The 29th Annual Report of the Board of Management.

The Board of Management has very much pleasure in presenting its 29th Annual Report, and in doing so has every confidence that the matter contained within its pages will be sufficient evidence if carefully studied to convince every donor and subscriber that the past year's work has been most satisfactory from whatever standpoint it is viewed—medical, administrative or financial.

The Medical Report, as submitted by the Medical Committee, will show the great increase in the number of cases treated during the past year, and can be well left to speak for itself, but the Board here offers its most sincere and warm congratulations to the Surgeons (Consulting and Acting) the Medical Staff, the Matron and Nurses and all who by their surgical, medical or nursing skill have co-operated in the alleviation of pain and suffering and the achievement of such excellent results, and if proof of this good work is needed it can be found in the many letters received continually from patients (or their friends) speaking in the highest terms of thankfulness and gratitude for what has been done for them by both the Medical and Nursing Staff.

FURTHER EXTENSION.

Two years ago (September, 1926) the enlarged Hospital (to accommodate twice the number of patients) was formally opened, and it was thought then that it would be some considerable time before any further extension would become necessary. Circumstances and facts, however, have proved the contrary, and by a glance at the statistics in the Medical Report (reference to which has already been made) it will be realised that the present accommodation is insufficient to keep pace with the rapid development of Clacton and the District, with its ever increasing population, together with the casualties arising from the number of accidents caused by the motor traffic in the Season. Accordingly the Board, being fully aware of its responsibilities and obligations, appointed, at a meeting held in November last, a Committee to discuss with the Matron, the lines upon which immediate extension was necessary, and at the same time, acting upon the advice

of your esteemed President, to take a broad survey of enlargement upon a comprehensive basis, and obtain plans for what, with the present rate of increase in population, must eventually become a much larger Institution. The Extension Committee has already got to work, and given instructions for the preparation of a draft plan, and although the details will require careful consideration for development before adoption, the Board wishes to emphasise the fact that part of the work at any rate must be taken in hand without loss of time, the most pressing and urgent need being the provision of a Casualty Ward, and a general Waiting Room. Relying upon the goodwill, the hearty support and liberality of the kind friends in Clacton and District as evidenced in the past, the Board feels confident that the raising of the necessary Fund for the work will meet with a generous response, both in Donations and by the organisation of all kinds of entertainments, and the fact that Mrs. H. J. Grant has once again most kindly undertaken the responsible position of the "Extension Fund" Secretary, ensures, in a great measure, the success of the Scheme. It is pleasing to note that she has at the present moment £,208 178 3d in hand as a nucleus of the Fund, and the co-operation of such an excellent body of workers, as she can always rely upon, encourages her to go forward. Attention is drawn to the fact, that in accordance with a resolution passed at the last Annual Meeting, the word "Cottage" has been deleted from the Title, and the Hospital is now known as the "Clacton and District Hospital," but like all good names it has proved a 'Die-hard'; the change in the name, however, should be noted by Subscribers and others when drawing cheques to its credit.

NEW OFFICE ACCOMMODATION.

The amount of clerical and administrative work for the Hospital having considerably increased, it was found necessary to find more suitable offices, and your Finance Committee, together with other members of the Board, made an inspection of rooms to let at Halifax House, 43, Station Road, and having made a favourable report to the Board of Management, it was agreed to rent two rooms from the "Halifax Building Society," the terms and conditions being incorporated in a properly constituted legal agreement. The offices are in a central position and the cost to the Hospital exceeds by very little that of the original office,

APPOINTMENT OF HON. SOLICITOR.

Questions of minor legal advice having occasionally arisen, it was felt by the Board that the time had come when it would be advisable in the interests of the Hospital, to enlist the honorary services of a gentleman in the legal profession, who would be available and willing to give an opinion upon any legal point that might arise, it being understood that such appointment would be in conformity with all other hospitals. It was decided unanimously that Mr. E. M. Leaning should be asked if he would be willing to act in that capacity, and it is with great satisfaction and much pleasure that the Board is able to report his acceptance of the honorary position.

LADIES' LINEN LEAGUE.

The Board once more wishes to place on record its high appreciation of the great assistance rendered to the Hospital by the Ladies' Linen League.

A reference to the Committee's own Report and Balance Sheet will show what a valuable aid to the Hospital this organisation has proved itself to be and grateful thanks to the Officers and Committee are tendered by the members of the Board, who at the same time wish to express their sincere sympathy with Mrs. Larkham, the founder and indefatigable Secretary of the League, in her impaired state of health, with the hope that she may soon be restored to good health.

TINFOIL COLLECTION.

