Privileges of Governors and Subscribers.

On the payment of £1,250 a Bed may be dedicated to the memory of any person nominated by the Donor.

Every Governor has the privilege of attending and voting at General Meetings, and of attending Meetings of the Board of Management.

Subscribers can set their subscriptions or donations against the maintenance charges due from patients in whom they are interested and upon notifying the House Governor that, in their opinion, they are suitable for treatment at a Hospital.

In-patients are required to pay a maintenance charge of £3 0s. 0d. a week and Out-patients are required to pay 2/-upon each attendance, unless they are members of a Contributory Scheme which undertakes to pay this.

Form of Bequest to the General Hospital, Birmingham.

Those disposed to contribute to the support of this Charity by Will are requested to do so in the following manner, as from a defect in the form the Hospital may be deprived of the intended bequest.



ANNUAL REPORT

AMALGAMATION WITH THE QUEEN'S HOSPITAL.

The amalgamation of the General and Queen's Hospitals as from January 1st, 1935, was effected by the Birmingham United Hospital Act, 1934, and this is therefore the last Annual Report of the General Hospital as a separate entity.

A final meeting of the Board was held on December 21st, after which the members were entertained to luncheon by the Chairman, Sir Herbert Austin, who spoke of the important developments of the Hospital since its foundation, mentioning the part played in those developments by members present: Sir Gilbert Barling, Ald. J. Hy. Lloyd and Mr. J. C. Vaudrey in the transfer of the Hospital from Summer Lane to Steelhouse Lane; Sir Gilbert Barling, Ald. J. Hy. Lloyd and Mr. J. C. Vaudrey in the extensive alterations made as a result of the John Roderick bequest in 1914 and 1915; the work of Mr. E. P. Beale, Mr. Owen W. Thompson and Dr. Stanley Barnes in connection with the establishment of the Contributory Scheme, the acquisition of St. Mary's site and the promotion of a comprehensive scheme of extension, later changed to the Hospitals Centre Scheme, and the large additions made to the Hospital in 1929 under the Chairmanship of Alderman Miss Bartleet.

On behalf of the Board the Chairman expressed special thanks to Mr. E. P. Beale for the great amount of labour undertaken by him in connection with the amalgamation and voiced the general regret that, owing to his University duties, he is unable to remain a member of the Board. The new joint Board has since unanimously decided to nominate Mr. Beale a Vice-President of the United Hospital.

PERSONAL.

Mr. A. C. Turner has been compelled again to retire from active association with the Hospital on his appointment as Agent of the Bank of England in Liverpool.

With the greatest regret the death in May last of Sir John Sumner, F.S.A., has to be recorded. He was a popular President in the year 1932-1933, and it will be remembered that he was not only a generous benefactor to the Institution but was responsible for the granting of a Coat of Arms to the Hospital.

MEDICAL STAFF.

Dr. A. Douglas Heath retired after 25 years' service from the Office of Honorary Physician to the Skin Department on August 1st, 1934, and an illuminated address has been presented to him on behalf of the Board.

Dr. B. C. Tate has been elected Physician to the Skin Department.

Professor G. Haswell Wilson has been appointed Pathologist to the Maternity Hospital and the General Hospital has undertaken the bio-chemical work in connection with that Hospital. The Board was glad to take advantage of this opportunity of effecting closer cooperation between the Hospitals of the City.

DEEP X-RAYS THERAPY DEPARTMENT.

The Deep X-rays Therapy Department, presented by Sir Herbert Austin and mentioned in the last report, was formally opened on September 21st by the President, Sir Charles Hyde, Bt. It was later examined on behalf of the National Physical Laboratory and both the design of the building and the arrangements generally were warmly approved.

Dr. J. F. Bromley, formerly Radiologist and Medical Officer in charge of the Radium Department of the North Staffordshire Royal Infirmary, Stoke-on-Trent, has been added to the X-rays Staff and will devote the greater part of his time to the new Department; he has given special study to this treatment in London, Stockholm, Hamburg, Frankfort and Paris.

