

ANNUAL MEETING

The Annual Meeting of the Governors of the Birmingham and Midland Hospitals for Women (Incorporated) was held in the Council Chamber at the Council House, Birmingham, on Thursday, 29th April, 1943, at 3 p.m.

The President of the Hospitals, Mrs. Neville Chamberlain, occupied the Chair.

The following ladies and gentlemen were present:—Mr. Barrow Cadbury, Mr. Christopher Southall, Mr. N. C. Plummer, Mrs. Leslie Arthur Smith, Mrs. Alfred Harris, Mr. C. W. Gillett, Mrs. Bertram Lloyd, Mr. Kenneth McMillan, Mrs. T. Cooper, Lady Smith, Mr. and Mrs. Hugh C. Aston, Dr. C. E. Purslow, Mrs. Willmott Dobbie, Mr. and Mrs. H. H. Payne, Mrs. Percy Reading, Mrs. J. F. Byrne, Mrs. McDonald, Mr. W. F. Newstead, Mrs. Crompton, Miss E. Thorne, Miss E. A. Meikle, and others.

Mrs. Neville Chamberlain, in moving that the Report and Accounts be taken as read, expressed appreciation of the presence of the Lord Mayor and Lady Mayoress.

In speaking of the Reports, she was glad to note that they recorded a year of progress and difficulties surmounted by the zeal and co-operation of all concerned with the management of the Hospitals. She felt that they were all very proud to be associated with these Hospitals, which were particularly valuable in war-time as they cared for so many of the wives of men fighting in the Forces.

War-time was a time of great strain and difficulty for all, but especially for women. When they were in a normal state of health war was bad enough, but when they were ill it was a great deal worse. To restore them to health and to return them to their home-life or their work in the Forces and factories meant a great deal, not only to the women themselves and to their husbands and children, but also to the war effort of the nation as a whole.

She referred to the opening paragraph of the last Report of the Ministry of Health which said that: "Although the period under review stretches well into the third year of the war, the health of the nation remains good." Although good health would not win the war, a nation in bad health would be well on the way to losing it. She had been interested

in the figures of maternal and infant mortality in Birmingham, which showed that the rate of both maternal mortality and infant mortality had gone down in 1942 as compared with 1941.

She referred again to the value of the Auxiliary Hospitals at Hammerwich and Barnt Green, which she said were ideal for their purpose. She also spoke of her visit to Cleeve Prior Convalescent Home, which was so charmingly situated near the Cotswolds.

Mrs. Chamberlain hoped that in the new plans for Health Services the Voluntary Hospital system would have its rightful place. She felt that it would be a disaster if the Voluntary Hospital system were to be destroyed, as it covered a very wide field of interest, and brought in an enormous number of helpers for the Hospitals.

She also referred to the Rushcliffe Scheme for raising salaries of Nurses which had been adopted by the Hospitals, and she felt that nobody would grudge the added expenditure it would entail.

She had much pleasure in moving that the Report and Accounts be taken as read.

The Lord Mayor, in moving the adoption of the Report and Accounts, said that having seen the patients from City Hospitals who had been transferred to Auxiliary Hospitals in the country he wondered whether after the war they should consider the building of Hospitals in country districts. There could be casualty clearing stations in the Cities, but the Hospitals might be in better surroundings in the country.

He and the Lady Mayoress had recently visited the Women's Hospital annexe at Hammerwich and were much impressed with the happy atmosphere and the work that was being done for the patients amidst delightful surroundings. The work done by the Women's Hospital and the Maternity Hospital was extremely valuable, and he hoped the generous citizens of Birmingham would clear the deficit on the funds; they could do so in the next few months if they set their minds to the task. It had been stated many times that low wages attracted bad workpeople, but the nursing service gave the lie to that statement. Nursing had attracted the best type of women.

He had much pleasure in moving the adoption of the Report and Accounts.

