



NINETEENTH ANNUAL REPORT.

To the Subscribers and Donors.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

In presenting to you the Annual Report of the work of the Hospital and the Statement of Accounts for the year ended 31st December, 1930, the Executive Committee first desire to place on record their deep sense of the loss the Hospital has sustained through the passing of their Chairman, Mr. C. A. Bailey, early in the year, and to pay once more a sincere tribute to his devotion and selfless work. The present development and efficiency of the Institution are very largely the fruit of his unceasing activities on its behalf.

The year under review has been a busy one, and the demands on the services of the Hospital more than confirm its indispensable service to the town and district.

The Committee are exploring every means to secure the best system of working, both as to economy and efficiency, and a larger measure of interest and support from the community the Hospital serves. Among the changes which have taken place during the past year are:---

- The appointment of Mr. A. J. Potter as Chairman, and of Mr. J. Mason Frith as Vice-Chairman. There have also been changes in the personnel of the Committee, Miss Walsh and Mrs. Kelcey-Bower have resigned, to the regret of their colleagues, who fully realised their useful service. The vacancies have been been filled by the appointment of Mrs. Percival Williams, Mrs. Mostyn-Kershaw, Captain F. Brindley, M.C., and the Reverend Saunders Williams.
- 2. The decision to appoint an Annual President, and we are happy to announce that Lord Hartington has consented to occupy this position for 1931.
- 3. The appointment of His Grace the Duke of Devonsnire as Patron of the Hospital.
- The appointment of a Resident Sister to act as a Qualified Radiographer and Superintendent of the Children's Ward.
- 5. Contributory Schemes for employees have been initiated, and the response so far justifies the hope that these may provide a steady source of additional income.
- 6. Through the efforts of ladies interested in the Hospital, to whom the Committee express their gratitude, a Linen League has been inaugurated with Mrs. Percival Williams as Chairman, to which further reference is made in the Report, and which will unquestionably render valuable service.
- Mrs. F. O. S. Leak very kindly gave £500 during the year to endow a Cot in memory of her late husband.
- 8. The exterior of the Hospital building, except the Children's Ward, has been painted and put into repair during the year.

The admissions to the Hospital during the year numbered 510, making a total since 1912 of 5,134. 187 operations were performed, and it will be noted from the classified report the increasing service demanded as the result of road accidents.

It will be observed from the Revenue Account that there was an actual surplus of $\pounds 234$ 6s. 7d. on the year's working, which, however, is more than exhausted by irrecoverable fees amounting to $\pounds 303$ 3s. 7d. written off, and the expenditure on alterations and removals amounting to $\pounds 105$ 0s. 6d. also written off against revenue.

The amount of service rendered for which no payment is received is causing some anxiety and emphasizes the need for increased and regular subscriptions to meet the necessary expenditure. The return in money from the Children's Ward is small in relation to its upkeep, but its value in saving and establising child life cannot be reckoned in terms of money.

The debt still remaining on the building of the New Wing stands at £1,766 9s. 6d., there having only been a few donations to this Fund during the year, and Bank Interest having been incurred on the Overdraft. This yearly cost in Bank Interest is a serious item, and it will be necessary very shortly to organise some scheme for extinguishing this burden on the finances of the Hospital.

The Committee desire to express their grateful thanks to the many friends who have organised efforts of various kinds to supplement the Maintenance Fund.

The Committee's thanks are also warmly tendered to Dr. Cochrane for compiling the analysed list of admissions; to Mr. W. Eccles Thompson, A.C.A., for again auditing the books and accounts; to the Medical and Surgical Consultants; the Radiologist, Visiting Doctors, and the Matron and Administrative Staff for their services during the year. They appreciate also the work of the District Collectors, and of Mrs. Milton in connection with the Collection Boxes, and all other helpers during the year.

Owing to the great call on the reserves of the Hospital for the replacement of Linen, certain ladies, with the interests of the Hospital at heart, decided that it would be very advantageous if a Linen League could be formed. A meeting of these ladies was held in December last, when it was unanimously decided that a League should be formed, and the following office bearers and committee have been appointed for 1931:

President: Mrs. Percival Williams.

Honorary Secretary: Mrs. Mostyn Kershaw.

Honorary Treasurer: Mrs. Hector.

Committee:

Mrs. Bowen, Mrs. F. Wallis Mrs. C. Shaw, Mrs. G. L. Q. Henriques, Mrs. A. J. Potter, Miss Whitehead, Miss Bethel (Matron).

The object of this League is to provide the Hospital with Household Linen, Blankets, and Emergency Garments for Patients.

RULES.

- 1. The General Management of the League shall be entrusted to the President, and a Committee of Management of nine persons, including the Matron at the Hospital, the Hon. Secretary and the Hon. Treasurer of the Linen League.
- 2. The Vice-Presidents undertake :--
 - (a) To contribute 10/6 annually.
 - (b) To send in two Garments or Articles of Household Linen.
 - (c) To send in their Contributions not later than March 1st. Vice-Presidents may commute all responsibilities by paying £1 1/per annum.
- 3. Associates undertake :--
 - (a) To contribute 5/- annually.
 - (b) To give two Garments or Articles of Household Linen annually.
 - (c) To send their Contributions not later than March 1st. Associates may commute their Subscriptions and Two Articles for 10/- per annum.
- 4. Those who are unable to subscribe may be Members and contribute Two Garments or Articles of Household Linen annually.
- 5. Gentlemen will be welcome as Hon. Members on payment of an annual Subscription of 10/-.
- 6. Membership Cards shall be issued with space for name and appellation, i.e., Vice-President, Associate or Member.
- 7. The Annual Report, with list of articles given during the year, and the cash account, shall be incorporated in the Buxton and District Hospital Annual Report.
- 8. The President of the Linen League shall be appointed annually by the Executive Committee of the Buxton and District Hospital on the nomination of the House Committee, in order that the connection between the Linen League and the Executive and House Committees shall be maintained.
