

Annual Report

The Board of Management has pleasure in presenting its report together with Statement of Accounts for the year ended December 31st, 1940, and is confident that its decision to condense the report in the interests of economy will be approved by the Governors.

NEW WARD BUILDINGS.

The new Private Wards were opened for the reception of patients early in March and the demands upon this accommodation have proved conclusively that this development in the Hospitals' Services has met a very pressing need.

Owing to the financial position, the opening of the beds in the new General Wards was delayed, but towards the middle of the year the pressure upon the Hospital accommodation became so acute that, despite the additional expense which would necessarily be incurred, a number of beds in the new Wards were opened for the reception of patients. The Board was also influenced in its decision by the need to provide more adequate accommodation for the reception of Air Raid Casualties and in particular because of the necessity of reserving certain specially equipped Wards for the reception of such cases suffering from severe shock. Four small Wards were therefore fitted up as Resuscitation Wards and, in this connection, your Board acknowledges with deep gratitude the gift of 16 electric blankets from the Armstrong Siddeley Benevolent Fund.

INTERNAL RE-ORGANISATION.

With the expansion of the Hospital and its services, it has become increasingly clear that, to secure the maximum of efficiency with economy, certain Departments should be separately administered under Sub Committees able to deal with the many special problems involved. The full development of these arrangements and services has necessarily been restricted by the War but much satisfactory progress has been made.

APPOINTMENT OF FOOD SUPERVISOR.

Following the retirement of Miss McGregor, Housekeeping Sister for twenty two years, it was decided to create a new post of Food Supervisor and Miss P. Webb, B.Sc., who has had considerable practical experience in other large Hospitals and abroad, was appointed to this post.

To Miss McGregor the Board expresses its appreciation of her long and faithful service and wishes her every happiness in her retirement.

FRACTURE SERVICES.

Owing to the increasing work in this new Department it has been necessary to make an additional medical appointment by the creation of the post of Resident Fracture and Orthopaedic Registrar. The Governors have every reason for gratification in the progressive development of our Fracture Service.

DAMAGE BY AIR ATTACK.

The severe damage sustained by Hospital Buildings during Air Raids will form the subject of a special Report by the Chairman and will later be incorporated in this report when it is distributed to Governors (see page 16).

OBITUARY.

It is with feelings of deep regret that your Board records the death of Col. Sir William Wyley, V.D.D.L., J.P., Mr. J. H. Perkins and Mr. Phillip Carter.

Sir William first became associated with the Hospital in 1913 when he was made a Trustee. He was President of the Hospital from 1929 to 1934. Over a period of twenty-seven years he had always shown a very deep and personal interest in the Hospital and its work and in particular in Nursing matters and in the Orthoptic Department to which he presented much of the present equipment. On July 10th, 1937, the foundation stone of the new Hospital Extensions was laid by him with full Masonic Ceremonial. He showed his great interest in the Hospital in many other ways and it is gratifying to know that, during his lifetime, it was possible to show some practical recognition of his work for the Hospital in the naming of the Wyley Ward, which was equipped by contributions subscribed by Freemasons on Sir William's 87th Birthday.

Mr. J. H. Perkins was a member of the Board of Management and House Committee for many years; he was a past Chairman of the Hospital Saturday Fund and had also been Chairman of the Annual Cleaning Committee of the Hospital. He was at all times a very ardent Hospital worker, always regular in his attendance at Meetings, until his health failed, and his practical advice and help will be greatly missed.

Mr. P. Carter served the Hospital for many years as a member of the Board of Management, representing the Hospital Saturday Fund.

TRUSTEE.

The vacant office of Trustee caused by the death of Col. Sir William Wyley has been filled by the appointment of the Rt. Hon. Lord Iliffe, a past President of the Hospital.

Despite the fact that throughout the year it has been necessary to keep a number of beds vacant in readiness for the reception of Air Raid Casualties and that onwards from November 14th until the end of the year only very limited accommodation was available to patients, the number of In-Patients admitted is the highest in the history of the Hospital. The number of Out-Patients, both as regards new cases and total attendances also constitutes a record, although here again there was considerable interference with services following November 14th.

