38 of the Deaths occurred within 48 hours of admission.

The number of patients admitted as the result of road accidents was 56, compared with 74 in 1937. These patients occupied beds for a total of 630 days, compared with 1,728 days in 1937, the daily average number of beds occupied being 1.72 as against 4.73.

In the X-Ray Department 4,599 patients have been radiographed (last year 4,153) in addition to 447 screen examinations and 73 treatments (superficial therapy) as against 543 and 166 respectively last year.

In the Massage and Electro-therapeutic Department the total number of patients attendances was 20,161 and in addition 461 treatments were given to In-Patients.

Honorary Staff. During the year Dr. E. C. Salt has retired from the position of Honorary Surgeon. Dr. Salt was appointed as Honorary Assistant Surgeon in 1900 and as Honorary Surgeon in 1902, and during a period of 38 years, has at all times placed his professional skill unreservedly at the service of the Infirmary and its patients. Your Committee desires to place on record its deep and sincere appreciation of his invaluable services to the institution.

To fill the vacancy thus caused, Dr. F. L. Pickett, who has been an Hon. Assistant Surgeon since 1927, has been appointed as Honorary Surgeon.

Nursing Staff. The acute shortage of Nurses has created serious difficulties in the working of the Infirmary and it has been necessary to close one ward of 14 beds for a greater part of the year. A number of candidates have been lost to the profession through failing to pass the recently instituted Educational Test Examination, and however desirable such an examination may appear in theory, its introduction at a time when there were already marked indications of a shortage of Nurses has added most seriously to the difficulties of the problem. It is generally recognised that one of the main improvements required in nursing conditions is a reduction of working hours, and this can only be brought about by an increase in the number of Nurses recruited.

Total ordinary income shows an increase of £224 for the year. The Saturday Collection has again advanced by £573, whilst Nursing Home fees and payments by Insurance Companies in respect of Road Traffic Act cases are also considerably higher. On the other hand the amounts received under the heading of Donations, Entertainments, etc. is less

by £358, last year's figure having included several substantial items of a special nature, whilst owing to the sale of the Roebuck Hotel property the amount received in rents is also reduced.

Expenditure for the year shews an increase of £1,021, most of which must be regarded as of a permanent character. Under the heading of Provisions any decrease which might have been possible owing to the reduction of the daily average number of In-Patients has been practically cancelled out by increased prices; the increase of nearly £400 in Surgical expenses is largely due to the increased work and cost of renewals (including the shock-proofing of a part of the plant) in the X-Ray Department. Salaries and Wages show an increase of £643, due partly to increased rates of pay and partly to the fact that members of special department staffs hitherto boarded and lodged are now non-resident; the bringing in to Unemployment Insurance of the Domestic and outside staff in July accounts for an increase of £75 under National Insurance.

As the result of the years' working the deficit on General Account is increased from £28 16s. 6d. to £363 14s. 2d.

Your Committee would again record its very sincere thanks for the loyal support received from the very large number of subscribers, whose generosity has contributed so largely to the welfare of the institution during the year.

Thanks are also due to all those who have promoted or assisted in the various special efforts, entertainments and sporting events and special reference must again be made to the Ladies Flower Day Committee for their contribution of £384 10s. 10d.; to the Mayor (Mr. Councillor J. W. Clark, J.P.) and the Committee responsible for the organization of the very successful Infirmary Ball, which produced £300; and to the Burton Breweries Cricket Association for their contribution of £85.

The amount received from the proceeds of Entertainments, etc., in the surrounding district has been well maintained, the principal contribution being one of £50 from the Woodville Parade and Gala Association.

The Sunday Collection also shews an increase of £11 and the Committee once more acknowledge with gratitude the valued support of the Clergy, Ministers and Congregations.

Infirmary Saturday Collection. A very substantial advance in the contributions to the Infirmary Saturday Collection has again to be recorded, the total for 1938, £9,619 7s. 3d., being nearly £400 more than the previous year.

The gratifying progress of the Saturday Collection is a source of much satisfaction to the General Committee, but in view of the increasing costs of maintenance the hope is again expressed that the employees at those establishments where the contributions are less than 2d. per week will come into line with the majority during the coming year.

The Committee would again place on record its most grateful appreciation and thanks for the support received as the result of the loyal and whole hearted labours of the Saturday Committee.

