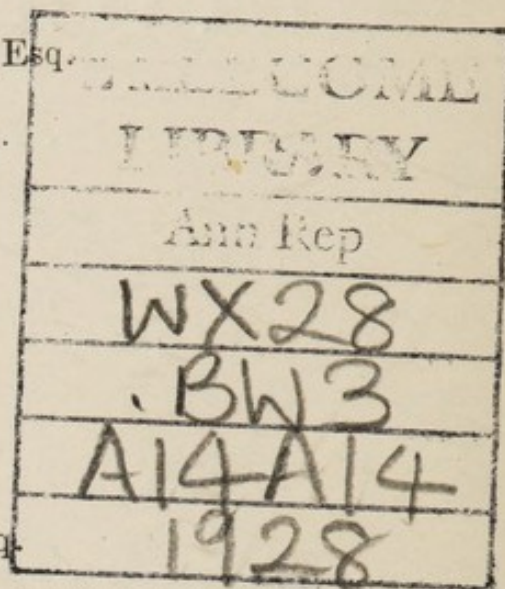

Extract from the Rules of the Infirmary.

All Subscribers shall pay their subscription in advance to the Bankers or Secretary for the time being, and all yearly subscriptions shall date from the 1st January preceding the time of subscribing. Tickets will not be issued to subscribers until their subscriptions are paid.

In-patients are admitted to the Infirmary by ticket on the recommendation of a Subscriber. In addition to a ticket in-patients or their friends must be prepared to pay in advance a fee of not less than £1 ls. per week towards their maintenance (in the case of those unable to pay, this fee, or part of this fee is remitted). Accident or urgent cases are admitted without any recommendation from a Subscriber the ticket and fee to be supplied later.

The right of recommendation vested in Governors shall be according to the subjoined scale with regard to all Patients resident within the County:

Annual Subscriber of 10s. 6d. may recommend two out-patients for two weeks; Annual Subscriber of £1 ls. may recommend one in-patient or four out-patients for two weeks, and so on in the same proportion. Subscribers to have the option of taking four out-door tickets instead of one in-door ticket, or vice-versa.

The following cases shall not be eligible for admission as In-patients:—Pregnant women, children under six years of age (except in case of fracture or where it may be necessary to perform a surgical operation), persons of unsound mind, and those suffering from infectious diseases and incurables.

No persons are admitted, except as Paying Patients, who are able to procure medical advice for themselves, nor shall any be received as In-patients whose cases will allow of equal relief as Out-patients.

In-patients are required to bring with them a proper change of linen, a comb, and a pair of slippers.

On the recommendation of one of the Honorary Medical Officers, and with the consent of the House Committee, persons may be admitted to the Infirmary as Private Patients. The fee (payable in advance) to the Infirmary for such patients shall be from £4 4s. a week in Private

Wards and 2½ guineas per week in Public Wards, as determined by the House Committee. The professional fees of the Honorary Medical Officers are distinct from any charges made by the Infirmary.

Subscribers recommending as In-patients a person residing at a distance are required to send a written statement of the Patient's case by his Medical Attendant.

Out-patients are treated at the Infirmary every day (Thursdays and Sundays excepted) from 11 to 1 p.m. for two weeks, on presentation of an Out-Door Ticket.

No Patient shall be continued on the Register longer than 2 weeks without a fresh letter of recommendation.

All Subscribers of Five Guineas and Donors of Twenty-five Pounds and upwards shall be Vice-Presidents.

An Annual Subscription of Half-a-guinea constitutes a Governor, for a donation of Ten Guineas at one payment a Governor for life; the Trustees of "The Joseph and Jane Downie Bequest" being Governors.

Places of Worship, Public Bodies, Associations, Clubs, etc., subscribing in the aggregate from One to Two Guineas, shall have the power to nominate one Governor; to the amount of Five Guineas, two Governors; to the amount of Ten Guineas, three Governors; above that sum, one Governor for every additional Ten Guineas.

Any body of employees subscribing annually not less than Five Guineas may nominate Governors according to the following Scale:—

The Annual General Meeting of the Governors shall be convened for the second Friday in February in each year.

The House Committee meets every Friday, at 3 p.m. The Committee of Management meets on the first Thursday in every month, at 11 a.m.

Any Subscriber may have a Copy of the Rules on application to the Secretary.

NOTE.—Subscribers are earnestly requested to grant Infirmary Tickets only to those Patients whom they are assured are proper and deserving objects of Charity.

ANNUAL MEETING.

Encouraging reports and interesting statistics were given at the Annual Meeting of Subscribers and Governors of Aberystwyth Infirmary and Cardiganshire General Hospital, at the Town Hall, on Friday, February 8th, when Col. G. Fossett Roberts, chairman of the Committee of Management, presided over a good attendance.

Before proceeding with the business, the Chairman mentioned that since the previous meeting the Committee of Management had lost one of its members through death—Alderman C. M. Williams, who had been an in-patient at the Infirmary.—It was decided to record the Governors' regret.

The President (Dr. Edward Roberts, Aberllofwyn), wrote regretting inability to be present and paid eloquent tribute to the splendid work done at the Infirmary. Letters apologising for absence were also read from the

Mayor of Aberystwyth (Councillor T. H. Edwards); Col. Fitzwilliams, Mr. Tregonning, Ystrad Meurig; Mr. S. D. Evans, manager of N.P. Bank, Aberystwyth; and Mrs. A. Griffith, Aberystwyth. Mr. D. R. Williams, Llanbadarn, wrote that the members of Saron C.M. Chapel had appointed their Pastor (the Rev. Robert Ellis) as their representative.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT.

