THE SIXTY-SECOND ANNUAL REPORT  
OF THE COMMITTEE OF THE BRIDPORT HOSPITAL  
FOR THE YEAR 1928.

---

THE past year has produced changes which will probably be far-reaching in the future history and activities of the Hospital.

The first event of major importance was the resignation in March of Miss Sophia Morris who had occupied the post of Matron for twenty-one years. Her good work for the Institution we much appreciate.

Miss Lizzie Winterbottom, whose services as Matron we were so fortunate as to procure, has already shown us that our patients are in the best possible care. It is interesting to note that 140 inpatients have received treatment since the 1st July, which shows an extraordinary increase.

We received the resignation of Doctors A. G. A. Thomson and J. H. Armistead with much regret. Doctor Thomson has been on our Medical Staff for many years. Doctor Armistead has always shown a great interest in the management, which we appreciate.

We should like to say how very glad we are to welcome Doctors G. Oliphant, Allan Pimm and J. C. T. Sanctuary. We are grateful to them for lecturing to the Nursing Staff and arranging to attend to out-patients on genito urinary and ear, nose and throat cases.

The Mayor's decision not to hold a Carnival in aid of the Hospital funds this year did not come altogether as a surprise to those who have followed the trend of events during recent years. In fact the proposal was seriously put forward in 1927 that such a step should be taken, and Mr. A. R. Travers' resolve to make a house to house collection in the Borough and district covered by the Hospital was very favourably received. The collection produced the very satisfactory sum of £157 9s. 4d., of which the Hospital Committee received £133 13s. 8d.

In addition we received £49 11s. 1d. in respect of Alexandra Rose Day.

We should like to place on record our sincere appreciation of Mr. Travers' good work on behalf of our Institution. The time and energy expended by him has, we well know, been very considerable, and we are glad that the results of his efforts have been so satisfactory.

During the past months the inauguration of a contributory scheme was inquired into, and we wish to thank all those who gave so much of their valuable time to this end. We feel sure that when it is put into operation its effects will be of very material benefit to the neighbourhood and Hospital finances, and would like to record our appreciation of the assistance the Medical Officers have offered. We hope to see the scheme in being at an early date.

A Linen Guild has been formed and we thank those ladies who are instrumental in the carrying on of this important department.

We hope to augment our funds by the collection of "silver" paper, and local school children have been asked to co-operate in this. Colonel T. A. Colfox very kindly offered to increase the Capital sum of the Miss Lee's Charity by £1,000 and his generosity will make a substantial addition to our standing income.

We offer our warmest thanks to those members of the Committee who retire this year, and look forward to their interest in our future progress.

Lastly we wish to thank all members of the Hospital Staff and the Medical Officers for their help and goodwill during the year, and particularly during the past few months, when there has been an extraordinary pressure of work.

## RULES.

1. This Charity shall be called the Bridport Hospital.

2. It shall be supported by voluntary contributions and by funds derivable from Mrs. Lee's Endowment, the Trustees of which shall have the power to withdraw the same at the end of any year by giving the General Committee 6 months' Notice—or immediately on the abrogation of Rule 22.

### COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

3. The affairs of the Hospital (except such as are subject to Meetings of Governors) shall be under the direction of a Committee (herein called the "General Committee"); consisting of a President, Treasurer, Secretary, Medical Officers, Surgeon Dentists, the Trustees of Mr. Thomas Hanham's Charity, who are ipso facto Trustees of the Hospital, the Trustees of Mrs. Lee's Endowment (so long as the funds from that Endowment shall be contributed to the support of the Hospital), the Mayor of Bridport for the time being, and by 12 Governors to be chosen at the Annual Meeting of Governors.

4. The President, Treasurer and Secretary shall hold office, until the Annual Meeting of Governors next following the date of their election. They shall be eligible for re-election.

5. Of the 12 elected members of the General Committee three shall retire by rotation each year at the Annual Meeting of Governors and shall not be eligible for re-election for the period of one year.

6. Any vacancy occurring on the General Committee by death, retirement or otherwise, between one Annual Meeting and the next, may be filled by the General Committee, but any person so chosen, shall, (subject to confirmation at the next Annual Meeting of Governors) retain his or her office so long as the deceased or retiring Member would have retained the same if the vacancy had not occurred.

