

# Thirty-First Annual Report for the Year ending 31st December, 1928.

The Annual General Meeting of the Builth Cottage Hospital was held at the Hospital on 7th February, Lord Swansea presiding.

The Accounts for the year were presented. The Accounts started with a deficit balance of £61 12s. 2d, and ended with a deficit balance of £47 15s. 1d.

The income for the year showed an increase of £94 and the expenditure an increase of £75 compared with the year before. The chief items in the receipts were the number of Entertainments organised on behalf of the funds and the patients' payments.

A comparison of Builth Cottage Hospital with figures given in the statistical report of Voluntary Hospitals for group C (Cottage Hospitals with less than 30 beds) shows per available bed:

The figures above for group C are taken from the Ninth Annual Report for 1927 of the Voluntary Hospitals in Great Britain.

The Accounts were adopted unanimously.

The Medical Report showed that during the year 174 patients were admitted and that there were 65 operations. The average cost per bed was £110 17s. 4d. compared with £112 5s. in 1927. The Average cost per patient £8 5s. 7d. compared with £8 13s 9d. in 1927. The average number of beds occupied 12.99 compared with 12.02 in 1927. The average stay in hospital 27.25 days compared with 48.41 days in 1927.

Lord Swansea was unanimously re-elected President; Rev. Lewis James, Vice-President; Dr. Black Jones, Dr. S. H. Pugh, Dr. Charles Martin and Dr Edgar Milwyn Jenkins re-elected Hon. Medical Officers; Mr Llewellyn Morris, Hon. Dental Surgeon; Mr. J. Meredith Jones and Mr. John Evans, Hon. Auditors; Mr E. Price Griffith, Hon. Treasurer; and Mrs. Telfer Smith, Hon. Secretary.

The Members of the Committee were all re-elected with the name of Rev A. J. Stanbury in place of Rev. W. E. Fielding.

It was decided to increase the Honorarium to the Hon. Secretary to £50 in consideration for the very valuable work done and the fact that it it is now considerably increased. Mrs. Telfer Smith has completed 25 years work as Hon. Secretary.

Thanks were accorded to all who had helped the Hospital in any way during the year.

#### RULES.

1-This Institution shall be called "The Builth Cottage Hospital and Convalescent Home."

2-The Governing Body of the Institution shall consist of Life Governors and Annual Governors to be qualified as follows:—

(a) Each Donor of £10 and upwards to the Funds of the Institution shall be a Life Governor and shall have one vote at any General Meeting for each £10 of his or her donation.

(b) Each Annual Subscriber of £1 or upwards to the said Fund shall be an Annual Governor and shall have one vote for each

£1 of his or her subscription.

- (c) Each person who remits to the said Funds a sum of £1 or upwards derived from offertories or other public sources shall be an Annual Governor for the year following the remittance and shall have one vote for each £1 of such remittance.
- 3—An Aunual General Meeting of the Governors shall be held in the month of January. Other General Meetings shall (if necessary) be called by the Honorary Secretary on her own responsibility or on the requisition of any six Governors. Not less than fourteen days notice of every such meeting shall be given to each Governor.
- 4—No motion except such as arises out of the business of the day shall be made at any General Meeting unless at least 16 days previous notice in writing thereof be given to the Hon. Sec.
- 5—The Iustitution shall be under the direction of the President, Vice-President and Committee of Management, the latter to consist of not less than 10 Governors together with the Hon. Sec. and Medical Officers. All the above shall be elected yearly by the Governors at the General Meeting and shall be entitled to inspect the Hospital at all times.
- 6—Committee Meetings shall be convened by the Hon. Sec. on her own responsibility or on the requisition of any three members thereof and at least three days notice of such Meetings shall be given.
- 7—The Committee shall have full power to appoint and dismiss all salaried officers and servants, to fix their remuneration and to make such bye-laws as may be required for the good management of the Institution, and to delegate such powers and duties as they may think fit to a sub-committee of their number.
- 8-At general meetings seven shall form a quorum and at committee meetings three.
- 9-All subscriptions shall become due on the 1st day of January in each year and no one whose subscription shall be unpaid shall be entitled to attend any meeting.
- 10-The Hon. Sec. shall keep the books and documents belonging to the Institution, conduct the correspondence, collect the subscriptions, and keep an account of same and pay all bills by cheque.
- 11—The Honorary Medical Staff shall consist of all registered medical practitioners within the district who are willing to give their services to all persons admitted to the Hospital by nomination of a Governor. The Honorary Dental Staff shall consist of all registered dental surgeons within the district, who are willing to give their services (dentures and appliances excepted) to all persons admitted to the Hospital by nomination of a Governor.
- 12—Every Medical Officer of the Institution shall have the right to continue the treatment of any patient under his care at the time of admission. For all other cases the Medical Officers shall attend the Hospital in rotation, the period and order of attendance to be fixed by themselves.

