



# Annual Report

THE Board of Management has pleasure in presenting its Annual Report and Statement of Accounts for the year ended December 31st, 1939.

#### PERSONAL.

It is with sincere regret that the Board records the death of Mr. William Bridge, J.P. Mr. Bridge held the office of Trustee for a number of years, and, at one time was an active member of the Board.

During the year the Board has received the resignation of Dr. J. H. Struthers, a member of the Honorary Medical Staff, and also of the Board. Dr. Struthers served on the Honorary Medical Staff for thirteen years, and in recognition of his services the Board appointed him an Honorary Consulting Surgeon.

To fill the vacancy caused by his resignation the Board appointed Dr. I. G. L. Ford a member of the Honorary Medical Staff. It will be recalled that Dr. Ford recently occupied the position of Resident Surgical Officer of the Hospital.

During the year there has been a change in the office of Resident Surgical Officer. Mr. A. K. Tulloch, M.B., Ch.B., F.R.C.S. (Eng.) was appointed to the position.

In the last report, reference was made to the loss sustained by the Hospital in the death of one of its Honorary Auditors— Mr. John L. Merchant. The Governors, at the Annual Meeting held in February 1939, appointed Mr. R. J. W. Merchant to fill the vacancy. Miss E. Perkins, the Almoner, recently obtained a similar position with the Manchester Corporation, and Miss A. R. Davies was selected to fill the vacancy. Miss Davies had occupied a similar position at the Worcester Royal Infirmary.

During the year Mr. Edgar Ormerod was appointed Organiser of the Contributory Scheme. Prior to coming to Bury he was the Secretary of the Burnley and District Workpeople's Hospital Fund.

#### THE WORK OF THE YEAR.

**In-patients.**—The number of In-patients treated was 2990, this figure being a decrease of 199 on the figure for the previous year.

Of the 2990 patients treated, 2720 were discharged, 164 died, and 106 remained in Hospital on December 31st.

The average number of beds occupied daily was 109.18 and the average number of available beds 126.88. This figure of available beds takes into account the restrictions which were placed upon admissions on the outbreak of war. The Hospital was requested at the commencement of hostilities to restrict admissions to accidents and urgent cases, and this restriction was operative, wholly or partly, until the middle of November. A further reference to this matter is made later in this report. The following figures serve to illustrate how the figure of daily occupied beds was made up over the various wards:—

- (a) In the Adult Wards which had an average bed complement of 92.53, there were 85.92 daily occupied beds.
- (b) In the Children's Ward which had an average bed complement of 23.35, there were 15.26 daily occupied beds.
- (c) In the Maternity Ward which had an average bed complement of 11 there were 8 daily occupied beds.

The average length of stay per patient during the year was 15.80 days as compared with 15.03 days in 1938.

Out-patients.—The number of Out-patients treated reached the figure of 5973, an increase of 404 on the figure for the previous year, which was itself a record.

The following summary illustrates in which sections of the Department the increased numbers were treated:—

The number of minor operations performed in the Casualty Department was 406, this figure being an increase of 119 on the figure for 1938.

In the X-Ray Department the figures of work done were as follows:—

The number of patients who attended the Department for treatment was 4235; this figure was an increase of 199 on the previous year's figure.

In the Light Department there were 82 new patients registered for treatment, and 2337 actual treatments given.

**Operations.**—The following is a summary of the operations performed during the year :—

By comparison with 1938 this total figure shows a reduction of 176, and taking into account the number of operations performed in the General Theatre, a reduction of 295. Again however, the restriction placed upon admissions generally was correspondingly reflected in the work of the Theatre.

Pathological Department.—The number of examinations carried out in this department was 4104, this being a similar figure to that for the previous year. During the year the department arranged for 33 Blood Transfusions, and carried out the work of grouping a fairly large number of volunteers for the panel of Emergency Blood Donors.

Convalescent Treatment.—16 patients received Convalescent Treatment, and 35 were recommended for and supplied with appliances.

Nursing Home.—There was an increase in the number of patients who used the Nursing Home. 234 patients were admitted as against 197 in 1938. Of the number admitted 85 were Maternity Cases. The average daily number of beds occupied was 10.29.

#### FINANCE.

For the year under review there was an excess of Expenditure beyond Income of £5,499. 2. 4.

Income.—It will be noticed that the section containing Subscriptions and Donations shows an increase of £1847 and that this is chiefly accounted for by an increased contribution from the Contributory Scheme. There are, of course, certain other increases and additions, amongst which may be mentioned the Flag Day Effort. Both subscriptions and donations however, show decreases, and this is regrettable in view of certain appeals which have been made in previous reports. The Board again expresses the hope that the number of Annual Subscribers will increase, and reference is directed to the mention of an Income Committee later in this report.

