

Annual Report of the Committee of Management for the Year 1946

Your Committee of Management has pleasure in submitting its report for the year 1946.

The year under review proved to be one of the most important in the

history of the Hospital.

Firstly, the number of patients admitted, in spite of our present cramped and temporary premises, proved to be the highest for eleven years. Secondly, the year 1946 saw considerable progress being made towards the completion of the restricted scheme of building work permitted by the Ministry of Health on the new premises at Stoke Newington.

In addition, the year was made memorable by the passing of the National Health Service Act, as a result of which hospitals supported from charitable

sources will cease to exist, as such, after April 1st, 1948.

Your Committee, jointly with the other Jewish Communal institutions affected, as well as other institutions of a sectarian or special character, submitted strong representations to the Minister for permission, whilst participating in the New Service, to retain their particular characteristics and, in the case of the Jewish institutions, that their future management be retained in the hands of representatives of the Community. Concessions were subsequently made by the Minister with regard to religious observances. At the time of writing this report, however, the future of the management of the hospital remains obscure.

The Community is assured, however, that the Committee will use every endeavour to ensure the retention in this Hospital of the required standards

of orthodoxy.

At the same time it is gratifying to record the use made of the Hospital's service by very considerable numbers of non-Jewish patients, and their many expressions of thanks for the help afforded them are much appreciated.

During 1946 a further link of the Hospital with its origin in East London was severed. Our 1945 report made mention of the transfer of the work of our Infant Welfare to the Stepney Borough Council. In March, 1946, as a result of the pending opening of our new unit at Stoke Newington, the work of the Ante-Natal Clinics and District Maternity Nursing Departments was removed to premises adjoining the site of the new hospital. The transfer was accomplished without any disruption of the work of the Clinics, and it is gratifying to record that attendances of patients at the North London Clinic show a substantial increase over those at East London during the past few years. Finally, arrangements are now in an advanced stage for the disposal of the old hospital premises at Underwood Road, Whitechapel, to the Stepney Borough Council. With the completion of this sale the Hospital's long-standing connection with East London will be terminated, not without many regrets, but with the cherished hope that its work on its new site will uphold its proud reputation in the sphere of Maternity and Child welfare.

In the meantime, our In-Patient department continues at Hampton Court and, for this purpose, the Hospital's tenancy of its temporary premises

has been extended until January, 1952; your Committee having given an undertaking to the Ministry of Health to carry on with its work in that area for the time being, owing to the acute shortage of maternity hospital accommodation in the surrounding neighbourhood.

ADMINISTRATION.—During the early months of the year arrangements were concluded for the transfer of the assets of the Hospital to the control of Trustees—appointed at a special meeting of Governors of the Hospital, held on February 12th, 1946. The Trustees appointed are the Hon. M. R. Samuel, the Hon. Peter M. Samuel and Mr. Arthur Franks.

As a result, control of all the invested funds, freehold and leasehold premises and other assets, has been vested in these Trustees. This arrangement should prove of the utmost value to the Hospital in future years.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.—The Hon. M. R. Samuel has been unanimously elected to serve as Deputy-Chairman of the Committee of Management. Mrs. D. Golding was co-opted onto the Committee during the early months of the year, but later resigned owing to pressure of other work. Mrs. Leonard Gluckstein and Mrs. Instone-Gallop also resigned their membership during the year. The Committee here record their gratitude to all these ladies for their valuable services to, and interest in the work of the Hospital.

It is with regret that we have to record the death of Mrs. J. Klein, who had been a member of the Committee almost since the inception of the

Hospital.

The following members of the Committee of Management retire in rotation, but are eligible and offer themselves for re-election, Mrs. F. C. Stern, J.P., Mrs. E. Strauss and Mrs. N. Hawke.

The Auditors, Messrs. Lionel H. Lemon & Company, also retire, but are eligible and offer themselves for re-election.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING.—The Annual Meeting was held at the Hospital's premises, 77 Lordship Road, N.16, on July 17th, 1946, formal business only being transacted.

