

65 of the deaths occurred within 48 hours of admission.

At the end of August official notification was National received that a state of national emergency Emergency. existed and that preparations should be made to evacuate all patients possible on receipt of 24 hours notice in order to have the greatest number of beds available in case they were required for war casualties. On September 1st an order was received to take action and by the following day the number of patients in the hospital had been reduced to 25. For several weeks no new patients were admitted other than the most serious emergencies and accidents, and the authorities then decided that Hospitals could admit patients up to 60% of their normal working capacity. Later on when it was found that the war had not developed on the lines at first anticipated the work of the hospitals was resumed on normal lines with the understanding that arrangements for speedy evacuation would be made if necessary.

In addition to the beds evacuated a large number of emergency beds provided by the Ministry of Health was erected and in case of need the accommodation of the hospital has to be extended by a further 70 beds.

The training of Nurses enrolled in the Civil Nursing Reserve and A.R.P. has been undertaken. 67 Auxiliary Nurses have passed through the Wards for the stipulated minimum of 50 hours practical hospital experience and a further 20 are at present taking a similar course.

Apart from additional expenditure incurred before the outbreak of war by the purchase of increased stocks of Drugs, Surgical Dressings and Instruments and by lighting restrictions, etc., the amount expended under the Emergency Hospital Scheme in respect of the treatment of patients has been small. Interim payments made by the Government up to the end of the year amounted to £2,700; these payments have now been suspended and a substantial portion will have to be regarded as payments on account to meet future work undertaken under the Emergency Scheme.

Honorary Medical The Infirmary has suffered serious and Surgical Staff. losses during the year by the death of two members of the Honorary Staff.

Dr. J. B. Stanley, F.R.C.S., was appointed as an Assistant Surgeon in 1910 and as Surgeon in 1919, and had thus given 29 years invaluable service to the Institution, during which time he established the Ear, Nose and Throat Department and in addition subsequently supervised the Pathological Laboratory. His services were always placed unreservedly at the disposal of the Infirmary and its patients and your Committee desires to place on record its deep and sincere appreciation of his devoted work.

Mr. Naughton Dunn, who was appointed as Honorary Consulting Orthopædic Surgeon on the establishment of the Fracture Clinic in 1937, was recognised as one of the leading Orthopædic Surgeons in the country. His periodical visits to the Infirmary were of the utmost value and his untimely death will be deplored by this and many other hospitals.

Major E. H. Brindle, M.D., Honorary Physician, and Major E. M. R. Frazer, M.D., Hon. Assistant Radiologist, have been temporarily absent on Military duties since the outbreak of War.

Owing to the depletion of Staff and in view of the development of the services of the Hospital, the Committee decided after careful consideration to increase the number of Specialist appointments as follows:— Hon. Physician—F. Graham Lescher, M.C. M.D., (Cantab).

Whilst the gross income for the year shows a very substantial increase it has to be borne in mind that the Government payments of £2,700 under the Emergency Hospital Scheme are greatly in excess of the cost of the actual services rendered by treatment of patients admitted as the result of the war. These payments were discontinued at the end of the year, and the Government require that the balance remaining over the ascertained cost to the Infirmary shall be treated as payment on account to meet the cost of future work. Actually the ordinary income for the year shows a slight decrease in spite of an increase of £430 in the amount received from the Infirmary Saturday Collection. Receipts from Insurance Companies under the Road Traffic Act are less by £303, the previous year's figure having been exceptionally heavy, and under the heading of Dividends and Rents there is a diminished income owing to certain Income Tax repayments being received too late for inclusion in the accounts and to loss of rents of properties required in connection with the Extensions Scheme.

On the payments side practically every item shows a substantial advance. The greater portion of the increase of £1,593 is accounted for by special expenditure due to the emergency in the shape of lighting restrictions and protective work and additional purchases for reserve purposes of Drugs, Dressings, Surgical Instruments, etc. It is certain however, that there will be a substantial permanent increase in maintenance costs; in addition to the very heavy increase in the price of com-

modities, the shortage of nurses has resulted in a general advance in salaries, the full effect of which has not been felt in the accounts for the year. Moreover, the extensions now proceeding will greatly increase the accommodation provided and the scope of the services of the hospital. It is inevitable therefore, that a very substantially increased income has to be provided, and after careful consideration the Committee decided to proceed with the establishment of the new Contributory Scheme, more detailed reference to which is made later in this report.