As honorary auditor, Mr. R. H. Thomas presented the annual report, and balance sheet. He complimented the Secretary (Miss Myfanwy Jones) on the way she performed her duties and added that he was struck with the efficient manner in which the accounts were kept.

Mr. D. C. Roberts, moving the adoption of the balance sheet, thought they had every reason to be very pleased. They started the year with a balance in hand of £50, and finished with a balance of £141. The receipts had increased by about £700, but their expenditure was also increasing from year to year. The annual subscriptions had now reached £599—an increase of over £100 on the previous year. There were still many in the town of Aberystwyth who ought to become annual subscribers. He was glad to see an increase of from £20 to £30 in the workers' contributions last year. The payments by patients in public and private wards had increased over £200, and for this they were greatly indebted to the Secretary, who had to do the difficult and delicate task. They were giving free service to those who were not able to pay, but they expected those who were in a position to do so to pay for their keep while at the institution. Payments by patients last year amounted to over £1,300. There was an increase in church collections of £40, and he thought there was plenty of room for a further increase. It was easy to account for the increase in expenditure. Although fewer were admitted than in the previous year, there was a striking increase in the number of days they were in the Infirmary—9,361 days compared with 7,809 in 1927.

Archdeacon D. Williams, in seconding, said it cost £84 per week to keep the Infirmary going.

The balance sheet was adopted.

THE YEAR'S WORK.

The Chairman spoke of the hard work that had been done at the Infirmary from the beginning of the year to the end. Throughout the year and up to that day the hospital had been practically full. That had entailed an enormous amount of work on the honorary staff, the house surgeon, matron and nurses. During the year they had a change of house surgeon. They lost Dr. Glyn Evans and appointed Dr. M. J. Evans in his place, and he was doing very good work. They also lost the matron—Miss Humphreys—who had been there for some years and carried out her work efficiently. The previous day he received from her a cheque for £1 1s. towards the fund. In her place they appointed Miss Hannah Evans. During the year they installed a new apparatus for administering anaesthetics. Among the gifts received were eggs from the Women's Institutes at Rhydypennau and Taliesin and St. David's Church, Talybont. The work of the Linen Guild had relieved them of the responsibility of providing linen of all kinds for the patients and staff. The number of in-patients treated last year was 400, compared with 412 in 1927. There was a decrease of 13 from Aberystwyth and the immediate neighbourhood, a decrease of one from the country districts, and an increase of two from outside the county. One reason for the increase in the number of patients from outside was that road accidents were, unfortunately, frequent. They admitted 17 as a result of motor accidents, and some of them were kept in the hospital for a long time—one for nearly six months. These paid £107 12s. 6d. Of a total of 400 patients, 142 were treated without payment. Four years ago the number of operations performed was 165. Last year it was 360. The year had not been a very fruitful one as far as donations and legacies were concerned. They received £42 15s. 2d. under the will of Elinor Evans, Llangybi; £20 from the Aberystwyth branch of

the British Legion; £45 under the will of Walter Williams, Lampeter; £50 from Mr. R. J. R. Loxdale, and £5 from Mr. D. J. Evans, Great Darkgate Street. Colonel Roberts referred to the special efforts made in the town and country district to raise money towards the Infirmary, and said that without these they would be down by about £1,000.

THE PRESIDENT.

The Rev. T. E. Roberts, moving the re-election of Dr. Edward Roberts as president, spoke of his past services and of the keen interest he still took in the Infirmary.

Mr. E. E. Ellis seconded, and the motion was carried unanimously.

The following were re-elected on the Committee of Management:—Mr. E. E. Ellis, Mr. R. Y. Bickerstaff, Major Mathias, Rev. J. D. Evans, Col. B. Taylor Lloyd, and Mrs. T. Humphrey Edwards. In the place of the Rev. T. E. Roberts, who is now a permanent member as trustee of Downies' Bequest, Mrs. Bonsall, Fronfraith, was elected.

Mr. R. H. Thomas, Midland Bank, was elected auditor, and on the motion of the Chairman a vote of thanks was passed to Mr. Arthur Jones, who had audited the accounts for many years.

THE HONORARY STAFF.

Dr. Abraham Thomas proposed a vote of thanks to the honorary staff. Speaking of the services rendered he said operations were performed very often from 8 o'clock in the morning until 2 or 3 o'clock in the afternoon. It was nothing uncommon for the doctors to do 20 hours' work in 24. They were sorry that Dr. Burrell and Dr. Lloyd were laid aside. The previous day Dr.

Emyr Owen-Lloyd was appointed on the staff, and started work that morning, assisting Dr. Ellis. He wished him every success.—The Rev. J. D. Evans seconded, and Dr. John Morgan, late of Pontrhydygroes, supported the motion, which was carried.

Dr. Ellis responded on behalf of the honorary staff, and extended a welcome to Dr. Emyr Owen-Lloyd.

The meeting confirmed the appointment of Dr. Owen-Lloyd to the honorary medical staff, and the appointment of Dr. Wynne Parry as ophthalmic surgeon.

It was decided that the Annual Meeting be held at the hour of 2.30 p.m. in future, instead of in the morning.

The Chairman was thanked on the motion of the Rev. J. D. Evans.
