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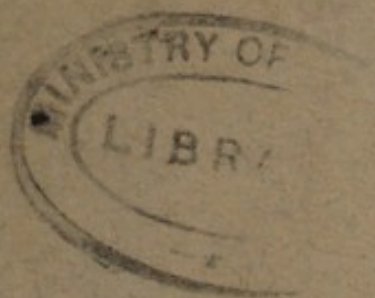

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ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

Bourton-on-the-Water Cottage Hospital

for the year 1927.

During the past year the Hospital has sustained an irreparable loss in the death of the President, Mr. G. F. Moore, Mr. Moore joined the Hospital Committee thirty-one years ago, he became Honorary Secretary ten years later and President in 1925. His interest in the welfare of the Hospital and its benevolent work never slackened and he crowned his many acts of generosity by donating £10,000 to build the new Hospital now approaching completion.

The 67th Annual Report marks another period of invaluable service to the sick and suffering.

The number of patients admitted to the Hospital during the year was 100, a decrease of nine compared with the previous year, 90 being adults and 10 children.

There were 59 Surgical cases and 41 Medical. The operations numbered 30, two of them being major and 28 minor. Of the whole of the number of cases treated 65 were discharged cured, 28 improved, in 3 the condition was unchanged, 2 transferred, 2 died and 6 remained in Hospital at the close of the year. The daily average of beds occupied was 5.7 as compared with 6.6 in 1926 and, 4.1 in 1925, and the average number of days per patient spent in the Hospital was 16. Five cases received massage and electrical treatment.

The Patients admitted during the year came from the following villages and towns respectively:—Bourton-on-the-Water 17, Clapton 4, Cold Aston 1, Temple Guiting 2, Lower Guiting 15, Hawling 1, Icomb, 2, Naunton 20, Northleach 1, Notgrove 4, Great Rissington 2, Little Rissington 2, Sherborne 2, Lower Slaughter 4, Upper Slaughter 8, Wyck Rissington 8, Leicester 1, Broadwell 1, Chipping Norton 1, Gloucester 1, Birmingham 1, Hook Norton 1.

The Financial Statement shows a slight decrease in Income compared with 1926 of £4 : 2 : 8. Subscriptions are £175 : 4 : 8 against £157 : 7 : 9 an increase of £17 : 16 : 11.

Donations are £123 : 10 : 2 against £157 : 1 : 1 in 1926.

The payments by the Patients are slightly less than in the previous year, the Private Ward bringing in £51 : 9 : 0 against £69 : 5 : 6 and the Public Wards £105 : 0 : 5 against £93 : 14 : 1.

Congregational Collections are £85 : 0 : 1 against £98 : 11 : 11 in 1926, the reduction no doubt being accounted for by the effect of the bad harvest and the general depression in agriculture.

There is an increase from the Invested Funds, the Warner Gift and the Holford Legacy bringing in an additional sum of £36 : 6 : 0.

The total Expenditure is £723 : 7 : 11 against £794 : 11 : 4 in 1926, chiefly accounted for by the fact that there has been no heavy expenditure in repairs, although it should be mentioned that the fuel account has increased from £52 : 17 : 8 to £78 : 17 : 1, owing to the dear market during the first few months of the year.

The Committee gratefully record the gift of £100 from the family of the late Mr. Joseph Foster.

There has been one change in the Nursing Staff, Nurse Ash leaving at the end of January, her place being filled by Nurse Coleman.

Grateful thanks are due to all the members of the Ladies' Linen League for their continued valuable support. The number of articles contributed for the benefit of the Hospital was 162 and the sum of £49 : 6 : 6 was raised for supplying extra comforts for the Patients.

Special thanks are due to those who so successfully organized the Hospital Sunday Collections, Hospital Football Competitions, other collections and entertainments.

The valuable egg collection organized by Mrs. Waller, of Cold Aston, and the work of so many kind helpers is most gratefully appreciated by the Committee. The total collected was 3663 against 3689 in 1926. Bourton-on-the-Water (Mrs. Bolter and the Hospital) 419, Cold Aston (Miss Frogley) 362, Wyck Rissington (Mrs. Phipp) 373, Sherborne (Lady Sherborne) 324, Notgrove (Mrs. Fluck) 313, Little Rissington (Miss Oakey) 176, Great Rissington (Mrs. Collett) 204, Stow-on-the-Wold (Miss Collett and the Church) 432, Hawling (Miss Comely) 240, Lower Slaughter (Mrs. Wilkins) 210, Upper Slaughter (Miss East) 124, Naunton (Mrs. Hanks) 300, Nether Swell (Children's Service) 66, Bourton-on-the-Water Church Flower Service 120.

Again we must thank Mr. Farbrother for supplying the Hospital with vegetables from his allotment near by; Mr. C. Bridges for cutting and mowing the front lawns during the summer; the Electric Light Company for re-charging the wireless batteries; the Parish Church and Baptist Church Choirs for their visits to the Hospital on Sunday evenings; Miss Beddome for reading to the Patients regularly each week; Messrs. E. Milton, J. A. Reynolds, J. Wheeler and Mrs. Hannis for their house-to-house collections, and Mr. Charles Joynes for supplying two newspapers each Sunday.

Finally your Committee would express its grateful recognition of the services given to the Hospital by the Hon. Medical Officers, the Hon. Masseuse, the Hon. Secretary and the Hon. Chaplains, and the efficient and conscientious discharge of their duties so willingly rendered by the Matron and Nursing Staff.

RULES

OF THE

Bourton-on-the-Water Cottage Hospital,

1928.

