Report 1927-28.



THE Committee have again to report a very busy year's work. The number of patients is approximately the same as last year, which was the highest on record. Many times during the past year the Hospital has been quite full. But in spite of the expenses such a large number of patients must entail, the Committee are thankful to report a balance in hand.

The new X Ray apparatus has proved invaluable. Not only has it been in constant use for patients in the Hospital but many others have availed themselves of it and their fees are a considerable help to the Hospital.

Miss Barclay has most generously given to the Hospital the adjoining house thus affording ample scope for extension. A detached room at the back is being put in order for use as a

ward and this will furnish additional accommodation. The Committee feel they cannot adequately express their thanks for this splendid gift which will enable them to expand as the need arises.

The Committee desire to express their most hearty thanks to Mrs. Croome and all her helpers for so ably organising and carrying out the Hospital Sale ; to Mr. Gladden and all those whose combined efforts made the Sheringham Carnival such a success ; to Mr. Barrington Boyce, and all who assisted in the East Runton Whit Monday Fete ; to Mrs. Hansell for arranging Rose Day ; and all the kind friends who have got up Dances, Whist Drives, etc. to help the funds.

Overstrand, Mundesley, Cromer, East and West Runton, and Upper and Lower Sheringham have held most successful Pound Days. The various things sent, also those given by Northrepps on Empire Day, and the gifts of the Sheringham Allotment Holders were very much enjoyed both by patients and staff, and were a very great help. We are also very grateful to Mr. Seago of Moy's Limited, for his help in collecting for Egg week, and to many former patients and their friends for gifts of cakes, eggs, etc.

The Committee are sure that all the patients who have been in Hospital would like to join with them in most heartfelt thanks to the Medical Staff for all the care and attention they so kindly and willingly bestow and to the Matron and nurses for all their kindness and help.

They also thank the Rev. E. M. Davys and the Rev. J. H. Holden for holding services at the Hospital and Mr. Brown for kindly auditing the accounts and all the staff for their kind efforts.