The new apparatus has been in constant use since its installation and, if it should be necessary (as appears probable) to make provision for the treatment of a still larger number of patients the apparatus will be extended, again through the generosity of Sir Herbert Austin.

DIABETIC CLINIC.

The death, owing to a most regrettable accident, of Dr. R. J. Gittins on October 7th is deeply regretted and has been a serious loss to this Department where he had done excellent work and treated such large numbers of patients.

An anonymous donation of £100, received through Dr. A. P. Thomson for the furtherance of this work, is gratefully acknowledged.

DEPARTMENT OF DIETETICS.

Miss E. Richards, who is a qualified Nurse, has been appointed Dietitian to the Hospital and, with the help of the specially equipped Diet Kitchen, the important subject of dietetics is now receiving considerable attention in the work of the Hospital.

BLOOD TRANSFUSION SERVICE.

The calls upon this Service continue to increase and much responsibility is thrown upon the special Committee responsible. On behalf of the large number of patients who have received such great benefit from this Service the Board offers its best thanks to the generous donors who have so readily given their blood and thereby saved many lives.

CONTRIBUTORY ASSOCIATION.

The Association has made further progress during the past year and is heartily to be congratulated upon its uninterrupted success.

The General Hospital has received £42,721, against £40,772 in 1933. This increased grant enabled the Board to undertake the maintenance of the new Department of deep X-rays therapy without curtailing other activities.

The Board gave its approval during the year to the proposed auxiliary Scheme which will enable those whose income is above the limit of members of the existing Association to insure against the cost of serious illness and thus be able to pay both hospital maintenance charges and a fee to the Physician or Surgeon.

The thanks of all connected with the Hospital are offered to the Committee of the Scheme and also to the Hospital Saturday Fund Committee for their large contributions which have enabled the Hospital to continue a full service calculated to give the very best treatment and to provide its cost out of ordinary income.

HOSPITAL SUNDAY FUND.

£1,447 17s. 5d. has been received from this important movement and the opportunity is taken not only of thanking the Council of the Fund for their work on behalf of the Hospitals but also of expressing appreciation of the members of the Medical Staff and others who were good enough to deliver addresses in places of worship on Hospital Sunday.

UNIVERSITY STUDENTS' CARNIVAL.

The Students decided to abandon the Carnival this year but were good enough to organize a special Revue at the Empire from October 22nd to the 27th which met with such financial success that the sum of £218 10s. 5d. was given to this Hospital.

The Carnival Committee have intimated that they hope to revive the Carnival in a modified form in 1935 and this decision will, of course, be very much appreciated by the Hospitals concerned.

ANNUAL HOSPITAL BALL.

The sixth Annual Ball was held on January 26th under the Chairmanship of Alderman R. R. Gelling to whom, together with the members of his Committee, best thanks are again tendered for very valuable work.

PATIENTS' LIBRARY.

With considerable help from the members of Toc H (Moseley Branch) an extensive Library has been arranged for the patients and the circulation of books will commence at an early date.

The idea of a patients' Library was first proposed by the Red Cross Society in London, and furthered by a Committee formed by Mr. H. M. Cashmore, City Librarian, who has been of great help by placing his experience at the disposal of the organizers.

FINANCIAL POSITION.

It will be observed that the financial position of the Hospital has further improved during the past year. While ordinary expenditure continues to be carefully scrutinized the usual contribution from the Contributory Association has been increased to a substantial extent, with the result that it has again been possible to meet ordinary expenditure out of ordinary income and to provide a large proportion of extraordinary expenditure from the same source. The Hospital has also been fortunate in the receipt of substantial legacies so that from this and other exceptional sources it is satisfactory to note that very material sums are available to increase further the reserves of the Hospital.

It is, however, desirable to emphasize that the need for continuous and increasing financial support is still pressing in order that new Departments, for example, for the treatment of cancer, and other improvements making for greater efficiency can be suitably maintained.

EGG COLLECTION.

The result of the Egg Collection at Eastertide was most gratifying, over 80,000 eggs having been brought in. The Board wishes to record its very grateful thanks to the donors, especially the many children's organizations who assisted to bring about this handsome result.