This comparatively new organisation, so far as the Clacton and District Hospital is concerned, which owes its inauguration and successful operation to Miss Fitch, has again this year been instrumental in raising more than the necessary amount for the Annual Endowment of a "Cot."

Miss Fitch is to be highly commended for the keenness and energy she gives to this branch of the Hospital work which at times requires a good deal of forbearance on the part of the organiser, and the Board, in its expression of thanks to her, would also like to include all those who kindly sent to her their collection if Tinfoil and Leadfoil.

HOUSE COMMITTEE.

The establishment of this Committee, reference to which was made in the last Annual Report, has proved its worth over and over again during the past year. Its officers and members take a very keen interest in assisting the Matron in the administrative work, and in the general welfare and comfort of the patients. This was well illustrated at Christmas and the New Year, when the Committee was able to render some assistance to the Matron and her Staff in providing one or two entertainments for the patients.

The work is carried out by the Committee in a very thorough and businesslike manner, and reflects great credit upon its Chairman and Secretary who devote much time and thought to the many details which come under their notice.

In the presentation of this Report the Board feels the great debt of gratitude it owes to all who have given of their substance large or small, or of their services to the support of the Hospital, either as individual Subscribers or Donors, or as members of a corporate body, who have assisted in any way to carry on the beneficent work.

To all, the Board extends sincere and grateful thanks, and without wishing to appear in the least invidious, it would like to express its high appreciation of the following Clubs or Societies:

Coan Football Competition, Clacton Bowling Club, Clacton Comedy Club,

Stock Exchange Dramatic and Operatic Society, each of which has raised a considerable sum for the Hospital Funds or the endowment of a bed (under Rule 18).

It would be almost impossible to adequately thank those ladies who year by year organise the Street Collections or "Flag Days," including the "Alexandra Rose Day," the total sum derived from this source of revenue for the Hospital this year amounting to nearly £300. In the capable hands, and power of organisation of Mrs. H. J. Grant, aided by such strenuous workers as Mrs. S. Wheeler, Mrs. F. W. Wagstaff, Mrs. Collins and a small army of collectors, the Board has no fear for the continued success of this department of Hospital work. It is gratifying to mention that the interests of the Hospital in Walton-on-Naze are now centred in Mr. S. J. Stevens, who has shown keen interest in the work and it is proposed by the Board that at the Annual Meeting in February, he should be elected a member of the Board as the Walton representative.

Grateful thanks are also accorded to Mrs. H. Lilley, and to Messrs. P. M. Thurlow and T. C. Kendon for the organisation and arrangement of dances at the Grand Hotel in aid of the Hospital Funds, each of which has proved an unqualified success; the "League of Mercy" for a donation of £30, and the Stock Exchange Dramatic and Operatic Society. The L. and N.E. Railway Staff (Clacton Section) for their continued support to the "Contributory Scheme," and the Board wishes while expressing its thanks to the other firms and employees for their contributions through this medium, sincerely hopes that employers generally will adopt the Scheme, which by payment of a small weekly contribution ensures free treatment at the Hospital for a subscribing member should he become incapacitated.

The kindness of Mr. and Mrs. Adams, of Westcliff Hotel, in placing their accommodation at the Hotel for the use of meetings of the Linen League, Whist Drives, etc., is greatly

appreciated by the Board of Management.

The auditing of the Accounts once again by Messrs. Smedley, Bensusan-Butt and Co., Chartered Accountants, of Colchester, is a service rendered to the Hospital with grateful recognition from the Board for this and past services.

NEW LIFE GOVERNORS.

It is with very great pleasure that the Board proposes the election of Mrs. P. M. Thurlow, Messrs. A. J. Green, G. Kensett and L. Warman as Honorary Life Govenors of the Hospital as a slight recognition and appreciation of services rendered in raising money for the Funds, with best thanks to them for their kind interest.

RETIRING MEMBERS OF THE BOARD.

In accordance with Rule 4, two members (representing Clacton-on-Sea) retire triennially from the Board of Management; the two to retire this year are Messrs. R. W. Coan and S J. Treby (the latter was elected to fill the vacancy caused by the retirement of Mr. John Ellis), but both of these gentlemen are eligible for re-election.

The Honorary Secretary would like to place on record in this Report his great indebtedness to the Hon. Treasurer (Mr. H. Weatherhead) and Mr. S. J. Treby, both of whom have rendered valuable service to the Hospital, by their ready and willing assistance at all times, for which the Secretary expresses his

personal thanks and great appreciation.

In conclusion the Board thanks the Proprietors of the Grand Hotel for their kind co-operation in granting the use of the room for the meeting.