FINANCE.

Since the closing of the Accounts for the year 1939 an adjusted contribution of £6,784 ls. 10d. from the Ministry of Health in payment of Medical Services provided by the Hospital has been credited to the income for that year, therefore bringing the total ordinary Income available for maintenance for 1939 up to £61,862 l8s. 9d. The total ordinary income for the year 1940 amounted to £78,914 l6s. 2d., an increase of £17,051 l7s. 5d. Income from Legacies amounted to £1,260 compared with £8,492 l2s. 6d. for the previous year (these sums had to be applied towards the general maintenance of the Hospital) and making a total income of £80,174 l6s. 2d. compared with £70,355 l1s. 3d. for the previous year.

The increased income received from voluntary sources, i.e., subscriptions, Firms' contributions, donations and other sources, is acknowledged with gratitude. A number of Firms readily adopted the new basis of contribution of \(^3_4\)d. per week per employee but, bearing in mind the increasing employment in the City and the continued industrial development, the response generally has not been satisfactory, although since the close of the year many more Firms have intimated their acceptance of these new proposals. It is earnestly hoped that this basis of contribution will be accepted as a minimum by all Employers of Labour and, if this were so, a very substantial increase in Hospital revenue would result enabling the fullest development of Hospital Services.

The Ordinary Expenditure amounted to £76,389 7s. 10d., compared with £66,669 0s. 2d. for the previous year; Extraordinary Expenditure, including a deficit on Alcock Convalescent Home, amounting to £3,173 6s. 8d., making a total expenditure of £80,261 6s. 11d., being a total increase of £9,703 16s. 8d. over the total expenditure for the previous year.

An additional financial burden has been thrown upon the Hospital in the loss of stocks, suffered as a result of air raid damage, an estimate computed at £2,192 8s. 9d., which must be added to the expenditure for the year, making, therefore, a total expenditure of £82,453 15s. 8d., and making a deficit on the year's work amounting to £2,278 19s. 6d.

COSTS.

The average cost per patient per day has increased from 11/1 to 12/9, while the average cost for each In-Patient has increased from £7 15s. 7d. in 1939 to £8 7s. 7d. in 1940. Examination of expenditure shows that the chief items responsible for this increase are, as in the previous year:

Salaries and Wages—an increase of £5,943 7s. 8d.

Finance—an increase of £1,817 13s. 7d., which includes payments for Rates and Taxes and increased interest on Bank Overdraft.

The average cost per Out-Patient, however, has been reduced from 10/7 to 9/2d.

The increased contribution—£698 2s. 0d. compared with £555 for the previous year—received from the Hospital Sunday collections is particularly encouraging and your Committee acknowledge the very practical co-operation and help which has resulted in this increased support for the Hospital.

ALEXANDRA ROSE DAY.

The magnificent contribution of £1,000 received as the result of the Alexandra Rose Day collections and after payment of all expenses, is acknowledged with deep gratitude. This splendid result reflects the very greatest credit upon the organisers and all who helped in this effort and your Board tenders its hearty congratulations and thanks.

CHRISTMAS APPEAL.

Owing to the difficulties arising from the War, the usual Christmas Stocking Appeal was not made but a special box collection through the Licensed Houses in Coventry and District brought in the splendid sum of £156 16s. 0d. and to all who supported this effort we tender our most sincere thanks.

LADIES' AUXILIARY COMMITTEE.

Very substantial help has again been received through the Ladies' Auxiliary Committe. Valuable gifts in kind, such as bedding linen and garments for patients have materially reduced expenditure which would otherwise have been necessary and, in addition, an increased contribution of £478 ls. 11d. was received in cash. To the Organisers of these Committees your Board extends its very sincere congratulations upon the result of their efforts and thanks for the continued practical help received.

ALL STAR VARIETY ENTERTAINMENT.

