



THE Executive Committee have much pleasure in submitting the fifty-third Annual Report, and in doing so, desire to convey their sincere thanks to all who have contributed to the support of the Hospital during the past year by means of donations and subscriptions, in cash or kind, and to all who have assisted its work in other ways.

YEAR'S RECORD IN THE HOSPITAL.

The total number of in-patients admitted was 276, of whom 117 were males and 159 females, while the number of casualties treated amounted to 624.

MEDICAL REPORT.

We have much pleasure in submitting to you our Annual Report on the Medical Work of the Hospital for the year 1928.

The Hospital continues to do very good work in the neighbourhood in the treatment of accidents and other emergencies, and in the surgical and medical treatment of ordinary cases in this district. The number of operations performed was 219—63 major and 156 minor operations. In addition there were 44 dental cases.

We have to thank the following specialists for giving their valuable time in helping us with difficult cases:—Mr. Roberts of St. Bartholomew's Hospital, Mr. Grant Massie, Mr. Bonar and Mr. White, of Guy's Hospital.

Our grateful thanks are due to the Matron, Miss Round, and her Staff, on whose efficiency the smooth-working of the Hospital has largely depended.

Our thanks are also due to Mr. H. P. Tait, the Hon. Dental Surgeon; Miss French, the Hon. Masseuse; and Miss Hobson, the Hon. Lady Almoner; all of whom have done excellent work in their respective spheres.

We were rather too optimistic when we stated last year that it would be the last report issued while in our present unsuitable surroundings. The New Hospital is not quite ready for occupation, but we understand that it is now only a question of a few weeks before the workmen go out. As soon as this takes place the work of equipment will at once be put in hand, and the patients transferred at as early a date as possible. Under the more favourable conditions and with more up-to-date equipment, we hope to do more surgical work.

FINANCIAL.

Income and Expenditure.

The gross income for the year 1928 amounted to £2271/9/2, of which sum £240/13/8 was derived from a legacy and has to be treated as capital, leaving a net income of £2030/15/6. The increase of net income on the previous year is due to the fact that during 1928 the collections of the Amalgamated Societies for 1927 and 1928 were received. The collection for 1927 did not appear in the accounts of that year. The expenditure in 1928 amounted to £1852/2/1, a decrease of £37/6/5 on the previous year.

Ladies' Collections, Flower Day, &c.

Miss Johnson and the Lady Collectors are to be heartily congratulated on the success of their efforts during the year which resulted in the very substantial sum of £282/13/0 being collected—an increase of £35 on the previous year. The Committee realise that a house to house collection is often a somewhat thankless task, and are correspondingly grateful to the ladies for their invaluable help.

The weather on Flower Day was not too favourable, but the receipts showed an increase of £7 on the previous year. Unfortunately it was found impossible to obtain an adequate number of Flower Sellers in the Lower Teddington District, and but for this there seems to have been every prospect that the 1926 figures would have been exceeded. The Executive Committee tender their sincere thanks to the ladies who took charge of depôts and sold flowers, and helped to make the day as successful as it was. They also invite any ladies who read this and would be willing to help on the forthcoming Flower Day, Saturday, May 25th, to send their names and addresses to the Hon. Secretary, who will put them in touch with the depôt holders.

The Pound Day gifts in kind fell somewhat short of the weight received in the previous year. On the other hand they were of the highest quality and usefulness, and the gifts in money showed an increase of £9. The arrangements were most efficiently organised by Messrs. Gould and Hallam, and once more the Committee express their gratitude to the ladies who worked so hard at their arduous task for their valuable help. They also thank the donors of the gifts for their generous assistance.

Annual Hospital Flower and Vegetable Show.

It had been hoped that a considerably larger sum than in 1927 would have been realised by this function. But owing to various difficulties the amount cleared by the Show only exceeded the 1927

total by £1. The Committee fully realise the hard work put in by Messrs. F. W. Nix, A. Kirby, G. H. Hall and the Show Committee, and are correspondingly grateful to them. They regret that their efforts did not meet with more support. Thanks must also be accorded to Mr. C. Neilson, Messrs. Cockerell, and the 3rd Teddington Boy Scouts for their help in running the Show.

Hospital Sunday Fund.

The Committee wish to convey their thanks to the Churches of St. Alban, St. Mark, SS. Peter and Paul, Christ Church, and the Church of the Sacred Heart, Hampton Wick, for holding collections on behalf of the Hospital Sunday Fund, and thereby indirectly benefiting the Hospital.

Hospital Saturday Fund.

The Committee are glad to be able to announce that the Hospital received £40 from this fund against £15 in the previous year.

Linen Guild.

The Linen Guild has not been quite so successful as last year. During 1928, 300 articles ranging from swabs to blankets were received, and £10 was spent on various articles specially asked for by the Matron. There is a cash balance of about £15. Considering the many and various calls which the Hospital makes on the ladies of Teddington this result is not altogether unsatisfactory and the Committee wish to express their deep gratitude to Mrs. Parmeter, Madame Mottu, and the members of the guild for their labours on behalf of the Hospital.

Collection of Tinfoil.

As foreshadowed in last year's report quite a useful addition to the income of the Hospital has been made by the sale of tinfoil during the year, a sum of £45/2/0 having been received in respect of it. We should like to give a word of appreciation to the collectors, who, to realise the sum they have, must have saved to the best of their power. It shows that a much larger sum of money could be raised yearly if more people would undertake to collect for us. The thanks of the Committee are especially due to Mrs. Langdon-Down and to the matron on whom devolves all the trouble of receiving, packing and disposing of the material collected, and she would be only too glad if the amount she had to deal with were doubled. Since the issue of the last report Mrs. R. Langdon-Down has pointed out that the idea of a tinfoil collection originally emanated from the matron. The omission to make due acknowledgement arose from ignorance of the facts, and the matron is hereby thanked for her happy thought which has proved of such value.

Bequest.

During the year the Hospital received a legacy of £240/13/8 under the will of the late Mr. D. Hall. As the money was available for general purposes the Committee decided to allocate it to a fund for equipping the X ray room at the New Hospital.

Hospital Saving Association.

Forty two patients presenting the Association's Vouchers were admitted to the Hospital during the year, and the sum of £103/2/11 was received in respect of them.

Hon. Auditor.

The Committee desire to express their sincere thanks to Mr. E. T. Wood, A.C.A. for his great kindness in once more auditing the Hospital Accounts.

New Hospital.

Unfortunately, the hopes expressed in last year's report as to the probable date of completion of the New Hospital have not materialised. Various unforeseen difficulties and delays have occurred, but at last it looks as if the final stages are being reached. As soon as the builders have departed, the work of making roads of approach and equipping the Hospital will be put in hand, and the change over from Elfin Grove to the New Hospital will take place with as little delay as possible.

In this connection the Committee are sincerely grateful to the family of the late Mr. and Mrs. Cornes who sent a cheque for £500 in memory of their parents, as a Christmas Gift to the New Hospital Building Fund.