- 13—The Matron shall devote her whole time to the duties of the Hospital. She shall have charge of all the linen, bedding and other stores, and keep full particulars thereof for the information of the Committee and shall, subject to their approval, have full power to engage and dismiss the nurses and servants of the Institution. Her engagement shall be terminated by three months notice on either side, and the engagements of the nurses and servants by one month's similar notice.
- 14—Each Patient shall be nominated by a Governor and shall be admitted at the discretion of the Hon. Sec. in conjunction with one other member of the Committee.
- 15—Each Life Governor shall have one nomination annually for each £10 of his or her donation and each Annual Governor shall have one nomination for every £1 contributed. Nominations under this rule shall remain in force until the end of the then current year.
- 16—Each person who remits to the funds monies derived from offertories or other public sources shall have one Nomination for each £1 so remitted and the same shall be available for one year from the date of such remittance.
- 17—Every application for admission to the Hospital shall be addressed to the Hon. Sec. and be accompanied by a nomination form duly filled up and signed. If the patient is not admitted, a fresh nomination form will be forwarded to the Governor recommending the same.
- 18—Patients must not attend at the Hespital until they hear from the Hon. Sec. or Matron that they can be received. Should a longer stay than three weeks be considered by the Medical Officer in charge to be desirable a fresh Nomination form, signed by a Governor, but not otherwise filled up, must be obtained for each further period of three weeks.
- 19—Poor Persons living in the district of the Builth Union shall pay in advance the sum of 5s. per week. But patients in the opinion of the House Committee not properly describable as poor persons shall pay such a weekly fee, not to exceed £1 !0s. per week as may be fixed by the House Committee. The amount of such fee to be fixed and notified to such patients as soon as practicable after the next meeting of the House Committee.
- 20-Cases of sudden accident only may be admitted at any time without a nomination.
- 21—Pauper Patients shall only be admitted on the understanding that in all cases entitling the District Medical Officer to an extra payment, such extra payment shall be made to him by the Board of Guardians.
- 22—The Institution being intended primarily to benefit poor persons living in or near the town of Builth, preference will be given to poor patients from that district. Cases of mental disorder, infectious cases, incurable cases and maternity cases are inadmissible.
- 23—Private Persons may be admitted without nomination, to Private Wards on payment of a sum not less than £3 3s. per week. Paying Patients may be admitted without nomination. to the Open Wards on payment of a sum not less than £1 15s. per week at the discretion of the Committee and provided that their admittance does not interfere with the accommodation available for patients admitted by nomination.
- 24—All monies belonging to the Hospital and not required for its immediate purposes shall be invested in the names of not less than two of the Governors in or upon some or one of the following securities:—
  - (a) In any of the investments specified in Section 1 and 5 of the Trustee Act 1893 as amended by the Colonial Stock Act 1860.
  - (b) In any Investments in which Trustees may at any time hereafter be authorised to invest trust funds.

(c) In the Debenture or Debenture Stock, Guaranteed or preference Stock, or Preference Shares of any Railway Company carrying on business in Great Btitain which shall have paid a dividend of not less than 3 per cent per annum on its ordinary capital for a period of 5 years immediately preceding the date of investment.

The Governors may from time to time vary such investments for others of a like nature as often as they may deem expedient.

25—The accounts of the Hospital shall be made up to the 31st December in each year and shall be duly audited and presented to the Governors at the Annual General Meeting.

26—The foregoing Rules shall not be altered, nor shall any new rule be adopted, except at the Annual General Meeting. Notice of any proposed alteration or new Rule shall be given in writing to the Hon. Sec. not later than the previous 1st of December.
