



Motor Ambulance

2. Thanks to the Red Cross Society, the Committee of the Hospital have been able to afford facilities for the use of the Red Cross Motor Ambulance in the Town and District when required. The Car has been used on 28 occasions, the distance covered being 541 miles, at a cost to the persons using the same, sufficient only to cover the actual running expenses.

Donations

3. The Committee are grateful for the Donations received from Hospital Saturday Fund, from the Engineers' Cup Competition, from the Hospital Cup Competition, and from all other Entertainments and Charities, etc., and thank those who have helped in anyway to make this source of income so atisfactory.

Gifts

- 4. The Committee acknowledge with gratitude the following gifts made to the Hospital during the year:—Two cots given by Miss Boulton, of Tew Park. A complete set of babies' linen given by the Women's Institute, of Great and Little Tew. Surgical appliances and other useful articles given by Mrs. D. Samuda, of Bruern Abbey. Special thanks are offered to the Ladies' Working Party of the Baptist Church and the Oxfordshire Needlework Guild for their continued generosity shown by their gifts of linen and other things.
- 5. The Committee sincerely thank all Friends who have sent presents of Clothing, Eggs, Fruit, Flowers, Vegetables, Books and other useful things for the patients, and ask for a continuance of these gifts.

Egg Day and Pound Day were very successful and the Committee are

indebted to Mrs. Daly for organizing these special days.

Wireless Fund

6. The Committee have much pleasure in stating that a 3-valve Marconi Wireless Set is now installed in the Hospital, and would like to thank all the patients and other friends who have made it possible to put it in free from debt.

Extension Fund

- 7. The Committee note with gratitude the donations given towards this fund from the maternity patients of the Hospital and from other friends, and beg for a continuance of their help. The great increase in the number of maternity cases during the past year has proved the need for more suitable accommodation than the present arrangements can give. The Committee have therefore most carefully considered the question, and after a thorough investigation of the matter, have decided to instal a Maternity Ward over the Outpatients' block. Any help by means of donations or other gifts will be very welcome.
- 8. The Collections made at various Places of Worship during the year amounted to £37 8s. 3d. The amount collected in the Collection Boxes was £6 7s. 4d. The Committee offer their best thanks to all those who have helped towards this source of income. They make a special appeal to all collectors to make greater efforts in the future, and would be very grateful for such help.

2d. Weekly Contribution Scheme

9. This Scheme has yielded £301 16s. 11d. this year, and the Committee wish to thank Mr. Hubert Burden, the recent Hon. Secretary, and all helpers for the assistance they have rendered in the work of the Scheme. The Hon. Secretary attends at the Hospital on the first Monday of each Month from 7 to 8 p.m., to receive contributions. It is hoped that all wage-earners who have not already availed themselves of this opportunity of becoming regular subscribers to the Hospital, will do so, and secure free nursing and maintenance at the Hospital or free medical treatment, nursing and maintenance at the

Radcliffe Infirmary and County Hospital. The following treatments have been given to Weekly Contributors during the past year:—In-Patients 52, Beds occupied 1610; Out-Patients 14, Treatments given 285; X Ray Patients 28, Photographs taken 50; Massage & Electricity Patients 12, Treatments given 377.

- 10. The Committee are pleased to record their appreciation of the efficient manner in which the Matron and her Staff have maintained the high standard of the Hospital.
- 11. In concluding this report, the Committee tender their most appreciative and grateful thanks to Mr. Bevers, M.A., M.B.B.Ch. Oxon, F.R.C.S., Hon. Surgeon, Mr. Girdlestone, M.A., B.M., F.R.C.S., the Medical Staff, the Hon. Auditors, Messrs. M. K. Pearson and B. H. Gibbs, Hon. Solicitor, Mr. S. G. Farrant, Hon. Treasurer, Mr. T. E. Davis, Hon. Secretary, Miss O. L. Hawkyard for their able and gratuitous services, and to those who have in any way assisted in carrying on the work of the Institution.

