



PRIVATE WARDS.

Terms of Admission, from £5 5s. and upwards.
Payments to the Hospi al to be made Weekly, in advance.
These terms include Board and Nursing. Extras to be defrayed by the patient—wine, beer, spirits, mineral waters, washing of personal linen, medicines, surgical dressings, etc., and medical attendance.

MEDICAL ATTENDANCE.

Any qualified practitioner may attend patients occcupying Private Wards:

All arrangements as to fees to the Doctor must be privately made between the patient and the Doctor. With such arrangements, as well as with the professional treatment the Hospital has nothing to do.

The Doctor must give his orders to the Matron, who will be held responsible for the efficient execution of the orders so given.

NURSING.

Nursing will be carried out by the Nurses of the Hospital, under the supervision of the Matron, and in obedience to the directions of the Doctor.

APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION.

Application to be made to the Matron at the Hospital, with a medical certificate stating the nature of the disease.

Cases of infectious or contagious disease, mental disorder, or incurable disease, are not admitted.

N.B.—The Board of Management reserves to itself the right of refusing to admit or retain any patient as an inmate of the Hospital, and, except by special permission, no patient can remain longer than two months.

SPECIAL RULES.

Patients must be willing to abide by the direction of the Matron in matters of Hospital discipline.

The nurses are not allowed to give more time to the patients than the exigencies of the case require.

Friends of patients in the Private Wards will be admitted at all times, subject to the convenience of the Hospital and to the directions of the doctor attending the patient.

FORTY-EIGHTH ANNUAL REPORT, 1928.

The Hospital statistics record another year of greatly increased work. In 1927 the number of In-patients was 820, in 1928 it grew to 1,008. Considerable extensions consequently became necessary both to the buildings and to the equipment. These additions and improvements have been duly made and the capacity of the Hospital has been permanently enlarged.

Two additional Wards for private patients and a Storesroom have been built; two Ward Kitchens and the Laundry premises enlarged. The heating system for the Operating Theatre has been renewed with new boilers and radiators

and brought up to the latest requirements.

The inevitable expenditure upon these urgent developments threatened to enlarge the amount of debt now owing to the Bank. Helpful legacies of about £1,600 received during the year have happily prevented an increase of that already very heavy burden of debt, viz., £6,500.

At the Annual Meeting last March of the Governors and supporters of the Hospital, presided over by the Mayor of Hastings (Councillor A. D. Thorpe, J.P.), Earl Beauchamp, K.G., was unanimously re-elected President for the ensuing

vear.

The Summer Garden Fete was held in the grounds and yielded £834 to the funds of the Hospital. It was opened by the Mayor of Eastbourne, Miss Hudson, and was attended by crowds of new and old friends of the Hospital. Very sincere thanks are offered to all the Stall-holders and helpers, including the special Fete Committees of Bohemia and Silverhill, Bexhill, and West St. Leonards, as well as to all the numerous other supporters who in many ways contributed willingly to the great success of this occasion.

The Nurses' Training School has worked successfully and obtained very satisfactory results at the Examinations under the General Nursing Council of England and Wales. Fully trained Nurses for patients under treatment outside the Hospital can now he secured on application to the Matron. Thanks are offered to the Matron, the Sisters and Nurses for their patient and skilful care for the comfort and welfare of the patients.

A specially gratifying event of the year was the presentation to the Hospital of a beautiful Chapel for the Nursing and Domestic Staff, wherein their daily prayers are offered. This munificent gift by the Mayoress of Hastings, Mrs. Arthur Thorpe, is in memory of relatives who have passed on. The foundation stone was laid by her daughter, Mrs. Kekewich, on the 14th March, and the Chapel was dedicated by the late Bishop of Lewes, the Right Rev. Thos. Cook,

on the 24th September.

