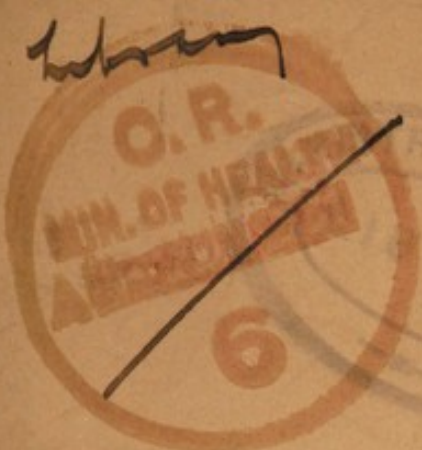

ANNUAL REPORT.

The Executive Committee of the Bognor War Memorial Hospital present herewith their Report and Statement of Accounts for the past year.

The Hospital has suffered a very severe loss by the much lamented death of Dr. S. A. Lane on April 4th.

The service he so generously gave to the suffering poor through the medium of the Hospital cannot be measured by ordinary standards. He was a kindly man and an exceptionally brilliant surgeon and it may truly be said of him that "he gave his life for others."

The Committee also greatly regret Mr. Hilton's resignation as Secretary of the Hospital.

For nine years Mr. Hilton carried out the Administrative and Secretarial work of the Hospital, the organisation of the Annual Fete, Flag Days, and many other annual events for raising funds, and assisted in the operating theatre, acted as radiographer, etc., etc. without fee or reward of any description. When Mr. Hilton disposed of his business the Committee decided to retain his services as Salaried Secretary, and his work has at all times been invaluable. In view of the difficulty in raising the money to carry out the complete Hospital scheme while the present severe depression persists, the Committee have decided that it would be wise to proceed with only a part of the work at the present moment. That part, it may be said, is complete in itself.

Consequent upon this decision Mr. Hilton tendered his resignation, as he was of opinion that his services as whole time Secretary would not be necessary under the modified scheme, and much as the Committee regret losing his wise counsel and indefatigable assistance, they were forced to agree that it would not be in the interest of the Hospital to retain him unless they could make full use of his whole time.

The Committee believe that their own sincere regret at Mr. Hilton's departure from the Town will be shared by all, while his work on behalf of the public has been so unobtrusively done that the full measure of his loss to the community will only be very gradually, if ever, realised.

With regard to the new Hospital the Committee has again very carefully scrutinised the plans with a view to reducing the cost in every way possible, and further consultation with the Architect has resulted in a reduction of £5,055 in the estimated cost of the building. A contract has been entered into with Messrs. Bailey, Hartley and Watton, Ltd., and the work of erecting the first and largest portion of the new Hospital was begun on May 18th of this year.

It must be borne in mind that the work will not be finished with the provision of the building, there will still be a large amount of extra furniture and equipment required, as well as heavier running expenses to be met consequent upon the larger number of beds.

Subscribers are reminded that they elect the Executive Committee at the Annual General Meeting, and that in accordance with the Statutes (No. 4D.) nominations must be sent to the Secretary at least seven days before the Meeting, (see notice herewith).

The Committee gratefully acknowledges the very substantial contribution of £8,310 to the Building Fund raised by the Sussex Commemoration Fund Committee, and of a further sum of £1,300 raised by the Building Industry at the Annual Fete.

The Committee is glad to say that it has been able to secure the services of Major W. I. Rogers as Secretary of the Hospital, and he takes up his duties on June 1st.