Thanks are extended to Mr. S. H. Newsome and his Directors of the New Hippodrome, Coventry, to the numerous Artists who gave their services and to the staff of the New Hippodrome for the substantial sum raised on the occasion of the All Star Variety Entertainment held in May. This effort brought in the most welcome sum of £300.

SPECIAL REPORT BY CHAIRMAN TO ANNUAL MEETING OF GOVERNORS.

The Report of the Board of Management, which was to have been presented to the Governors at the Annual Meeting originally convened in April, included a statement on the damage to the Hospital buildings through air attack, and the resulting effect upon Hospital services.

New and heavier disasters have since befallen the Hospital, which occasioned the postponement of the Annual Meeting, and the Board have thought it desirable to make a separate statement to the Governors on the position arising from the present emergency, and this statement will be incorporated in the report of the Board of Management for subsequent circulation to the Governors and Subscribers.

It will be recalled that as the result of air raids towards the latter end of 1940, a large portion of the Hospital buildings became uninhabitable. These buildings included the Sir Thomas White block, which accommodated the male and female Medical Wards and Eye Wards; also the original Hospital accommodating the Cox Spencer, Chater, Clowes and Gulson Wards. Several other Wards were damaged, but after first aid repairs had been carried out, a number were brought back into use for the treatment of patients, and at the time of the more recent heavy raids on Coventry, we had the following Wards in use: Edward Ward for female surgical cases, Alexandra Ward for male surgical cases, Henry Johnson Ward for medical cases, Siddeley Ward (part of which was reserved for Resuscitation Wards for air raid casualties), and a small portion of Wyley Ward and a small portion of Herbert Ward. The Fracture Gymnasium was transferred to the Men's Medical Ward in the White block, and the room thereby vacated, adjoining the Pathological Laboratory, was brought into use as a male accident Ward.

The Nurses' Home was also extensively damaged, but was partly repaired, and a number of the rooms had been brought back into use for the accommodation of Nursing Staff. The Maids' Home, one section of which received a direct hit, was extensively damaged, and was completely uninhabitable. The maids were, therefore, transferred to the house occupied by the Resident Medical Staff, who in turn were accommodated in the Pay Bed block, which, owing to its position on the top floor of the new wing, could not be used for the reception of patients.

A claim for War Damage Compensation in respect of the damage above briefly outlined was submitted through the Architects, Messrs. W. S. Hatrell and Partners.

We had continued to play the full part assigned to us under the Emergency Medical Service Scheme, although our ability to admit patients was necessarily considerably reduced. As the result of the recent heavy raids on Coventry, the Hospital was virtually put out of commission. Direct hits by high explosive bombs on various portions of the Hospital resulted in a number of patients and Staff being killed. We deeply regret to record that the following members of the Staff lost their lives:—

In addition, two stretcher bearers, Kenneth Johnson and George Goode, were killed, together with twenty one patients and two visitors who had come to make enquiries of patients in Hospital. Fourteen other members of the Hospital Staff were injured on duty, several of whom have now recovered, and others are making satisfactory progress. Your Board desires to place on record its high appreciation of the services rendered by all grades of the Hospital Staff; their courage and devotion to duty merit the highest praise.

Not one building or department escaped extensive damage, and little imagination is required to realise fully not only the dangers which the Staff on duty had to face, but the great difficulties which confronted them.

The following day all patients were transferred to other Hospitals, and the Staff were accommodated at the Kenilworth Convalescent Home—which earlier in the year had been acquired for Hospital use—and at our Convalescent Home at Keresley. A few days later many of the Probationer Nurses, with a few trained Staff, were transferred for duty to Barnsley Hall Emergency Hospital, Bromsgrove.

A week later the Emergency Committee—which was appointed by the Board of Management in December last year—met to consider the position, and immediately convened a Special Meeting of the Board of Management, which was held on April 24th. In the meantime, Sir Alfred Herbert—to whom this Hospital owes so much—had written expressing his great distress at the disaster which had overtaken the Hospital, and offered a generous donation of £10,000 to assist in carrying on the Hospital services. This gift would be made over a period of years, under Deed of Covenant, and the Hospital would ultimately benefit to the extent of approximately £20,000—but in order to provide immediate funds Sir Alfred offered to lend £10,000 free of interest and repayable over a period of seven years. He had approached Lord Nuffield—another generous benefactor of the Hospital—who had immediately and generously offered to give a donation of £10,000 provided a similar sum was raised by public subscription by the end of May, 1941.