HOUSE COMMITTEE.—Regular monthly meetings of the House Committee were held throughout the year—this Committee being almost entirely responsible for the day-to-day working of the Hospital. Grateful thanks are here expressed to Mr. Arthur Franks, its Chairman, and his co-members, for their most valuable and painstaking efforts.

BUILDING SUB-COMMITTEE.—Regular monthly meetings of this Committee were also held throughout the year in connection with the new Hospital building, its equipment and furnishing. Considerable detailed work was involved in the inspection of building work and the placing of orders for the multitude of items of equipment and furniture required—a task made the more difficult by the many restrictions at present in force and the many applications for licences and permits made necessary in consequence.

Sincere thanks are here conveyed to Mr. Henry Jacobs, Chairman, and the members of this Committee, for their help and guidance on many problems.

Our thanks are also conveyed to Mr. Ernest Joseph, architect, for his keen personal interest in the work proceeding on the new building.

SICK ROOM HELPS' SOCIETY.—The following Trustees have been appointed to serve in connection with the control of the funds and activities of the Society: The Rt. Hon. The Viscount Bearsted, M.C. and the Viscountess Bearsted, acting together with the Hospital's Trustees, The Hon. M. R. Samuel, The Hon. P. M. Samuel and Mr. Arthur Franks.

LADIES' ASSOCIATION.—With the return to peace, the Association resumed its activities, including the popular Sewing Meetings which were discontinued during the war period. Very satisfactory progress has to be reported.

The Association also decided to contribute £500, from its funds, towards the cost of the linen for patients and doctors, in the new Hospital.

The Committee of Management extends its thanks to the Committee of the Association for its continued efforts on behalf of our patients.

A short report will be found on page 10.

AID SOCIETY—This new Society, founded towards the end of 1945, with Mr. R. M. Lotinga as its Hon. Secretary, undertook the organisation of collections on "Hospitals' Day." As a result, the Hospital benefited to the extent of £211 from this source, in addition to which the Society collected a sum of £99 towards the Hospital's funds. The Committee's thanks are here accorded to the Committee of the Society and to Mr. Lotinga in particular.

HONORARY MEDICAL STAFF.—During the year Dr. G. L. S. Konstam, Hon. Physician to the Hospital, returned from military service, resumed his duties and, in addition, undertook the routine periodic medical examination of the members of the Nursing Staff.

Dr. John Challis also resumed as anæsthetist to the Hospital, following

release from H.M. Forces.

Dr. Sydney A. Owen resigned his appointment as Hon. Pædiatrician on retirement from Hospital work, and Dr. R. H. Dobbs, recently returned from war service, was appointed to fill this vacancy.

The Committee's most sincere thanks are here extended to all the members of the Hospital's Medical Staff, whose conscientious services have so largely

contributed towards another year of successful achievement.

Thanks are also accorded to Dr. Loutit and the staff of the London South West Region Blood Transfusion Service for their co-operation and timely help on many occasions and to the Medical Superintendent and staff of the Kingston County Hospital for similar valuable co-operation.

IN-PATIENT DEPARTMENT.—Patients delivered in 1946 numbered 642, an increase of no less than 158 over 1945. This was only made possible by a reduction of the length of stay in the more normal cases to a maximum of ten days, on a recommendation of the Ministry of Health, and arising from the present acute shortage of maternity hospital accommodation. Your Committee is glad to be able to report that there was no maternal death during the year. The still-birth rate continues at a satisfactorily low figure.

OUT-PATIENT DEPARTMENT.—

ANTE-NATAL CLINICS.—The fortnightly Clinics at Hampton Court continued regularly throughout the year, and attendances show a satisfactory increase over those in 1945.

As already mentioned the work of the Clinics previously carried on at Underwood, Whitechapel, was transferred early in the year to Stoke Newington. Attendances at these Clinics show a very considerable increase on those for the previous year.

POST-NATAL CLINICS.—These Clinics continued regularly throughout the year, and attendances were satisfactory.

