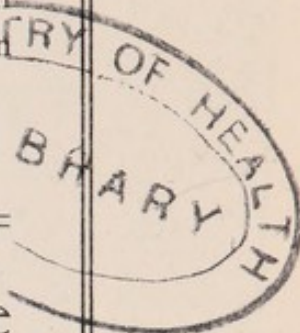

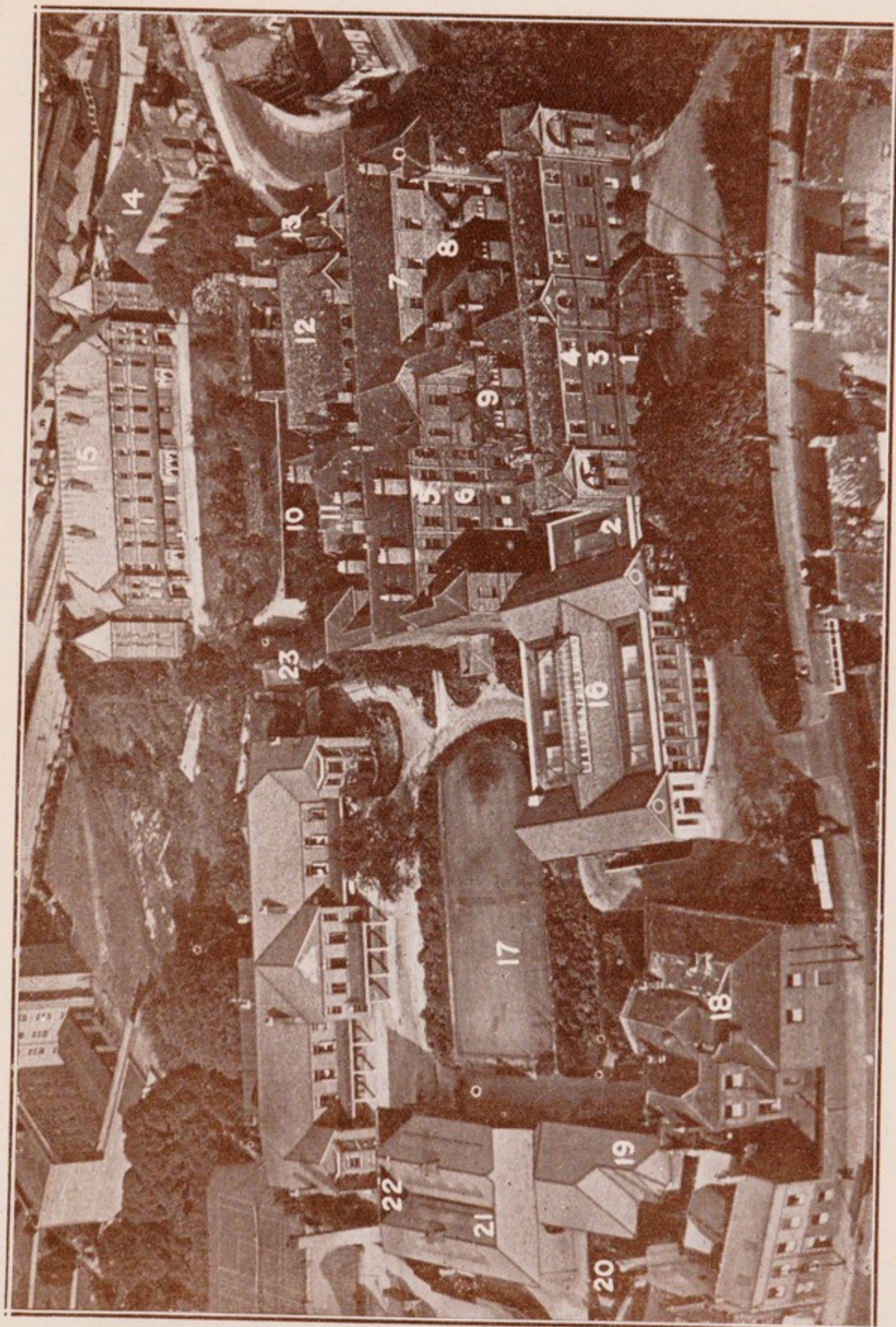

CHESTERFIELD AND NORTH DERBYSHIRE ROYAL HOSPITAL.