1.—The Hospital is designed for the relief of poor persons in illness or suffering from accidents; but no case of advanced pulmonary consumption, nor of chronic, infectious, or contagious disease, excepting enteric fever, shall be admitted.

2.—In-Patients shall contribute a certain sum weekly towards their maintenance, the amount to be determined by the Committee, according to the circumstances of the Patient, but no Patient shall pay less than 7/6 weekly.

3.—The admission of Pauper Patients suffering from accidents or disease, the attendance on whom elsewhere would entitle the District Union Medical Officer to *extra* payment, does not interfere with his claim to the accustomed fees.

4.—Every subscriber or donor of 10/- and upwards and Clergymen or Ministers who make Annual Congregational Collections towards the funds of the Hospital, shall have the Privilege of recommending Patients for admission, subject to the Medical Officers—to one of whom the recommendation must be made in writing—finding the case suitable for admission, and also to there being accommodation in the Hospital at the time.

5.—A Donor of money, or securities approved by the Committee and Trustees, to the Value of twenty-five times 10/- or £1 or approved securities producing 10/- or £1, shall have the same privileges as annual subscribers of those respective sums.

6.—No Patient shall be admitted to the Hospital without a written Certificate from a Medical man stating the nature of the illness, except in cases of accident when no recommendation or Certificate will be required.

7.—Every requisite for the Patients shall be provided by the Hospital. Patients must bring with them a sufficient change of clothing and arrange for their washing.

8.—The Matron shall reside in the Hospital, and her services are not available elsewhere (except by special sanction of the Committee in each case). When on duty in the Hospital she shall wear uniform. She shall have such occasional assistance as may be required.

9.—The Medical Department shall be under the control of the Medical Officers.

10.—The Management of the Hospital shall be in the hands of a Committee consisting of the President, the Hon. Medical Officers and the Hon. Chaplains, *ex-officio*, of 12 elected Subscribers, and of not more than 2 additional Subscribers who may

be co-opted (for the current year) by the Committee. Of the 12 elected members of the Committee, 4 shall cease to be members immediately before each Annual General Meeting, but shall be eligible for re-election. The Subscribers shall at each Annual General Meeting elect 4 to serve on the Committee for a period of 3 years.

11.—In the case of vacancies occurring on the Committee beyond those mentioned above, the Subscribers shall at the Annual General Meeting elect a sufficient number to bring the total of elected members up to twelve. The names of any Candidates for election to the Committee shall be sent in writing to the Hon. Secretary not less than 7 days before the Annual General Meeting together with the names of Proposer and Secunder in each case, and an intimation of willingness to serve.

12.—The Committee shall at its first Meeting after the Annual General Meeting of Subscribers elect a Chairman and an Hon. Secretary who shall remain in Office until the first Meeting of the Committee after the next Annual General Meeting.

The President shall be elected at an Annual General Meeting of Subscribers for a period of 3 years.

N.B. For the purpose of elections referred to in the three foregoing Rules 10, 11 and 12, a Subscriber shall be deemed to be a person who has individually and directly subscribed a sum of not less than 10/- to the general funds of the Hospital during the previous year.

13.—Meetings of the Committee shall be held monthly, and three members present shall constitute a quorum, In the event of a quorum not being formed, two members present may pass the ordinary accounts and transact routine business.

14.—Four members of the Committee resident in Bourton-on-the-Water shall be appointed, with power to act, individually or collectively, to any one of whom application can be made in matters requiring immediate attention, connected with the Hospital, Such member or members to report at the next Committee Meeting any action taken.

15.—The Furniture and all other property belonging to the Hospital shall be vested in the Committee.

N.B.—The Hospital building and land are vested legally in the Trustees.

16.—The Committee shall have power from time to time to make such By-laws as they think necessary, but no alteration in the present Rules shall be made except at the Annual Meeting which shall be held on some convenient date in the month of January in each year. Notice of any proposed alteration shall be sent to the Secretary not less than 14 days before the date of the Meeting. The Annual Meeting shall be open to all Subscribers.

17.—A copy of the Rules for In-patients shall be suspended in each Ward of the Hospital.

18.—An Annual Report of the Hospital with statement of receipts and expenditure when appoved and passed at the Annual General Meeting shall be printed, and a copy forwarded to each Contributor.

19.—The Matron shall give immediate notice of the arrival of any new Patient to the Medical Officer, and also of anything happening which requires his immediate presence.

20.—Patients are to submit to the regulations of the Hospital and to the control of the Matron.

21.—Patients are not allowed to use any article of diet or of drink other than those provided by the Hospital, without special sanction of the Medical Officer or the Matron.

22.—Patients are not allowed to walk beyond the Hospital premises without permission of the Medical Officer or Matron.

23.—Patients of all religious denominations may be attended by their respective Minister of religion at such times as may be most convenient to themselves and to the Medical Officer.

24.—Patients may be visited by their friends on any day in the week, at the discretion of the Matron, between two and four p.m. If any other time is desired they must obtain a note from the Medical Officer to ensure admittance.

25.—No Out-Patients shall be admitted for treatment without first having the Medical Officers approval.



Form of Bequest.

To those kindly disposed to become Benefactors to this Institution by Will, the following form of bequest is recommended:—

I bequeath to the Bourton-on-the-Water Cottage Hospital the sum of (state the amount in words) free of legacy duty, which sum I direct to be paid by my executors within three months next after my decease out of such part of my personal estate as the law permits, to be applied to the general purposes of the Institution, and I declare that the receipt by the Treasurer or any two Trustees of the Institution will be sufficient discharge to my executors.
