

The Annual General Meeting was held at the Hospital on Thursday, March 27th, 1941, at 5 p.m. His Worship The Mayor (Councillor W. E. R. Short) presided.

The Secretary read the Report for the year 1940.

The Statement of Accounts was taken as read.

The Hon. Treasurer (Mr. C. E. Hancox) made some explanatory remarks.

His Worship proposed that the Report and Statement of Accounts be approved and adopted.

Seconded by the President (Mrs. Jackson).

His Worship proposed that thanks be given to the Executive Officers, General Committee and Honorary Medical Staff for their services during the year 1940, and that they be elected as at present standing, and that Messrs. J. D. Nickels and Peake be re-elected as Auditors.

Seconded by Miss Horne and resolved.

Mr. Jackson proposed that thanks be given to His Worship the Mayor for his kindness in presiding at the Meeting.

Seconded by Mr. Rowlands and resolved.

BIRKENHEAD MATERNITY HOSPITAL.

ANNUAL REPORT, 1940.

The Hospital services have been maintained, as far as possible at the usual level, during this, the first complete year under war conditions; statistically however, 1940 is not strictly comparable to a normal year.

The greatest difficulty has been that of staffing the Hospital; the absorption of trained midwives into the Military and Civil Defence Services has drained the usual supplies, and, unless measures are taken to avert it, this may well develop into an insuperable difficulty, grave in its consequences to maternal welfare.

STATISTICS.

IN-PATIENTS.—The admissions numbered 471, as against 516 the previous year; this total included 261 first cases, 29 ante-natal cases and 8 single girls. The average daily number was 16.92 and the average length of stay 13.4 days.

SICK BABIES' WARD.—15 Babies were admitted; the average daily number being 1 and the average length of stay 23.3 days. The Committee offer their grateful thanks to Mrs. Don. Nicholas and Miss Hancox for their gift of £5 each towards the maintenance of the "Jean Watson" Cot.

OUT-PATIENTS.—Ante and Post Natal Clinics.—103 Sessions were held, at which the total number of attendances was 2,929: of these 2,780 were ante natal and 149 post natal visits. First visits numbered 518.

Infant Welfare.—The total attendances at the 52 Clinics held was 1,270, of which 204 were first visits.

The kind services of the following helpers at these clinics are gratefully acknowledged:—

Ante and Post Natal: - Miss Yates, Miss Rawlins and Miss Tickle.

Baby Clinics:—The Misses Blood, Miss Beazley, Mrs. Owen and Mrs. Cradock.

Thanks are also due to Mrs. Johnston and Mrs. Lea who have given their services in the Hospital.

DISTRICT.—1,064 visits have been paid by the District Sister, whose work has been an important part of the Hospitals' activities.

TRAINING SCHOOL.—As reported last year, there has been a great dearth of pupils, the position, however, is slightly improved as, at the end of the year, 4 pupils had arranged to take their training, but only one had started.

COLLECTORS.—The collection of the annual subscriptions for the year has presented great difficulties, many collectors having left the district: the Committee welcome this opportunity of expressing their very grateful thanks to those ladies, who in the midst of multifarious war duties have found time to give such valuable help to the Hospital.

The total amount collected was £211 a decrease of £31 on 1939's total.

Other representatives remain the same: i.e., Mrs. Hancox—Birkenhead Charities Ladies' Committee and Mr. Rowlands—The Merseyside Hospitals Council.

The Committee appreciate very much the services of those members who undertake the additional work of representation on other organisations, and in thanking them wish also to make special mention of Mrs. Owen, who is indefatigable in visiting the Hospital and promoting its welfare. HON. MEDICAL STAFF.—The Hon. Medical Staff has been augmented by two new appointments: i.e., Mr. John Hamilton as Hon. Consulting Assistant Obstetrician and Dr. Hugh Smith as Hon. Pathologist. The Committee desire to place on record their very sincere appreciation and grateful thanks to the members of the Hon. Medical Staff who, under the stress of wartime calls and duties continue to give their invaluable services.

STAFF.—Since the last report was issued Miss Bowden has resigned the position of Matron, and Miss A. A. Bate has been appointed and took up her duties on 1st August, 1940. Miss Bate was trained at Liverpool Royal Infirmary and came to this Hospital from Wigan, where she was Sister-in-Charge of the Christopher Home for Private Patients in connection with the Royal Albert Edward Infirmary. The Committee have been much impressed with her ability to surmount the unusual problems brought about by the War.

In conclusion the Committee wish to express their deep appreciation of the services rendered by all sections of the Staff, who have admirably carried out their duties under the difficult conditions which now prevail.
