filled by Mr. Kendall a fifth year's Medical Student.

In their last Report, the Committee described the further steps they had taken to provide an additional Isolation Block of rooms and cubicles, as the most urgent need of the Hospital, owing to the number and variety of cases of disease seeking admission. They are now able to report that the New Isolation Block, designed by their Architect, Mr. Keith D. Young, is complete, and in use. It provides twenty additional Cubicles and Private Rooms ; with the necessary Receiving, Discharging, and Administrative Rooms, viz., twelve Isolation-Rooms separate by glass partitions on the ground floor, and eight private rooms on the upper floor. Its great value in facilitating administration and affording accommodation for cases which formerly must of necessity have been refused admission, is amply proved.

COMMITTEE.—The consent of Lord Muir Mackenzie to join the Hospital Committee has afforded great satisfaction. The Hospital thereby has gained the services of a valuable adviser.

FINANCIAL POSITION.—During the past year the Annual Subscriptions amounted to £4,270, a decrease of £117. The Donations amounted to £1,365, an increase of £550 5s. 4d. on 1914. Legacies amounted to £220 only as against £2,163 11s. 5d. in 1914 and £6,092 in 1913.

The King's Fund made a grant of £100, being an increase of £50. It will be remembered that last year this Fund also contributed £500 towards the new Isolation Block. Under these circumstances the Committee have found it necessary to contract a Loan from their Bankers of £4,200. The serious financial position is due in part to the expenses of building and furnishing the new Block, in part to increased cost of food, drugs, material and labour owing to the war, and in part to diminution of income.

It has been found necessary to raise the fees for private rooms to 5½ guineas per week, and the ward fees for Diphtheria to 3½ guineas per patient.

## LAWS AND REGULATIONS.

---

### Reception of Patients.

1. The Hospital is intended for the reception of persons suffering from infectious fever other than small-pox, and more especially for such of those persons as may require isolation, in order to prevent the further spread or propagation of the disease from them to others.

2. Any person (not being a parochial pauper) labouring under such disease shall, subject to the next rule, be considered a proper person for admission into the Hospital.

3. The Committee may from time to time make regulations for the admission of such persons as patients on payment of such sums as may be from time to time determined, provided always that—

(a) Domestic servants of governors shall be admitted gratuitously.

(b) The Committee may, if they think fit, at any time reduce or wholly remit the fees in the case of individual patients.

4. Applications for admission should be accompanied by a medical certificate stating the nature of the disease. The medical officers may, in the exercise of their discretion, refuse admission to any case which they deem unfit; but every refusal to admit a patient shall be reported at the next meeting of the Committee, together with the reason for the refusal.

### Governors.

5. All subscribers of not less than one guinea per annum, who have subscribed for more than one year, and all donors of not less than ten guineas in one donation, shall be governors of the Hospital. This rule shall not be retrospective.

### General Meeting and Election of Committee.

6. A general meeting of the governors, of which ten days' previous notice must be given in three morning newspapers, shall be held every year, on the second Friday in February, or as near thereto as may be convenient, for the purpose of approving or rescinding the proceedings of the Committee for the preceding year ; for receiving the annual report of the state of the funds ; and for electing a president, vice-presidents, treasurer, honorary secretary, and other members of the Committee for the ensuing year.

7. The Committee for the management of the Hospital shall consist of the president, the vice-presidents, the trustees, the treasurer, honorary secretary, and not less than fifteen nor more than twenty-five other governors.

8. A special general meeting of the governors may at any time be called by direction of the president or of the Committee ; or on the requisition of any twelve governors, provided the requisition be made in writing to the secretary and the purpose for which the same is summoned be published in three morning newspapers at least ten days prior to the meeting ; but the proceedings of such special general meeting, though acted upon *pro tempore*, shall not be deemed final until confirmed by another general meeting.

9. No new rule or law shall be made, nor shall any existing rule or law be repealed or altered, until determined upon at a general meeting by a majority of governors present and voting, and until confirmed at a subsequent general or special meeting.

10. The presence of seven governors shall be necessary to constitute a quorum at general meetings, and without that number no business shall be transacted.

### The Committee.

11. The Committee shall manage the Hospital. They shall meet on the second Friday, or on such other day of every month as they may appoint ; and three members shall be necessary to constitute a meeting and to transact business. A special meeting of the Committee may be called by the direction of the honorary secretary, or by any three members of the Committee, on giving at least three days' notice of the same to the members of the Committee, and specifying the business for which it is called.

12. The Committee shall have authority to appoint sub-committees, whose reports shall be submitted to their consideration ; and with the assistance of the medical officers shall, from time to time as may be expedient, form regulations and by-laws for the internal management of the Hospital.

13. The resolutions of one meeting of the Committee shall not be rescinded by another, unless it be specially summoned for that purpose.

14. The Committee shall yearly publish a report of the state of the Hospital.

15. All accounts, except such sums as may be comprised under the item of petty cash, shall be submitted to the Committee at the monthly meetings, after having been duly examined by the secretary, the resident medical officer, the house directors, and certified by the auditor; and such accounts, if approved, shall be paid by cheques, payable to order, signed by two members of the Committee, on production of the house directors' minutes relating to them, and countersigned by the secretary.

16. No member of the Committee shall furnish, otherwise than gratuitously, any goods, provisions, or other articles, for the use of, or on account of, the Hospital, or be concerned in any contract, directly or indirectly, for supplying the same, or be employed for hire, fees, wages, or profit in any office or employment in connection with the Hospital.

#### Conduct of Meetings.

17. At all meetings a simple majority of the members present and voting shall bind the minority; and in case of equality of votes, the chairman shall have an additional or casting vote.

#### Treasurer.

18. The treasurer, if present, shall take the chair at all meetings of the Committee, in the absence of the president or vice-presidents. He shall keep an account at the bankers', and all moneys received for the use of the Hospital shall be paid to such account; he shall honour cheques signed, as provided in Rule 15.

#### Honorary Secretary.

19. In the absence of the Committee, the honorary secretary shall represent the Hospital with the public and with public bodies, reporting his action to the Committee.

#### Audit.

20. All accounts of the Hospital shall be audited by a professional auditor. The auditor shall certify the accounts, and it shall be his duty to report to the Committee anything in the books or accounts which in his opinion appear to call for comment.

21. At the meeting of the Committee in November, three gentlemen, one at least of whom shall not be a member of the Committee, shall be appointed to examine the accounts of the Hospital for the current year, and approve an abstract of all receipts and disbursements to be prepared by the secretary, and laid before the annual general meeting in February.

