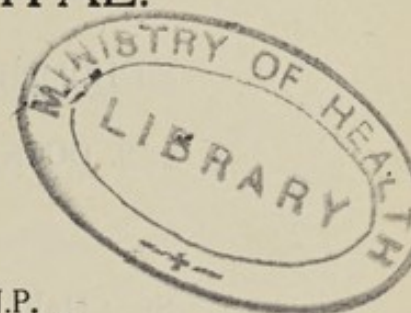

## REPORT FOR 1931.

The Board of Management have pleasure in presenting the thirty-seventh Annual Report and Statement of Accounts.

The demand for admission to the Hospital has been greater than ever before, and the number of available beds has proved quite insufficient to meet the needs of the locality.

704 In-patients (85 more than in any previous year) have been admitted, and the Electrical and X-Ray Departments have shown a similar greater activity.

To assist in the treatment of Orthopaedic cases a Clinic has been instituted at the Hospital in conjunction with the British Red Cross Society, and Mr. S. L. Higgs, M.A., M.B., B.Ch., F.R.C.S., L.R.C.P., has been appointed Hon. Orthopaedic Surgeon. The Board are confident that his services will be of great value to the District.

The rapid growth of the work at the Hospital has naturally resulted in increased expenditure, but the Board are pleased to report that the revenue, mainly owing to the efforts of Mr. B. C. Rowlandson who was appointed Secretary in March, was the highest on record. It has, however, only been possible to obtain sufficient revenue to meet expenditure and to show a small surplus by using for maintenance some legacies received during the year: a course which the Board were reluctant to adopt.

The year under review has been a memorable one in the history of the Hospital. The arrangements foreshadowed in the Report for 1930 for extension of the Hospital have matured, and on 21st October last the Foundation Stone of the new block was laid with full Masonic Ceremony by Admiral Sir Lionel Halsey, G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., K.C.I.E., C.B., Provincial Grand Master for Hertfordshire.

The new buildings, giving a total accommodation of 61 beds, will comprise a Men's Ward of 16 beds, a Women's Ward of 16 beds, a Children's Ward of 12 beds, a self-contained Maternity unit and an entirely new and up-to-date Theatre, etc. These additions cannot fail to assist the work at the Hospital and provide greater facilities for those requiring treatment. The equipment must necessarily prove expensive, and the Board are particularly grateful to Mr. John Balfour for his gift of £1,000 to endow a bed in the Men's Ward.

The Contributory Scheme has continued to expand, and the goodwill and help which the Committee of the Scheme have given at all times has been very much appreciated.

The Linen Guild, organised by Miss J. Chester with the assistance of a Committee, has proved most valuable to the Hospital, and the Board desire to express their sincere thanks to her and the members of the Guild.

The Board wish to record their sincere appreciation of the work of the Medical Officers. During the year 428 operations were performed and at all times the Medical Staff have freely given their time and skill for the benefit of the Patients.

The successful working of the Hospital and the fact that during the year a very large number of expressions of gratitude have been received from Patients have been due, to no small extent, to the work of the Matron and the Staff, and the Board desire to pay tribute to the efficiency with which the work has been carried out in all Departments of the Hospital.

The thanks of the Board are also due to the *Herts. and Essex Observer* and the *Herts. Mercury* for publishing the weekly list of gifts, to Mr. C. M. Bullpitt for his work as Hon. Dental Surgeon, and to all those who have given their assistance in many and various ways.

The Subscribers will be asked to elect two new members to the Board to fill the positions occupied by Mrs. A. E. Cutforth and Mr. J. Balfour who are not eligible for re-election for twelve months.

In conclusion the Board wish to record their deep sense of gratitude to the Donors and Subscribers and to all who have so generously continued to assist the Hospital during a year of National financial difficulty. They feel confident that in the greater work of the enlarged Hospital they will be able to rely on that support in an increased measure.