Collection. Committee has again resulted in a new record collection, and for the first time in its history the sum raised has exceeded £10,000. Commencing in 1874, with the late Alderman Metcalfe as its Chairman, and Mr. John E. Wood as Honorary Secretary, the first collection raised £538; and an almost uninterrupted series of increased yearly totals, realising altogether over the period a gross figure of £185,255, may be regarded as the measure of the magnificent response of the Saturday Committee and its contributors, to the demand for the increased support necessary to meet the financial requirements of the great development of hospital services during the past 66 years.

As previously stated the Com-The New Contributory mittee decided to establish a Scheme. Contributory Scheme, as has been done with so much success in other towns during recent years. A very large number of both In-Patients and Out-Patients are treated every year at the Infirmary who make no systematic contributions towards the cost of the provision of such treatment, although they are able to do so and cannot be regarded as coming within the description of indigent or destitute poor, the treatment of the latter being the original object of the voluntary hospital movement. Under the new Scheme all contributors requiring treatment will be able to obtain vouchers on the same lines as under the Saturday Committee, but patients who are eligible to join the Scheme and in regular employment but who are not contributors, will be required to pay towards the cost of their treatment in accordance with the scale set out in the Scheme. No alterations will be made in the conditions relating to necessitous patients, who will continue to be treated without charge, and all casualties and emergencies will of course receive immediate treatment.

The issue of patients' recommendation notes to firms and private individuals who subscribe so generously to the funds will require modification. The need for this very substantial and valuable portion of the Infirmary's income will however, be greater than ever when the re-constituted hospital is brought into use and an earnest appeal is made to all supporters to continue their annual subscriptions and special efforts to enable the poorer section of the community to be provided for.

Extensions. Substantial progress has been made with the erection of the new Ward Block of 162 beds, the new Nurses Home and the Power House, for which a contract of over £120,000 was entered into by the Committee in the early part of the year. The magnificent response to the appeal for funds in the early months has been seriously slowed down owing to the War, but a number of notable contributions have been received, amongst which may be mentioned the fund organised by the then Mayoress (Mrs. J. W. Clark) by which the women of Burton raised the very gratifying sum of £475 8s. 3d. Welcome support has also been received from Friendly Societies and numerous social and sporting events, as well as private individuals, and the total of Donations promised or received now stands at £109,139 15s. 6d.

Thanks are due to Messrs. Bass, Ratcliff & Gretton Ltd. and Messrs. James Eadie Ltd. for their generous gift of land adjoining the Infirmary, which provides the site for the extensions.

Unconditional Legacies received during the year, amounting to £4,545 have been transferred to the Extensions Fund.

It might appear that the financial position of the Extension Scheme is not unfavourable, but it must be borne in mind that the present contract does not comprise the whole of the work originally envisaged. It was thought advisable to make a start on the more urgent and essential section of the work. If this had not been proceeded with the whole extension scheme would have been held up for the period of the war.

The Committee would point out that the furnishing of the New Wards and the Nurses Home, also the provision of the latest type of equipment and apparatus for the Operating Theatres and Wards will be an additional heavy cost that will have to be met.

Your Committee desires to place on record its deep sense of gratitude to these generous benefactors.

In her will the late Mrs. Holbrooke expressly stated that the legacy was bequeathed as a mark of her appreciation of the services given to the Infirmary by the late Sir Sydney Herbert Evershed. A sum of £1,000 has accordingly been placed to Investment Account for the endowment of a bed in the name of the late Chairman. The balance of the legacies has been placed to the credit of the Extensions Fund.

Gifts. The Infirmary, in common with many other hospitals throughout the country, has received through Lord Nuffield's generosity, a "Both Respirator," and the apparatus is available for cases requiring this form of treatment.