#### House Directors.

22. The house-directors shall consist of the trustees, treasurer, the two physicians, and the architect, who shall be *ex-officio* house-directors, and of three elected house-directors chosen as follows:—The Committee at their meeting in February shall

appoint a member of their own body to be chairman of house directors, who shall retain office for a term of three months. They shall in like manner appoint a chairman of house directors at their meetings in May, August, and November. The same person shall not, unless by special resolution of the Committee, be elected for two terms in succession. The Committee at each monthly meeting shall appoint two members of their body to be house directors for the ensuing month, one of whom, if possible, shall not have served during the previous month. If the same house directors are re-appointed, they shall only be so appointed by special resolution.

23. They shall from time to time cause the beds, clothes, and apparel belonging to the Hospital to be examined, and shall report thereon, if necessary, to the Committee. They shall inspect the tradesmen's bills, and take care that the provisions, bedding, clothing, furniture, and every article for the use of the Hospital be supplied on the most reasonable terms; they shall order in writing all permanent stores, and shall advise the Committee as to all larger requirements and structural alterations.

24. All articles required in large quantity shall, where practicable, be supplied by contract after public tender, and all considerable contracts for work or repairs be made after public tender or invitation to not less than three respectable firms, but the house directors shall not be obliged to accept the lowest or any tender.

25. They shall be authorised in all respects to enforce the observance of the regulations of the Hospital; they shall notice and report to the Committee any irregularity or misconduct on the part of the officers, servants, or patients of the charity, and shall, at every meeting of the Committee, cause a statement of the house expenditure to be produced for the preceding month. They shall appoint and dismiss, or approve the appointment or dismissal, of all nurses, porters, and other servants, male or female.

26. The chairman of the house directors shall, during the intervals between their meetings, be authorised to exercise the functions of the house directors in any matter of urgency, reporting, at their next meeting, what he may have done under this authority.

#### Physicians.

27. There shall be two physicians and one or more assistant physicians, who shall be Fellows or Members of the Royal College of Physicians of London; and also a surgeon, who shall be a Fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons.

28. One of the physicians shall visit the Hospital at least once every day. The physicians shall have the power of dismissing any patient for refractory conduct or disobedience of orders. The physicians, assistant physicians, and surgeon shall be entitled to attend all Committee meetings.

28A. No physician shall hold the appointment of physician for more than twenty years, nor after he shall have attained the age of sixty-five years.

#### Assistant Physicians.

29. In case of the illness or necessary absence of either of the physicians, one or the assistant physicians shall attend regularly in his stead. Such attendances

shall be reported to the Committee. If the number of patients exceed 150 an assistant physician shall come on active duty.

30. The surgeon shall undertake the surgical charge of such patients as the physicians may deem necessary, and in case of emergency shall attend when summoned by the resident medical officer. Such attendances shall be reported to the Committee. If unable to attend, the surgeon shall substitute a duly qualified deputy.

#### **Hospital Pupils.**

31. No medical student shall be permitted to visit the Hospital unless in company with one of the physicians, or unless regularly entered or registered as a pupil by the physicians.

#### **Architect.**

32. There shall be an Architect to the Hospital. He shall advise on all questions concerning the Hospital sites and buildings, and shall supervise the structural maintenance of the Hospital, prepare all plans, and superintend all works connected therewith.

33. His status shall be similar to that of the physicians to the Hospital.

#### **Resident Medical Officer.**

34. The resident medical officer shall reside constantly at the Hospital, and shall devote himself entirely to the duties of his office, as defined by these laws and by the by-laws. Candidates for the post shall be required to produce satisfactory testimonials to the Committee.

35. He shall superintend the wards and Hospital generally, between the visits of the physicians, and the dispensary shall be exclusively under his control. In the absence of the Committee and house directors, he shall be recognised as the head of the establishment.

36. He shall keep accurate registers of the patients and of their cases, which registers shall be the property of the Hospital; he shall produce a special report every month, to be laid before the Committee.

37. When the number of patients shall be sufficiently great, or other circumstances render such a step necessary, the Committee shall have power to appoint one or two assistants to the resident medical officer, and he or they shall receive such remuneration as the Committee shall from time to time determine.

#### **Secretary, House Steward, and Collector.**

38. There shall be a secretary and a house steward. These offices shall be filled by the same or by different persons as the Committee shall from time to time think fit.

39. The duties of the secretary shall be to have the conduct of the correspondence of the Hospital, the keeping of the accounts, and to perform all duties appointed by the by-laws.

40. The house steward shall have the management of the domestic affairs of the Hospital, under the general superintendence of the resident medical officer, and shall perform the duties appointed by the by-laws.

41. The duties of the collector shall be—

To call on subscribers and collect all donations and subscriptions of the Hospital ; to give only authorised printed receipts for the same ; to attend all meetings when required ; to keep correct lists and duplicate lists of all donations and subscriptions, with the residences of the donors and subscribers, made up from day to day ; to pay weekly all moneys he may receive to the bankers ; to deliver weekly to the secretary reports in writing of all moneys received and paid, with the balance at the bankers' ; to keep the accounts regularly entered in the collector's cash book ; to deliver a copy of the annual report to each subscriber ; and to perform all the duties appointed by the by-laws.

42. The secretary, house steward, and collector shall be required to enter into bonds with sufficient sureties for the due and faithful performance of their duties in such sums as the Committee may determine.

#### Matron.

43. The matron shall have the direction of the nurses and female servants in the Hospital, subject to the superintendence of the house directors and the resident medical officer, and shall be responsible for the care and order of the wards. She shall have charge of the housekeeping arrangements, and shall perform the duties appointed by the by-laws.

#### Election of Officers.

44. The physicians, surgeon, assistant physicians, architect, resident medical officers, matron, auditor, and secretary shall be elected by a Committee comprised of the Committee for the management of the Hospital, the honorary medical officers, and the architect.

#### Salaries.

45. No variation in the fixed salaries of officials shall be made unless the Committee be summoned for that purpose, and unless the proposed addition or diminution be confirmed by a subsequent Committee.

#### Trustees.

46. The legal estate in the lands, buildings, and premises of the Hospital shall be vested in not less than three trustees, new trustees being appointed at a general meeting of the governors when vacancies occur.

47. All legacies of £100 and upwards, unless otherwise directed by the testators, shall be invested for the benefit of the Hospital, in the names of three trustees, to be called trustees of the fund.

#### Religious Ministrations.

48. Ministers of religion of all denominations shall have free and equal access to the Hospital, but no minister of any denomination shall receive any payment out of the funds of the Hospital in respect of his ministrations.

49. It shall be a standing instruction to the Committee and officers of the Hospital that any minister of religion desirous of visiting or ministering to patients of his own denomination shall be received with all courtesy, and shall be afforded all facilities consistent with the wishes and welfare of the patients, and the convenient conduct of the Hospital.

