

REPORT.

The Board beg to present the 36th Annual Report and Statement of Accounts.

The demand for admission to the Hospital has again been greater than in any previous year, 619 Patients have been admitted, an increase of 37 on the previous record.

The volume of work in the Electrical and X-Ray Departments has also increased. X-Ray patients have numbered 487, and 4,024 Electrical Treatments have been given.

The Expenditure at the Hospital during the year is slightly higher, but unfortunately owing to a decreased amount in donations the accounts show a deficit during the year of £319 5s. 4d.

Representations to the Hospital by the Herts County Council have been considered during the year and as a result it has been decided to increase the Hospital from 34 to 61 Beds to include a Maternity Unit and of the additional beds it is proposed to allot for the use of the County Council 16 General Ward Beds, and 4 Maternity Beds. This decision the Board feel is in accordance with the spirit of the Local Government Act, and that co-operation with the County Council will result in increased facilities for Patients in the District, economy and general usefulness.

The Contributory Scheme has once again proved an unqualified success, membership has increased and £1,172 10s. has been paid to the Hospital during the year. The Board wish to tender to the Officers of the Scheme their sincere thanks for the goodwill which had been fostered, and the material help and advice which have been given to the Hospital.

With great pleasure the Board wish to set on record that during the past year the work at the Hospital has proceeded smoothly and very efficiently, and to the Matron and her Staff the Board wish to express their sincere thanks and appreciation.

During the year 353 operations have been performed, entailing the expenditure of a very considerable amount of time by the Honorary Medical Staff to whom the Board owe a very great debt of gratitude for the assistance so readily given by them at all times.

The Board also desire to set on record their thanks to the numerous donors and subscribers who have made the work of the Hospital possible; to *The Herts and Essex Observer* for publishing the weekly list of gifts and matter in connection with the appeal fund; to *The Herts Mercury* for publishing the weekly list of gifts; to Mr. C. M. Bullpitt for his work as Honorary Dental Surgeon, and to numerous others for their assistance.

The Board regret to announce the resignations from their Members of Miss F. Stacey, who is leaving the District, and Miss S. Somerset through reasons of ill health. Miss F. Stacey has been intimately connected with the Hospital for a very great many years, not only as Honorary Organiser of the Linen Guild which has been so advantageous to the Hospital, but also as a Member of the Board, and to her the Board owe a great debt of thanks for the invaluable and ready assistance she has at all times given to the Hospital, and for the great success that the Linen Guild has achieved.

The Subscribers will be asked to elect 3 Members to the Board to fill the positions occupied by Miss Stacey and Miss Somerset, and that of Mr. W. G. Gold, who retires by rotation, and is not eligible for re-election for twelve months.

X-Ray and Electrical Department.

The work in these departments has considerably increased during the year.

The equipment of the X-Ray department is absolutely up-to-date, and the excellency of the work done by the Radiographers has resulted in an increased number of Patients being sent to the Hospital for Radiography, the number for the last two years being :—

In addition to the X-Ray department the Hospital is now equipped with the necessary apparatus for Ultra-Violet Ray or Sunlight Treatment, Diathermy, Galvanism, Faradism, etc.
