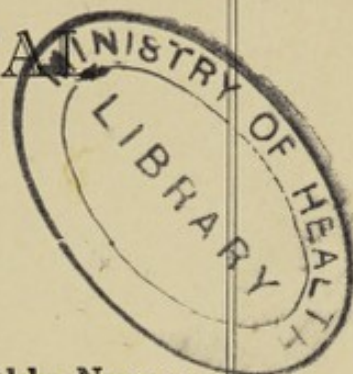

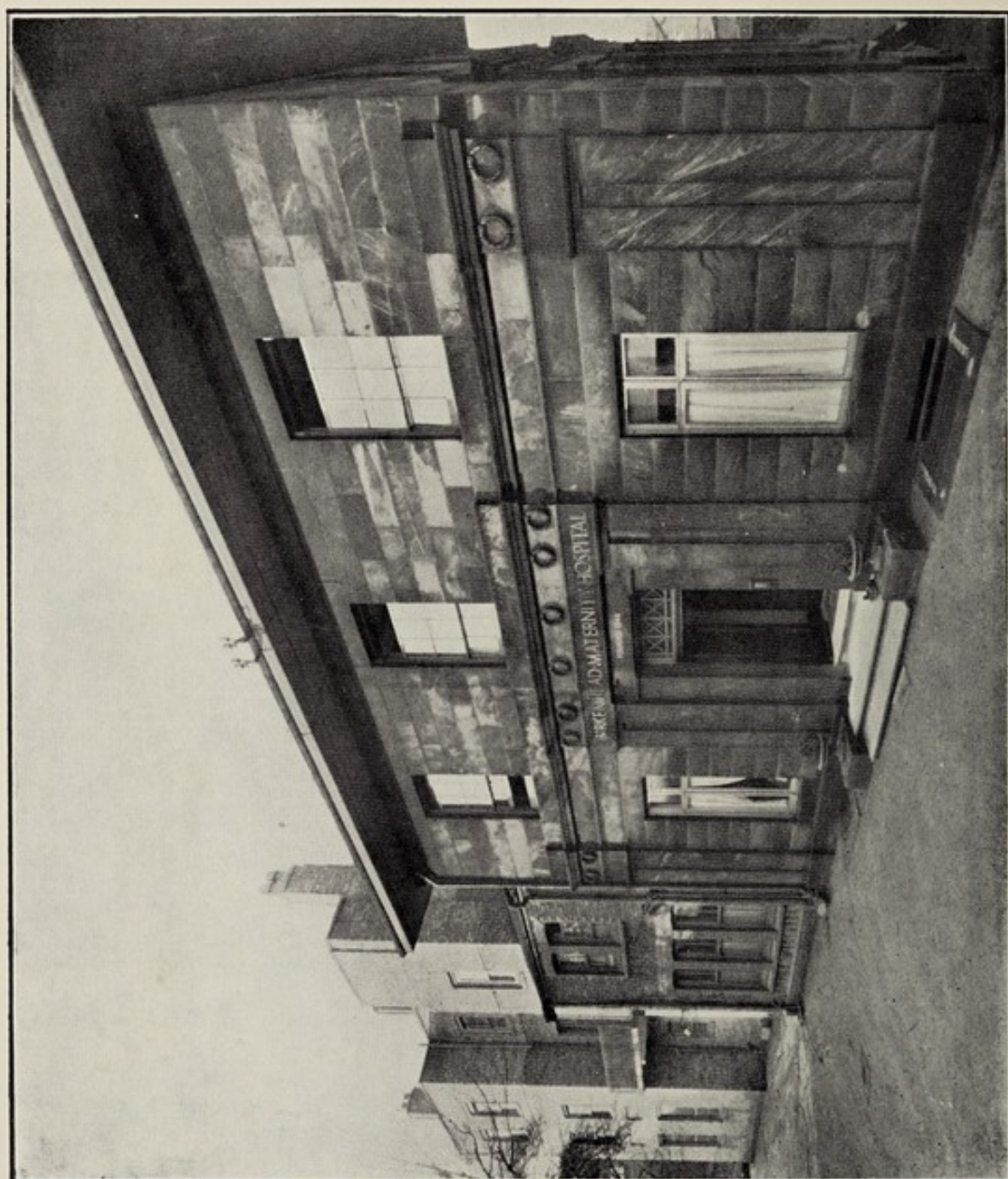

BIRKENHEAD MATERNITY HOSPITAL.