#### By-Laws.

50. The by-laws which shall from time to time be made by the Committee shall be open to the inspection of any governor, and shall contain, among other things, a full specification of the duties of the resident medical officer, the matron, and other officers and servants of the Hospital, together with the terms of their employment. This specification of his or her own duties shall be read to and assented to in writing by, every person before his or her appointment, and referred to on all occasions of doubt.

---

At a Meeting of the Committee held at Freemasons' Tavern, on October 13th, 1882, it was resolved:—

1. That no election to the offices of physician, assistant physician, resident medical officer, assistant resident medical officer, secretary, auditor, or matron, be proceeded with until the vacancy has been advertised in three daily London papers and in two medical journals. The first advertisement to be inserted not less than eight days before the election.

# THE LONDON FEVER HOSPITAL.

## SPEECH of LORD BALFOUR OF BURLEIGH

(President)

AT THE

**ANNUAL MEETING OF GOVERNORS, held on Thursday, February 12th, 1914,**

**at the Hotel Victoria, London, S. W.**

LORD BALFOUR OF BURLEIGH: It falls to me now to remark to some extent upon the work of the past year, and I shall conclude by moving approval of the proceedings of the Committee, and that a vote of thanks be tendered to them for their services. We have now completed our 112th year, and I think from the report which you have heard read, and the remarks of Dr. Sidney Phillips, who is as competent as anybody I know of to express an opinion, you will be satisfied that at least our usual success has attended the operations of the Hospital. You have heard what has been said by Mr. Muir Mackenzie as to finance, and I am inclined to say that on the whole that is satisfactory, although I shall have something to say about it before I sit down. I shall not attempt to cover the ground which has been already put before you by previous speakers, but what I have to say will take a more general form. You have heard that we have treated 732 patients last year, which is above the average. What I particularly want to emphasise and to impress upon you is not so much the numbers—although that is of itself of importance—but the fact that our patients comprise all sorts and conditions of men, women, and children, who are able to contribute some part at least of the cost of their treatment; rather than to cast themselves upon the rates. That is a class of the community which over and over again I have expressed my sympathy for; because they are not desirous of sponging upon the community as a whole, and yet they are wholly unable to meet all the charges that come upon them in cases of infectious illness. I think it is eminently reasonable that that class of people should be treated in a Hospital of this kind—people of a better social position than those who can take advantage of free medical or surgical treatment in general hospitals—for the reason that the more we can induce them to come into the Hospital, the more we take away from the community the risk of their spreading infection. That is a point which I am always inclined to lay great stress upon in connection with the London Fever Hospital. Some of those who come

into our Hospital pay the whole cost of their treatment, and to them we have nothing to say except this—that the existence of the Hospital in their case still contributes to the safety of the community because we deprive them of the power of spreading the disease at least while they are in the Hospital. I want to emphasise that as reacting upon another matter, because the few who come into the Institution and who pay the whole cost of their treatment would not suffice to run the Hospital by themselves. Unless we had the other class who urgently require assistance, the area from which we should draw our patients would not be large enough to make it worth while keeping the Hospital going. I am sure you will agree with me that this work is of real value not only to those who come into the Hospital, but to the public at large, and yet we have to beg pretty hard for the means to carry on our work. I turn for a moment just to emphasise what was said by Dr. Sidney Phillips and Dr. Hunter that most of our typhoid patients—not all—come from places round about London. It is a very significant and gratifying fact to the Metropolitan that as far as London residents are concerned, typhoid fever has been so largely eliminated from the list of diseases to which the Metropolitan community is subjected. We do get some, because people sicken of the disease while resident in London, although they may have contracted it outside. There is another class for whom our Hospital is very useful. Last year I commented upon the fact that we received patients of other nationalities than our own. This year we have had a small family of Australians, who are not of another nationality, although they belong to another community. Two ladies and a little girl from Australia were staying at one of our large hotels and were seized with what is described as a highly infectious disease—mumps—which, although not dangerous, is certainly a most infectious and very unpleasant malady which is communicated on very slight contact from one person to another. The fact that there was this disease in an hotel alarmed the other residents, but the patients were

brought to our Hospital, and they were among those who paid the whole cost of their treatment. They showed themselves appreciative of what was done for them in the Hospital, because at Christmas-time they sent cards of remembrance to those who had paid attention to them while sick and away from home, which is very gratifying evidence that they went away with kindly feelings of the treatment they had received. We have had a certain amount of scarlet fever and a good deal of diphtheria to deal with this last year. In this connection I should like to emphasise what Dr. Hunter refers to in the report—how two generations ago the mortality from scarlet fever was very much heavier than it is now, and how less than a generation ago the mortality from diphtheria was very serious. In the case of scarlet fever the mortality has been reduced from 14 per cent. to 1 per cent., and in diphtheria from nearly 25 per cent. to 3·8 per cent. What I think we ought here to emphasise is that medical science has not only reduced the mortality from these infectious diseases, but has also reduced the chances of one getting these diseases. That was brought out very clearly by Dr. Sidney Phillips and is a point well worth bearing in mind. Medical science is becoming more skilful every year, and is sub-dividing the cases when they are admitted, and not running the risk in doubtful cases of putting those who are suffering from one disease into a ward with those affected with another disease. The greater number of diseases you deal with, the more pressure is put upon you for isolating them, in order that every case may be carefully diagnosed. It is for that reason that a larger number of small rooms is necessary in our Hospital, and it was on that basis that we applied to King Edward's Fund for assistance. The cost of these isolation rooms will be something over £8,000. King Edward's Fund has given us a contribution of £2,000 towards the work; a handsome gift for which I am bound to say we are most grateful. (Hear, hear.) We have sometimes had little controversies with the Fund, but on this occasion I think it is the unanimous opinion of everybody we have been met in

a spirit, and in a way which gives us the greatest satisfaction. (Hear, hear.) We have nothing to conceal; we have courted enquiry; a fair and proper enquiry was made with the result that we have got this handsome donation of £2,000 towards the work. My plea is that we want more. I remember hearing in Scotland a story of a man who went to church, and a friend met him outside and asked "What was the sermon about?" "Well," he said, "it finished up in the usual way by the Minister saying, 'Have ye not got half a crown about ye.'" (Laughter.) We are here saying to the public, "Have you not got half a crown about you?" We are doing excellent work; a work which requires funds. We believe the public get an ample return for the funds which they give us, and the appeal I want to make again this year is for increased help. We can offer a practical inducement to any householder in London to subscribe to our Hospital because if they will only become a life governor by a donation of 10 guineas, or will give us an annual subscription of 1 or 2 guineas, they will be entitled to free treatment for any of their servants who may be attacked with any infectious fevers. This is a very wise insurance and you pay less for it in proportion than you pay for insurance against fire, or burglary, and if people can only be got to see that there is a real advantage to themselves in making that insurance, I am sure our financial difficulties would come to an end. We have lost a good friend in Miss Bass. She gave us £2,500 at different times during her life and she left us a legacy of £500 under her will. Another link with the past has been broken last year in the departure of Mr. Wardroper, who was for nearly thirty years our chaplain. He has gone to take up other duties in the country, and Mr. Procter, of Islington, kindly came forward and immediately offered his services as chaplain. We are very grateful to him for stepping into the breach at a time when we required assistance. I have now to move the approval of the proceedings of the Committee during the past year, and that a vote of thanks be tendered to them for their services. (Applause.) The resolution was carried.