The Board again records its appreciation of the assistance given by the District Charity Committees. It will be seen by a reference to the account that certain of the contributions show substantial increases.

**Expenditure.**—The Ordinary Expenditure showed a reduction over that for the previous year. It was however £929 in excess of Income. To this figure should be added the Special Expenditure amounting to £4,750.

From the remark made above concerning Ordinary Expenditure it must not be assumed that the Hospital has not yet felt the increased cost of living. It was pointed out last year, that in certain directions the Hospital was paying more for its commodities, and of course, the outbreak of war, and the rise in prices generally has been reflected over the whole range of purchases. The reason for the decrease in the total of Ordinary Expenditure is largely due to the decrease in patients resident during the last three months of the year. An increase in Ordinary Expenditure must assuredly be faced.

It is gratifying to note that on the Expenditure side there have been certain decreases of an outstanding nature. For instance, Drugs show a decrease, and, if compared with the figure for 1937, are less by nearly £400. Dressings too, are more, by only a small

amount, when compared with 1937; on the other hand there has been a large increase in the use of Dressings over the two years. During 1939 there were, for instance, in the Casualty Room alone, 8,315 dressings carried out, as against 5,904 in 1937. The arrangement made some years ago with the Honorary Medical Staff as to their receiving a percentage of the receipts of the Contributory Scheme has now come into full operation, thus accounting for the increase in the amount paid to the Honorary Medical Staff Fund.

The amount expended on Instruments and Appliances includes a sum of £75 for the purchase of a Rematherm Short Wave Apparatus. This Apparatus was purchased for use in the Massage Department, and has proved of great benefit since its installation.

#### SPECIAL ITEMS.

The outbreak of War.—In common with all other undertakings, the emergency which developed so unfortunately in September created special problems for the Hospital.

An Emergency Committee was appointed in order to provide the means of dealing expeditiously with matters of a vital and urgent nature. The object of the Board was to provide, in consultation with the Ministry of Health, a complete and satisfactory service for possible war casualties, and to carry out the necessary measures for the proper protection of the Hospital.

As regards protection, there had for some time been in existence, an Air Raid Precautions Committee, and this Committee had prepared plans which were considered to be as exhaustive as it was possible to make them. Since the emergency, a part of these plans has been put into effect and every effort is being made to complete them at an early date.

With regard to service, a large number of beds were cleared at the request of the Ministry of Health on September 1st. These, at a later date, were re-occupied, but the co-ordination in existence between the Ministry and the Hospitals is such, that should an emergency develop in such a way as to involve this area, a number of beds could readily be made available for the reception of Casualties.

#### Special Appeal.

In the last report mention was made of the decision to issue an appeal for a sum of £50,000. The object of this appeal was to provide for improvements and additions which had become necessary, and to meet in some way, the recurring deficits in Income and Expenditure.

The organisation of the appeal had actually been commenced and a number of people had been invited to become members of the Special Committee proposed. At outbreak of war however, it was considered advisable to postpone the appeal. It was with reluctance that this decision was taken, for certain additions and improvements had already been undertaken, and others were contemplated, of equal importance. Chief of these was the new Out-patient Department to which reference was made in the last report. During the year the X-Ray Apparatus for diagnostic work has been replaced, and the Theatre Sterilizing Apparatus thoroughly overhauled.

#### Income Committee.

For some time it has been felt that special steps should be taken with a view to increasing the annual income of the Hospital. In consequence an Income Committee has been appointed with this object and to take such action as might be deemed desirable to increase the Funds of the Hospital in every possible way

The Committee has been at work a few months. It has already decided to make a special effort to obtain new and increased Annual Subscribers. Another effort for which the Income Committee was originally responsible, was the Flag Day held in December. Over £200 was raised in spite of inclement weather, and the result was most encouraging to all concerned.

Orthopaedic Sister.—During the year there has been a new appointment made—that of an Orthopaedic Sister. It will be recalled that some three years ago reference was made to a proper organisation of the Orthopaedic Department and to the appointment of a Consulting Orthopaedic Surgeon. The addition of a Sister, specially trained in Orthopaedic work, is another step towards providing more efficient treatment for the patient.

#### THANKS.

In conclusion, the Board would tender its thanks to all who have assisted the Infirmary by gifts in money or in kind, and in particular to the following:—

The Donors of eggs collected during Egg Week, the persons responsible for collection, and in particular the Co-operative Societies of the district who arranged for their various branches to act as collecting centres.

