RULES.

- Name. I.—That this Institution, founded in 1877 as the Berkeley Cottage Hospital, be in future called the Berkeley Hospital.
- Object. II.—That the object of the Hospital be for the reception and assistance of the poor, and other persons when suffering from sickness or accident, by providing free medical and surgical treatment.
- Advantages to Subscribers, etc. III.—That every annual subscriber of one guinea shall be entitled to a ticket of recommendation admitting a patient for four weeks, and that all clergy and ministers of religion making collections of two guineas in their respective Churches and Chapels shall be allowed the same privilege.
- Admission in the case of Sickness. IV.—That candidates for admission must be provided with a ticket (except in cases of accident, which will be received immediately on application).
- In cases of Accident. V.—That all cases of emergency and accident or patients requiring operation, shall be freely admitted without recommendation subject to the approval of the Medical Attendant.
- Times of Visiting. VI.—That patients may be visited by their friends between the hours of 2 and 4 o'clock p.m. on Sunday and Wednesday in each week and that all patients may be visited by their own minister of religion.
- General Committee. VII.—That the General Committee consist of the President, Lady President, Vice-Presidents, Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Medical Officers, Hon. Treasurer, Hon. Secretary, and of not more than twenty-four others, elected annually at the General Meeting. No ordinary member of the Committee shall be eligible for re-election unless he or she shall have attended at least one quarterly meeting of the Committee during the previous year.
- Committee of Management. VIII.—That the supervision of the Hospital be entrusted to a Committee of Management consisting of five members of the Committee and the Medical Officers and Hon. Secretary "ex-officio."
- Annual Meeting, etc. IX.—That the annual meeting be held as soon after the termination of the financial year as possible, and quarterly meetings of the Committee on the second Monday in March, June, September, December, and that an official report from the Committee be submitted to the annual meeting.

Report of the Medical Officers.

TO THE COMMITTEE OF THE BERKELEY HOSPITAL.

Our Lord and Lady Presidents, Vice-Presidents,
Ladies and Gentlemen,—

DURING the year 1936, there was admitted to your Hospital, a total number of 221 Patients: this was a considerable increase from the previous year.

Sixty of these were under Gloucestershire County Council Medical Authority, and, as previously, were mostly for Tonsil and Adenoid operations.

There were 11 Maternities. Surgical cases numbered 75, and the remainder were mostly Medical. A few were admitted for observation and investigation. Your Maternity and Private Wards have been well occupied during the year, and they have proved satisfactory to those Patients who used them.

The Electrical and X-Ray department has been busy, and there were 157 X-Ray examinations made. Electrical treatments given were 1,133.

Your Matron, Miss Whitehead, and her Staff, have given thoroughly efficient service, and have done all in their power for the welfare of the Patients and your Hospital. We take this opportunity of thanking them for all the assistance they have given to us Medical Officers.

We again thank you for your confidence in our services.

Report of Committee for 1936

YOUR Committee have pleasure in reporting that the income for the year has been sufficient to meet all expenditure and leave a balance in hand of £291 18s. 4d.

The unusually large balance in hand is accounted for by the very large increase in income from the Paying Wards, Maternity Ward, and Electrical Treatments. The total income on these accounts being £415 6s. 0d., against £175 17s. 6d. received last year, an increase of £239 8s. 6d., which practically accounts for the larger balance in hand. The Paying Wards are becoming much more generally known and appreciated in the district, but your Committee cannot anticipate that the average income from them will be nearly so great as that received this year.

Annual subscriptions at £267 7s. 10d. show a small but satisfactory increase of £15 6s. on the previous year. The Committee would express their gratitude for the favourable response accorded their appeal in the last annual report.

Donations, the mainstay of the Hospital, amounting to £668 3s. 5d. have been received, £14 0s. 3d. more than last year.

Your Committee would again express their thanks to all who have in any way contributed to this amount, making special mention of the Carnival Committee and their supporters for £147 11s. 7d.; Berkeley Harvest Show, £77; Tournament Whist Drives, £83 6s. 11d.; Berkeley Hospital Cup, £48 5s. 2d.; Berkeley Church Parade, £28 16s. 11d.; Berkeley Hunt Committee, £15; Thornbury Rugby Match, £14; Mrs. Peter's Jumble Sale, £13 4s.; Dursley Amateur Dramatic Society, £13 1s. 4d.; and Berkeley Parish Church Harvest Festival Collections, £11 0s. 10d.

Thanks are due to the Linen League for many articles which help so much to keep down the expenditure. Mrs. Clark, who founded the League and who has been Honorary Secretary since its inception, has, owing to ill-health, found it necessary to resign. Your Committee would tender to Mrs. Clark their sympathy with her in her illness, and at the same time place on record their thanks for her great interest in the Hospital. Mrs. Browning and Mrs. Peter have undertaken the Secretaryship of the League in succession to Mrs. Clark.

Thanks are due to the donors of fruit and vegetables, which are at all times most acceptable.

A legacy of £100 has been received from the estate of Mrs. S. Robinson, to which no special conditions were attached. Your Committee have therefore used it to reduce the loan on the New Building.

The Tournament Whist Drives organized by Mrs. Browning's Committee proved a great success. The proceeds amounted to £128 11s., and of this amount £45 4s. 11d. was paid to the Building Fund account. This enabled the loan from the Stroud Mutual Society to be paid off. The Committee congratulate the district on now having an up-to-date Hospital entirely free from debt.

The annual Hospital Ball at Dursley, organized by Mrs. F. Lister and her Ladies' Committee was again a great success, resulting in a profit of £93 which has been placed to the Building Fund account. This has been done in view of the fact that additional sanitary arrangements are required to complete the new building at an estimated cost of about £250. The receipts for the six Balls amounted to £572 10s.

£100 War Loan Stock has been transferred to the Official Trustees of the Charity Commission by Mr. and Mrs. J. A. Peter in memory of their daughter Diana.

The Committee would tender their sincere thanks to the Honorary Medical Officers and Nursing and Domestic Staffs for the efficient running of the Hospital during the past year, and they would congratulate Miss Whitehead on her careful and efficient management of the Household expenses, which, notwithstanding the large amount of extra work done, show a small reduction from last year.

In conclusion your Committee would thank all Donors, Subscribers and friends of the Hospital for their continued interest and support during the past year, and appeal for a continuance of that kindly help so generously given in the past.