Mr. Barrow Cadbury, Chairman of the Management Committee, who seconded the adoption of the Report and Accounts, spoke of the work of the respective Committees of the Women's and Maternity Hospitals and of the efficient staff, and to all those who had been working for the Hospitals during a very difficult year. He also said that they still hoped that one day they would have a new Maternity Hospital on the Hospital Centre site, amidst more pleasant surroundings.

He had pleasure in seconding the adoption of the Report and Accounts.

Mr. C. W. Gillett, Chairman of the Finance Committee, who spoke on the Accounts, said that the fund to rebuild the Maternity Hospital now stood at £68,500. It would not be sufficient to build a new Maternity Hospital, but it would go a long way towards it, and he was sure that when the time came the people of Birmingham would be glad to make further contributions to enable the maternity work of the City to be housed under the best possible conditions.

He was glad to be able to report an increase in the number of patients treated. It was also encouraging to be able to report an increase in the subscription lists of both Hospitals and an improvement in the bank balances at the end of the year.

He was also pleased to say that these Hospitals had adopted the recommendations contained in the Rushcliffe Report; although this would mean increased expenditure for the Hospitals.

Mrs. Bertram Lloyd, in proposing the re-election of the President, said how glad she was to be able to report that the number of patients at the Women's Hospital during 1942 had practically doubled the number treated in the previous year, and this was due largely to the fact that the Hospital was now back to the pre-war number of beds.

She also spoke of the successful work of the Out-Patient Department, which had been moved from the centre of the City to Sparkhill. It was interesting to note that the numbers of Out-Patients for 1942 had very greatly increased, in spite of the fact that it had always been felt that an Out-Patient Department should be in the centre of the City.

With regard to the Maternity Hospital, she spoke of the increased ill-health during pregnancy, particularly with regard to patients suffering from anaemia. The question of extra nourishment for pregnant women was a very urgent one and numerous Welfare Centres in the City were doing their best to educate mothers to the importance of looking after their own health.

She also spoke of the increasing number of calls made on the Flying Squad which goes out and gives help by blood transfusions to mothers throughout the City.

She had much pleasure in proposing that Mrs. Neville Chamberlain be re-elected President and that the other Officers also be re-elected.

Mr. W. F. Newstead seconded the Resolution, which was carried unanimously.

In proposing the re-election of the Honorary Medical Staff, Mrs. Leslie Arthur Smith said that she would like, on behalf of the Maternity Hospital in particular, to express thanks to the Honorary Medical Staff for all they did for the Hospitals.

During the year more beds had been re-opened at the Maternity Hospital, and now the second floor at Loveday Street was once more fully equipped and working to full capacity. In addition to this, a small ward for paying patients had been opened, and this had been made possible by the generosity of Mr. Harry H. Payne, who gave a very generous gift of £500 to defray the cost of equipment. This meant that there were now 75 beds at Loveday Street and 20 at Barnt Green, which made a Hospital of 95 beds.

The pressure of the work at the Maternity Hospital was very great, and during 1942 there had been an increase of over 400 patients. About half of them were emergency cases which are sent in at the last minute for very special care. This work puts a very great strain on the staff, and she would like to take that opportunity of thanking the Matron and her Sisters and Nurses for the splendid way they tackle the problems as they arise. The difficulties of domestic staff are very acute, and, in spite of appeals to various sources, there seemed little hope of any improvement.

She expressed thanks to Mr. H. C. Aston and his staff for the additional work they have been called upon to do during the year.

She had much pleasure in proposing the re-election of the Honorary Medical Staffs.

Mr. Christopher Southall, in seconding the Resolution, said he would like to endorse all Mrs. Arthur Smith had said about the Medical Staff. The patients were also very appreciative of their skill and the time they devoted to their work.

He expressed the appreciation of the Committee for the help given by Professor Parsons, who had made available beds at Burntwood E.M.S. Hospital to assist with reducing the waiting list at the Women's Hospital. He also thanked the Officers and helpers of the Women's Hospital League for the splendid work they were doing in spite of many difficulties. He also expressed thanks to Mr. Francis and his voluntary fire-watchers.