The Bury Branch of the Farmers' Union for their assistance in supplying and collecting eggs during Egg Week.

The Corporations of the district for their help in advertising Egg Week.

Those responsible for the organising and carrying out of the work in connection with the Annual Christmas Dinner Table Appeal.

Those who assisted in the organising and carrying out of the Flag Day effort.

Those who have assisted by volunteering, when called upon under the Blood Transfusion Service, and to others whose names remain on the list for such service.

The Women's Voluntary Service Committee for its help in arranging an Emergency Panel of Blood Donors.

The Boy Scouts' Association and the Bury Lad's Club for their help in sandbagging, and the Rover Scouts who, each night since the outbreak of war, have been on duty at the Infirmary in case of need.

The Rotary Club of Bury, in providing conveyances for individual patients in difficult circumstances.

Bury Branch of the Toc H. for their service in connection with the patients' Library.

The Police for their help in many ways, particularly in conveying messages to patients' relatives.

The Secretaries and Officials of the various companies and firms for assistance rendered in connection with the Contributory Scheme, and to the collectors of contributions from individuals.

The Press for their valuable help throughout the year.

The Honorary and Resident Medical and other Officers, and the Matron and Staff of the Infirmary, for the constant and devoted work on which the efficiency of the Hospital mainly depends.



#### REPORT FOR 1939

#### Personal

It is with very deep regret that the Committee places on record the death of one of its members—Miss Williams. Miss Williams was one of the oldest members of the Committee and had in many ways given valuable service to the Committee and the Hospital.

It is with much pleasure that the Committee reports the appointment of Mrs. R. P. Timpany as Honorary Treasurer to the Committee. In taking up this post Mrs. Timpany now occupies the position held for so many years by Mrs. T. Holt.

#### The Work of the Year

The Linen Guild has had a very successful year considering the circumstances with which it has met. Owing to the outbreak of war it was not possible to organise two efforts as in former years but it was decided that the amount usually received from one of the efforts should be made up by a subscription from each member of the Committee. Linen to the value of £70 has been purchased by the Infirmary and once again the Committee has provided operation stockings, matinee coats etc.

Another outstanding effort made during the year by the Committee was the provision of twenty oak bedside lockers for the use of one of the Womens' Wards. These were provided entirely by the Ladies' Committee and are a great improvement.

One member of the Ladies' Committee also undertook the replacement of a large amount of Mortuary Linen, this being in remembrance of the late Mr. Samuel Howarth, and to her the Committee has expressed its gratitude.

### Bury Infirmary Children's Fund Committee

#### REPORT FOR 1939

#### PERSONAL.

It is with great regret that the Committee records the resignation of Miss S. T. Ashworth who has been President of the Fund since October 1930. This step has been taken by Miss Ashworth because of her removal from Bury to undertake Military Duties in some other part of the Country. The Committee wishes to record in this report its gratitude for the valuable work and assistance Miss Ashworth has rendered to the Fund during the time she has been connected with it.

Another resignation which is recorded with regret is that of Mrs. F. Sykes.

Both Miss Ashworth and Mrs. Sykes will, it is hoped, rejoin

the Committee at the end of the War.

It is also with regret that the Committee records the resignation from the office of Honorary Secretary in August last of Mrs. R. Byrom. Mrs. Byrom had held this office since February 1938, and the Committee is pleased to report that she will continue her membership of the Committee.

Mrs. Struthers, one of the oldest members of the Committee, left the district in June and, in consequence, tendered her resigna-

tion. This also is recorded with regret.

#### THE WORK OF THE YEAR.

The Annual Garden Fete was held on Midsummers Day, and in spite of the weather being more like Midwinter, the sum of

£202 17s. 3d. was raised.

Owing to the outbreak of War the Committee was unable to hold the Annual Dance in December but instead, a Morning Bring and Buy Sale was held on January 25th, 1940. Up to the time of preparing the Annual Accounts, the sum of £22 9s. 0d. had been realised, and, at that time, there were certain contributions still to be received.

The sum of £250 has been handed over to the Infirmary for the maintenance of cots, and the sum of £2 2s. 0d. to the Childrens Ward towards Christmas Festivities. Insulin costing £5 12s. 6d. has been supplied to one girl.

Flannel for nightdresses, pyjamas and coats has also been

supplied for use in the Children's Ward.

# Matron's Report for 1939

A review of the nursing work of the Hospital for the year 1939 shows steady progress.

In January there was an epidemic of influenza, otherwise the standard of the health of the Staff has been good.