7. The General Committee shall meet once in every quarter.

8. At each meeting of the General Committee, four shall form a quorum, and in the absence of the President, a Chairman shall be appointed by the Members present.

9. The General Committee shall have power to make and enforce regulations for the good government of the Hospital, provided they are not inconsistent with these rules.

10. The Secretary shall summon a Special Meeting of the General Committee if requested to do so in writing by any four members.

11. The General Committee shall annually appoint six of their members to act, together with the President, Treasurer and Secretary, as a House Committee, who shall meet monthly. Three shall form a quorum. Their duties shall consist in the

general inspection and supervision of the Hospital, and the ordering of the necessary supplies. They shall order such repairs and articles as are absolutely necessary, and submit a report to the General Committee at their next Quarterly Meeting.

#### GOVERNORS AND SUBSCRIBERS.

12. A Donor of £10 and upwards shall be a life Governor and a Subscriber of £1 and upwards an Annual Governor, during the continuance of his subscription. Subscribers who have not paid a subscription of the requisite amount for the Hospital year immediately preceding the holding of the Annual Meeting of Governors, shall not be entitled to vote as Governors.

13. An Annual Meeting of Governors shall be held in the month of January in each year, at which not less than eight Governors entitled to vote at that Meeting shall form a quorum, for the purpose of receiving Report and Statement of Accounts from the General Committee, electing Officers and Members of Committee, making any alteration in the Rules that may seem advisable and for general business. The General Committee shall have power to summon a Special Meeting of Governors at any time should occasion arise; and shall do so at any time on the requisition of six Governors.

14. No new rule shall be adopted, or old rule altered, save at an Annual Meeting of Governors; and notice shall be sent by the Secretary to each Governor, as far as practicable of such proposition, at least a week before the meeting.

15. A contribution of £3 or upwards made by any Religious Community, Body of Trustees, Corporation, Public Company, Friendly Society or Firm entitles such body to nominate, in writing, a person to act as "Annual Governor" on their behalf. A contribution of £30 or upwards entitles any such body to nominate a "Life Governor." Such Annual or Life Governors shall have all the rights and privileges of Governors as laid down by these Rules.

16. A Life Governor shall for every £10 and an Annual Governor for every £1 during a year for which he has paid his subscription, be entitled to recommend annually one Patient to the Hospital, and two to the Out-Patients' Department, or five Patients to the Out-Patients' Department, and may be allowed to exchange three tickets for the latter for one Hospital ticket.

17. A Subscriber of 5/- shall be entitled to recommend one patient; a Subscriber of 10/- two patients; and a Subscriber of 15/- three patients annually to the Out-Patients' Department, during a year for which he has paid his Subscription.

18. The Minister of any Church or Chapel and any Society making a collection on behalf of the Hospital shall be entitled to Hospital and/or Dispensary Tickets on the same scale as Governors or Subscribers (see Rules 16 and 17.)

19. The Recommendations shall be valid only during the current year and shall entitle the holder to Medical Relief for one month from the date of issue. Each Out-Patients' Department ticket must be accompanied by payment of 1/-; each Hospital ticket by payment of 2/6:

20. The Treasurer, Medical Officers, and Surgeon Dentists shall each have the privilege of a Subscriber of £3.

#### PROPERTY OF THE HOSPITAL.

21. The Property of the Hospital shall be vested in the Trustees for the time being of Thomas Hanham's Charity.

22. The General Committee shall from time to time direct such Trustees to invest the funds of the Hospital in such securities as for the time being may be authorised for the investment of Trust Funds, and shall have power from time to time to realize or vary such securities.

#### GENERAL.

23. In case there should be more applicants for admission than can be accommodated the admission shall be in order of the urgency of the cases, preference being given to the inhabitants of the Borough of Bridport.

24. Accidents and urgent cases shall be admitted at any time if there be room.

25. No one shall be admissable as a Hospital patient who is suffering from confirmed pulmonary tuberculosis, any mental or infectious disease, or any such chronic complaint as is not likely to be benefited by Hospital treatment.