HISTORY.

THE Hospital was founded by Deed of Trust in 1854 and with it was incorporated a Dispensary, established in 1800 for the benefit of such poor people "as have not relief from the Parish and are unable to pay for medicine and assistance themselves."

The premises taken over for the Hospital were situate in St. Mary's Gate, opposite the Church, and were rented from Mr. Richard Dixon for £15 per annum, the rooms comprising a "parlour," a "front room," a "sitting room," two "lodging rooms" and two "attics."

The first meeting of the Board of Management was held on the 3rd May, 1854, when the Duke of Devonshire was elected President.

The Income for the first year was £714 18s. 4d., and the Expenditure, including equipment, amounted to £360 6s. 8d. The In-Patients numbered 10.

The Hospital accommodation, however, soon proved inadequate, and Durrant Hall and Grounds were purchased from the Duke of Devonshire for the nominal consideration of £100.

The Hall was demolished with the exception of the kitchens, which were utilised as part of the present buildings.

The foundation stone was laid on the 28th September, 1859, by the Rt. Hon. Spencer Compton Cavendish, Marquis of Hartington (afterwards the 8th Duke of Devonshire). The ceremony was preceded by a Public Breakfast and the stonelaying was carried out with full masonic honours, and in June, 1860, the Hospital was opened for the admission of cases.

In 1863 a special appeal was made to those employed in or about the Collieries, Manufactories and Railways of the district to support the Institution "expressly designed for their own benefit," and the workmen at a number of concerns consented to a deduction from their wages of sums varying from a farthing to a penny per week, and in the following year the Hospital had working men representatives elected by popular vote to sit on the Board of Management. This system has greatly extended and in 1930 the workpeople in the Hospital area contributed the very large sum of £15,250 1s. 1d. It should be noted that the employers have, by arrangement, agreed to contribute 33½ per cent. of the money contributed by the employees. The Board of Management includes, also, 12 working men representing the different industries and trades.

The Devonshire Ward and a new Dispensary were added in 1873, and the Portland Ward in 1890, bringing the accommodation for patients up to 60 beds.

In 1901 the late Alderman Edward Eastwood purchased from the School Board the Durrant Road School and the Board's Offices adjoining, and presented them to the Institution fully equipped for the purpose of two Medical Wards, the male Ward being named after the Donor and the female Ward after the late Earl Manvers, who performed the opening ceremony in April, 1902.

A Röntgen Ray apparatus was installed in 1903.

In 1904 the late Alderman Edward Eastwood gave to the Hospital a piece of land adjoining the Hospital, on which was subsequently erected a Nurses' Home, thus setting free, for the accommodation of further patients, the whole of the top floor of the original buildings. An Ophthalmic Department was also inaugurated. The alterations and extensions were carried out in 1907 and 1908 and provided for an increase of 39 surgical and ophthalmic beds, a Nurses' Home to accommodate all the Nursing Staff, an anæsthetic room, and a Mortuary, bringing up the total bed accommodation to 110.

On 29th July, 1908, the Nurses' Home was opened by the Duchess of Devonshire.

The Basil Ward of 20 beds, given by the late Mr. Charles Markham in memory of his brother, the late Sir Arthur Basil Markham, was opened on November 9th, 1916, making the total bed accommodation 150.

In January, 1918, the Royal Patronage was bestowed upon the Hospital, the title being changed to "The Chesterfield and North Derbyshire Royal Hospital."

The Orthopædic and Electrical Department was opened early in 1919, the Nurses' Dining Room being appropriated for this purpose, and the Board Room utilised for the Nurses' Dining Room.