He had much pleasure in seconding the re-election of the Honorary Staffs.

Mr. Norman C. Plummer, in proposing a Vote of Thanks to Mrs. Neville Chamberlain for taking the Chair, and to the Lord Mayor and Lady Mayoress for their presence, said how fortunate the Hospitals were in having the interest and sympathy of Mrs. Chamberlain and for the interest that was always shown by Lord Mayors of the City, not only in these but in other Hospitals in the City. They were extremely grateful to Mrs. Chamberlain in presiding and to the Lord Mayor and Lady Mayoress in being present and granting the use of the Council Chamber for the Meeting.

This was seconded and received with acclamation.

Mrs. Chamberlain expressed thanks for the kind Resolution, and said how pleased she was to continue for another year as President, and she also added her thanks to the Lord Mayor for his interest in the Hospitals.

The Lord Mayor replied on behalf of the Lady Mayoress and himself, and said how pleased they were to be there and how interested he had been in the proceedings.

Report of the Management Committee for the year 1942

The Committee of Management have pleasure in submitting their Annual Report on the work of the Women's and Maternity Hospitals for the year ended 31st December, 1942, also the Annual Statements of Account and Balance Sheet as certified by the Auditors.

The year 1942 has presented many difficulties, but these have been surmounted and the work of both Hospitals has been carried on successfully.

As stated in last year's Report, it was found necessary to obtain an Annexe for each Hospital in a safer area. The Women's opened an Auxiliary Hospital at Hammerwich, and one was provided for the Maternity Hospital at Barnt Green.

There has been a considerable increase in the number of patients. At the two Hospitals 4,484 patients were treated as In-Patients and Home Patients, as against 3,030 in 1941. 5,901 new Out-Patients were treated, and 17,171 attendances were recorded.

Of the Women's Hospital In-Patients, 909 were sent on to Hammerwich, and from the Maternity Hospital 613 were sent to Barnt Green. Both these auxiliary Hospitals have worked exceedingly well during the year.

WOMEN'S AND MATERNITY HOSPITALS LEAGUE.

Thanks are due to all the Officers and Collectors of the various Branches for the good work they have done during the year. The Committee have endeavoured to keep the various Branches together during the War, and they cannot stress too highly the importance and value of the help the Women's and Maternity Hospitals receive from the League. They are very grateful indeed to all the Officers who are keeping their Branches going in spite of almost overwhelming difficulties.

CONVALESCENT HOMES.

The Convalescent Home at Sparkhill has been lent to the Birmingham Health Committee as a Day Nursery. The Gertrude Myers Home at Cleeve Prior has been used to its fullest capacity. The number of patients received during the year is a record. This Home has been found invaluable to the Hospital in relieving the pressure on the beds at Sparkhill, and the benefit the patients derive from going there enables them to return home more ready to undertake the duties of life.

AFTER-CARE WORK.

The work of the After-Care Committee of the Women's Hospital is still suspended for the period of the War.

At the Maternity Hospital the After-Care Committee has found it difficult to provide extra nourishment to the mothers and babies owing to rationing restrictions.

In many cases of need, baby clothes, oatmeal, Bournvita, etc., have been given, and they have found that the women most needing help are the wives of men in the Forces, many of whom write letters expressing grateful thanks for the help they have received.

The Committee had been fortunate in procuring a quantity of wool which was being knitted into matinee coats and vests for the babies.

They are specially grateful to "The Birmingham Mail" Christmas Tree Fund for their splendid contribution of £100, without which the work of the Committee would have been considerably curtailed.

SPECIAL DEPARTMENTS.

The Radium, Pathological, Bacteriological, X-Ray, Dental and Massage Departments have continued to do very useful work for both Hospitals.

BEVERIDGE REPORT.