NURSING SCHOOL

1934.

The total number of entrants to the five Preliminary Courses held during the year 1934 was sixty-four. Of these, fifty-five passed from the school to continue their training in hospital, and six candidates with previous training in a special hospital were admitted as secondyear probationers.

The new arrangement of the theoretical course is proving most satisfactory and examination results have exceeded the record for Although few candidates attained exceptionally high many years. marks, the general average appears definitely improved as is shown by the fact that of the thirty entries for the Final State Examination, together with five re-entries from the previous year, twenty-nine were successful and the remaining candidate who failed in one section only, satisfied the Examiners at a subsequent examination.

The nineteen entrants for the Preliminary State Examinations scored ninety-five per cent. successes and two re-entries also satisfied the Examiners. During the year, thirty-six student nurses completed the Hospital course, Miss M. E. Walters and Miss S. Griffiths gaining honours certificates.

An excellent model for practice and demonstration purposes has been purchased, to the cost of which the nurses contributed a sum of £16 and efforts are being made to meet the urgent need for an extension of the School reference library, which is proving quite inadequate for the present requirements.

The Student Nurses Unit of the College of Nursing, among other activities, has steadily continued its work in connection with the management of the Home fiction library and the tuck shop. Representatives have attended meetings in London and, during the year, the nursing staff of this Hospital raised the sum of £100 as its contribution towards the Cowdray Memorial Fund, which sum was presented by Sister E. R. Dyke to Her Majesty the Queen, at the Headquarters of the College of Nursing last May.

An outstanding event in the Nursing Service has been the appointment of Miss E. Richards as Sister Dietitian and the establishment of the Dietetic Department which opened in April. Its work, which has developed with extraordinary rapidity, is not only important on account of the increased efficiency, but as the means of affording experience of exceptional value to a number of student nurses. The attendance of Preliminary Training School Students at the Domestic Science Department, The Central Technical College, for a course in invalid cookery is proving a great advantage and will in future enable nurses in their senior year to undertake a more thorough study of dietetics.

A course for Student Housekeepers has been established, and final arrangements made for lectures covering the required syllabus for the examination for the Diploma of the Society of Radiographers.

A number of students taking the International Course for Nurse Administrators have spent short periods at the Hospital and post-graduate experience has been afforded to a German Nurse and three Icelandic nurses, the Government of Iceland expressed its appreciation of the assistance given by the Hospital towards the increased efficiency of its nursing service.

The year has seen many changes in the Nursing Staff. Miss L. M. Stokes has been promoted to the post of Assistant Matron upon Miss P. M. Lodge's appointment as Matron of St. Chad's Hospital. Deep regret was experienced on her resignation and on the retirement of Sister Pearson and Sister Staley after so many years' service in the Hospital.

In November the remaining students in the School of Massage and Medical Electricity were successful in their examinations and temporarily the school is closed.

ALMONER'S REPORT, 1934.

The Almoner's report might well be headed "The Tale of Common Things," for in dealing with people who are sick many factors have to be taken into consideration that might be ignored or, almost unconsciously, accepted, in normal times but which in times of sickness are apt to become problems. It is the individual in relation to his social environment at home or at work, that constitutes the particular problem of the Almoner. The ill-health of any member of the family has the immediate effect of disturbing the normal balance of family affairs. Whether it be the wage-earner who is sick—thereby causing financial difficulties—or the child, whose illness claims too much of the family purse or time,—or the Mother upon whom the family relies for domestic comfort.

The object of the Hospital Social Service is to discover and treat the social factors affecting the patient's illness and his ability to respond to medical treatment. The nature of the work varies little from year to year—convalescent treatment has been arranged; surgical instruments supplied; patients sent to sanatoria and nursing homes for permanent and advanced cases; district nurses have been sent to the homes; journeys arranged and paid for; extra nourishment given; books and clothing supplied; plans discussed and advice given on many subjects.