In 1919 Ald. G. A. Eastwood gave to the Hospital Holywell House and grounds, on which a new Out-Patient block was erected, comprising Consulting rooms, Ophthalmic Examination room, Casualty room, Orthopædic, Electrical and Massage rooms, Pathological Laboratory, X-Ray rooms, etc. Alterations were made to Holywell House, providing accommodation for 23 members of the Nursing Staff. A Laundry was also erected and opened in 1923, the cost of the alterations and extensions amounting to £50,029 16s. 8d.

The old Out-Patient Department was adapted for the use of the Resident Medical Staff, which now numbers five, and considerable improvements were made in the old administrative block.

In 1923 the late Mr. Charles Markham gave shares to the value of £10,000 for the purpose of providing additional beds for women and children, and the Staveley Ward was built over the Devonshire Ward, bringing the total bed accommodation for patients up to 190. The addition of this Ward necessitated further accommodation for the Nursing Staff, and an annexe was built to Holywell House containing 18 rooms.

In 1926 an appeal was made by the Mayor of Chesterfield for providing a Wireless Installation, and every adult bed is now fitted with headphones, the Children's Ward having a Loud Speaker.

In 1931, a New Block of two storeys was opened by the Duke of Devonshire, the capital cost being £22,200. It contains on the first floor a Ward of 31 beds, called the Murphy Ward to commemorate the legacy of £10,000 bequeathed by the late Mr. Thomas Murphy. The ground floor comprises a new Ophthalmic Out-patient Department, a complete Theatre Unit for the use of this Department and the Ear, Nose and Throat Department, and a Laboratory for the Pathological Department. Eighteen additional rooms for the Nursing and Domestic Staffs were added to Holywell House. 126 milligrammes of Radium and the necessary accessories were purchased and a building erected for the Department, the total cost being £2,000. An X-Ray Film Store was also built. The bed accommodation for patients is now 220.

CHESTERFIELD AND NORTH DERBYSHIRE ROYAL HOSPITAL.

REPORT

Of the Board of Management for the Year ended 31st December, 1931.

The Board of Management have pleasure in presenting their Annual Report and Statement of Accounts for the past year ended 31st December, 1931, this being the 78th year since the establishment of the Hospital.

It is with sincere regret that the Board have to report the death of Mr. J. W. Tonks, who had been an Honorary Surgeon of the Institution for thirteen years. Mr. Tonks had, during the whole of this period, given most devoted and skilful service to the Institution, and it was in the exercise of this service that he lost his life. The Board desire to place on record their most sincere regret at his death, which is not only a great loss to the Institution but also to the district and to his many personal friends.

Mr. F. J. Milward, F.R.C.S., who had previously held an important surgical appointment at St. Thomas' Hospital, London, has been elected to fill the vacancy.

During the year there also occurred the death of Mr. Arthur Townrow, after a long illness. He had been a prominent member of the Board of Management and the House Committee for many years, to both of which bodies he had rendered great services. He was a most generous supporter of the Institution, having given considerable sums of money at various times.

EXTENSIONS.

The Extensions which were referred to in last year's Report, and which were commenced in July, 1930, were finally completed at the end of this year. They consist of a block of two storeys, on the first floor of which is situate a new Ward containing 31 beds, and this has been called the Murphy Ward to commemorate the legacy of £10,000 bequeathed by the late Mr. Thomas Murphy. The accommodation on the ground floor comprises (1) New Ophthalmic Department, (2) a complete Theatre Unit for

the use of this Department and the Ear, Nose and Throat Department, and (3) a Laboratory for the Pathological Department, etc.

An additional wing has also been added to Holywell House to provide the necessary accommodation for the increased Nursing and Domestic Staffs.

The total cost of the buildings and equipment is approximately £22,200, and to meet this liability a sum of £20,600 has been accumulated. This sum includes the above-mentioned legacy, without which it would have been impossible to proceed with the much needed extension. Mr. Murphy's name will always be remembered with gratitude by the Board and everyone interested in the Institution. There remains a debit balance of approximately £1,600 and the Board earnestly hope that generous donors will assist in removing the burden of this debt. The Block was formally opened by our President, the Duke of Devonshire, on the 10th December.