During the year the Hospital Committees have learned of the proposals contained in the Beveridge Report. It is too early yet to visualise very clearly the effects of these proposals on the future of the Hospitals, but they undoubtedly provide much scope for earnest thought and consideration.

THE WOMEN'S HOSPITAL.

As stated in the last Report, at the end of 1941 it was decided to open more beds at Sparkhill, and this has been of great assistance in reducing the waiting list, and to further assist in this way the Ministry of Health have put at the disposal of the Hospital twenty beds at Burntwood E.M.S. Hospital. These are under the supervision of three of our Surgeons.

During the year, 2,594 patients have been admitted, an increase of 1,046 over last year.

Early in the year the Out-Patient Department was removed from the Upper Priory to Sparkhill. A ward on the top floor which had been closed on account of danger from air raids was reopened with its ancillary departments and was adapted for use for the Out-Patient Department. This new arrangement has been most successful; in fact, a definite improvement on the old premises at Upper Priory. If Out-Patients required some slight treatment it was possible to deal with them at once in the operating theatre adjoining, and this has meant a decided improvement in the service to Out-Patients. It has also been a saving of time for the staff, who hitherto had to travel into the City every day in all weathers. 4,156 new Out-Patients were dealt with, and the total attendances numbered 10,122.

THE MATERNITY HOSPITAL.

The year has been a very busy one. The Committee found it possible to open further beds, and this has somewhat relieved the pressure on the Hospital. 1,565 patients were admitted as compared with 1,144 in 1941; 613 of these patients were sent out to Barnt Green.

5,047 attendances were made at the Ante-Natal Clinic during the year, 924 at the Post-Natal Clinic, 78 at the Dental Clinic, and there were 393 attendances at the Baby Clinic.

The Emergency Maternity Service (The Flying Squad) has been of great value. Thirty calls have been made, and in the majority of cases the life of the patient has been saved.

The work of the Pathological Department has continued to be carried on by Dr. Claude Taylor, the Women's Hospital Pathologist.

The X-Ray work is still undertaken at the Women's Hospital, and during the year 37 In-Patients and 166 Out-Patients were treated.

The Committee much regret to report that they have lost many friends and subscribers of the Hospital:—

Sir Charles Hyde, Bart., who has on so many occasions been most generous to the Hospitals.

Mr. W. A. Albright, who for over fifty years was a generous subscriber.

Mr. H. A. Dugard, Alderman S. J. Grey, and Miss Edith Hodson, who for so many years was such a faithful Treasurer to the Edgbaston Branch of the League. She was tireless in all the good work she undertook, and her life was a wonderful example of unselfish devotion to duty.

THANKS.

The Committee wish to thank the Birmingham Hospitals Contributory Association for their special grant of £1,000 to each Hospital against the deficit on 1941.

To those who have again made many garments for the babies born at the Maternity Hospital.

Report of the Women's Hospital Committee for the Year 1942

The Committee present their Seventy-Second Annual Report of the work of the Hospital for the year ended 31st December, 1942, together with Statement of Accounts for the same period.

At the close of 1941 it was decided to open further wards at Sparkhill, with the result that considerably more patients were admitted.

The arrangement for having the Out-Patient Department at Sparkhill has proved most satisfactory.

The number of new cases at the Out-Patient Department during the year has been 4,156, as against 3,300, being an increase of 856 on the previous year. The total number of attendances of new and old patients has been 10,122.

2,594 patients have been admitted to the In-Patient Department, being an increase of 1,046 on the number in 1941. Of these, 586 made use of the Private Wards. Of the patients admitted, 2,394 required operative treatment, particulars of which will be found in the Medical Report. Of these patients, 909 were sent on to the Auxiliary Hospital at Hammerwich.

The posts of House Surgeon during the year have been held by Dr. Derek Freeth, Dr. J. S. Tomkinson, Dr. Dorothy M. Shotton, Dr. Peter Denham and Dr. Jean McDonald.