FORM OF BEQUEST

TO THE

Chipping Norton & District War Memorial Hospital

The following Form of Bequest is submitted for the guidance of any one desirous of benefiting the Institution by means of a Legacy under his or her will.

I give and bequeath to the Chipping Norton and District War Memorial Hospital for the general purposes of the Institution the sum of pounds, and I direct the same to be paid (free of duty) to the Treasurer for the time being, whose receipt shall be a sufficient discharge.

Note—Land or other Property or Money charged or secured thereon may now legally be given for charitable purposes.

RULES

- 1—This Institution shall be called the "Chipping Norton and District War Memorial Hospital."
- 2—The Institution shall be managed by a Committee consisting of the President of the Hospital, the Mayor of Chipping Norton, the Trustees, the Treasurer of the Hospital, the Medical Staff, the Hon. Secretary of Contributory Scheme (all ex-officio), and 15 other Members, viz.—

9 Elected by the Annual Meeting.

- 3 ., ,, ,, ,, and representing the surrounding District.
 2 ,, ,, ,, and Nominated by the local Friendly Societies.
 1 ,, ,, ,, ,, ,, and Nominated by the Local Trades Unions.
- 3—A General Meeting of the Subscribers shall be held early in each year, notice of which shall be given at least seven days previously by an announcement in the local press. At this Meeting the President, Secretary, Treasurer, Committee and Auditors shall be elected for the ensuing year, and the Annual Report and Balance Sheet received.
- 4-At all Meetings of the Committee seven shall form a quorum.
- 5-The Medical Staff shall consist of all duly qualified practitioners residing within the district.
- 6-All Annual Subscriptions shall become payable on the 1st day of January in each year.

BYE-LAWS

- 1—Each patient while in Hospital shall be attended by his own Doctor. Cases admitted not under the care of any particular Doctor shall be allotted to the Medical Staff in rotation.
- 2-No Doctor shall occupy more than his fair proportion of beds unless by mutual arrangement with other Members of the Staff.
- 3-No patient shall be admitted without a recommendation of one of the Medical Staff except in the case of accidents.
- 4—There shall be a minimum charge of 5/- weekly for admission to a general ward, except in the case of 2d.a week subscribers who will be admitted free on production of their card paid up to date. The fee for medical attendance as arranged with the Doctor will be in addition.
- 5—In ordinary cases the weekly payment of a patient in a private ward shall be at least £2 2s-The fee for medical attendance as arranged with the Doctor will be in addition.
- 6—For Maternity cases the minimum charge shall be £1 ls. weekly paid to the Hospital, or other sum to be decided by the Committee. The 2d. weekly subscription does not include Maternity Benefit. The fee for medical attendance as arranged with the Doctor will be in addition.
- 7—Cases other than urgent will, before admission, arrange with the Secretary the amount of weekly payment to be made to the Hospital. Such arrangements to be subject to confirmation by the General Committee.
- 8-Cases, known to be Infectious or of Mental Disorder and Incurable or Inoperable, are not eligible for admittance.
- 9—Patients friends shall be admitted to visit them Wednesday, Saturday and Sunday Afternoons from 2 till 4 at the discretion of the Matron. Not more than two persons shall be allowed to visit a patient on any one day.
- 10-No patient shall receive food or drink from any but the Hospital Authorities without the special sanction of the Matron.
- 11-Patients shall strictly observe the hours appointed for all the arrangements of the Hospital.
- 13-No patient shall go beyond the garden without the special leave of Matron.
- 14—No male patient shall enter the female wards and no female patient shall enter the male wards without the special permission of the Matron.
- 15—Smoking shall be permitted in the men's ward in the afternoon and evening at the discretion of the Matron.
- 16-The Hospital shall be open for the inspection of visitors on Wednesday from 2 till 4 p.m.