RADIUM.

As mentioned in last year's Report, generous donations have been given from time to time for the purpose of supplying Radium for the use of the Hospital, and during the year the fund was added to by a gift of £250 from Mr. S. Berresford, to whom the Board tender their most sincere thanks. Up to the present the total sum available for this Fund has reached £2,070, and with this money the Board have been able to purchase 126 milligrammes of Radium and provide the necessary building and equipment.

EXPENDITURE.

The Statement of Accounts shows that the Ordinary Expenditure for the year was £25,698 4s. 1d., against £25,133 17s. 0d. in 1930, and Special Expenditure £192 11s. 4d., mainly incurred in alterations to Durrant Hall, making a total of £25,890 15s. 5d., exclusive of the cost of the Venereal Department, £1,396 4s. 3d., which is defrayed by the County Council.

The Ordinary Expenditure was £564 7s. 1d. more than in 1930. The principal cause of the increase is the cost of the maintenance of the new Murphy Ward, which was occupied during the last three months of the year.

The Repairs and Improvements Suspense Account, which, on the 31st December, 1930, showed a credit balance of £708 9s. 3d., has been drawn upon during the year to the

extent of £638 0s. 1d., new floors having been laid down in Eastwood and Markham Wards and extensive improvements carried out in the Portland Ward.

INCOME.

The Ordinary Income was £25,809 1s. 8d., against £27,363 17s. 2d., a decrease of £1,554 15s. 6d.

While the Board very much regret such a serious decrease in the Income they are glad to be able to report that the Ordinary Income is practically equal to the Ordinary Expenditure, a result which in these very difficult times cannot be otherwise considered than as extremely satisfactory.

The new Murphy Ward and the other additions mentioned above will entail an increased expenditure of £4,000 per annum for maintenance, and the Board appeal to all sections of the Community to assist them in providing this extra sum. The workmen in the district have been specially appealed to. The question was brought up at a meeting of representatives of the working men on the 29th June, 1929, when a Resolution was passed by a large majority recommending that all workpeople in the area should subscribe one halfpenny per week for the maintenance of the new Ward in addition to the twopence already contributed. The workpeople employed at a certain number of firms have already complied with this request.

The Board of Management have in the past done their utmost to equip and maintain the Institution in a thoroughly up-to-date manner, and have been enabled to do so by the generosity of their subscribers.

It will be a calamity if through lack of funds the Board are not able in the future to maintain this high standard of efficiency and may even have to contemplate reducing the scope of their activities.

During the year a new organisation, called the Chesterfield Royal Hospital Voluntary Workers' Association, has been formed to replace what was generally known as the Carnival Committee. It is conducted on an entirely voluntary basis, and although the Association has only been at work for six months the very gratifying amount of £600 has been handed over to the Institution. The Board are extremely grateful to this organisation for the splendid efforts they are making and hope that during the next year they will achieve even greater results.

In order to supply accommodation for the use of this Committee and the entertainments they give, particularly

Whist Drives, the old Baptist Church, which is now called the Durrant Hall, and which was acquired by the Hospital in 1928, has been altered and renovated and now is an excellent building for entertainments and functions in connection with the Hospital.

The Chesterfield and District Agricultural Discussion Society has again attained another record, 56,009 eggs having been collected. The Board tender their most sincere thanks to the Society and to all the collectors, including the school children, for all their work in connection with it.

The Board also tender their most grateful thanks to all classes of subscribers for their generous assistance, and to the Hospital Committees (£1,137 6s. 10d.), the workers of the Women's Medical Ward Fund (£583 12s. 5d.), and the Alexandra Rose Day Fund (£134), for their efforts on behalf of the Hospital.

These sums have been placed to the credit of the Capital Account (General Purposes).

A Legacy of £750 has also been received from the Executors of the late Mr. Ernest Edmund Barnes, and this sum has been placed to the credit of the Radium Fund Account.