The Committee again acknowledge gratefully the valuable services rendered during the year by the members of the Honorary Medical Staff and the great amount of time they devote to the Hospital. They also greatly appreciate the action of the Medical Board in again foregoing an honorarium in order to help the difficult financial position of the Hospital.

The Committee also desire to express to the Matron, Sisters, Nursing and Domestic Staff their appreciation of the devoted service given during the past year.

The X-Ray Department has continued to do most useful work for the Hospital. During the past year, 399 treatments were given, and in addition 732 radiographs were taken. These figures include the treatment of 203 patients from the Maternity Hospital.

The Committee wish to offer their sincere thanks to the auxiliary firemen, of whom a certain number have been on duty each night throughout the year. They certainly give an added feeling of security to all the patients and residents of the Hospital.

During the year the Hospital Committees have learned of the proposals contained in the Beveridge Report. It is too early yet to visualise very clearly the effects of these proposals on the future of the Hospitals, but they undoubtedly provide much scope for earnest thought and consideration.

The thanks of the Hospital are due to the Birmingham Hospitals Contributory Association for the special grant of £1,000 towards their deficit on 1941, and during the past year they have also received £13,827 for services rendered, being an increase on last year of £4,014. This is mainly due to the increased number of patients treated. The Committee tender their very grateful thanks to the Committee of the Association and also to the Hospital Saturday Fund Committee for the great interest that is shown by them in the Voluntary Hospitals of the City.

The Committee are pleased to report that this year shows an increase in the amount received from annual subscriptions.

Two new subscribers have entered into seven year Covenants; one for £90, and the other for £75. This enables the Hospital to reclaim Income Tax at 10s. in the £, which means considerable additional income.

The Committee are pleased to report that the precarious financial position of last year has been relieved for the present, and they hope that the year 1943 will show equally good results. The cost of maintaining the Hospital and the Annexe at Hammerwich is very high—there being two separate sets of overhead charges with no increase in the number of beds available, as compared with pre-war numbers.

Special sums received during the year, including free legacies, have reduced the deficit on the year's work on the Ordinary Account to £874 2s. 7d. This will reduce the accumulated deficit.

The Committee again appeal to all friends of the Hospital to endeavour to obtain new subscribers, as they feel that the work of the Hospital must not be curtailed in any way.

Medical Report, 1942

The Medical Board presents its report for the year 1942.

IN-PATIENT DEPARTMENT.

The number of patients admitted to the wards was 2,594. an increase of 1,046 on the number for 1941. 909 of these patients were transferred to Hammerwich House after operation. 24 cases died (.93%).

In a separate table are figures showing the nature and results of the operations performed; in all, 2,394—1,223

major and 1,171 minor.

SEPTIC WARD.

161 cases were admitted suffering from some form of infection following pregnancy. Details are given in a separate table.

RADIUM.

The 50 milligram tube is again in use in the Hospital, for non-malignant cases only. The carcinoma work is carried on at the Queen Elizabeth Hospital, suitable cases subsequently attending the General Hospital for X-Ray Therapy. The Follow-Up Clinic continues as usual. 55 new cases of carcinoma were treated during the year.

OUT-PATIENT DEPARTMENT.

The number of new patients admitted to the Out-Patient Department was 4,156, an increase of 856 on the number for 1941 The number of attendances of old patients was 5,976, an increase of 815 compared with 1941

PATHOLOGICAL DEPARTMENT

An indication of the work of the department is given by the figure in Table VI.

X-RAY DEPARTMENT

The total number of radiographs taken was 732, an increase of 148 compared with the previous year. Details of the work of the department are given in a separate table.



Report of the Maternity Hospital Committee for the year 1942

The Maternity Hospital Committee have pleasure in presenting their Annual Report for the year 1942. During the year there have been 1,565 admissions, as compared with 1,144 in 1941.

The total number of Out-Patients who have attended during the year is 7,049, and of these 1,745 were new cases.