NURSING STAFF.—The Committee once again take the opportunity to extend to the Matron and the Midwifery Staff, grateful thanks for their continued devoted service to the Hospital. The high standard of the Hospital's work owes much to their skill and efficiency.

MIDWIFERY TRAINING SCHOOL.—Twenty-five pupils entered the Hospital for training during the year and seventeen were successful in passing the Part I examination of the Central Midwives Board. The intake of pupils for training continues to be satisfactory.

FINANCE.—The Accounts, Balance Sheets and Statistical Tables will be found on pages 12 to 21.

INCOME.—Total ordinary income for general maintenance purposes amounted to £12,817 an increase of £914 over that for the previous year. This increase again results almost entirely from increased payments by the patients themselves and from Hospital Contributory Schemes on their behalf.

The Committee regrets to have to report that in spite of vastly increased financial needs, the receipts from subscriptions and donations continue at a very low and unsatisfactory total, and therefore renew the hope that the community will give much increased financial support in the current year. Ordinary income failed to meet expenditure incurred by no less than £766, and the deficit was only made good by the transfer of a like sum from Legacies Account.

The slight relaxation of paper control enables us, this year, to resume publication of lists of subscribers and donors, which will be found on page 22. Special mention must be made, however, of the following generous Contributions to our General Fund and sincere thanks are here accorded the donors:—

Sincere thanks are also due to the Committee of the British Red Cross and St. John War Organisation, for a most generous gift of surplus hospital supplies of all kinds, amounting in value to many hundreds of pounds. A proportion of these supplies was put into immediate use. The balance is being retained for use at the new unit at Stoke Newington.

EXPENDITURE.—Total expenditure for the year amounted to £13,583. an increase of no less than £2,864 over 1945. In the main, this heavy increase is accounted for as a result of the increased rates of salary of the Midwifery Staff, and by increases in the pay of male and female domestic staff of all grades. As a result of these increases there was an excess of expenditure over income, as already mentioned, of £766. Still further increases, which it is already known will have to be met during the current year, make it imperative that the Hospital's income be correspondingly increased if further and much larger deficits are to be avoided. The opening of the new unit in 1947, too, will result in vastly increased sums of totally new expenditure.

NEW HOSPITAL.—The Committee is glad to be able to report that, as far as can be seen at the time of publication of this report, the restricted

unit at Lordship Road, Stoke Newington, with thirty-two beds available for patients, will be open for their reception in July or August, 1947.

The many enquiries already received ensures the Committee that this new unit will fulfil an urgent need of the large Jewish Community and, as far as the accommodation permits, of the non-Jewish Community of that neighbourhood.

CONCLUSION.—At the time of going to press, there are many matters of great moment to the future of the Hospital under discussion. Owing to negotiations now afoot not yet having been completed, it is not possible to comment on them further in this report.

It is hoped, however, to submit full details of these matters at the Annual

General Meeting, which will take place in June or July, 1947.

MEDICAL REPORT for the Year 1946

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

The year 1946 has been a particularly busy one for the Bearsted Memorial Hospital. Six hundred and forty-two patients were delivered, the highest number recorded for any one year since we took over the Hampton Court Hotel and converted it into a Maternity Hospital.

It was only possible to accommodate this high number by reducing the average length of stay of each patient, and although regretting this curtailment, we feel it was justifiable owing to the extreme shortage of maternity beds in the country and the large number of women seeking admission to our Hospital.

We are glad to report that there were no maternal deaths.

The infant mortality rate remains below the average for England and Wales—there being six infant deaths. There were thirteen stillbirths.

The ante-natal Clinics have been well attended and the ever increasing number of attendances have made it necessary for additional Clinics to be arranged.

Post-natal Clinics have been held regularly throughout the year with satisfactory results.

These facts and figures bear testimony to the high efficiency of the Medical and Nursing staff of the Hospital and are especially noteworthy when the difficulties of the present building are taken into consideration.