## CHAIRMAN'S ADDRESS

LORD BALFOUR OF BURLEIGH: Gentlemen, it now falls to me to say a word or two upon the general position in which we find ourselves to-day. I need not go over the figures again which Dr. Hunter has so lucidly put before us, but I should like to emphasise the fact that we had the largest number of inmates under treatment last year that we have had since 1887; that is practically a quarter of a century ago. That is an eloquent fact in answer to those who say that the London Fever Hospital is superfluous. These figures of the past year's work show that you never know when it may be required, and the past year shows how greatly the Hospital has been taken advantage of. The figures which Dr. Hunter has marshalled with singular skill are of extreme interest, and I think they ought to be very widely circulated. We shall, of course, make them public in the report. We are met by the striking fact that medical science has practically conquered typhus fever and it has also greatly reduced the mortality from scarlet fever. In the five years from 1860 to 1864 it was over 14 per cent; while last year it was just a little over 1 per cent. The mortality from diphtheria has been referred to by Dr. Hunter and I need not go over the figures again, but in the five years from 1880 to 1884—long enough to establish a fair average, the mortality was 23 per cent; while in the last ten years it has come down to about 3—under 4 per cent. These are very striking facts which are a great credit to the profession and they ought to be known to the general public. One other piece of statistics and I have done. It is a striking fact that from November, 1910, to June, 1911, a period of about eight months we had 633 cases of measles, and only two deaths occurred. If you think for a moment what might have happened if these 633 cases had been left to fructify in their own homes, you will see that in all probability there would have been a very much more serious epidemic of measles in the Metropolis than there was. I think probably I am right in saying that this fact which has been made known from time to time has had the result of calling public attention to our work, and that in consequence,

people have sent us subscriptions to support us. An increase in annual subscriptions and donations is very gratifying, but it is not much more than in the past when the additional charges which have come upon us on account of the improvements which have been mentioned. I should like to call attention to one very interesting case as showing the necessity for this Hospital. It is the case of a lady who came to England from Virginia. She was taken ill with typhoid fever when she landed; she was nursed by us at the London Fever Hospital from the 28th July to the 20th October—three months. For a considerable time she hovered between life and death, but eventually she recovered and returned to America early in November. What would have been the position of that young lady and her brother who was with her, had there not been an Institution of this kind to which she could be sent and where she had all the medical and nursing care which such a case demands? The question of finance is perennially in our minds—shall I say it is uppermost in our minds at the present time. I never like to make a bad point and therefore when I have with perfect frankness recorded an increase both in subscriptions and donations, it does not do to express in the next breath too great apprehension, but some of our annual subscribers have intimated that they are not going to continue in consequence of the Insurance Act. One gentleman either from political feeling or a sense of humour reduced his subscription from two guineas to one and told us we might get the other from the Chancellor of the Exchequer. (Laughter.) I think that those people are crying out before they are hurt. The Insurance Bill has not yet come into effect, and if it does come into effect it won't touch the London Fever Hospital because doctors are not going under the Bill to attend people in their own homes on the terms suggested. I am not going to deal with the point as to whether this Bill may or may not reduce our subscriptions, but of this I am perfectly confident, that it will increase our work. (Hear, hear.) If so, we must of course, make an appeal for increased support. I am quite certain that if the

servants of employers are treated in their masters' houses by doctors for *non-infectious diseases* under this Bill, they will not treat cases of *infectious fevers*, and I don't think I am going too far in saying that we are extremely likely to have an increase in that class of patients who will be sent to our Institution. Where are these people to go except to our Hospital? What is to become of the hotel visitor, the stranger from abroad—a conspicuous evidence of which I have just given—if attacked by infectious fever—they cannot remain in the hotel where there are a large number of other persons? What too, is to become of the lady clerk, the doctor, the nurse, the governess, and the hundreds, even thousands, of other people who, under modern conditions of life, find themselves in London separated from their families to earn their own living—what are they to do when struck down by infectious disease? They are a most helpless class under such conditions. They cannot go, and they ought not to go to the rate supported hospitals and be treated as if they could not pay anything at all. That would be wrong, and if that wrongful act is not to be performed they have no other recourse open to them but to take advantage of the London Fever Hospital which is designed to take that very class of person, and which does take them and treats them successfully. Dr. Hunter has pointed out that taking it over a series of years the proportion of fever cases occurring in London which come to us is pretty steady—we get about 10 or 15 per cent. of the whole of the cases of infectious disease. These people will not go to the public hospitals, and they ought not to be asked to go there. I thoroughly agree with and appreciate that feeling, and it is the very class which in my opinion most deserves attention. They can pay something towards the cost of their treatment, and in some cases they can pay the whole cost. Therefore, I claim that the Hospital is a great asset to London in that it serves the public in this way, and it also serves other hospitals when their employes are struck down with infectious illness. There are large classes of people who must be compulsorily removed at such a time; not because they are paupers or because they are unable to pay, but because there is not the physical accommodation for them in the places where they are living. Some, of course, have to be removed because they cannot afford to pay, others have to be removed because there is no room for them to be adequately treated where they live, although they can afford to pay something. That latter class is much higher up in the social scale and it is exactly the class for whom we cater. They are a danger to the household where they live because there is no means of isolating them; and there is nobody to nurse them. They are perfectly safe when they are with us, and they make a more rapid recovery, and are of infinitely less danger from a contagious point of view than if they stayed in their own homes. Notwithstanding the Insurance Bill I believe our work will continue, and

