

their friendship has resulted in a gift of the greatest generosity.

The Committee realise the work of the Masters, Mistresses and the boys and girls in the various schools. Their work has made possible the most generous gifts and it is inspiring to know that the children are willing to make this great effort to help other children.

The Flag Day which was planned by the Ladies' Auxiliary Association on the 30th May, 1942, resulted in a collection of $\oint 962$ 15s. 1d. Although this was not quite as much as the previous year owing to difficulties in obtaining sellers the result was eminently satisfactory. The Committee thank Mrs. Blandy, the Chairman and the Executive of the Auxiliary for their magnificent work in organising it. In addition to the Flag Day the Auxiliary organised a house-to-house collection in districts outside the city boundaries. The Committee thank all those who helped with these efforts and are grateful to the City and County Authorities who granted permission for these efforts to be made.

The Needlework Guild has continued its work under increasing difficulties. The coupon restrictions have prevented people sending garments as in previous years. In spite of this the work has gone on and has done much to provide the Hospital with linen and ward clothing. Miss Laura Wills has continued her work as Hon. Secretary, but it is regretted that Mrs. Stanley Wills, their Chairman, has found it necessary to resign, owing to living so far from Bristol. The Committee thank Mrs. Stanley Wills for all that she has done to help the Guild, and they are glad that she will remain a member. Mrs. E. W. Lennard is kindly acting as Vice-President for the time being.

The members of the Hallen Women's Institute and other ladies have helped with sewing and their co-operation is much appreciated.

Grateful thanks are accorded to the Bristol Evening Post, Children's Corner, for their record collection for the maintenance of cots and to the Bristol Evening World, Children's Corner, for their gifts of toys, money and "silver paper."

The various Contributory Schemes and employees' Medical Charity Funds have given the greatest assistance by organising contributions throughout Bristol and the district, and by interesting people in the work of the Medical Institutions. Their work is gratefully acknowledged.

It is with sincere regret that the Committee record the passing of Mr. W. H. Greville Edwards and Mr. Claude Fry. Both gentlemen were among the Trustees of the Hospital and Mr. Greville Edwards had also filled the position of President and Hon. Treasurer. The following gentlemen have accepted the invitation of the Committee to become Trustees : Sir G. Stanley White, Bart., Bt.-Col. Mark Whitwill and Mr. R. M. E. Reeves, and this additional mark of their interest is much appreciated.

The kindness of Mr. Cyril Clarke, the Hon. Solicitor to the Hospital, is acknowledged. He has given great assistance in legal matters for many years.

The Committee thank the Organisers of the Lord Mayor's Hospital Fund, and it is with a sense of real appreciation that their co-operation is acknowledged.

The Bristol Sick Benefit and Dividing Society has continued its kindly gifts to the Hospital.

The Weston Convalescent Home has been leased under the Government Evacuation Scheme for the period of the war.

Eastern House E.M.S. Children's Hospital, Weston-super-Mare, remains under the administration of the Hospital, and continues to be of great service in maintaining the number of children treated by the Hospital.

The Committee record their thanks to all the members of the Hospital personnel for their loyal service during the year.

It is with pleasure that the Committee acknowledge the gifts which have been received from the charitable American public. This co-operation is most encouraging.

The Committee thank all the many friends who have joined with them in the work of the Hospital either as subscribers, donors or by sending special gifts. The kindness of the Churches and Chapels and Sunday Schools is a matter for sincere thanks, they have been great friends.

The Committee would invite the citizens of Bristol to become subscribers to the funds of the Hospital, or by sending gifts to assist in the continuance of the work of helping the children who are ill, a work more necessary than ever before.

OBJECTS OF THE INSTITUTION

1.—To provide for the reception, maintenance and medical and surgical treatment of Children under thirteen years of age, in a suitable building, cheerfully and salubriously placed; to furnish with advice and medicine those who cannot or need not be admitted into the Hospital; and also to receive Women suffering from diseases peculiar to their sex.

2.—To promote the advancement of medical science with reference to the diseases of Women and Children, and to provide for the instruction of Students in these essential departments of medical knowledge.

3.—To diffuse among all classes of the community, and particularly among the poor, a better acquaintance with the management of Infants and Children during health and sickness; and to assist in the education and training of Women in the special duties of Children's Nurses.