ANNUAL REPORT, 1931.

Bearing in mind the abnormal conditions which have prevailed during 1931, the results of the year's work at the Hospital may be considered satisfactory, as will be gathered from the report now presented to you.

STATISTICS.—The admissions to Hospital, 447 against 481 were less by 34 than in the previous year; but this is probably attributable to general causes, e.g., the decline in the birth rate, which in 1931 was the lowest on record for this Country, and the economic depression. No deaths occurred during the year. The average number of patients per day was 17.73; last year's average being 18.81; the average length of stay was 14.44 days.

OUT-PATIENT DEPARTMENT.—On the other hand, the Out-Patient attendances have increased considerably; the ante-natal attendances were 1,410 as against 691 last year, and the babies' attendances totalled 2,500, being 2,363 in 1930, thus showing increases of 719 and 137 respectively. Of the ante-natal total of 1,410, 395 were first visits and 1,015 re-visits, exceeding last year's figures by 44 and 675.

The Clinic which was formerly held every Tuesday, has, since October, been extended to three clinics weekly and merged into the Out-Patient Department, which has always existed, though not under that name. The value of this re-organisation has already been proved, as it enables the Staff, both Medical and Nursing, to gain a thorough knowledge of their cases before their actual admission into Hospital; and the Committee feel confident that it will be found of great assistance in the future.

DISTRICT.—The cases attended on the District number 109, 3 less than in the previous year; visits paid by midwives increased by 74 and those paid by pupils show a decrease of 97.

TRAINING SCHOOL.—123 applications were received and 16 pupils entered for training; 12 pupils have already gained the Central Midwives Board's certificate.

The cot which has been generously supported by Miss Chamberlain is now unappropriated, and the Committee would be very grateful if some friend or subscriber would contribute the £10 10s. 0d. per annum required to name it, or would undertake to collect it.

At the present juncture it is impossible to avoid a certain measure of apprehension in contemplating the financial future of the Hospital. Thanks to the generous gift per Mr. Temple by an Anonymous Donor of £270, the debt on the Building Fund Account is reduced to £122; but the overdraft on the General Account is £498, though it must be borne in mind that the Merseyside Hospitals Council decided to postpone the payment of their final grant for 1931 until early this year, and it has not yet been received.

The Annual Subscriptions are less by £43, than last year's total; that the loss is not more, reflects great credit on the generosity of the subscribers and the zeal of Mrs. Hendry and the Collectors, to whom the Committee wish to express their grateful thanks.

COMMITTEE AND STAFF—OBITUARY.—It is with great regret that we have to record the death of Mr. St. George, an event which deprived the Hospital of a friend and supporter. Mr. St. George was the Honorary Treasurer for ten years and his interest and help will be very much missed.

The Hospital is fortunate in having the services of Mr. Hancox as Honorary Treasurer, he having shared the office with Mr. St. George for the last year. Mr. Hancox's practical knowledge and help is very much appreciated and sincere thanks are due to him.

RESIGNATIONS.—In July Mrs. Beazley resigned the Chairmanship of the Executive Committee and the gratitude of all connected with the Hospital is owing to her for taking office when need arose, and for the great personal interest she has always shown in everything that concerns the welfare of the Hospital.

Mrs. Beazley's place has been taken by Mrs. Owen, and the Committee are very much indebted to her for the generous interest and energy she brings to her work. On taking office Mrs. Owen was elected a Vice-President.