Several changes have taken place. Miss Welford was appointed Home and Housekeeping Sister to replace Sister Owen who became Assistant Matron at Chesterfield Royal Infirmary. Sisters Campbell and MacLeod replaced Sisters Russell and Emmott who left to take Housekeeping training. Sisters Bury, Hulme and Wright replaced Sisters Hoare, Maughan and Broadbent. Sister Taylor was appointed Night Sister when Sister Kenyon, who was a member of the Q.A.I.M.N.S. was called up on the outbreak of war. Sister Bowers was appointed to Barlow Ward. A new appointment was that of Sister Holden in charge of the Orthopaedic Department. Nurse Edwards and Nurse Durkan were sent by us to the Q.A.I.M.N.S. Reserve, the latter returning after one month. Nurse Edwards was sent abroad and is still serving with the B.E.F.

Since the outbreak of war we have given practical instruction to fifty members of the Nursing Auxiliary Service several of whom on completion of their course, continued to give service to the hospital and have been of great assistance.

There have been changes with regard to the examinations set by the General Nursing Council. The General Intelligence Test for prospective candidates has been cancelled. The October State Examination was postponed owing to the outbreak of war but was held here in November. Out of nine candidates who entered seven were successful.

I would like to convey my sincere thanks to all who have assisted at the hospital since the outbreak of war—help given in the kitchen and stores, making of black curtains, emergency dressings and bandages, has been much appreciated.

# Almoner's Report for 1939

It is only in fairly recent years that the work of Hospital Almoners has become more generally known, yet the need of some kind of social service within the hospitals was recognised over fifty years ago. It was Sir Charles Lock who suggested the office of a "charitable assessor or co-operator, well instructed as to all forms of relief other than Medical." Her office should be to supplement the work of the Medical Officer by obtaining the general assistance without which medical relief will often fail in its purpose.

The title of Almoner has met with many criticisms and yet no satisfactory alternative has been suggested. When the office was created at St. Thomas's Hospital, the fact that the Executive Board had from its earliest days included six "Almoners" made it necessary to distinguish the new official by prefacing "Lady" before "Almoner."

The first Almoner began her work forty-five years ago, and there is no doubt that in the eyes of the hospital authorities the most pressing side of the new work was the prevention of abuse and checking misuse of the hospital, although it was intended that the future Almoner or trained social worker within the hospital would provide a link between the treatment given in the hospital and the realities of the world in which the patient lived.

This was the basis on which the work of Almoners was built, and today the importance of social work within the hospital has been recognised by the Voluntary Hospitals Commission, whose report has been so generously implemented by Lord Nuffield. The Regionalisation provided in the Commission's recommendations envisages a Regional Office as a centre for social service, which will co-operate with the Almoner's service within the hospital.

The work of the department is essentially one of co-operation as a liason between the administrative, medical, and nursing departments of the hospital, and the Local Authorities and various social agencies such as the Charity Organisation Society and the United Services Fund. The prime function is, of course, to assist the doctor by providing information of the social handicap of the patients, and at the same time, through such agencies as those mentioned and by other means, endeavouring to alleviate such disadvantages. In some cases patients can be discharged from hospital earlier by an efficient link with Home Nursing and the patient's own doctor, and so render available urgently needed beds.

The parents of Roger, a young diabetic patient, will always be grateful for the co-operation between the Almoner's department and outside agencies, which has enabled their son to live an almost normal life, instead of spending most of his childhood in a hospital ward.

Roger first started to attend the Out-Patient clinic when he he was nine years of age. A special diet was prescribed and insulin supplied through the Almoner's department. Roger was later admitted as he was not making satisfactory progress, and his diet was stabilised. He was discharged a few weeks later and careful instructions were given to his parents with regard to his diet. A special pair of scales was also supplied to enable Roger to receive an accurate diet. A few weeks later, however, Roger was again admitted, but this time in a serious condition. On investigation it was found that as his mother had to help to support the house, she could not supervise all his meals. Altogether Roger spent eighteen months in hospital over a period of two years and did not receive any education during that period.

Roger's difficulties were explained to a sympathetic Medical Officer of Health and to the Education Committee of the town in which he lived. It was finally decided that a special grant should be allowed to permit Roger to receive his education at a hospital school in the south of England. Roger spent three years at this school and received an excellent education, and only on a few occasions was it necessary for him to have lessons while he was in bed.

He has now returned to his home and is well enough to start to earn his living, instead of being an invalid. There is always great scope for social work among child patients and efforts made on their behalf are well repaid.