During the year, 78 attendances have been made by patients at the Dental Clinic as part of their ante-natal treatment. Since the outbreak of war, the Clinic has been held fortnightly instead of once a week.

The Baby Clinic continues to be well attended, and many of the mothers express their appreciation of the advantages

they derive from this Clinic.

During the year, 79 mothers who have been In-Patients attended with their babies, and altogether they made 393 attendances. 924 patients attended the Post-Natal Clinic. They greatly appreciate the help and advice they obtain at this Clinic after they have been discharged from Hospital.

71 Pupil Midwives have been accepted for Part I. training during the year. Of this number, 41 have taken the Examination and 37 passed. In addition to these, 23 pupils who entered in 1941 completed their training and took their examination and 22 passed, making the total number of passes for the year 59. Of the 71 Pupil Midwives who were accepted for training, three abandoned the course for health and other reasons.

30 Medical Students applied for training and were

accepted.

The Emergency Maternity Service has again proved invaluable, and many practitioners have expressed their appreciation of the service. During the year, 30 calls have been made, and in the majority of the cases the life of the patient has been saved. There were two patients for which the Flying Squad was called out too late. 15 were admitted to the Birmingham Maternity Hospital, and one died in Hospital.

During the year Dr. Dorothy M. Shotton was appointed

as Resident Medical Officer and Registrar.

The posts of House Surgeon were held by Dr. Nye, Dr. Margaret Ingham, Dr. Dorothy W. Smith and Dr.

Margaret A. Shields.

The Committee acknowledges gratefully the services rendered during the year by the Honorary Medical Staff and the great amount of time they devoted to the work of the Hospital.

The Committee also desire to express to the Matron, Sisters, Nursing and Domestic Staff as a whole its appreciation of the efficient and loyal services given during a very difficult year.

Special thanks are also due to the ladies of the After-Care Committee who give much time in helping needy patients after

they are discharged from the Hospital.

They particularly wish to thank Mrs. Haswell Wilson and Mrs. Archdale who gave much of their time to visiting the patients in the Hospital every week. Their interest was

very greatly appreciated.

The Committee would also like to express thanks to the Voluntary V.A.D. Workers who were a very great help in the wards, and without whose services it would be difficult to carry on the work, as, owing to the war, it was almost

impossible to get adequate staff.

In this connection, too, the Committee take this opportunity of expressing most sincere thanks to the "Birmingham Mail" Christmas Tree Fund for their handsome donation of £100. But for this generous contribution the assistance available for needy women would be very much curtailed. The Committee feel that with the increased demands there must necessarily be in these difficult times they are able to continue this work with confidence that any emergency that may arise can be met.

325 cases were attended in their own homes by the district midwives, who had the help of the District House Surgeon in any cases of difficulty. This was of great benefit to the midwives and patients. Until rationing was instituted, needy cases were supplied with milk on the report of the midwife to the Almoner, who was also often able to help with

clothing.

37 In-Patients and 166 Out-Patients were sent to the Women's Hospital for X-Ray photographs or treatment during

the year.

The Massage Department has continued to do very useful work. During the year, 768 patients received treatment and advice.

During the year a series of lectures and practical demonstration in Gas Air Analgesia were given to trained midwives; 33 candidates attended and 31 have been awarded Certificates.

A University Course was held in October, 1942, and May, 1943. 45 candidates entered and 40 have just completed the course.

In May, 1942, a one-day Intensive Course of Lectures for Teachers of Midwifery was organised and was enthusiastically supported by teachers from all over England and Wales, there being 100 attendances. It is hoped that it will be possible to organise another Course in 1943.

The Committee are again very grateful to the workers who have undertaken the A.R.P. duties at the Hospital, and wish to express their appreciation of the splendid work they are doing by giving their services night after night for the benefit of the Hospital.

The Maternity Hospital at "Long Rede" has continued to be of great assistance to the Hospital, no less than 613 patients having been sent on there during the year. It is the means of providing safe convalescence for the patients, and relieves the pressure on the beds in Loveday Street.