will be on a larger scale than in the past. People will not go themselves, and they will not send their servants or their business employes to the rate-supported hospitals, and so I urge upon them the importance of subscribing to this Hospital. By virtue of their subscriptions we treat domestic servants of governors and employes in hotels or large business houses free of charge. Annual subscriptions commence at one guinea, and they go on according to the size of the establishment. Taking it from the lowest point of view and also from the public point of view, such persons as I have mentioned and the ordinary London householder makes an exceedingly good bargain if he subscribes a guinea to our Institution. He gets free treatment for any cases of infectious disease that break out among his servants or employes; and treatment for himself or any member of his family in a private room on payment, and is actually helping to maintain an Institution which is doing all this good work, because our annual subscriptions amount to something like £4,000, and upon the class who subscribe in that way we only spend about £1,000 in treating and curing their servants. That leaves £3,000 to be used in lowering the cost of treatment to the poorer cases, and yet all these householders get all they can possibly require for the guinea. Last year, as a matter of fact, 327 servants and employes were treated in virtue of their employers' subscriptions; 455 cases paid fees amounting to about one-fourth of their cost, and in 25 cases the fees were either reduced or remitted owing to the inability of the patient to pay, while 80 householders and others were treated in private rooms paying approximately their full cost. I repeat again that where we feel that the full cost ought to be paid we take it especially if the patient wishes to have a private room; in other cases we reduce the fee where the circumstances warrant it, and in some other cases we still further reduce it. Before I conclude I want to make a very urgent plea for funds for the provision of more private isolation rooms. This is a thing we want more than anything else. Some people hesitate to come into the ordinary wards owing to a desire to avoid publicity or to anything savouring a public institution, and partly, perhaps, from the risk of there having been a false diagnosis, and the feeling that they may contract a disease which did not exist when they were admitted. That very seldom happens, but it is a risk that is absolutely done away with if we could extend the system of private isolation rooms, and therefore, I cordially support the plea for funds which will allow us to perform the small initial expenditure necessary. We have as good a record to put before the public this year as ever before, and I have the greatest possible pleasure in moving a vote of thanks to the committee for their work and to ask that the subscribers will be good enough to carry it unanimously. (Applause.)

The resolution was carried unanimously.

## SPEECH by LORD BALFOUR OF BURLEIGH

DELIVERED AT THE

ANNUAL MEETING OF GOVERNORS, held on Thursday, February 6th, 1913.

at the Hotel Victoria, Northumberland Avenue.

LORD BALFOUR OF BURLEIGH: Gentlemen, it now falls upon me to say a word or two upon the work of the past year, and I shall conclude as usual by moving the approval of the proceedings of the Committee during the year, and that a vote of thanks be tendered the Committee for their services. As you will have gathered the past has not been one of the most strenuous years—we have had, in some ways, almost an uneventful year. We have nursed 572 patients, which is quite an average number, but it does not come up to 1911 when we had 913 patients, the increase being largely owing to an epidemic of measles which then prevailed. One matter to which I should like to call attention at once is the question of our funds, which has given us cause for anxiety. The past year has been a year of decrease all round. There has been a decrease in annual subscriptions, a decrease in donations, and a decrease in legacies. Personally, I can get over the decrease in legacies for obvious reasons, but the decrease both in annual subscriptions and in donations is not comforting, and it is no consolation to say that "it is not very large, and that it is not very serious, because your number of patients is down, and if you have fewer patients you have a smaller outlay." I have said over and over again on these occasions that that is a very fallacious comment. It is really not true, except to a very small extent. Of course, if we have fewer patients we have fewer months to feed; but your other expenses remain the same. You cannot reduce your staff to any serious extent. We must keep up our establishment in all such matters as doctors, nurses, the steam laundry, disinfectors, the refuse destructor, and the rest of the staff necessary for serving the establishment. It may be true that individually they may have less to do, but there they must be, and they must be paid their living wage. It is no use telling us we can reduce our staff, because we simply cannot do it. The diseases with which we deal—though, on the balance, probably rather less serious and the cycles of increase less frequent—are still with us, and you never know what you may be in for. For all you

know this year, calm as the outlook is at the present time, it may be a very serious year in any one of the diseases which the Hospital treats, which no foresight can enable you to be prepared for in advance, and we must, therefore, endeavour when any decrease arises in our funds to try to ascertain the reason. First of all, may I say that I do not think we have any reason to suppose that there is any discontent with the service we are rendering. On the contrary, those who have come in the Hospital, or who are sent there—servants, or dependents, or children—have almost without exception voluntarily expressed their appreciation of what has been done and their gratitude for the services rendered, and in a very large proportion of cases they have shown their gratitude in a very practical way by becoming subscribers, or donors of a sum which is equivalent to an annual subscription. I said last year that we had had some threats of reduction of subscriptions owing to the offence which had been taken at the Insurance Act. I ventured then to go on to say that I thought those who had taken that course were crying out before they were hurt, and I went on to say that it was perfectly obvious that the Insurance Act could not decrease our work. You may have doctors on the panel or doctors off the panel, voluntary doctors or doctors who are bound to serve, but whatever the terms of their service they are not going to attend infectious diseases in the homes of those who are attacked, under the Insurance Act any more than they did in the past—probably less, and therefore the strain upon our work must tend inevitably to become greater. The threat which I mentioned has really taken practical form. We have had several letters from subscribers, some of whom gave 4 guineas and some 2 guineas a year, who have halved their subscriptions, telling us outright that owing to the coercion applied to them—they are not always very reserved in their language—they are going to reduce their subscriptions. Why they should punish us I can't quite make out. I don't think any member of your Committee or any subscriber to the Hospital

or any patient in the Hospital is particularly responsible for the Insurance Act. (Laughter.) We have never had to deal with Mr. Lloyd George in the Hospital. If we did we would give him the very best attention we could, and it might not be a bad advertisement. (Renewed laughter.) But it is not fair to reduce our subscriptions for a cause for which we are not responsible, and which rather brings upon us an increase of expenditure and difficulty rather than the reverse. We can only hope for the best, and that when people get more used to the Act they will not visit upon us the wrath which they feel. I want to say a word on another important point in connection with the Hospital which I have referred to on previous occasions. Our Hospital is of real use to temporary sojourners in London. We have, at the present moment, a certain number of those who come from beyond the seas, actually within our walls. We have, at this moment, two Swedish ladies suffering from typhoid fever; we have an Italian and a German recovering from the same disease, and we have the child of one of our fellow-subjects in the Canadian Dominion who has had an attack of measles. It would be a very unkind thing; it would be a very unreasonable thing if, in a great metropolis like London, there should be no public Institution where people of this class could be sent with perfect confidence and perfect safety; and that they should have to go to a rate-supported Institution. I venture to say that it would be a real star on the medical arrangements of the Metropolis, and one for which we might very justly be reproached were such the case, and I can say that except our Hospital that would be the state of affairs in a quarter of a metropolis. This is the only Institution which meets the needs and provides accommodation for that class of case,

