REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT FOR THE YEAR 1936.

The Committee present to the Subscribers their Annual Report and Statement of Accounts.

During the year the number of patients treated in the Hospital was 106 as compared with 94 the previous year, the average length of stay being 20.8 days. For the first time since its establishment the Hospital has been open the whole year.

There were two deaths in the Hospital during the year.

The cases treated were 77 Surgical, 29 Medical and 30 Infra Red treatment.

30 out-patients attended for treatment making 284 visits.

32 patients were admitted from Odiham, 23 from North Warnborough, 12 from Hook, 8 from South Warnborough, 5 from Long Sutton, 4 from Upton Grey, 3 from Greywell, 2 from Rotherwick, 2 from Newnham and 15 from other Parishes in the District.

The new private ward has been occupied for eight months of the year, the receipts from private patients amounting to £119.

In consequence of the increase in the number of patients the household expenses have necessarily been larger than last year and the amount paid in salaries of the staff is also more as a supply nurse has been on duty for four months.

It is regretted that the Matron has not up to the present been able to find and appoint a suitable permanent nurse on the staff as one is urgently required.

The Odiham Branch of the Royal Berkshire and Associated Hospitals Aid Contributory Scheme during the year sent £470-17-6 to Reading, being an increase of £7-8-4 over the previous year. The number of Contributors being 951. £510-9-9 has been received from the Scheme for the maintenance of Contributors in the Hospital an increase over the previous year of £78-15-1.

Sincere thanks are due to the Voluntary Collectors who spend a considerable time in calling at the numerous houses each week for the contributions.

During the year a legacy of £50 was received under the Will of the late Miss Emily Kate King.

The Committee desire to thank Mrs. C. B. Lacey for the gift of a Nesbit-Evans bed for the public ward, and Dr. R. L. Harward for the gift of an Oxygen Stand.

The Committee desire also to thank the Organisers of the various entertainments in aid of the funds and to all who have helped in various ways to further the work of the Hospital.

The Committee regretfully announce the resignation of Mr. G. E. Gush who for the past ten years has so ably carried out the duties of Hon. Secretary and desire to put on record their grateful thanks to him for all his work and interest in the Hospital during those years.

Lastly the Committee desire to express their grateful appreciation of the services of the Medical Officers, the Matron and Staff Nurse who have done so much to make the Hospital such a benefit to the people of Odiham and District.