The Board of Management, having discussed the many problems involved, and fully appreciating that apart from the Out-Patient Department, none of the present Hospital buildings could be brought into use, resolved that every avenue be explored, and all necessary steps be taken, to acquire other suitable premises and to carry on our services as a Voluntary Hospital. The Emergency Committee were authorised to collaborate with Sir Alfred Herbert in launching an immediate Appeal for funds, and to report to the Board of Management as occasion required upon the measures taken or proposed in connection with the re-establishment of the Hospital services. At this Meeting, approval was also given to the following suggestions from the Emergency Committee:—(1) that a temporary modified Out Patient service be instituted in Department 17; (2) that Operating Theatre accommodation be provided at Keresley Convalescent Hospital; (3) that authority be given for the purchase of two small vertical steam boilers.

The "Emergency Fund Appeal" has met with most gratifying success. Employers and the general public have responded magnificently, and up to date* the Appeal Fund amounts to £31,913 0s. 0d., exclusive of the donations from Sir Alfred Herbert and Lord Nuffield. Your Board wishes to take this opportunity of conveying to Sir Alfred Herbert, to Lord Nuffield, and to our numerous friends who have responded so readily and so generously to our appeal for funds, most sincere and grateful thanks.

The present position regarding Hospital services may be summarised as follows:-

- (1) Repairs to the Out-Patient Department are nearing completion—but for the time being out patients and casualties are receiving treatment in the old Medical Block. It is hoped, however, that the section of the Out-Patient Departments allocated for our Casualty services will be ready for occupation by the end of this week.
- (2) The costly X-Ray Diagnostic and X Ray Therapy apparatus has been dismantled and taken to Keresley. A new building—of air raid shelter construction—is in course of erection at Keresley, and will, it is anticipated, be ready for occupation within the next six weeks. This will provide a Casualty Department for night casualties; a Department for major X-Ray diagnosis and for X-Ray treatment, and will have accommodation for twenty in-patients.
- (3) Operating facilities are now available at Keresley and sixty in-patients beds are now in use.

*(The date of the Annual Meeting, June 11th, 1941)

- (4) Kenilworth Convalescent Home has been brought into use for Medical cases, and has accommodation for thirty in-patients.
 - (5) Additional accommodation for the Nursing Staff employed at Keresley and in the Out-Patient and Casualty Departments, has been provided by leasing a house which immediately adjoins the grounds at Keresley.
 - (6) A large house called "The Towers" at Kenilworth has been purchased—and will provide accommodation for at least a further forty in-patients. It is possible that this accommodation, when available, will be used for medical cases, as there are adequate facilities for housing the orthodioscope and cardiograph apparatus. There are also extensive grounds covering approximately 11½ acres.

These proposals provide a total of 150 in-patient beds, together with Out-Patient and Casualty Services, now available or to be available in the immediate future.

The Emergency Committee, after careful consideration, also propose that two hutment Wards of air raid shelter construction (that is, with 14" external walls and 6" concrete roof) complete with operating theatre, be erected adjoining the Convalescent Hospital at Keresley.

Plans have been prepared and the scheme has the approval of the Board of Management. Altogether, therefore, the accommodation now envisaged will provide two hundred and twenty in-patient beds. The Minister of Health writes expressing his appreciation of the energy and foresight with which the Hospital has acted in the matter and "his satisfaction that such a useful addition to the available Hospital accommodation in the district has been made." The Minister is referring particularly to the new Department at Keresley and to the proposed two hutment Wards.

Your Board brings these proposals forward and hopes that the measures taken will be approved by the Governors.

(The recommendations above outlined were approved by the Governors at the annual meeting.)
