

# REPORT

FOR THE YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31ST, 1927.

THE Board of Management have pleasure in submitting the Eighty-sixth Annual Report of the work of the Hospital and in doing so would at the outset express our gratitude to the Citizens of Coventry and District for the way they have so generously supported their Hospital, and enabled us to carry on the work efficiently during the past year and to meet to a certain extent the growing needs of the City. It is true we have been greatly handicapped through the need of more Beds and, while there is no immediate prospect of this handicap being removed, we are hoping that events may so develop in our favour that in the not far distant future the City Hospital buildings and grounds may become part of our own. This would meet our requirements but would mean an added financial burden which we rely upon the Citizens to help us to bear.

#### In-Patients.

With regard to the work of the past year—the number of Patients admitted during the year was 4,615, and the number of Operations performed 2514. The number of Patients dealt with was rather less than last year, but the average length of stay was a trifle higher.

The number of beds available was somewhat curtailed for a few months on account of the closing of the Ophthalmic Ward on account of Small Pox, also the annual cleaning of Wards and the

alterations to the Gulson Balcony.

It is a matter for very great thankfulness that the financial needs of the Hospital have been liberally met. The outstanding item in the year's Income was the handsome donation of £15,000 given by Mr. W. R. Morris; it is not often a Hospital is able to include a donation of such magnitude in its yearly list. The condition he laid down when he made his offer of the money, viz., that the Hospital Carnival Committee should raise £5,000, acted as a tremendous lever for them in their work and the unprecedented success which they achieved in raising a total of over £12,000 is something of which the City and District have cause to be proud. They handed over, through the Hospital Saturday Committee, a sum of £11,014, retaining £1,000 in hand to cover them for any loss that might be incurred in connection with future Carniva's owing to bad weather. We hope that this may be like many "insurances"—never drawn upon!

It was felt that the Carnival Appeal had a somewhat adverse effect upon the ordinary income of the Hospital, therefore it was decided to credit a portion of Mr. Morris's £15,000 to the General Fund; the remainder to the Capital account for purposes hereafter

explained.

#### Hospital Saturday Fund.

Among the many organisations at work on behalf of the Hospital the Hospital Saturday Fund still maintains the leading position; the help that they give is really unbounded, £29,000 (which includes the £11,014 from the Carnival) is a vast sum for any organisation to be able to hand over and our very hearty thanks are accorded to their enthusiastic Committee.

#### Ladies' Auxiliary Committee, etc.

We greatly value the work of the Ladies' Auxiliary Committee who this year succeeded in augmenting their Collection even after the strong appeal that had been made during the year for the Carnival.

Much help is also rendered through the Linen League and Sewing Guild. A large number of household articles (i.e., sheets, towels, etc.) were given by the Members of the League and many useful garments, e.g., nightdresses, bed-jackets, etc., particularly for the use of the young patients in the Children's Ward, were made and given by the Members of the Sewing Guild. We would thank all those who give such practical help.

#### Hospital Cabaret Dance.

The first Hospital Cabaret Dance was considered a great success but even greater success was attained this year, both from the financial and the social entertainment points of view. We offer the organising Committee our hearty congratulations and thank them for the financial assistance afforded us.

#### "Hospital Sunday."

We could wish to see the Church Collections increasing rather than decreasing though we fully appreciate all the help received from the Churches. Unfortunately "Hospital Sunday" followed immediately upon Easter Sunday last year, but it was considered unwise to make any alteration in the usual date. There is no doubt, however, that this had some effect upon the Collections.

#### "Alexandra Rose Day."

Although handicapped by the many other appeals being made for the Hospital the "Alexandra Rose Day" managed to raise a substantial sum, viz., £400 2s. 4d. This collection has been a very fruitful source of income ever since its inception and we would assure the Committee that their work is highly valued.

#### Extraordinary Income.

Several contributions have been received towards the Extension Fund, notably among them a donation of £1,000 from the Warwickshire Miners' Welfare Fund; this is the second such donation they have given.

#### Endowment of Cots.

During the year a donation of £250 was received from Mr. and Mrs. F. Johnson for the endowment of a Cot in memory of their daughter Peggy; a second Cot is also being endowed by the Sunday School Children from the proceeds of their Annual Procession in our aid, and a second Cot is also being endowed by "The Orme School of Dancing" from the proceeds of their yearly Displays. It is a pleasure to have these permanent evidences of the generosity and support of different Citizens and Organisations.