Owing to their departure from the neighbourhood, the resignations of Mrs. Angus and Mrs. Broadbent from the Executive and General Committees respectively, have been accepted with great regret; both have been on the Committee for many years and it is desired to record appreciation of their services.

The Committee are glad to announce that Lady Leverhulme has kindly consented to become a Patron: Lady Leverhulme performed the opening ceremony when the Walter Harding Wing was added in 1927, and she has always shown her interest in the Hospital.

Mrs. Jackson, whose resignation from the Birkenhead Charities Ladies' Committee was reported last year, in default of a successor and against her personal inclination, continued on the Committee till the end of 1931, and the result of her work during a most successful year was the allocation of £205 to the Hospital funds.

As was mentioned in our last report, Mrs. Jackson has represented the Hospital on the Birkenhead Charities Ladies' Committee for seventeen years, and it can only be reiterated that the Hospital is very deeply in her debt for her self-sacrificing and generous work in its interests.

We are glad to be able to report that Mrs. Stewart Johnson has been good enough to undertake the representation of the Hospital in Mrs. Jackson's stead, and the Committee feel that the furtherance of its interests can safely be left in her hands.

The Committee are also indebted to Mr. Walter Harding, who represents them on the Merseyside Hospitals Council, and to whom they express their thanks.

STAFF.—Dr. Norman Capon has kindly accepted the invitation of the Committee to join the Staff as Honorary Consulting Paediatric Physician, an appointment which it is felt will be valuable in connection with the Babies' Ward.

LINEN GUILD.—On May 20th, Mrs. Beazley with her accustomed generosity, organised an American Tea in her grounds in aid of the Linen Guild, which, owing to the much heavier demands on its resources was greatly in need of funds; the effort realised £66 and provided a very enjoyable afternoon's entertainment.

Mrs. Brancker, President of the Linen Guild, reports that the supply is very far from keeping pace with the demand, largely owing to the loss through various causes of subscribers and we appeal to any who are interested to become subscribers to the Guild.

In considering the general situation it may be reflected that, as with the Nation at large, so in the Hospital world, the traditions of the past justify a reasonable optimism for the future, which, coupled with a determination to use the resources at their command to the best possible advantage, should fortify those bearing responsibility in their task of carrying on till the advent of better times.

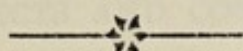

Regulations relating to the School for Midwives and Monthly Nurses.



LECTURES.

Courses of Lectures on Midwifery for Pupil Midwives, are delivered three times a year at the Hospital, by the Medical Officer on duty. They are delivered twice a week, and extend over a period of not less than twelve weeks.

No Candidate will be admitted to the Class who cannot both read and write legibly, and is not sufficiently educated to write answers to questions.

The Lectures must be attended regularly and punctually.

Pupils are prepared for the examination of the Central Midwives' Board.

Any pupil who fails to pass the examination is permitted to attend the next course of Lectures without payment of any further fee, and a subsequent course of Lectures at half the usual fees.

Any certified Midwife (having already attended a first course of Lectures) may attend a second or subsequent additional course of Lectures on payment of a reduced fee of three guineas.

Candidates desirous of qualifying as Midwives and Monthly Nurses should apply by letter in their own handwriting to the Matron at the Hospital who will supply them with a form which must be filled up and returned.

PUPIL MIDWIVES.

I.—Fully Trained Nurses who hold a certificate of three years' training from a recognised Training School, are received for training as Midwives.

The fee for training, including Lectures, Board and Residence for six months is £30; laundry and uniform extra.

Each Pupil must personally conduct twenty cases before entering for her examination. The practical work is taken in the Hospital and on the District.

PUPILS FOR MIDWIFERY AND MONTHLY NURSING.