To mark the completion of the year's work the Delegates were entertained to Dinner at the Town Hall by Mr. J. H. Birch and Mr. C. Spalding, the function being a most successful and enjoyable one.

Notification has also been received from the Executors of the will of the late Mrs. Elizabeth Holbrooke, of Bladon Castle, that by her will the late Mrs. Holbrooke left to the

Infirmary a legacy of £5,000 free of all duties. In making this bequest Mrs. Holbrooke expressly desired that the following words should be inserted in her will :—

“ The legacy to the Burton-on-Trent General Infirmary is bequeathed by me as a mark of my recognition of the services given to such Infirmary by the late Sir Sydney Herbert Evershed.”

Your Committee desires to place on record its deep sense of gratitude to these generous benefactors.

Extensions. Reference was made in the last Annual Report to the necessity for additional accommodation for patients and staff, and after careful consideration it was decided to proceed with a scheme which includes the provision of a new Ward Block of 162 beds together with operation Theatre Unit and the necessary service rooms, the demolition of the old main Ward Block, and the erection of a new Nurses Home. Further details of the scheme will be found in the copy of the Appeal for the necessary funds, which appears elsewhere in this report. The response to this appeal has been a really magnificent one, the total of donations promised or received to date being £107,403 0s. 8d.

It will be seen, however, that a very considerable sum has yet to be raised, if the full scheme is to be carried through.

A Tender has been accepted for the main portion of the scheme, i.e., the new Ward Block and the Nurses Home, and further donations will be most gratefully received.

Roebuck Hotel Property. During the year the sale of this property has been completed and after repayment to Investment Account of the sum of £700 paid from that Account for the enfranchisement of the property in 1924, the proceeds have been transferred to the Extension Account.

Obituary.

Your Committee records its deep regret at the death of Sir Reginald Hardy, Bt., who had been a Vice-President of the Infirmary, and an annual subscriber to its funds, for the long period of 49 years.

Since the close of the year another great loss has been sustained by the death of the late Mr. Christopher Spalding, J.P., who had been a valued member of the Committee for 22 years, and who was also a Vice-President and a Trustee of the institution. In addition to endowing the Bed bearing his name in the men's surgical ward, Mr. Spalding was always a most liberal contributor whenever funds were necessary for the purpose of extensions and development, and in his passing the Infirmary has lost a great hearted and generous friend.

Linen League.

Once again the Infirmary is greatly indebted to the Members of the Linen League, whose work, by providing the very heavy cost of renewals and replacements of household linen, relieves the General Fund of a considerable liability each year, and your Committee records with gratitude its cordial appreciation of their efforts.

Red Cross

The services of the Red Cross Sewing Sewing Party. Party in the making of bandages, pneumonia jackets, etc., are also again acknowledged with grateful thanks.

Egg Collection.

The Annual Egg Collection organized by the "Burton Daily Mail" again met with remarkable success, nearly 30,000 eggs being received, and once more the Committee would record its sense of obligation to the Mail, to the organizers of the various collecting depots and to all those whose work and generous contributions brought about such a very gratifying result.

In conclusion sincere thanks are tendered for the many gifts of vegetables, fruit, flowers, periodicals, tinfoil, etc., received throughout the year, from numerous friends and from

Churches, Chapels and Schools; to the contributors of donations and gifts for the Christmas Festivities; to the Police and the Press, and to all who by many and varied services have given invaluable assistance.

Extensions Scheme.

BURTON-ON-TRENT GENERAL INFIRMARY.

July, 1938.

Dear Sir,

Owing to the continuous increase in the demands made upon the services of the Infirmary the Committee are faced with the urgent necessity to undertake large extensions if the Burton Infirmary is to continue to provide an adequate hospital for the service of the town and the surrounding district. In addition to the general increase in the number of cases to be dealt with new conditions cause the existing accommodation to be inadequate to meet the requirements of a modern hospital.

At the suggestion of the South Derbyshire Miners' Welfare Committee, a special Fracture Department has been established during the past year, in accordance with recommendations made by the Inter-Departmental Committee appointed by the Government, whereby all fracture cases are treated by one Surgeon from the time of arrival at the hospital until they are finally discharged. Such Fracture Departments have been instituted at a number of the leading hospitals resulting in a considerable reduction in the period of disability and treatment. In order to meet these requirements it is necessary to provide a special Fracture Ward of 20 beds towards the cost of which the Miners' Welfare Committee have provisionally offered a grant of £10,000 spread over a period of ten years.