A Hobart mixing and mincing machine for the kitchen has been very kindly provided by Mrs. Manners.

Thanks. Your Committee would again express its very sincere thanks for the continued generosity of the large body of Annual Subscribers, and for the valued support received from the Infirmary Sunday Collections; also to all who have promoted or assisted in the many special efforts, entertainments, etc., organised on behalf of the funds of the Infirmary, both in the town and the surrounding district. Special mention should be made of the very successful Infirmary Ball arranged by the Mayor, and of the annual Flower Day.

The work of the Linen League and the Red Cross Sewing Party has again been of the utmost value and is acknowledged with gratitude.

The Annual Egg collection organised by the "Burton Daily Mail" was carried through with its customary efficiency and success, and thanks are due to the many helpers who provided the depots, and to all who responded so generously to the appeal.

Thanks are also tendered for the many gifts of vegetables, fruit, tinfoil, periodicals, etc., received throughout the year; to the contributors in cash and in kind for the Christmas Festivities; to the Police and the Press; and to all who by many and varied services have rendered invaluable help.

Committee. It is with deep regret that the Committee records the death of the late Mr. Alderman George Sanders, who for many years had rendered valuable service to the Institution, both on the General and the Saturday Committees.

During the year Mr. Alderman W. Hutson (Chairman of the Corporation Health Committee) was invited, and consented, to become a Member of the General Committee.

PRINCIPLES OF THE CONTRIBUTORY SCHEME established by the Committee of the Burton-on-Trent General Infirmary.

OBJECTS.

The purpose of the Scheme is to enable persons whose incomes are within certain defined limits:—

- To assist in the support of the Infirmary;
- 2. To provide by means of small periodical payments for Hospital service for themselves and their dependants, without charge.

2. MEMBERSHIP.

The following are eligible for membership :-

- Section 1. All persons who are entitled to Medical Benefit under the National Health Insurance Acts and other persons whose income does not exceed £300 a year.
- Section 2. Persons whose income exceeds £300 but does not exceed £500 a year may become contributors, but in these cases benefits will be confined to assistance in meeting maintenance costs only, not exceeding three weeks, whilst receiving In-patient treatment as Private Patients in St. Modwen's Nursing Home or the Infirmary.

3. SCALE OF CONTRIBUTIONS.

4. PRIVILEGES.

Treatment. Applicants for treatment will be admitted in accordance with the existing practice, and the Infirmary will continue to provide only such services as are outside the scope of the Family Doctor. In the case of Patients attending the Out-patient or Special Departments, a note from the Family Doctor must be produced.

Contributors, or their dependants, receiving treatment as In-Patients or Out-Patients at the Infirmary will **not** be asked to pay for such treatment, but will be asked to produce a Voucher certifying that they are contributing Members of the Scheme.

The term "dependant" covers wife, children not in employment, and relatives who are resident with and wholly dependent upon the Contributor.

A supply of Vouchers will be placed at the disposal of the Contributors through their Works, Shop, Office, District or Village Committee or Collector, for issue to Contributors and their Dependants. These Vouchers will be accepted at all Voluntary Hospitals and patients presenting the Voucher will be relieved of payment, and need not make any additional contribution to the Hospital giving treatment.

In the case of contributors under Section 2, consultation fees and Out-patient treatment cannot be included.

The privileges offered do not include Medical or Surgical Fees for services given in a Private Ward, Bed, or Nursing Home, nor financial assistance for patients treated in Sanatoria, Mental or Infectious Diseases Hospitals; nor do they include provision for services which should be rendered by the Private Practitioner, or under the National Health Insurance Acts, or by the Public Health Authorities, or for which an Insurance Company may be responsible.

In the event of Contributors or their dependants being admitted to or treated at other Hospitals as the result of accident or emergency, the scheme will be prepared to make a contribution towards the cost of maintenance.

Prior to admission or treatment at such Hospitals (other than as the result of accident or emergency), application should be made to the Organising Secretary of the Association.

