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

Orthopædic Clinic

Hon. Secretary, Mrs. E. T. Chamberlayne

2. An Orthopædic Clinic is held at the Hospital on the 1st and 3rd Tuesdays in each month at 2.30 p.m., 1.30 p.m. on Doctor's day. Patients on the Roll, December 31st, 1926, 53; discharged cured, 4; discontinued treatment, 1; left the district, 8. Children of school age, 22; under school age, 7; Adults, 24. Number of attendances in 1926, 190. Plaster bandages used (approximate number) 500. Mr. Girdlestone, M.A., B.M., F.R.C.S., & Dr. Stoker have attended the Clinic 6 times.

Motor Ambulance

3. Thanks to the Red Cross Society, the Committee of the Hospital have been able to afford facilities for the use of the Red Cross Motor Ambulance in the Town and District when required. The Car has been used on 44 occasions, the distance covered being 1386½ miles, at a cost to the persons using the same, sufficient only to cover the actual running expenses.

The Committee also wish to acknowledge the help rendered by Members of the St. John's Ambulance Brigade when called upon.

Alterations and Improvements

4. During the year some important improvements have been effected on the premises, and the Committee are pleased to report that the Nurses' quarters have been altered, and are now suitable for their needs. A system of Central Heating has been installed, which has greatly added to the comfort of the Hospital. The X-Ray department has been moved over to the Out-Patients block and has been equipped with the most modern apparatus, which enables the Hospital to do more efficient work.

Legacy

5. The Committee desire to record their deep appreciation of the Legacy of £500 made to the Hospital, under the Will of the late Mr. A. L. Warner.

Donations

- 6. The Committee are grateful for Donations received from the Hospital Saturday Fund £140, and from the Royal Agricultural Show Collection £12 5s. 1d., and from all other Entertainments, Charities, etc., and desire to thank those who have helped in any way to make this source of income so satisfactory.
- 7. The Committee desire to acknowledge the generosity of those Friends who have sent presents of Clothing, Eggs, Fruit, Vegetables, Books and many other useful things for the patients, and would be grateful for a continuance of similar gifts.

Our thanks are due to Mrs. Daly for kindly organizing the Egg Day and Pound Day; also to Mrs. J. Hartwell for the donation of £15 1s. Od. from her Tree Competition. This amount is in a separate Fund opened for donations towards the installation of wireless in the wards.

Wireless in the wards.

8. The Collections made at various Places of Worship during the year amounted to £36 14s. 2d. The amount collected in the Collection Boxes was £6 6s. 7d. The Committee tender their best thanks to all those who have encouraged this welcome source of income, and are glad to see that the amount in the Boxes is double last year's Collection.

2d. Weekly Contribution Scheme

9. This Scheme has yielded £247 8s. 5d. this year, and the Committee wish to thank Mr. Hubert Burden, the Hon. Sec.. and all helpers for the assistance they have rendered in the work of the Scheme. The Secretary of the Scheme attends at the Hospital on the first Monday of each Month from 7 to 8 p.m., to receive contri-

butions. It is hoped that all wage-earners who have not already availed themselves of this opportunity of becoming regular subscribers to the Hospital, will do so, and secure free nursing and maintenance at the Hospital or free medical treatment, nursing and maintenance at the Radcliffe Infirmary and County Hospital.

Nursing and Medical Staff

- 10. The Committee are pleased to record its appreciation of the efficient manner in which the Matron and her Staff have maintained the high standard of the Hospital.
- 11. In concluding this report, the Committee tender their most appreciative and grateful thanks to Mr. Bevers, M.A., M.B.B.Ch. Oxon, F.R.C.S., Hon. FORM OF BEQUEST

TO THE

Chipping Norton & District War Memorial Hospital

The following Form of Bequest is submitted for the guidance of any one desirous of benefiting the Institution by means of a Legacy under his or her will.

I give and bequeath to the Chipping Norton and District War Memorial Hospital for the general purposes of the Institution the sum of pounds, and I direct the same to be paid (free of duty) to the Treasurer for the time being, whose receipt shall be a sufficient discharge.

Note -Land or other Property or Money charged or secured thereon may now legally be given for charitable purposes.

* In Bye-Law No: 8 lead! Cases Known Whe Infection, or of Mental Disorder, and Inturable or Inoperable are not eligible for admission. 1-This Institution shall be called the "Chipping Norton and District War Memorial Hospital."

2—The Institution shall be managed by a Committee consisting of the President of the Hospital, the Mayor of Chipping Norton, the Trustees, the Treasurer of the Hospital, the Medical Staff, the Secretary of Contributory Scheme (all ex-officio), and 15 other Members, viz. -

9 Elected by the Annual Meeting.

,, and representing the surrounding District. ,, and Nominated by the local Friendly Societies. 27 12 ,. and Nominated by the Local Trades Unions.

3-A General Meeting of the Subscribers shall be held early in each year, notice of which shall be given at least seven days previously by an announcement in the local press. At this Meeting the President, Secretary, Treasurer, Committee and Auditors shall be elected for the ensuing year, and the Annual Report and Balance Sheet received.

4—At all Meetings of the Committee seven shall form a quorum.

5—The Medical Staff shall consist of all duly qualified practitioners residing within the district.

6-All Annual Subscriptions shall become payable on the 1st day of January in each year.

BYE-LAWS

1-Each patient while in Hospital shall be attended by his own Doctor. Cases admitted not under the care of any particular Doctor shall be allotted to the Medical Staff in rotation.

2-No Doctor shall occupy more than his fair proportion of beds unless by mutual arrangement with other Members of the Staff.

3-No patient shall be admitted without a recommendation of one of the Medical

Staff except in the case of accidents.

4-There shall be a minimum charge of 5/- weekly for admission to a general ward, except in the case of 2d. a week subscribers who will be admitted free on production of their card paid up to date. The fee for medical attendance as arranged with the Doctor will be in addition.

5-In ordinary cases the weekly payment of a patient in a private ward shall be at least £2 2s. The fee for medical attendance as arranged with the Doctor

will be in addition.

6-For Maternity cases the charge shall be £1 is weekly paid to the Hospital, or other sum to be decided by the Committee. The 2d. weekly subscription does not include Maternity Benefit. The fee for medical attendance as arranged with the Doctor will be in addition.

7-Cases other than urgent will, before admission, arrange with the Matron the amount of the weekly payment to be made to the Hospital. Such arrange-

ments to be subject to confirmation by the General Committee.

* 8-Infectious Cases, Cases of Mental Disorder and Incurable or Inoperable Cases are not eligible for admission.

9-Patients friends shall be admitted to visit them Wednesday, Saturday and Sunday Afternoons from 2 till 4 at the discretion of the Matron. Not more than two persons shall be allowed to visit a patient on any one day.

10 - No patient shall receive food or drink from any but the Hospital Authorities

without the special sanction of the Matron.

11-Patients shall strictly observe the hours appointed for all the arrangements of the Hospital.

13-No patient shall go beyond the garden without the special leave of Matron.

14-No male patient shall enter the female wards and no female patient shall enter the male wards without the special permission of the Matron.

15-Smoking shall be permitted in the men's ward in the afternoon and evening at the discretion of the Matron.

16-The Hospital shall be open for the inspection of visitors on Wednesday from 2 till 4 p.m.