By arrangement with the Burton Corporation Maternity and Child Welfare Committee, the Infirmary has for some years provided for the treatment of Abnormal Maternity Cases. The number of these now being received makes it necessary for special accommodation to be provided, and a new section of 8 beds, with accommodation for isolation where necessary, is required.

At the present time congestion is frequently caused in the hospital wards by the admission of emergency surgical cases and accidents which cannot be refused; this causes delay in the admission of patients on the waiting list. In order to avoid the present over-crowding and delay in admission of patients needing treatment additional surgical and medical beds are urgently required.

Another important development is the movement for reduction of working hours of the nursing staff in hospitals. This question cannot be postponed. It will necessitate a considerable increase in the number of nurses and a corresponding increase in the accommodation provided for them. At present all the available nurses' bedrooms, which are in three separate buildings, are fully occupied; the situation can be met only by the provision of a new Nurses' Home which must be on modern lines.

It is found to be quite impracticable to provide the additional accommodation at present required by extending the existing Wards, and in deciding upon the steps to be taken due consideration must be given to the needs of the future. A Scheme has been prepared by an eminent firm of Hospital Architects, by which the whole of the general Surgical, Medical, Fracture, Children's and Maternity Wards, with a total of 162 beds, together with Operation Theatre Unit, Sterilizing Rooms and Service Rooms will be accommodated in one block of five floors facing Duke Street.

In order to house the additional Nursing Staff necessary to cope with the increased volume of work and a reduction in their working hours it is necessary to build a new Nurses' Home facing Union Street to accommodate a total Nursing Staff of 100 which will be reached gradually as required; the staff at present engaged is 60.

These additions involve a corresponding enlargement of Kitchens, Stores, Staff Dining Rooms and quarters for Resident Medical Staff, together with a new Power House, Laundry, etc.

The total cost of the Scheme, including demolition work, purchase of Properties, Furniture and Equipment, and Architects' Fees, is estimated at £150,000. Before deciding to embark upon so large an undertaking the Committee have received assurances of the following donations, namely :—

ST. MODWEN'S NURSING HOME.

REGULATIONS.

ADMISSIONS.

Applications for admission of Patients should be made to the Matron of the General Infirmary.

Patients may be sent into the Home, after such application, by any Doctor, and will be under his treatment and supervision.

Qualified Dental Surgeons (L.D.S.) may also treat Dental Patients in the Home.

In cases of emergency the services of the House Surgeons may be called upon, such services to be properly remunerated.

CHARGES.

FOR A PRIVATE ROOM, £6 6s. per week. Patients staying less than a week, £1 1s. per day.

FOR THE FIVE-BED WARDS, £3 13s. 6d. per week. Patients staying less than a week, £1 1s. for the first day and 10s. 6d. per day afterwards.

The above payments to include Board, Medicine, and ordinary Nursing Home Treatment and Nursing.

When an extra Nurse is required her services must be paid for by the Patient at current rates.

The Doctor's fee to be arranged between the Doctor and the Patient.

Accounts to be rendered weekly.

OPERATIONS.

Major operations requiring the use of the main Theatre may be performed by any Surgeon who is or has been on the Honorary Staff of a recognised Hospital.

Major operations to be performed as far as possible in the morning in order to avoid interference with the ordinary Hospital operations.

Minor operations may be performed in the Out-Patient Theatre by any Doctor.

MATERNITY CASES.

These cases cannot be admitted so long as the Burton Nursing Institution is providing facilities for them, except such cases as require Cæsarean Section.

LONG CASES.

No Patient shall be allowed to remain in the Home for a longer period than six weeks without the sanction of the Committee.

The Committee shall have absolute power at any time and without assigning any reason to terminate the stay of any Patient in the Home.

INFECTIOUS CASES.

These cases cannot be admitted, and any case developing infectious disease shall be at once removed if this can be done without endangering the life of the Patient.

VISITING.

Visitors are allowed between 10-30 and 11-30 o'clock in the morning, 3 and 4 o'clock in the afternoon, and 6-30 and 8 o'clock in the evening. Not more than two Visitors can be admitted to a Patient at the same time. No articles of Food or Drink to be brought into the Home except by express permission.