II.—Pupils desirous of being trained as Monthly Nurses will be admitted for a course of one year's training, part of which is given in the Hospital and part in the outdoor department. During their residence, Pupil Monthly Nurses will be given practical and theoretical instruction in nursing, infant management, and general management of the sick room, and be required to assist in the nursing under the direction of the Matron, and to conform to any regulations for their conduct laid down by the Committee. Three months are devoted to Lectures given by the Medical Officer on duty, and the training in Midwifery including twenty cases personally conducted.

Pupil Monthly Nurses who have conducted themselves in all respects to the satisfaction of the Committee will be entitled to receive a Certificate as trained Monthly Nurse, signed by the President and Matron.

Fee for training, board, lodging, and lectures is £50; laundry and uniform extra.

Admission of In-Patients.

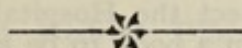
Applications are received at the Hospital every day, except Sunday.

Names and addresses and other necessary particulars shall be entered by the Matron in the Register.

No applicant who shall have been previously attended in the Hospital shall be entitled to enter a second time unless the child born on the previous occasion shall, if alive, have been vaccinated.

No In-patient shall be allowed to remain in the Hospital longer than a fortnight, unless on the recommendation of the Hospital medical Officer in charge and for special reasons.

Rules for the Management of the Hospital.



NAME, OBJECTS AND CONSTITUTION.

I.—The Institution was started in the year 1846 under the name of "The Ladies' Charitable Institution and Lying-in Hospital" for Birkenhead and its neighbourhood. In 1905 it was decided to call it "The Ladies' Charitable Institution and Maternity Hospital." But at the Annual Meeting, which took place on February 19th, 1913, at the Town Hall, it was resolved that in future the Institution should be known as the *Birkenhead Maternity Hospital*.

II.—The objects of the Institution are:—(1) To provide married women with skilled assistance during confinement in the Hospital or home. (2) To afford the advantages of the Hospital to cases of abnormality during pregnancy, labour or the lying-in period. (3) To provide single women recommended by the Rescue Society or other approved organisation with assistance in the Hospital at their first confinement. (4) To provide relief for necessitous out-door patients. (5) To maintain a School of Midwifery for women desirous of becoming certified Midwives or Monthly Nurses. (6) To provide ante-natal instruction and advice for pregnant women (School for Mothers and Ante-Natal Clinic); and the advantage of systematic examination of and medical advice for infants (Infant Consultation and Clinic).

III.—No person shall be eligible to be attended by the District Midwife unless she shall at the time of her confinement be resident within the District allotted to the Midwife.

IV.—The Hospital shall be open at all hours for the reception of Patients.

In-door Patients need not be resident within the District. No Patient can be received into the Hospital who is insane, or who is afflicted with or recovering from, any disease of an infectious or contagious nature, or living in a house where anyone is so afflicted.

MANAGEMENT.

V.—The Management of the Hospital shall be vested in a General Committee, consisting of a President, one or more Vice-Presidents, Hon. Secretary, Hon. Treasurer, or in lieu of the two latter, a salaried Treasurer and Secretary, Hon. Consulting Medical Officers, and three Hospital Medical Officers, and not exceeding thirty subscribers consisting of twenty ladies and ten gentlemen.

VI.—The General Committee shall be appointed by the Subscribers at the Annual General Meetings, which shall be held every year on such day and at such time and place as the Executive Committee shall appoint, and they shall hold office until the next following Annual General Meeting only, but shall be eligible for re-election. Should any vacancies occur between two annual meetings, they may be filled by the General Committee.

VII.—At the Annual General Meetings the Committee's Report and Statement of Accounts shall be presented, the latter duly audited by an Auditor appointed by the General Committee.

VIII.—The General Committee shall meet monthly, and at its first meeting shall appoint an Executive Committee from among its Lady members of not exceeding ten members, upon whom the actual management shall devolve. The President shall be an *ex-officio* member.

