REPORT of the COMMITTEE of MANAGEMENT for the Year ending 31st December, 1929.

THE number of Patients admitted to the Hospital during the year was 258, of which number 119 were children.

The number of admissions was less than in 1928, the reason being that several bad accidents to local people occasioned the occupation of beds for long periods.

The average number of days' stay of each patient was 15.786 days, an increase of 4½ days on 1928.

There were 40 major and 120 minor operations performed in the theatre.

The X-Ray department dealt with 260 ordinary cases and 34 dental cases, and 660 films were used.

The massage department dealt with 90 patients, and the number of treatments given was 1518.

As in former years, the arrangements made with the Education Committee of the Essex County Council were carried out in respect of treatment for tonsils and adenoids, and a large number of children were admitted during the year.

In April, 1929, a letter was received signed by the Medical Officers of the Hospital urging, for consideration by the Committee, a substantial increase in the Hospital accommodation to deal with the increasing needs of Brentwood and District.

Since that date the matter has been carefully gone into by the Committee and is still under discussion. Various schemes for the enlargement of the Hospital have been investigated in consultation with the Hon. Architect. The difficulties of dealing with such a small ground site available for building are considerable, but it is hoped that a way may be found to provide adequate accommodation at any rate for the next few years.

Note.—The Expenditure on the Site, Buildings, Furniture, and Appliances of the Hospital prior to the 3rd September, 1912, is not included in this Balance Sheet.

I have examined the foregoing Balance Sheet and Income and Expenditure Account with the Books and Vouchers and verified the correctness of the Cash at Bank and in hand, and had certificates for the Investments produced to me. The Investments of £550 London Electric Railway £4 0/- Debenture Stock and £34 8s. 9d. £5 0/- War Stock, 1929/47, for the specific Endowment of the "Quennell Memorial Children's Ward," remain in the names of the Trustees of that Fund. Subject to these observations, I beg to report that in my opinion the Balance Sheet is properly drawn up so as to show a true account of the financial condition of the Hospital at the date of the Balance Sheet, as shewn by the Books and information supplied to me.

Notes.

Gifts and Bequests.—It is particularly requested that any person who desires to present, or to bequeath, money for the benefit of the Hospital, should indicate to which fund the amount should be placed, *i.e.*,

- (a) The Endowment Fund.
- (b) The General Purposes Fund.

Guarantors.—Residents in Brentwood and District are invited to become Annual Subscribers and/or Guarantors.

X-Ray Examinations.—The Hospital is equipped with a first-class X-Ray Apparatus. The Radiographer attends on the Friday of each week, but in exceptional cases appointments may be made for other days. Appointments should be made with the Matron, from whom particulars of charges (which must be prepaid) may be obtained.

Private Patients.—There are two Private Wards in the Hospital and private patients are received when accommodation is available.
