GENERAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1929.

CHORLEY,

January, 1930.

To the Governors of the Chorley Hospital.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

The Board of Management beg to submit their Annual Report, together with the Statement of Accounts for the year ending December 31st, 1929.

During the year the work has increased as shown by the number of operations, which is an advance in numbers of 91. Motor accidents claim a total of 114, a slight increase on last year.

Finance.

Notwithstanding the continual depression in most of the local Industries, the Board are pleased to report that the financial support given to the Hospital has been most satisfactory. The total income received was £4,091 7s. 10d. (compared with £4,183 18s. 9d. for the previous year) and the expenditure £3,925 19s. 10d. (compared with £3,346 16s. 9d.)

Obituary.

It is with deep regret that we record the death of Dr. J. A. Harris, J.P., who died on September 6th, 1929, and was interred on September 10th. His work for the Chorley Hospital, of which he was President and Trustee, is well known. Very much of the time that he was able to spare from other duties was devoted to the interests of this Institution. He was also one of the originators of the scheme for a Hospital which was opened in 1893. He will long be remembered by those who knew him for his geniality and important work done for the Hospital.

New Hospital.

At the end of March the Architectural Competition closed, and the Assessor's award was as follows :—

In May, Mr. Garner, of Liverpool, was appointed quantity surveyor.

The drainage question, one of the great objections to the Rookwood site, was the fact that we could not connect with the main sewer in Preston Road without considerable alterations in the plans. After several meetings with the Corporation and the Trustees of the Tatton Estate, the Hospital Committee are pleased to report that an arrangement has been come to, by which each of the three parties have agreed to pay one-third of the total costs including legal expenses. The plans have been submitted to the Building Committee, and after some interviews with the Architect, will be ready for submitting to the Corporation in regard to the lay-out of the buildings, and we hope to be able to ask for tenders in a few weeks.

Visiting Staff.

The Committee once again express their appreciation of the valuable services rendered by the Visiting Staff, who give so much time and labour to the Hospital.

House Visitors.

The House Visitors, who are appointed each month, and who make frequent unannounced visits, speak with pride on the working of the Institution and the care and attention bestowed on the patients; in no case have they had any complaints to make of the treatment. The Committee have again great pleasure in acknowledging the loyalty and devotion of the Matron and her Staff to their work.

Ladies' Linen League.

The Linen League is an invaluable auxiliary to the organisation of the Hospital, and our warmest thanks are extended to the Committee for their continuance in the work which has, year by year, proved of such benefit to the Hospital.

Ladies' Committee.

The Committee again wish to tender their thanks to Miss Hibbert and the Ladies for their work in collecting subscriptions. This year the amount shows a slight decrease.

Workpeople's Fund.

We desire to thank the Committee of the Workpeople's Hospital Fund, who, in spite of the depression in our staple industry, have raised the sum of £1,500. Our warmest thanks are tendered to the Officers, Representatives and Contributors for their splendid help, which has been of the greatest benefit to the Hospital.

Donations and Gifts.

The Board are very grateful to all those who have worked so strenuously to raise funds for the year. Amongst these we would mention The Chorley Golf Club, Townley Parker Lodge, 1,032, Police Force, Chamber of Trade, Chorley A.F. Club, Tennis Tournament Committee, East Ward Rose Festival, Etc., The Misses Stone, and Messrs. Ingham & Tipping.

Other Efforts.

The Collectors of Tin-foil will be pleased to know that their efforts have resulted in raising £13 6s. 5d. No less a sum than £52 has been obtained in the last three years by the sale of Tin-foil.

The Scholars of St. Peter's School collected and forwarded to the Hospital 500 Eggs.

To Philanthropic Friends,

No gift to the Hospital is more valuable than the endowment of a bed or cot, as the money is permanently invested and the income applied in perpetuity for the maintenance of the desired object. Better means cannot be chosen to commemorate, for all time, the memory of a relative or friend.

The following Rule is deserving of serious consideration by philanthropic friends as forming a suitable way to permanently commemorate the loss of a relative or friend, and at the same time do something for the relief of human suffering.

Rule.—Every donor of One Thousand Pounds to the Endowment Fund of the Hospital shall have the right to have his or her name affixed to one of the Beds in perpetuity; and every donor of Five Hundred Pounds shall have the right to have his or her name affixed to one of the Children's Cots in perpetuity.

RULES OF THE CONTRIBUTORY SCHEME.

1. All Employees are eligible to join the scheme, but where the family income exceeds £250 per annum members of the Medical Staff may at their discretion charge the usual Fees.
2. The Voluntary Levy may be either ONE PENNY or TWO PENCE a week. Two pence a week secures free treatment at the Hospital to the Contributor and all other dependent members of the family. One penny a week secures free treatment at the Hospital to the Contributor only.
3. By free treatment at the Hospital is meant also the services which the Hospital can render, including House Surgeon's Services, X-Ray, Massage, Pathological Investigations, &c.
4. But free treatment at the Chorley Hospital does not apply to services rendered by the Hospital on behalf of the Local Education Committee, County Council, Pensions Committee, Maternity and Child Welfare Committee, nor to Maternity Cases, etc.
5. In the above circumstances the Medical Staff will waive any claim to receive any percentage of monies received from Approved Societies Insurance Committees, Contributory Schemes, Employers of Labour, and massed or periodical contributions of Employees.

In addition to Free Hospital Treatment at Chorley, the Fund makes provision for its members to have Recommends for Preston Royal Infirmary, in conjunction with the Workpeople's Scheme at Preston; and free Recommends for Southport and Buxton Convalescent Hospitals for suitable cases.

Recommends are available for Bolton, Wigan and Blackburn Infirmaries; and also for Twenty-five Hospitals in Manchester and District, in conjunction with the Manchester and Salford Medical Charities, on most favourable terms to our members.

The Fund subscribes to the following local Institutions:—Chorley and District Nursing Association, Care Committee for Consumptives, and the St. John Ambulance Brigade, as being Kindred Institutions deserving of the support of the Fund.

CHORLEY AND DISTRICT WORKPEOPLE'S CENTRAL HOSPITAL FUND, 1929.

This Fund has made further remarkable progress. The Contributions have increased by 25% in value, and its membership has increased by 50% in number of bodies contributing.

Although the amount shewn on the Accounts does not give the actual increase, this is due to the fact that the balance of the Fund has yet to be allocated. £2,000 only has been allocated as yet.

The Hospital Authorities can look forward to a progressive increase from this Fund in future years, for the Committee of same are alive to the fact that if the best Hospital Treatment is required, the means to provide it will have to come from those who require it, in a *collective* manner.