No alteration will be made in the conditions relating to poor and necessitous patients who will continue to be treated without charge.

All Casualties and Emergencies will continue to be treated at once without question, and contributors will be required to obtain the usual Voucher as soon as practicable.

Persons joining the Scheme by July 1st, 1940, who have previously been contributors to the Infirmary Saturday Collection will be entitled to the privileges of the Scheme without any waiting period.

Young persons joining on securing their first employment after leaving school will also be entitled to immediate benefit.

In other cases a waiting period of 3 months will be imposed before a new member is entitled to benefit.

Contributors more than 13 weeks in arrears will forfeit all privileges.

Employers are earnestly invited to co-operate in the working of the Scheme:—

- (1) By encouraging their employees to join.
- (2) By giving facilities for contributions to be deducted from wages, or by allowing Collectors to be appointed.

5. HOW TO JOIN.

Employees at Breweries, Collieries, Factories, Shops, Offices, etc.:—

- (a) Obtain if possible the approval and help of your employer; fill in Form "A" and hand it in at the Office and your contributions will then be deducted from wages and remitted to the Infirmary monthly or quarterly
- or (b) Appoint one of your number as Collector.

Individual Contributors.

Contributions may be paid to authorised Collectors, or remitted quarterly to the Infirmary (see Form "B"). District and Village Committees will be formed.

Note. Employers may register Domestic Servants, Chauffeurs, Gardeners, etc., in the name of occupation instead of personal names.

To obtain treatment get a Voucher from your works and present it at the Infirmary. Members contributing through a Collector or direct to the Infirmary should apply to the Collector or the Secretary

In all cases (except accidents or emergency), patients should present a letter from their family doctor.

Patients who are eligible to join the Scheme and are in employment, and who are not contributors will be required to pay the following charges towards the cost of their maintenance and treatment.

REGULATIONS.

ADMISSIONS.

Applications for admission of Patients should be made to the Matron of the General Infirmary.

Patients may be sent into the Home, after such application, by

any Doctor, and will be under his treatment and supervision.

Qualified Dental Surgeons (L.D.S.) may also treat Dental

Patients in the Home.

In cases of emergency the services of the House Surgeons may be called upon, such services to be properly remunerated.

CHARGES.

FOR A PRIVATE ROOM, £6 6s. per week. Patients staying less

than a week, £1 1s. per day.

FOR THE FIVE-BED WARDS, £3 13s. 6d. per week. Patients staying less than a week, £1 1s. for the first day and 10s. 6d. per day afterwards.

Extra Charges are made for the following :-

Special Day and/or Night Nurses.

X-Rays.

Electrical and Massage Treatment.

Pathological Examination, Private Telephone Calls.

All Medicine and Vaccines to be supplied by the Doctor in charge of the case.

Sera will be supplied by the Home and charged to the Patient.

The Doctor's fee to be arranged between the Doctor and the Patient.

Accounts to be rendered weekly.

OPERATIONS.

Major operations requiring the use of the main Theatre may be performed by any Surgeon who is or has been on the Honorary Staff of a recognised Hospital.

Major operations to be performed as far as possible in the morning in order to avoid interference with the ordinary Hospital opera-

tions.

MATERNITY CASES.

These cases cannot be admitted so long as the Burton Nursing Institution is providing facilities for them, except such cases as require Cæsarean Section.

LONG CASES.

No Patient shall be allowed to remain in the Home for a longer period than six weeks without the sanction of the Committee.

The Committee shall have absolute power at any time and without assigning any reason to terminate the stay of any Patient in the Home

INFECTIOUS AND MENTAL CASES.

These cases cannot be admitted, and any case developing infectious disease shall be at once removed if this can be done without endangering the life of the Patient.

VISITING.

Visitors are allowed between 10-30 and 11-30 o'clock in the morning, 3 and 4 o'clock in the afternoon, and 6-30 and 8 o'clock in the evening. Not more than two Visitors can be admitted to a Patient at the same time. No articles of Food or Drink to be brought into the Home except by express permission.