With deepest regret the death is recorded of Dr. W. Clowes Pritchard. For nearly 30 years he was a member of the Hon. Medical Staff and gave this Hospital his whole-hearted support. The new Ward for Women bears his name in recognition of his excellent work for the interests and welfare of the Hospital and its patients.

With regret we have to record the death of Major-General Cooper, C.B., and of Mr. A. J. G. Anson, both of whom rendered valuable service on the Board of the Hospital.

The Honorary Medical and Surgical Staff has been strengthened by the addition of Mr. M. C. Mason, M.R.C.S. (Eng.), D.O., M.S. (Eng.), who has charge of the Ophthalmic Department, Mr. C. de W. Kitcat, M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P., for diseases of the chest, and Mr. F. C. Cutler, M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P.

The Board of Management appreciates very highly indeed the valuable services rendered freely all the year round by the Honorary Medical and Surgical Staff, Dental Surgeons, Pathologist and Masseur. For helpful Services best thanks are offered to the Rev. E. T. G. Hunter, M.A., our Honorary Chaplain, to the Rev. E. J. Walker, and all who assist them.

The Board offers sincere thanks to the Rotary Club and the Alexandra Rose Day Committee, as well as to the League of Mercy, for continued financial help. Also to the Saturday and Sunday Fund, the Hastings and St. Leonards Fetes, the Parade Committees, and to all other Contributors to the Funds of the Hospital by means of Entertainments and Collections.

The Board values very highly the generous assistance of the Elizabeth Mirrlees Trustees.

Very hearty thanks are rendered to the Bexhill Hospitals Fund Committee for increased support to the League of the Golden Penny, at Bexhill. The large amount of work done for Bexhill and District by the Buchanan Hospital is now evidently appreciated.

To the members and supporters of the Linen Guild under the guidance of Mrs. Frank Shaw very sincere thanks are offered for their valuable help, also to the Ladies' Committee

under the leadership of Mrs. W. Clowes Pritchard.

The increased support of the Hospitals Benevolent Fund is most highly esteemed, and warm thanks of the Board are tendered to the Workers and Collectors.

For the larger amount of work now undertaken the Hospital needs a larger income. It has become necessary to borrow £6,500 from the Bank: the interest to be paid on this is a heavy burden. Will Supporters kindly make efforts to increase their help? Is it too much to suggest that as the work has doubled in recent years some might now kindly double their financial assistance? All promises or payments are welcomed, and should be addressed to the Hon. Treasurer, A. D. Thorpe, Esq., J.P., Mayor of Hastings, or to the Secretary, Mr. Gilbert Henderson.

The Matron is at all times glad to receive gifts of fruit, groceries, vegetables and eggs, and also tin-foil.

The Board thanks all who during the year have kindly sent various Gifts to the Hospital, and contributions in kind or in money towards the Christmas Fund.

RULES.

--: 0: ---

Ι

This Hospital shall be named the Buchanan Hospital, and is intended for the reception of persons suffering from ophthalmic and acute surgical and medical diseases and accidents.

II.

Subscribers of £1 is. od. shall be entitled to one in-patient's letter or four out-patient's cards.

In-patient's letters and out-patients cards are interchangeable

at any time on application to the Secretary.

Donors of £21 os. od. in one sum at one time to the General Fund shall be entitled to become Life Governors, and to receive one in-patient's letter or four out-patient's cards for life.

Donors of £1,000 in one sum shall be entitled to name a bed in perpetuity, and shall have the right during life of sending in a patient

to that bed free of charge.

Subscribers of £50 shall be entitled to the same privileges as

donors of £1,000 so long as the subscription be paid.

In the case of Executors paying a Legacy to the Hospital of not less than floo, free of Legacy Duty, the senior Executor shall become a Life Governor and be entitled to one in-patient's or four out-patients' cards annually.

III.

No Subscriber will have the power of recommending patients in any year beginning January 1st, until his subscription for the year be paid; and recommendations not used in the current year will be void

IV.