Under the Will of the late Rev. Hugon S. Tayler, the Hospital will receive a Legacy of £50 free of duty. The Board greatly appreciate this remembrance, particularly as whilst residing in Chesterfield Mr. Tayler was a very helpful and sincere worker on the House Committee for many years.

IN-PATIENTS AND OUT-PATIENTS.

During the year 1931, 2,623 patients were admitted to the Hospital, being 163 less than in 1930. At the close of the year 1930 there were 157 patients in the Institution, so that 2,780 in all have received In-Patient treatment, being a decrease of 168 compared with 1930.

Of the 157 patients remaining in Hospital at the end of 1930, 141 were cured or relieved, four unrelieved, six died, two were transferred to other Institutions, two left at own request, and two remained in Hospital.

The total number of deaths of patients admitted during the year was 157, of which number 59 died within 48 hours of admission.

There have been 4,221 cases in which anæsthetics have been administered during the year, the number of operations performed being 4,407.

There were 4139 persons X-Rayed during the year, and in the X-Ray Therapeutical and Diathermy Department 40 patients (23 new, 17 old) made 608 attendances. Screen examinations numbered 350. In the Ultra-Violet Ray Department 137 cases were dealt with, the number of attendances being 1392.

During the year, 7611 patients were treated in the Out-Patient Department, as compared with 7541 in 1930.

In addition to the above, 6,024 cases were treated in the Casualty Department, of which number 1,265 persons ultimately became In-Patients.

In the Orthopædic, Electrical and Massage Department the attendances numbered 30,584.

The total attendances of Out-Patients, excluding the Venereal Department, numbered 84,772.

In the Special Department dealing with Venereal Diseases, the number of new cases dealt with was 321. During the year, 184 persons were discharged cured. The whole of the expenses in this Department are borne by the County Authorities.

GENERAL.

In addition to the extensions which have been referred to above, during the year there have been further considerable improvements. The Portland Ward has been entirely

renovated, making it now a thoroughly modern and well-equipped Ward.

The equipment of the Kitchens has also been amplified and brought up to date to meet the increased demands arising out of the enlargement of the Hospital.

A small building at some distance from the main buildings has been erected for the purpose of storing X-Ray films required for record purposes, as the retention of these in the Main Block has been found to be a source of danger in the experience of other Hospitals.

Other improvements have been carried out with a view to keeping the Hospital in a thoroughly up-to-date condition.

With the addition of the Murphy Ward, the Hospital now consists of 220 beds, and as the maintenance of these beds and all the other activities of the Hospital will entail a cost of about £30,000 per annum, it will be realised what a serious responsibility rests upon the Board of Management.

The Board wish to point out that a very large proportion of their annual income comes in almost at the last moment, and they again appeal very strongly to subscribers to give their subscriptions as early in the year as possible, so that the Board may be able to meet the liabilities as and when they fall due, especially as in the case of the salaries and wages of the nursing and other members of the Staff, the payments are made monthly.

A new scheme has been formulated for the provision of Blood Donors, as a result of which certain members of the St. John Ambulance Brigade and the Rover Scouts have been good enough to offer their services, in addition to members of the Chesterfield Borough Police, who for some time past have been willing volunteers. The Board take this opportunity of expressing their appreciation of their services.

The Ladies' Section of "Toc H" still continue to run the Canteen for the supply of refreshments for the patients attending the Out-patient Department. This has in the past proved a great boon to the patients attending and hearty thanks are given to the ladies who devote so much time and trouble to this useful work.

Numerous gifts have been presented to the Hospital during the year, and the Board desire to express their thanks to the donors.

The Board of Management wish to draw the attention of the benevolent public to the fact that a bed may be named in perpetuity upon receipt of £1,000, or of a legacy of the same amount (free of duty) specially bequeathed for this purpose, and that a cot may be named under the same conditions upon payment of £500.

A tablet with an inscription recording the names of the benefactors, or that of relatives or friends whom it is desired to commemorate, would be affixed to the bed so appropriated.
