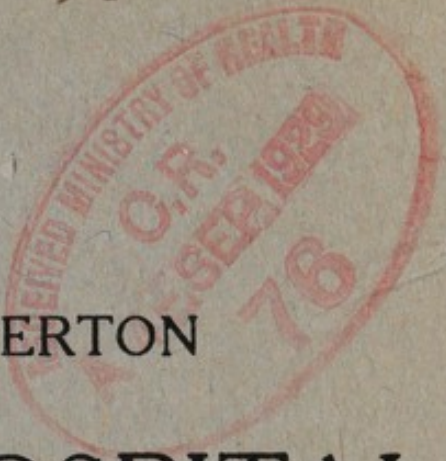

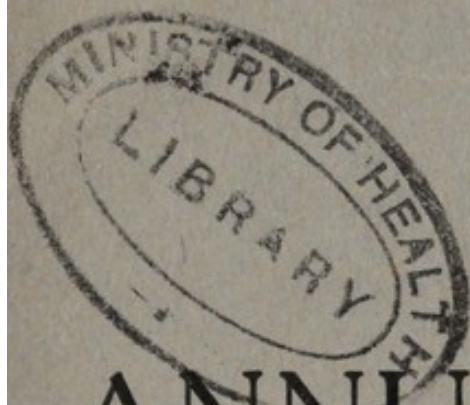

THE FORTIETH
ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE
BUDLEIGH SALTERTON COTTAGE HOSPITAL

THE Committee has pleasure in presenting the Annual Report for the year ending November 30th, 1928.

At the commencement of the year eight Patients were in Hospital and 136 have been admitted since, making a total of 144 cases treated during the 12 months, a decrease of eight on last year. Had the year been a normal one there would have been an increase in the numbers admitted to the Hospital. Unfortunately, however, five cases of typhoid had to be sent to the Hospital, and this, for some time, prevented the admission of other patients, the tax on the Nursing Staff being extremely heavy; as constant and unceasing day and night attention was needed. Forty-eight operations were successfully performed during the year; 13 of these being of a major character and 11 cases of accidents were admitted.

The average duration of a Patient's stay in Hospital works out at $15\frac{1}{2}$ days, and the average cost of treatment per Patient at a fraction over £9.

The increased cost of treatment being due to a number of very serious cases in the Hospital during the year, many of which were in Hospital for a considerable time, also extra Nurses had to be engaged for the Typhoid cases.

One Typhoid Patient died 28 days after admission, and the remainder were in Hospital for periods varying from 64 to 130 days and, owing largely to these cases, the Committee has considered it advisable to repaint and decorate the interior of the Hospital throughout, which means a very heavy expense.

Five Patients received free treatment from the Needy Patients' Fund, and 25 under the Wage Earners' Insurance Scheme.

Twenty-one new Subscribers have been obtained during the year, and the Subscriptions show an increase of £19 9s. 6d. and Donations an increase of £13 11s. The Committee thanks the Subscribers for their continued and generous support.

The total Fees received from Patients amounts to £564 4s. 3d., or £16 11s. 5d. more than last year. 34 Patients received treatment in the Private Wards and the Fees from these amount to £348 12s. 4d. The sum of £24 1s. 1d. was received from various Health Insurance Societies, and £14 17s. from the Devon County Council for the treatment of School children.

Rose Day was again most successful, realizing £103 10s. 1d.—a record—and the Committee thanks Miss Miles, Miss Milne, Mrs. Irwin Clark and the ladies who so kindly

collected and helped in other ways to secure such an excellent result.

Pound Day and the Linen Guild again secured splendid results, thanks to the efforts of Mrs. Fulton and Mrs. Hartree, and to all who so kindly assisted them, and those who so generously contributed.

The Committee acknowledges with thanks the very efficient manner in which the Medical and Nursing Staff have carried out the work of the Hospital.

To Mr. Maurice Goodman for his kindness in Auditing the Accounts and to all who have in any way assisted the Hospital during the year the Committee tenders its grateful thanks.

Owing to the increasing requirements in the District for Hospital treatment the Committee has decided to enlarge the Women's Ward by the addition of five more beds and to modernize other parts of the Building. An appeal to cover the cost of these alterations and extensions will be issued shortly, and the Committee, in making the appeal, has every confidence that it will meet with a prompt and generous response, as no charity is more deserving of the support of the residents than the Cottage Hospital, which is maintained solely for the benefit of the sick amongst the whole of the community.

The Annual Meeting of the Wage Earners was held in the Long Room of the Feathers Hotel, on November 17th. Mr. J. W. Palmer presided and the Report for the year was presented by the Hon. Sec., Mr. Perriam.

Mr. Hartree, Mr. Marks and the Hon. Sec. attended the meeting as representing the Hospital.

Mr. Green occupied the position of Vice-President for a period of 41 years, and during the whole of this time he was always a strong and sympathetic supporter of the Cottage Hospital, and the Committee desires to place on record its great appreciation of the very many years willing service which he so ably rendered to the Cottage Hospital.
