ANNUAL REPORT

PRESENTED TO THE ANNUAL GENERAL COURT OF GOVERNORS, MAY 14TH, 1947

The Council have much pleasure in presenting to the Governors and Subscribers this Report for the year ending 31st December, 1946. Owing to the continued restriction in the use of paper the list of subscribers and donors is omitted, but a complete list may be inspected at the Hospital at any time during office hours.

FINANCIAL POSITION

The income for the year amounted to $\pounds 121,895$ compared with $\pounds 119,920$ in the previous year. Warmest gratitude is expressed to all concerned for the splendid help accorded to the Hospital. Appreciation is also expressed to the King Edward's Hospital Fund for London, the Hospital Savings Association, the Hospital Saturday Fund, the Hospital Sunday Fund, and to other contributory schemes for the generous support received from them.

The Council regrets that it is not possible to record the fact that income has exceeded expenditure. For the first time for many years, the balance is on the wrong side of the account. Expenditure rose from $\pounds 112,436$ in the year 1945 to $\pounds 150,413$ in the year under review. There are various causes for this increased expenditure including:

- The increased prices of everything required for the work of the Hospital;
- (ii) The greatly increased amount which has to be found under the heading of Salaries and Wages;
- (iii) The introduction of a forty-eight hour week for the Nursing Staff, Porters and Domestics, resulting in the necessity for the employment of many more people to maintain the twenty-four hours a day service, which the Hospital must provide.

The Governors and Subscribers may, however, be assured that the work of the Hospital is carried out with every possible economy compatible with efficiency, and due regard for the comfort and the welfare of the patients.

THE YEAR'S WORK

On the closing down of Ashridge Hospital, on the 31st March, 1946, the arrangement whereby we maintained forty-eight maternity beds at that institution came to an end. Since that time the whole of our patients have been accommodated in the main Hospital.

Negotiations with the Middlesex County Council, for the

acquisition of a site on which to re-build the Hospital at Northwick Park, Harrow, have been brought to a very happy conclusion, by the granting to the Hospital of a site of twenty-seven and a half acres, on which it is hoped to build one of the finest hospitals in the country. Warmest gratitude is expressed to the Middlesex County Council for their sympathetic and generous action in this most important matter.

The average daily number of occupied beds at Charing Cross in 1946 was 246 compared with 190 in 1945. This number could have been increased considerably, but for the fact that two small wards reserved for fracture cases, containing ten beds, have had to be used as sleeping quarters for the Staff. Efforts to obtain a Domestic Servants' Hostel in the near vicinity of the Hospital have so far failed, but everything possible is being done, and every avenue explored to ensure the early return of these beds for the use of patients.

The number of attendances in the Out-Patient and Casualty Departments increased from 134,955 to 143,366.

TREASURER

The Council is happy to announce the election of Sir Sydney Parkes, C.B.E., as Treasurer of the Hospital in succession to the late Mr. Abell.

THE COUNCIL

The Council has been strengthened during the year by the return of R. A. D. Fleming, Esq., and by the election of Arthur Mullins, Esq., C.M.G., C.B.E., and John Adamson, Esq., to whom a hearty welcome is extended.

It is with deep regret that the death is recorded of Mr. Valentine Williams and Mr. Kenneth Layton-Bennett. The wise counsel and help of these two members will be greatly missed by their colleagues.

Dr. Watts Eden, the consulting Obstetric Physician also died during the year, and his valuable service to the Hospital will be long remembered.

EXPRESSIONS OF APPRECIATION

It is difficult to find words to express adequately the gratitude which is felt to all who have helped the work of the Hospital in any way. Warmest appreciation is expressed to the members of the Honorary Medical and Surgical Staffs, for their splendid and devoted services, and the Governors and Subscribers would, the Council feel, wish to associate themselves with an expression of gratitude to the Nursing and Executive Staffs for their loyal and enthusiastic service. Grateful thanks, too, are extended to the voluntary blood donors who have continued to give their blood so regularly and so cheerfully to benefit the patients who have needed such help.

It is with every confidence that the Council submits its Report to the Governors for consideration and approval.





An Executor, or one out of several executors, paying a legacy to the Hospital of £100, is qualified for election as an Honorary Life Governor. If the legacy amounts to $\pounds 200$, all the Executors named in the Will are qualified for election as Honorary Life Governors. (Charter, page 15, Clauses 24 and 25.)

Every Executor or Trustee of a Will by virtue of which legacies or trust-moneys are left generally to or for Charities without specification, who shall in the exercise of his discretionary power contribute any portion thereof to the funds of this Hospital, shall be entitled to the same privileges as if the same had been paid out of his own private funds. (Charter, page 11, Clause 8.)
