



# Cromer Cottage Hospital Report 1926-27.



THE Committee have again to report a year of very full work in the Hospital. The number of patients this year has been fifty more than last year. There have been many serious cases, requiring very long care and attention, hence the average of occupied beds is much higher and the expenses necessarily greater, (but the committee are glad to report a balance in hand.)

The great event has been the installation of the new X Ray apparatus. The former apparatus has done excellent work, but so many improvements have been made since it was installed, improvements which are quite invaluable that it was felt advisable to get the new apparatus in order that patients might get the full benefit of the most recent discoveries. The

apparatus cost £525, part of this has been met by special efforts and it is hoped the Annual Hospital Sale and Entertainment will meet the deficit.

The Committee desire to express their most hearty thanks to the Medical Staff who gratuitously give such unremitting care and attention to the relief of the patients, to the matron and nurses whose kindness and skill the patients are continually extolling and to the domestic staff for their willing help.

Much has been done to revive funds for the Hospital. Sheringham arranged a Carnival, the proceeds of which were divided between the Cromer Hospital and the Norfolk and Norwich. East Runton organised a Fête on Whit Monday, which brought in £120, Dances, Whist Drives and a Gymkhana have also been held. The Committee are most grateful to all who have helped in this way.

The Committee also thank most warmly Mrs, Croome and all her kind helpers for so successfully organising the Sale and Entertainment; Mrs. Hansell for arranging Rose Day and the Lady Sandhurst for organising such a successful house to house collection in Sheringham and Beeston, and to all the helpers on Hospital Day.

Pound Days were held at Cromer, East and West Runton, Upper and Lower Sheringham and Mundesley, and their gifts, as also those of the allotment holders of Sheringham were much appreciated, as well as many gifts from former patients and their friends.

Thanks are also due to Rev. E. M. Davys and Rev. J. A. Holden for holding services at the Hospital and to Mr. R. H. Brown for so kindly auditing the accounts.
