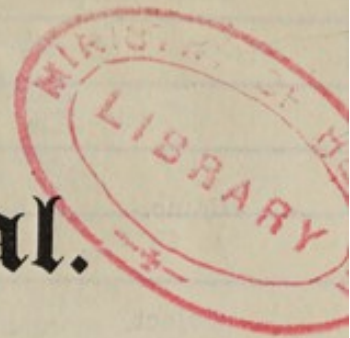

RULES.

Object.

I.—That this Institution, founded in 1877 as the Berkeley Cottage Hospital, be in future called the Berkeley Hospital.

II.—That the object of the Hospital be for the reception and assistance of the poor, and other persons when suffering from sickness or accident, by providing free medical and surgical treatment.

Advantages to
Subscribers,
etc.

III.—That every annual subscriber of one guinea shall be entitled to a ticket of recommendation admitting a patient for four weeks, and that all clergy and ministers of religion making collections of two guineas in their respective Churches and Chapels shall be allowed the same privilege.

Admission in
the case of
Sickness.

IV.—That candidates for admission must be provided with a ticket (except in cases of accident, which will be received immediately on application).

In cases of
Accident.

V.—That all cases of emergency and accident or patients requiring operation, shall be freely admitted without recommendation subject to the approval of the Medical Attendant.

Times of
Visiting.

VI.—That patients may be visited by their friends between the hours of 2 and 4 o'clock p.m. on Sunday and Wednesday in each week and that all patients may be visited by their own minister of religion.

General
Committee.

VII.—That the General Committee consist of the President, Lady President, Vice-Presidents, Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Medical Officers, Hon. Treasurer, Hon. Secretary, and of not more than twenty-four others, elected annually at the General Meeting. No ordinary member of the Committee shall be eligible for re-election unless he or she shall have attended at least one quarterly meeting of the Committee during the previous year.

Committee of
Management.

VIII.—That the supervision of the Hospital be entrusted to a Committee of Management consisting of five members of the Committee and the Medical Officers and Hon. Secretary "ex-officio."

Annual
Meeting, etc.

IX.—That the annual meeting be held as soon after the termination of the financial year as possible, and quarterly meetings of the Committee on the second Monday in March, June, September, December, and that an official report from the Committee be submitted to the annual meeting.

Report of the Medical Officers.

TO THE COMMITTEE OF THE BERKELEY HOSPITAL.

Our Lord and Lady Presidents, Vice-Presidents, Ladies and Gentlemen,

DURING 1937 your Hospital had 189 in-patients, 51 of these being for tonsil and adenoid operations under the auspices of the Gloucestershire County Council. There were 14 maternity patients.

In the X-Ray department 147 patients had X-Rays for diagnostic purposes, and 956 had one or more forms of electrical treatment, mostly for rheumatic and nerve affections. Your X-Ray installation has been overhauled and now has been brought thoroughly up-to-date by a new outfit.

In the majority of both in-patients and out-patients the various treatments provided either cured or alleviated their conditions.

The County Council out-patient school children clinics have increased, as regards the numbers attending them.

Your maternity and private wards have been kept fairly well occupied during the year.

Thanks are due to your Matron and her staff, both nursing and domestic, for their steady and painstaking efforts to promote the welfare and comfort of the patients.

As on a former occasion we draw attention to the advisability of additional lavatory accommodation for the male ward. We take the liberty of again doing so, and hope that funds will now permit this addition to be made.

We thank you for your confidence in our services, and hope to be allowed to continue with them for another year.

Report of Committee for 1937

YOUR Committee have pleasure in reporting a successful year's working of the Hospital, and that the income has been sufficient to meet all expenditure and leave a balance in hand of £181 1s. 1d., after providing £166 14s. 0d. towards the cost of the new X-Ray plant.

Annual subscriptions at £265 13s. 4d. fall just short of last year's record and your Committee again appeal for more Annual Subscribers.

Donations amounting to £612 2s. 11d. have been received, £56 less than last year. Your Committee would again express their thanks to all who have contributed in any way to this amount, and would particularly mention the Carnival Committee

£134 18s. 6d., Berkeley Harvest Show £65 12s. 9d., Smith's Charity £50, Berkeley Hospital Cup Committee £49 12s. 2d., Berkeley Church Parade and Berkeley Hunt Show Collections £34 3s. 3d., Mrs. Peter's Jumble Sale £16 11s. 6d., Berkeley Hunt Committee £15, Thornbury Traders' Association, proceeds of football match, £14 0s. 0d.

The outstanding event of last year has been the replacement of the X-Ray Plant by an up-to-date installation at a cost of £455 13s. 0d. Your Committee feel that the excellent work done by the electric department warrants their doing everything possible to keep the plant abreast of the times. They therefore decided to use the balance of the Building Fund, which had been augmented by some very generous donations for this purpose, to the amount of £289, and to complete the purchase from the balance brought forward on the general account from last year.

Thanks are due to the Linen League for their continued care of the Hospital's wants for bed and household linen. The Committee also wish to thank Mrs. Robert Lister for the very generous gift of an Instrument Trolley for the Maternity Ward, and a Bed-Table, which has been very much appreciated by the patients.

Grateful thanks are also due to the donors of fruit and vegetables, which are always most acceptable.

The Hospital Ball at Dursley was again very successful and has resulted in the sum of £90 being placed to the credit of the Building Fund. The Committee tender to Mrs. F. H. Lister and her Committee sincere thanks for their work in connection with the Ball, and trust it may continue to prosper as it has done during the past seven years.

The late Mr. A. H. Garton left a legacy of £350 to the Hospital, less legacy duty, and this sum, £315, has been received and handed over to the Charity Commission for investment in 3½% War Loan, the amount purchased being £313 4s. 1d.

The Committee would tender their sincere thanks to the Honorary Medical Officers and Nursing and Domestic Staffs for the efficient running of the Hospital during the past year, and they would congratulate Miss Whitehead on her careful and efficient management of the household expenses.

In conclusion your Committee would thank all Donors, Subscribers and friends of the Hospital for their continued interest and support during the past year, and appeal for a continuance of that kindly help so generously given in the past.