and, as I venture to think, does it satisfactorily. I am sure we shall agree with what Sir Shirley Murphy has said, that a subscription to this Hospital should be regarded by householders as an investment. They may have to ask the help of the Hospital at any time, and I am confident that they would find a small subscription of a guinea or two a year even as an insurance, would repay them over and over again. We are a Conservative body on your Committee, but we have resolved, after due deliberation to-day, to take a very revolutionary step. We have resolved that ladies should be invited to join the Committee. Whether this will be in any respect regarded as a compensation for the loss of the Franchise Bill and the chances they had under it I cannot tell. (Laughter)—but I hope it will be taken as an earnest of our desire to do what in itself seems to be not only a right but a very reasonable thing. When you come to think of it, I cannot understand why it has not been done long ago. I cannot conceive of a more suitable place for a philanthropic lady who desires to do good work for her kind, than the Committee of the London Fever Hospital. There are, of course, female patients; there are, of course, servants of the same sex, and it does seem to me that on no Committee could a lady find a more useful outlet for her energy. We have not only resolved to admit ladies to our Committee, but we have actually resolved to offer membership to two ladies whom we have every reason to believe are not only well fitted for the duty, but who will be willing to attend. I don't think there is anything more that I have to say, and I shall conclude by moving the approval of the proceedings of the Committee, and that a vote of thanks be tendered them for their past year's work.

LORD BALFOUR OF BURLEIGH : It now falls to me, gentlemen, to say a word or two, and my remarks need to be very short indeed after what Sir Thomas Barlow has said. I should like to take up my parable where he left it, and say that I don't believe there is any Institution which gives so good a return to the community for the money which is spent upon it as does the London Fever Hospital. If you look at the report as a whole you will see that no fewer than 946 people have been under treatment during last year. They came from all classes of the community, and from all parts of the Empire—mostly of course from London. All our patients pay something. We cater for all classes except those who are treated absolutely at the cost of the community, and they go to the Metropolitan Asylums Board hospitals. The well-to-do who are afflicted with infectious diseases pay us four guineas a week, but the larger number of those whom we help pay a sum equal to about one-fourth of the cost of their treatment, the balance in each case falling upon our funds. I may say that the poorest amongst those I have mentioned pay even less than the amount indicated, and, in a few instances where we are convinced it is a worthy case, the Committee have remitted the fee altogether. I may sum up the work of the Hospital during the past twelve months in a few words : it has treated nearly 1,000 people of all ages, and of both sexes, suffering from one or another of the infectious diseases we deal with—scarlet fever, measles, diphtheria, and typhoid fever—with a death-rate of a little over one per cent. over the whole of the patients. I say that this confirms what Sir Thomas Barlow has said, that medical science is a progressive science. The result we have got is very satisfactory, and it denotes in my

opinion a splendid year's work on behalf of those who, but for the existence of our Hospital, would have been in very great difficulties, and a large number of whom would almost certainly have succumbed. I am not going to say any more about the work, but I wish to say a few words about the funds, as to which we are very anxious. Speaking with the concurrence of the whole of the Committee, I wish to say that we have a grave problem facing us in the very near future with regard to ways and means. We are always anxious to give our patients not only the best treatment, but the best conditions, and in furtherance of this object last year we resolved to rebuild the old out-of-date block, the oldest which we have, which has been standing empty for the last three or four years—and make it of service to the public. We believed it would cost us no less than £11,000, and it was, as Sir Thomas Barlow has said, to embody all the latest improvements and ideas for the better isolation of doubtful and infectious cases. We did not come to this decision lightly; but when we did come to it we thought we saw our way to carrying the scheme through with the money at our disposal or with money that we should soon have. We knew that we should be spending nearly all of our available reserve. Contracts were entered into, and the work was actually begun. We had hardly started when this calamitous war was declared, and signs were soon forthcoming that we should feel its effects in a financial way. Subscriptions and donations, which for many years had come in steadily, began to fail, and in the course of the last few months that failure has brought us face to face with a very real danger. We are about ten per cent. down at the present time. We have intimations from a good many people that they have ceased to subscribe "for the present." We can only hope that they will give us their help again in happier times, but for the present we are faced with a deficit which we may find it hard to meet and to make good. I don't want to make the position worse than it really is. A large body of our subscribers continue their help, and we are very grateful to them. I may also mention that King Edward's Fund gave us £2,000 towards the building scheme, and since the position has become difficult they have given us £500 more, so that we have enough money to carry on for about another month or so. I most earnestly hope that further help will come before that time. I have tried to go into this matter of finance with some care, and from the figures supplied to me it appears that we actually received in 1914—or it looks on the face of it as if we had received—£1,250 more than we actually spent. But that is a fallacious way of putting it. It is really not the case, and the explanation of it is that we are prohibited, by the way in which the King's Fund makes us keep our accounts, from showing on the expenditure side the money

## ADDRESS OF **SIR T. BARLOW, BART.,** K.C.V.O., M.D., F.R.C.P.

Vice-President of the London Fever Hospital.

Sir THOMAS BARLOW, in proposing the adoption of the report, together with a vote of thanks to Dr. Hunter for preparing it, said the report was a most interesting document, and, looked at from the point of view of a subscriber who wished to be assured that the money he was giving was well spent, he thought it was

indeed. In the first place, it drew attention to the extreme variety that characterised the work of the Hospital, as shown by the large number of diseases which it attended. Anybody who had had to do with isolation hospitals in the country knew how very difficult it was to find one where adequate arrangements were made to deal with different diseases. They would be told, "Oh, yes, we can take in cases of scarlet fever, but we cannot take in measles, or diphtheria, or typhoid." It was very important that there should be an institution, like the London Fever Hospital, which was willing to take in cases of nearly all infectious diseases and do the best for them. As an old hospital doctor, he looked with very great favour upon that point in regard to the Hospital—its willingness to take in such a variety of cases. The second important point in the report was that with regard to the mortality returns, especially in respect to scarlet fever. The small mortality was all the more remarkable because last year's scarlet fever was by no means a trifling ailment, as was sometimes the case. The case mortality from that disease had improved enormously during the past few years, and generally the results last year had been extremely good. He had read through all the tables in the report, and had been very much struck by them. The most important matter in the report was that which referred to the new isolation block, and that was very important indeed. A point which he never lost a chance of emphasising was that all the great progress in regard to matters of health and hygiene which had taken place in this country had come from the voluntary side. (Hear, hear.) That new isolation block now in course of erection at the Hospital was a very important thing. It was a very common occurrence for a