The Almoner's department is fortunate in its friends; financial help has been received from the Hospital Saturday Fund, the Hospitals' Contributory Association, Public Assistance Committee, Blue Coat School, United Charities Fund, Approved Societies, Insurance Committee, Firms, and privately for individual cases. Help and advice has also been received from the Public Health Department, Education Committee, Estates Department, etc.

Two Ladies kindly give help in taking patients by car to and from Hospital and Convalescent Homes. These are friends acquired this year and their kindness is very much appreciated.

Groups of students and others continue to give help in home visiting and are useful in following up patients for the Diabetic and Radium Departments, also in reporting on home conditions, etc.

The Samaritan Guild continues to meet regularly, and by means of entertainments, etc. has raised a sum of £62 14s. 2d. during the year which has been paid to the Samaritan Fund.

Thanks are due to all who in many and various ways have helped the Social Service Department during the year, and by their courtesy, interest and practical sympathy have made it possible to carry on, and extend the work, and have added so much to the value and pleasure of it.

FORTY-NINTH ANNUAL REPORT.

The Committee have pleasure in presenting their Report for the

year 1934.

Income from all sources (apart from grants from the Contributory Association) amounts to £2,701 14s. 9d. This includes £950 8s. 1d. being one-half of Lagacies received from the Estates of G. D. Swiffen,

deceased, and James Davenport, deceased.

Expenditure amounted to £5,613 0s. 10d. as compared with £5,080 11s. 10d. for 1933, leaving £2,911 6s. 1d. as usual to be charged to the General Hospital. The increase here is consequent mainly upon the expenditure on extensive painting, improvement work inside the building, and relaying of outside drains.

The Committee much appreciate the usefulness of Mr. G. D. Swiffen's and Mr. J. Davenport's benefactions. They have made it possible to undertake painting work and improvements which were long

overdue.

556 patients were treated, 89, more than last year. Many of the cases were of more acute form than in 1933.

The average number of beds occupied daily was 57.7, the total number of beds being 63.

Eleven beds in the Hospital have been dedicated at a cost of £1,250 each; the Committee commend this as a suitable means of perpetuating the memory of relatives or friends whilst it affords valuable permanent support to the funds of the Hospital. Each bed bears a tablet recording the dedication, as follows:-

Consideration has been given to improving the sanitary arrangements in the Nurses' Quarters. An additional bath, three wash basins, and an additional W.C. have been provided. Re-arrangement of the rooms has made it possible to concentrate the Nurses' quarters in one

part of the building.

A great improvement has been effected in two of the Ward annexes by re-making the flooring of the passages leading thereto with composition material, making cleaning more easily possible, at the same time freeing the floor from joints and cracks which are likely to harbour harmful material. Arrangements have been made to treat the remaining two Wards similarly.

The main Kitchen has been further improved by the addition of two gas-heated boilers for vegetables. The tiled flooring has been partly relaid and the whole Kitchen has been repainted and enamelled. The main corridors also have been repainted and decorated. The Hospital presents a more pleasing impression with its brighter colour scheme than it did formerly.

CHRISTMAS.

The President, Mrs. Albert Cay, was unable to visit the Hospital at Christmastime, but, sent a message of greeting and good wishes to all in the Hospital. Mrs. Cay also sent, as she has done for many

years, a cash gift for every patient in the Hospital.

On Christmas morning the Chairman, Mr. John Levick, accompanied by Mrs. Levick, Colonel Howard Wilkinson, and Members of the Staff, visited the Hospital and distributed gifts of chocolates and cigarettes to the Patients and Resident Staff. This kindly thought and generosity on the part of the President and Chairman was much appreciated by both Patients and Staff, and added considerably to the joys of the Festive Season.

LAUNDRY

The amount of work passing through the Laundry has increased considerably during the year. The weekly number of articles at present is about 24,100, an increase of 1,100 a week. The cost of carrying out this work shows a slight reduction compared with last year, of 1/4 per thousand articles. The average cost of each article for the year was .778 of a penny, or approximately \(\frac{3}{4}\)d. (see statement page 44).

The Laundry is still under the able management of Mr. P. Crocker, and with the loyal assistance of Mrs. Cook is working very satisfactorily.
