



# Thirty-fifth Annual Report.

## National Health Service Act.

The transfer of the Hospital, under the National Health Service Act, has been uppermost in the minds of the members of the Hospital's Committees during the year under review and has had a direct bearing on many of the decisions reached. It is regarded as being essential that the hospital should continue as a surgical and medical unit, particularly as the town is surrounded by a rural area liable to isolation in the winter, and which is also the centre of the quarrying industry.

Every effort is being made to hand over the hospital equipped with the most efficient apparatus, and in a position to provide the best possible nursing service for the inhabitants of the area which it serves. Unfortunately the present shortages of labour and materials make it impracticable to commence some of the projected improvements before the date of transfer, but it is confidently hoped that the Management Committee to be appointed under the National Health Service Act will proceed with the schemes for which specifications and tenders have been obtained.

# Increased Use of the Hospital.

On an average, the number of beds occupied is about one-half of the accommodation available, even though at times the wards are full. It is therefore felt that if patients were received from a wider area it would help, if in a small way, to reduce the lengthy periods of waiting at some of the larger hospitals. Steps to this end have been taken recently and provided the surgeons are able to attend more frequently there should be a considerable increase in the number of operations performed in the immediate future.

# Nursing Service.

In the belief that a happy and contented staff is essential to the proper conduct of a hospital and the well being of the patients the recommendations of the Rushcliffe Committee have been adopted. These relate to hours of duty, salaries and pensions. Consideration has also been given to the report of the Working Party on the Recruitment and Training of Nurses. The recommendations outlined are summed-up in the suggestion that the conditions should be such as one would wish one's own daughter to work and live in.

As a result it has been decided

- 1. To form a Nurses' Representative Council.
- To dispose of the very inadequate and well-worn furnishings
  of the nurses' bedrooms and to fit them up as bed sittingrooms, complete with modern suites, hot and cold water,
  and decorated in a pleasing manner.

On the resignation of the porter early in the year it was decided to convert the lodge into bedrooms for the night staff, and this has proved to be a most beneficial arrangement.

# Improvements.

In addition to the improvements already mentioned, the following are recorded:—

The installation of a modern anæsthetic apparatus in the outpatient department.

The provision of new wireless equipment throughout the wards and nurses' sitting-rooms.

Purchase of electric vacuum cleaner, polisher, washing machine and potato peeler, together with other articles of domestic equipment. A tender has been received for the extension of the heating system and the provision of additional baths and other sanitary fittings.

#### Income.

It is gratifying to report that public support of the hospital has been maintained, the amount received from ordinary subscriptions and donations showing an increase of £180 over the previous year. A detailed list of these contributions will be found on pages 14 to 23.

The income from fees at £4,433 6s. 0d., shows an increase of £1,008 16s. 7d. over the amount for 1946.

Claims upon the Ministry of Health for grant towards the increased cost of Nurses' salaries, etc., have been submitted for the four years to 31st March, 1947, and the total amount of £1,150 5s. 6d. is included in the income for the year. Settlement has also been made with the Ministry in respect of the Emergency Hospital Scheme, the amount being £231 10s. 8d.

# Expenditure.

The total expenditure of £9,916 13s. 4d. shows an increase of £1,888 15s. 5d. on the 1946 figure. Salaries, wages and superannuation contributions, including adjustment of underpayments for previous years, cost £1,566 ls. 8d. more than in 1946. There have have been further increases in the prices of nearly all services and commodities, especially of drugs, dressings and apparatus.

## Deficit.

The deficit on Income and Expenditure Account for the year is £1,601 17s. 7d. The accumulated deficit of £8,674 2s. 8d. has been liquidated by transfers from Reserve and Capital Accounts.

# Contributory Account.

This Account has reference to the Fund formed by the allocation of £100 a year from the annual contribution of the Manchester and Salford Saturday and Convalescent Homes Fund. The amount in hand at the 1st January, 1947, was £310 11s. 2d. and the allocation of £100 for 1947 brought the total to £410 11s. 2d. During the year £201 19s. 6d. was paid to specialists and doctors called out in cases of emergency. The balance at 31st December, 1947, was £201 11s. 8d.

## The Year's Work.

The following is a summary of the treatments given during the year, with the comparative figures for 1946:-

# Linen League.

The linen requirements of the hospital have been met through the assistance of the Ladies' Linen League. The main items supplied during the year were as follows:—70 sheets, 42 pillow cases, 69 towels, 13 blankets, 24 quilts and 44 miscellaneous items.

The Bank balance shewn by the last Report as at 24th June, 1947, was £100 16s. 2d. During the period to 31st December, 1947, a

donation of £2 2s. 0d. was received from Mrs. Wrigley and the Expenditure amounted to £3 18s. 8d. The balance in hand at 31st December, 1947, was £98 19s. 6d.

The Committee are most grateful for the continuance of the valuable help rendered by members of the Linen League.

## Medical Committee.

The Medical Committee is as been particularly active, and numerous suggestions have been made for consideration by the Executive and House Committees. Wherever possible the recommendations have been adopted and this close co-operation on the part of the doctors is much appreciated.

#### Thanks.

The Committee are most grateful for the generous support received from many quarters. The list of subscriptions and donations is included in this Report. Gifts in kind and personal services rendered have added materially to the comfort and well-being of the patients, and have been so numerous and varied that it is not possible to record them. From the matron and her staff we have received in an unstinted measure the most devoted and efficient service.