Report of the Medical Committee

The Medical Committee have pleasure in presenting their report for the work done during the past year. The increase of work noted in the last report has been steadily maintained. Operations performed show an increase of 20 per cent. on last year's figures, and minor casualties treated at the Hospital also show an increase. In view of the latter fact the Committee desire to emphasise the need for accommodation at the Hospital for the treatment of those cases, the conditions of which does not warrant admission.

The Committee again wishes to record its appreciation of the excellent work carried out by the Matron and the Nursing Staff.

Extracts from Rules.

OBJECT.

2.—The Hospital is intended for the benefit of persons who are unable to obtain the necessary medical attention, accommodation and nursing at their own homes, for accidents of all kinds, and cases of sudden illness, and shall be for the benefit of Clacton-on-Sea and the surrounding Districts supporting the Institution.

ELECTION OF BOARD.

6. A General Meetting of Life-Governors and Subscribers shall be held once in each year during the month of January, or as soon thereafter as practicable, to fill vacancies on the Board of Management, to elect the Secretary, Treasurer, Auditor, the Medical Staff, and to transact any business that may be considered necessary.

DONATIONS AND SUBSCRIPTIONS. HOW SUPPORTED.

14.—The Hospital shall be supported by Annual Subscriptions, Donations, Bequests, payments made by patients, ect. The Annual Subscriptions shall be payable in advance and renewable from the date of the first payment.

LIFE-COVERNORS AND SUBSCRIBERS.

shall be a Life-Governor and have the right of voting at all General Meetings, and every Annual Subscriber of one guinea and upwards shall have the same privilege during the current year of such subscription.

LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION.

16.—Life-Governors shall be entitled to have one letter of recommendation yearly for each donation of

guinea yearly subscribed, such letters to be issued guinea yearly subscribed, such letteds to be issued annually to Life-Governors during the month of January in each year, and to subscribers on payment of their Annual Subscription. Each letter shall be available for one month, any patient requiring the benefit of the Hospitatl for a longer period must obtain another letter of recommendation, or the permission of the Board of Management to be given upon the recommendation of the Medical Officer attending the case.

COLLECTIONS.

17.—Clergymen and Ministers of Religion, and any person or Committee obtaining a minimum sum of £5 5s. towards the maintenance of the Hospital, shall, during the then current year, be entitled to the privileges of subscribers in respect of each guinea so obtained.

ENDOWING BEDS.

18.—Any person, association or club, making a yearly contribution of £50 and upwards towards the funds of the Hospital, shall during the continuance of such subscription, be at liberty to give a name or designation to one of the beds of the Hospital and to have the right of recommending patients for such bed without further payment. A yearly contribution of £30 or more shall entitle any person, association, or club, to have similar privileges in respect of a child's cot.

RECULATIONS-ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

- 19.—The admission of patients shall be by letters of recommendation except that:—
 - 1.—All cases of accidents and sudden illness shall be admitted provisionally by the Matron if accommodation be available, and upon admission the Matron shall immediately summon

a member of the Medical Staff who may, if he deems the case unsuitable for the Institution, discharge the patient and report the same to the Hon. Secretary. Those retained in the Hospital must obtain letters of recommendation and will come under the general provisions of Clause II. of this rule.

LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION.

2.—Patients shall be admitted upon the recommendation of Life-Governors or Subscribers, if accommodation be available. Such admission shall be subject to the approval of a member of the Medical Staff. All patients are expected to pay at least £1 per week for adults and 10s. per week for children to the Funds of Hospital, except in necessitous cases, or in the case of those who pay through the Contributory Scheme.

20.—Patients occupying a private ward shall pay a sum of at least five guineas per week, plus such fees for medical attendance as shall be decided between doctor and patient.

RESPONSIBILITY OF REMOVAL.

21.—The most urgent cases shall be admitted without reference to priority, and no case shall be admitted which can be treated equally well outside. Every patient shall obtain an undertaking from some substantial householder to defray expenses of removal or burial.

VISITING CLERCYMEN.

23.—Patients of all religious denominations shall be admissible and may be visited by a Clergyman or Minister of their own denomination, if they desire to avail themselves of their ministrations.

VISITORS.

24. Relatives of friends may visit patients in dangerous cases at any time, by an order from the Matron or Medical Attendant. The usual visiting days shall be Sundays and Wednesdays from 2 to 4 p.m.

REMOVAL.

25.—Any patient may at any time be removed by order of a member of the Medical Staff attending the case, or in consequence of improper conduct or breach of the rules of the Hospital.

DISQUALIFICATION.

26.—The following persons shall be disqualified for admission:—Women in advanced stage of pregnancy, unless, in the opinion of the Medical Attendant, an immediate operation is necessary, those disordered in intellect, suffering from consumption in an advanced stage, epilepsy, or any infectious disease, or from incurable disease, and children under two years, except accident or operation cases.