The impact of the war has imposed a strain on the social work of the Almoner's department, a strain which every department in the hospital is experiencing. Convalescent Homes have come under the Government's Emergency Medical Service and in many cases are not available to us; thus the problem of ensuring the aftercare of the patient is difficult. While black-out conditions have increased enormously the work of the fracture clinics, surgical appliances—particularly those of light metal—are more costly than before, and patients, finding themselves living on reduced means, particularly in cases where the wage-earner is serving in H.M. Forces, experience considerable difficulty, in meeting any additional expenditure. Such difficulties, however, only serve to deepen our resolve to fulfil our responsibility.

It is appropriate to take this opportunity of thanking the Members of the Board for their understanding and assistance, the members of the Ladies' and Children's Fund Committees for their unfailing help with the social work of the hospital, the Almoner's Committee for the time and care which they devote to helping with the details of the work of the department, and the Super-

intendent for his advice and co-operation. Contacts with the Medical and Nursing Staffs have been of the happiest, enabling the

department to give full value of service to the patients.

Finally, if one may introduce a personal note, one would mention one's sense of privilege at being able to carry out this interesting and important task. Previous experience on Merseyside and in the Midlands has demonstrated the existence of opportunities of maintaining and raising standards. Such opportunities will always be welcomed.

# Contributory Scheme

#### **REPORT FOR 1939**

Before reviewing the financial results of last year, I should like to express my sincere thanks for the very warm manner in which I have been welcomed to the position of Secretary of the Contributory Scheme here in Bury.

It is with a sense of pride and gratification that I review the accounts. To have borne the brunt of the outbreak of War and successfully carried on our collections, with notable increases in all Branches of the Scheme, during the first four months of the conflict, is an achievement which I know you will regard with the utmost satisfaction.

A grant of £5,850 has been made from our Funds to the Bury Infirmary for the year 1939, being an increase of £1,800 over the preceding year, and £1,100 more than in the peak year of the Scheme in 1936. The total amount now donated to the Bury Infirmary since the inception of the Scheme is £25,845 4s. 4d.

During the year, £1,496 2s. 6d. was also granted to other Voluntary Hospitals and an amount of £534 17s. 10d. to Municipal Hospitals, for the maintenance of our Contributors bringing the total of grants from the Scheme for 1939 to £7,881 0s. 4d.

It also gives me pleasure to report increases in the Incomefrom the various districts as follows:—

The Office Contributions for the year amounted to £1,291 3s.0d. These figures, showing as they do, highly satisfactory results of a year's working, give me confidence to face the future in good heart and I know that in these difficult times, co-operation will not be lacking.

May I take this opportune time of making an appeal to those who are not yet members of the Contributory Scheme. Bury Infirmary is, by those most able to judge, one of the finest Hospitals in the country for its size. It is a great institution of which the whole town is justly proud. Its services are ungrudgingly given to all who need them. Everything that skill, knowledge, experience and loving kindness can do, is done as a natural and normal thing for those who are afflicted.

Such an institution needs and deserves financial support and the Contributory Scheme was commenced with this end in view. It has done great things already and has augmented the Hospital Funds in a wonderful way. Its success shows how even in a period of acute depression, Lancashire people can face them, and achieve the finest results when things and conditions are at their worst.

It has done great things, but it can do even better. The ideal is for EVERY mill, workshop and place of business in the Bury Area to be linked up with our Scheme. That is only just; for no one knows who will need the services of the Hospital next. No one knows what a day may bring forth.

I feel that if all those eligible to join the Scheme would do so at once, the anxiety regarding the finances of the Hospital, which so consistently confronts the Board of Management, would be lessened to a very material extent.

All of us would like to see an Income of £10,000 on the Balance Sheet; it can be done by a united effort, by making every endeavour to persuade people that it is their duty to maintain, equip and improve the splendid voluntary Hospital at Bury.

In conclusion, may I express my appreciation for the very valuable assistance I have received from my Chairman (Mr. T. Steen), the Committee, Collectors, all Office Staffs, the Press and others who in any way have made a contribution to the success of our Scheme.



## Private Nursing Home



There are ten rooms available at a charge of £5 5s. 0d. per week, and one room to accommodate two patients at a charge of £4 4s. 0d. each per week. There are also four rooms for Maternity Cases at a charge of £5 5s. 0d. per week. This charge includes accommodation, food and the services of the nursing staff.

If the services of a special Nurse are required they must be paid for by the patient.

Stimulants and any special medicines or dressings must be provided at the cost of the Patient.


These Private Nursing Rooms are a complete unit, quite apart from the General Wards. The Home has its own Theatre.