26. The Out-Patients' Department shall be open on days fixed by the House Committee, for the purpose of seeing and treating Out-Patients.

27. Members of a Sick Club, and Insured Persons, are not eligible as Out-Patients unless accompanied by a letter from their own Medical Attendant asking for a further opinion.

28. Persons actually in receipt of Parish Relief are not eligible as Out-Patients, but patients who, after being admitted to the Out-Patients' Department are obliged to apply to the Parish, shall not be disqualified on that account.

29. The House Committee shall have power to reject any out-patient they may deem unsuitable; notice shall be sent to the Subscriber recommending the Patient of the reason of such rejection; the recommendation shall be returned to the Subscriber.

30. Out-patients must apply in the first instance personally, on the day and at the hour appointed by the House Committee. They must bring their own bottles, etc.

31. The Medical Officers and Dental Surgeons shall be appointed by the General Committee. They shall be duly qualified and registered.

32. Subscriptions are payable in advance and considered due on the 1st January.

33. All In-patients are liable to pay a fee of 3/- per week and upwards which may be modified at the discretion of the House Committee.

34. The two small wards are for the use of Private Patients at a minimum charge of Three Guineas per week, or if required for a few days only, 10/6 per day. These charges being for Board Residence and Attendance.

# REGULATIONS

RESPECTING THE

## CONVALESCENT BRANCH OF THE BRIDPORT HOSPITAL.

1. Convalescent Patients of the Bridport Hospital may be sent to the Bridport Harbour or elsewhere, and the expenses of their being so sent, and their maintenance there, paid out of the income of a fund given in accordance with a charitable bequest under the will of the late Mrs. Hannah Colfox.

2. All arrangements for such Patients shall be under the direction and management of a Committee, to be called the Convalescent Committee, to be chosen annually by the Committee of the Bridport Hospital, at their first meeting after the Annual General Meeting of Governors, and to consist of three Governors and three of the Ladies' Committee of the Hospital. The President of the Bridport Hospital to be *ex-Officio* a member of the Convalescent Committee.

3. The Convalescent Committee shall choose one of their number as Hon. Secretary and Treasurer.

4. Convalescent poor, not Patients of the Bridport Hospital and other poor persons who would likely to be benefited by such a change may, at the discretion and under the direction and management of the Convalescent Committee, and at the expense of the same fund be sent in like manner to Bridport Harbour or elsewhere.

5. The following cases shall be ineligible, viz :—Cases of epileptic or other fits; of any disease requiring any active Medical or Surgical Treatment; of Convalescents who are still in an infectious stage, or coming from an infected home.

6. In the event of there being more applications from time to time of Patients of the Bridport Hospital, or other poor persons, than can be met by the income of the aforesaid funds, selection shall be made in the order of the urgency of the cases, preference, however, to be always given to Inhabitants of the Borough of Bridport.

7. Anyone applying for the Benefits of the Branch shall do so to the Hon. Sec. of the Convalescent Committee, and must be previously provided with a Certificate from one of the Medical Officers that the case is one likely to be benefited by the change, and also with a Certificate of Character from the Clergyman of the Parish or the Minister of the Congregation to which the applicant belongs, or some respectable Householder.

8. The Convalescent Committee shall keep a Register of Persons willing to receive boarders.

9. The Convalescent Committee shall be satisfied as to the comfort of the respective lodgings, and as to the ability of the owners to provide proper food, &c.



10. The term of stay of a patient shall in no case exceed a fortnight, unless on an application being made and brought before the Convalescent Committee; and a fresh Certificate being procured from the same Medical Officer who gave the former, an extension of time be granted, which shall not be for longer than a fortnight; and the same course shall be adopted at any subsequent extension of the term.

11. The Convalescent Committee shall meet once a quarter, three to form a quorum, or oftener if called together by the Hon. Secretary.

12. The Convalescent Committee shall have power, if they think fit, out of the annual income of the Branch, to subscribe to the Herbert Convalescent Home at Bournemouth, or other similar institution, for the purpose of sending there, cases eligible under the foregoing regulations.