The great pressure on the beds at the Hospital has led the Committee to make arrangements for converting the large dormitory, which was used for the domestic staff, into a ward, the domestic staff being housed in part of the new Nurses' Home in Loveday Street.

The Committee are also making arrangements for providing a few private beds, as there appears to be great demand for these.

The Committee are very grateful to Mrs. H. H. Payne for providing £500 towards the cost of these alterations.

The Committee acknowledge with many thanks gifts of garments from the following:

The Committee have pleasure in reporting that they have received a contribution from the Birmingham Hospitals Contributory Association of £7,643, for services rendered.

This is an increase of £528 on the previous year.

They again wish to express their grateful thanks for this grant, both to the Birmingham Hospitals Contributory Association and the Birmingham Hospital Saturday Fund, and, through them, to the workers of the City who contribute so splendidly to these organisations.

During the year the Hospital Committees have learned of the proposals contained in the Beveridge Report. It is too early yet to visualise very clearly the effects of these proposals on the future of the Hospitals, but they undoubtedly provide much scope for earnest thought and consideration.

Although the financial position of the Hospital is slightly better than in 1941, it still causes very great anxiety to the Committee. They are only able to reduce the deficit on the ordinary working of the Hospital by extra donations received in the shape of special donations and legacies.

Although they have approached the Ministry of Health and the Birmingham Health Committee with a view to

assistance, so far they have not been successful.

The Committee are pleased to report an increase in annual subscriptions, but they still appeal to all friends of the Hospital to endeavour to obtain further subscriptions, as the needs of the Hospital are as urgent as ever, and there is always a great amount of free work to be done

The Committee have given grants to the new Baby Ward and the Servants' Sitting Room—Two much needed "Wardway" chairs have been provided for Loveday Street and new baby scales and nine folding garden chairs for "Long Rede."

We have been fortunate in procuring 60-lbs. of wool, which is being knitted into matinee coats and vests for the babies by the staff and mothers. The Committee thank them for their kind help. We should be very grateful for any contributions of baby clothes, as these little garments are difficult to get now without coupons.

The Committee are specially grateful to "The Birmingham Mail" Christmas Tree Fund for their splendid donation of £100, which makes it possible to help so many more cases, and without which the work would have to be considerably curtailed.

The Committee acknowledge with many thanks Messrs. Cadbury Bros. kind supply of Bourn-Vita.

OUT-PATIENT DEPARTMENT.

During the year, 1,745 new cases attended the Ante-Natal Clinics of the Out-Patient Department, the total number of attendances being 5,047, an average of 2.9 visits per patient.

In the Dental Clinic 78 patients received treatment.

At the Baby Clinic 79 mothers attended with their babies after delivery in the Hospital or on the District, their total attendances numbering 393.

The main feature of the year's work has been the marked increase in the haematological examinations performed; this has thrown a great strain on the already overcrowded laboratory, and a separate room is badly needed. The increased use of blood transfusion will constantly necessitate haematological examinations and the expansion of the laboratory will soon be imperative.

There has been a general increase in work done compared with the previous year; only one technician has been employed compared with two in pre-war years.

During the year 1942, 768 mothers received treatment This is an increase of 137 on the previous year.

Exercises were given to normal lying-in mothers, to tone up their muscles and assist the circulation. Special breathing exercises have greatly helped cases of chest trouble. Massage was given to special cases in which there was much weakness after a prolonged period in bed.

Infra Red Ray treatment was given to lacerated perineums which were not progressing satisfactorily. These showed much improvement after a short course of treatment. Cases of flushed breasts felt much relief after the same treatment.

Ten babies were treated during the year. Six were born with varying degrees of Talipes—these received manipulation and strapping. One baby had a mild Erbs paralysis, and was massaged and splinted. Babies suffering from other varieties of paralysis were supplied with suitable splinting and treatment.