For the purpose of voting at the General Annual Meeting, or at a Special Meeting of Subscribers, each Subscriber present shall be entitled to one vote, but in the event of a poll being demanded, each subscription of 10s. 6d. for the year in which such subscription shall have been paid shall carry one vote, one guinea two votes, and so on in proportion; each donation of £10 10s. shall carry one vote for life, and so on in proportion; but no Subscriber shall in any case be entitled to more than fifty votes. The poll shall be taken at a special meeting duly summoned by the Hon. Secretary, within fourteen days of the demand, when votes may be given by proxy.

V

The Hospital shall be under the control of a Board of Management consi ting of not less than six, and not more than fourteen subscribers, four of whom shall retire annually by rotation, but be eligible for election at the Annual General Meeting: the Lady Manager, the Hon. Chaplain, the Hon. Treasurer, and four members of the Medical Staff, being ex-officio members of the Board, who shall be elected annually by the Medical Staff, assisted by a House Committee elected annually by the Board

The following addition to Rule V. was passed at the Annual General Meeting on 26th February, 1916:—" Non-Attendance for 12 months shall constitute a vacancy, and in the event of a vacancy occurring thus, or by resignation or death, the Board may co-opt a Subscriber or Life Governor to fill such vacancy, who will take the place of the late member. Notice of such vacancy shall be given at a Board Meeting, any nominations shall be made in writing at the next Board Meeting, and the election shall be made by a ballot vote at the Meeting then next following."

VI.

The Board of Management shall meet at the Hospital once a month, or more frequently if necessary, for the transaction of business, three to form a quorum. The Board shall have power generally to direct all the affairs of the Hospital; to make and alter Bye-laws; appoint Committees for occasional or special purposes; and to appoint and dismiss Hon. Treasurer, Hon. Medical Officers, and Hon. Chaplain (who shall be a Clergyman of the Church of England), and Matron.

VII.

The Board shall convene Special General Meetings for any exceptional business during the year, and also whenever a requisition is received, signed by no less than twelve subscribers, stating the purpose for which a Special General Meeting is required.

VIII.

The domestic arrangements shall, subject to the control of the Board of Management, be under the superintendence of a Lady Manager.

IX.

All lands, buildings, funds, and other properties of the Hospital shall be invested in three Trustees, who shall be the present Lesees of the Hospital Estate, any vacancy occurring to be filled by the surviving Trustees, in accordance with the deed of declaration.

X.

All moneys received shall be paid into the Banking Account of the Hospital, and all drafts thereon shall be signed by the Treasurer, subject to the approval of the Board of Management.

XI.

The Treasurer shall lay before the Board at their Quarterly Meeting a statement of Receipts from the commencement of the current year to the end of the month last preceding such meeting.

XII.

The Accounts of the Hospital (with the Vouchers) shall be made up each year, and examined and certified by the Auditors.

XIII.

Patients shall be admitted on payment of a weekly sum, to be fixed from time to time by the Board of Management.

XIV.

Patients shall be eligible for admission to the Hospital on the recommendation of a subscriber (or in cases of emergency without any recommendation), but the admission of patients shall be subject to the decision of Medical Officers. Patients suffering from mental or chronic diseases, or from any infectious disease, are not admissible.

XV.

Patients will be expected to obey the rules of the Hospital, and be subject to the control of the Medical Officers and Nurses, or be discharged from the Hospital.

XVI.

The Medical and Surgical Department shall be under the control and superintendence of the Medical Officers, subject to the Bye-laws made by the Board of Management.

XVII.

The Annual General Meeting of Subscribers shall be held before the end of March, and at such meeting the Annual Report shall be read, the Accounts presented, the Board of Management elected for the ensuing year, and any other business transacted.

XVIII.

No alterations shall be made in these Rules except by the votes of two-thirds of the subscribers present at the General Annual Meeting, or at a meeting specially called for the purpose, and then in accordance with Rule IV.