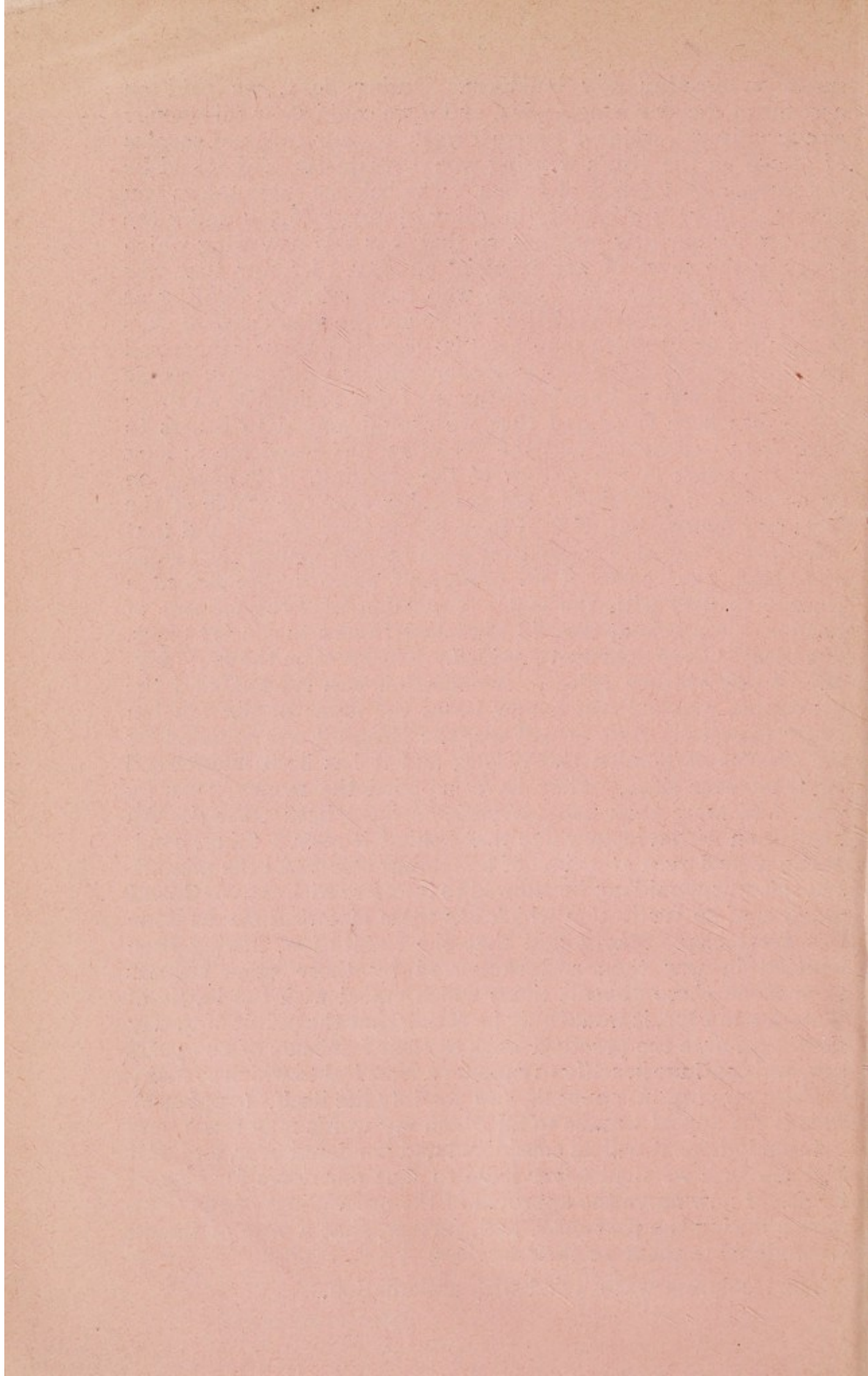
doctor to be called to a patient and not to be able to make up his mind whether it was going to develop into an acute infectious case, or whether it was a case of temporary stomach disturbance. The case might be in a school, or a house, where there were many other residents, or in a business establishment, where there was no accommodation for isolation. In such a case, the doctor was in a great fix, for it might happen that if he sent the patient to a fever hospital straight away, there was almost the certainty that the patient would contract the disease from the other patients, although he was not actually suffering from it at the outset. He had known very distressing cases of that nature, where patients had been sent into fever hospitals and had caught the disease from other patients. It was that knowledge that had made those who were responsible for the management of the London Fever Hospital launch out into the very considerable expense of building a new isolation block. When they came to think about it, they would see that

and when he saw a hospital like that spending money on bricks and mortar for the advancement of the treatment of disease, and not for mere decorative purposes, he knew, as a subscriber, that it was doing good work. (Applause.) He had not yet had an opportunity of seeing this new isolation block, but he was quite satisfied that it was all that they could desire, seeing that it was modelled on the lines of the Pasteur Institute, and had been designed by such a well-known hospital architect as Mr. Keith Young. Although it was a costly work, he felt that it was one of the best things that the Hospital had ever done, and it was being carried out by voluntary effort. The committee were to be commended on their courage and forethought, and he hoped the public would see that the necessary funds needed to complete the block were forthcoming. (Hear, hear.) It was matter for regret that the income of the Hospital had diminished last year. Everybody who had anything to do with the Institution could, with a very good conscience, say to the subscribers and to potential subscribers who wanted to give their money in a really beneficent way, "If you give money to this Hospital, it will be well expended by an Institution which is progressive and always advancing, and always trying to make things better." If they did anything that lessened the weary time of one of those infectious cases, that made the disease less painful and gave the patient a greater chance of recovery, and if they simplified the treatment in such a way that it would commend itself to the medical world generally, even though it cost money, it was money well spent. (Applause).

The motion was carried.

spent on erecting new buildings. During 1914, we paid on account of the new wing £4,864, and if we could show this money as expenditure—which of course it really is—our apparent surplus of £1,250 on the year's working would disappear, and would be converted into a deficit of £3,614. The balance sheet shows you also that there is a liability accruing of about £6,500 under the contract for our new building, so that it is this new wing which is really the cause of our financial anxiety. I know that war time is a difficult time. Those who have relatives fighting at the Front have great anxieties; there are the many special calls made upon us all which should not be neglected, there is increased taxation, and when the war ends there will be a number of people coming back who will need assistance—I don't minimise all that; but it has been suggested that we should appeal to others to learn from experience, and the Secretary has asked me to look back 100 years in the history of the Hospital. Obviously, on an occasion of this kind, I am not going over the whole of the facts and figures, but, if I go back to the year 1801, I find that infectious fevers were committing such ravages among the people of London that some of its prominent citizens commenced a crusade to deal with the evil. A meeting of "the citizens of London" was held at the Old Thatched Tavern to concert plans. The then Duke of Somerset presided. They met on the first May-day of last century (1801). A collection was started, and the Institution founded which now bears the name of the London Fever Hospital. As you will see, the Hospital was founded by the citizens of London themselves, and it has been maintained by them ever since. They have supplied the money, year by year, and more than 100,000 patients have been treated. An Institution with a history like that behind it may, I think, confidently appeal even at a time of temporary stress like the present and this war should not be allowed to interfere with the continued progress of an Institution which has these historical claims upon this great city. May I add that the Institution, having been founded in war time and supported by those same citizens through all those difficult times which ended with the battle of Waterloo in 1815, it would only be fitting that the public of to-day should emulate the practical work of their forebears of 100 years ago, and continue heartily to support a Hospital to which so many of them owe health, strength, and possibly life itself. (Applause). This is the appeal I make to all whom my words may reach, and I sincerely hope it will be considered and pondered over, and, if it is, I am sure we shall never have to shut our doors for lack of funds. I now move the approval of the proceedings of the Committee during the past year, and, further, that a vote of thanks be tendered to them for their services.