#### Legacies.

It is encouraging to find that the Hospital is still being remembered by different friends in their Wills. The following legacies have been received or notified during the year:—

The only outstanding item calling for comment is that the repair and painting of the outside of the buildings has been progressing, a further sum having been allocated to this purpose during the year. The Committee at all times watch the expenses very closely to ensure that there is no waste or unnecessary expenditure.

#### Gulson Balcony.

One important item that does not appear in the accounts is the remodelling of the Gulson Balcony and the glazing of both the Balcony and the windows on the east side of the Ward with Vita Glass. This was done at the request of Mr. Harry Johnson, one of our Vice-Presidents, who very generously met the entire cost. Not only has it effected a vast improvement to the Balcony, but is also a great boon to the many young Patients treated in that Ward, and remains a standing proof of the generosity and thoughtfulness of Mr. Johnson who has helped us so handsomely in other directions.

#### Heating of Leicester Street Home.

One of the commitments found necessary during the year was the installation of a Central Heating System in the Leicester Street Home. The work was well in hand, but not completed by the close of the year, therefore the cost will come as a charge on next year's accounts.

#### Extensions.

After many set-backs the erection and equipment of the new Theatre Block, Pathological Dept., and Extension to the Nurses' dining room etc., has been completed. The Theatre Block and Pathological Dept. were actually opened at the commencement of 1928. They have been fitted with the most modern equipment, which will greatly facilitate in the work of the Hospital for some years to come.

The Clerical Staff of any Hospital must of necessity increase as the work goes on. It was found necessary to increase our personnel in this direction (as compared with other hospitals of a similar size, the staff is very much smaller), but unfortunately the accommodation available did not admit of this. It was therefore, imperative that further rooms should be erected and the only convenient available site was at the front of the Hospital. A plan was accordingly drawn up for an extension of the Administration B'ock, containing a new Board Room, Secretary's and Clerks' Offices. This work has also been completed and the rooms opened. There are further alterations still to be made, viz., the altering and equipping of a room for a proper Enquiry Office and the fitting up of a larger Office for Accountants and Cashiers. Provision is also being made for an Honorary Officers' Room.

#### Scroll in Keystone.

During the alterations to the Administration Block a Scroll and several old coins were found in the keystone of the entrance door. The Scroll was in commemoration of the laying of the foundation stone of the Hospital. A copy of this was printed and the original placed with the coins in the keystone of the new entrance door, with a further document relating the history of its being found and replaced.

#### House Doctors' Residence.

To meet the pressing need for further accommodation for the Staff, No. 2 Stoney Stanton Road was taken over and fitted up as a residence for the Resident Staff.

#### Keresley Hall.

One of the outstanding features of the year was the acquirement of Keresley Hall for conversion into a Convalescent Hospital. We had the offer of this Hall with three cottages and approximately  $9\frac{1}{2}$  acres of land for the sum of £7,000. It was found that the Hall would lend itself admirably (with some alterations) to the purpose for which it was required and the offer was accepted, and it is hoped to be able to provide approximately 35 Beds. It is intended to call this extension the Alcock Convalescent Hospital.

Through the kindness of the Alcock Convalescent Fund Trustees we are allowed to use part of that capital (at present invested) to purchase the property and carry out the necessary alterations; the remaining portion to be used towards the maintenance of the Home. Rather than realise the Alcock investments these are to be transferred to the General Fund Capital Account and the amount of their original cost to be transferred to the Alcock Fund out of Mr. W. R. Morris's donation.

#### City Hospital Offer.

During the year your Board approached the City Hospital Public Health Authorities with a request to purchase a small portion of the City Hospital Grounds for the purpose of building a second Nurses' Home adjoining our present one. This they could not grant, but as an alternative offered us the whole of the buildings at a price to be agreed upon later. Your Board have expressed their willingness to consider the matter and a small Committee has been appointed to enter into negotiations; these are progressing satisfactorily, and we feel certain that when the final settlement is made it will be considered equitable to both parties.

It is with much regret that we refer to the death of the late Mr. W. E. Bennett, at one time an Honorary Surgeon of this Hospital. Mr. Bennett had only early last year retired from our Honorary Staff under the Law governing the age for retirement and it came as a great shock to all when his decease came not many months after. Drs. J. Vaughan, Janet Stephens, and J. L. Clarke were appointed as Hon. Anaesthetists, and upon the resignation of the first-named, Dr. W. P. Elford was appointed on the Staff.

Good and valuable service is given by all Members of the Honorary Staff and we would take this opportunity of recording our thanks to them.

Our thanks are accorded to the Resident Medical and Nursing Staff for the way in which they have carried out their duties. It is a pleasure to report that the Matron (Miss S. Hutchinson, R.R.C.) has recovered from her illness and has returned to duty.