The resolution was carried with acclamation.

THE PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS TO THE GOVERNORS  
OF THE HOSPITAL AT THE ANNUAL MEETING  
HELD ON THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 10TH, 1916,  
AT THE HOTEL VICTORIA, LONDON, W.C.

LORD BALFOUR OF BURLEIGH: It falls to me, ladies and gentlemen, to move the approval of the proceedings of the Committee for the year, and thanks to them for the work which has been done. We go upon the principle of giving very full information to the public, and I think that anyone who has studied that information and has heard what has been said by our two medical friends who have spoken will say we have a thoroughly good record, and one at any rate of which as a public institution we need not be in the slightest degree ashamed. We have had a full year. The number of patients—1,059—is a larger number than in any year since 1882, when the numbers were forty-six more than in the past year. The information I have upon the subject is that the increase is largely due to two causes. One is that it is not the serious cases which have increased but measles. Everyone knows that ordinary measles is a much more infectious disease than some of the other diseases, in that it is infectious before it is discovered, and when you have a large number of children associated in school it is obvious that a certain amount of risk is inevitable. Partly the increase is due to the increase of population. A third cause to my mind, and a more pleasant one, is that we are becoming more useful to that class which Dr. Sidney Phillips has alluded to. I mean those who do not want to go to an ordinary hospital and receive charity, but who cannot afford to go to a nursing home, and who do not want to be treated in their private dwellings with the risk of infecting others. They prefer to come where they can pay

their way to an institution like ours. It seems to me that is a direction in which we are doing a very great public service. Undoubtedly the fact that people in good positions in life can trust themselves to an institution of this kind must tend to diminish the risk of infection of others in their same class. There has been allusion made to the cases of cerebro meningitis. It is rather cheering to see that there have been seven cases, I think, of whom five have recovered. That, I am informed, is a very large proportion of cures in the case of this most treacherous disease. I am afraid from what I hear that one poor lad in the hospital now is in a very serious state, but where there is life there is hope, and we will hope for the best. He is the son of a man who did good service in the Army, and was killed in one of the frontier wars in India, and he himself was just preparing to go to the Front when he was attacked by the disease, and no one can tell how it was conveyed to him. It is gratifying that in regard to this disease, as well as with the others, the death rate continues as low as we can reasonably expect. Dr. Phillips was shy on the subject of finance, but I am afraid I must impress on you the fact that our position is not an easy one. We have had a falling off of £117 in the annual subscriptions, which is not a large ratio of falling off taking all things into account. Still we have had a falling off of subscriptions, and although there is a much abused maxim about business as usual I do think old established institutions like ours have a strong moral claim to subscriptions as usual. It is not business in one sense, but it is certainly not pleasure, and there can be no reproach to those who keep up their support to an institution of this kind. There is no reproach to those even compelled by stress of circumstances and high prices and taxation to cease subscribing, but I think we are entitled to say of an institution of this kind that it should be one of the last things to be cut off even if necessity does compel economy. Our donations have kept up fairly well, but the difficulty we have to meet—and it has been touched on by those who know more about internal management than I do—is the increase in ordinary expenses, in wages, in goods, and so on. It has not been therefore the loss of subscriptions which has caused the deficit, but the increases in prices which is absolutely unavoidable. It is not a question of economising, for everything possible is done to run the place as moderately as is consistent with efficiency. But we all know in our own households there are things which are absolute necessities which have risen in price, and you cannot help it. There are eggs, bacon and a multitude of other things: I know the truth of it. It is gratifying I think that four members of our medical staff have joined the Army for service. Dr. Hunter, our senior physician, proceeded to Serbia. We have had a report that he has been invalided, but

I do not know how far that is confirmed. Dr. Maynard Smith is in charge of a base hospital at the Front, and Dr. Garrow and Dr. Lund are doing their duty amongst the sick and wounded. I think we are entitled to advertise the fact that we have treated about eighty officers and men who had contracted infectious disease, either in this country or at the Front, and I think I can say they have had the best we can offer. That also to some extent has caused the increase in the number of patients. I ought also to mention that our medical staff deserve recognition for one thing they have done this year which is rather unusual. Some of the cases were actually wounded men. They were not only suffering from infectious disease but were surgical cases as well, and it is greatly to the credit of our staff that they discharged the double duty with energy and success. I am bound to refer to the new wing. As I explained last year, we had commenced work upon it when the war broke out. Probably if we had not gone so far as we had we would not have proceeded with it, necessary and important as it was. But we had to go on, and as you see we have had to borrow money to pay for it. It certainly tends to the efficiency of the hospital, and the fact that we have had this extra expense makes an additional plea for the kindly consideration of those who are making large war profits, if my remarks can possibly reach them. We have had to borrow. Even if it is not a very good financial proceeding we were driven to it for this reason that when we had payments to make securities had so fallen in value, or were under an embargo which prevented their transfer, that there was no other course if we were to meet our obligations at all but to borrow. We are paying 5 per cent. on the loan, and if it was in Germany it would probably be at a much higher rate of interest than that. But it is gratifying to have heard what our two medical friends have said, and I know from the observations I have been able to make that the wing is a success and tends to the efficiency of the institution. We welcome Lord Muir Mackenzie as a new member of the Committee, and we have also to report a change in the trusteeship, as my colleague, Lord Hillingdon, has resigned. However, his brother, Mr. Algernon Mills, becomes a trustee in his place, so there is no breach in the tradition, and nothing but advancing age and infirmity would have induced Lord Hillingdon to leave us. I think on the whole, having regard to all the difficulties, we have had a satisfactory year in most senses, and if we saw the means of paying our way a little better we should be comparatively happy. I think you can accept the motion I put to you and thank the Committee for the work they have done.