IX.—The Executive Committee shall appoint out of their number and from the ladies of the General Committee, one or two visitors for each month, who shall inspect the Hospital thoroughly at least once a week, and report thereon in a book to be kept for that purpose. The Visitors should attend the Meetings of the Executive Committee to report if they think necessary.

X.—The General and Executive Committee may be specially summoned to meet together at the request of not less than six members of the Executive Committee.

XI.—The Executive Committee shall choose a Chairman from among their own number. They shall meet weekly or as often as and at such time and place as they may appoint. Three members shall form a quorum. They may appoint Sub-Committees from their own number for particular purposes, and may delegate to them such of their powers as they deem fit.

XII.—The Executive Committee shall appoint and discharge the Officers of the Institution, viz.:—A duly qualified Matron, to reside in and take charge of the Hospital and Midwives under her, who shall reside in the Hospital; also the necessary staff, and generally they shall exercise such powers as are necessary to carry on the work. (The appointment of the Matron to be confirmed by the General Committee.)

XIII.—The Executive Committee shall have power to invest or deal with the funds of the Charity in such manner as they shall think fit. They shall see that proper and sufficient books and accounts are kept to explain the management and expenditure, which books shall be open to any member of the General Committee. They shall make, sanction, or alter Rules and Bye-Laws for the management of the Institution, subject, however, to confirmation at the next following meeting of the General Committee.

XIV.—It shall be the duty of the Hon. Secretary to keep a record of the minutes of the proceedings of all Committees in a book provided for the purpose, and such minutes shall be signed by the Chairman of the Meeting at which they are confirmed.

XV.—The Hon. Treasurer shall keep the accounts of the Institution with the Bankers appointed by the Executive Committee. All bills shall be laid before the Executive Committee and signed by the Chairman for the time being before payment.

MEDICAL STAFF.

XVI.—The Medical Staff shall consist of Honorary Consulting Medical Officers, and Hospital Medical Officers.

XVII.—Each of the Hospital Medical Officers shall in turn have the sole Medical charge of the patients in the Hospital for a period of one month, and, in case of his unavoidable absence, the Hospital Medical Officer next in rotation shall take his place. In cases of peculiar interest, the Hospital Medical Officer in charge shall, as far as practicable, request the attendance of the other members of the Medical Board.

XVIII.—The Medical Officers of the Institution may not employ their Assistants in the direct working of the Hospital.

XIX.—The Medical Board may confer with the Executive Committee at any Meeting, if they so wish, previously notifying them thereof, and also of the subject on which they wish to confer.

XX.—The election of all Members of the Medical Staff shall be vested in the General Committee.

XXI.—Each Hospital Medical Officer must be on the Medical Register of Great Britain, and hold at least one Medical and one Surgical Diploma, Licence, or Degree recognised by the Medical Council.

XXII.—All Members of the Medical Staff shall hold office until the Annual General Meeting following their appointment, when they may be re-elected.

XXIII.—No hospital Medical Officer shall, however, be eligible for re-election after he has attained the age of 60 years, but he may then be elected a Consulting Medical Officer.

SCHOOL OF MIDWIFERY.

XXIV.—Classes shall be held for the instruction of women desirous of becoming Midwives or Monthly Nurses.

One of the Hospital Medical Officers shall be the Lecturer to the Class, and shall be entitled to receive such fees in respect of each woman attending the Lectures as may be fixed by the Committee.

XXV.—No woman shall be admitted to a class until she has been approved of by the Committee, after examination and enquiry into her moral character, conduct and general fitness for the duties of Midwife or Monthly Nurse.

XXVI.—Any Midwife who holds the Central Midwives' Board Certificate, or Monthly Nurse who has received, or shall receive, a certificate from the Officers of the Hospital, shall, with the approbation of the Committee, be entitled to register her address from time to time at the Hospital without charge.

XXVII.—The name of any Midwife or Monthly Nurse who shall, in the opinion of the Committee, have been guilty of any improper conduct may, after due notice to her, and upon hearing any explanation, which she may offer, be struck out of the Register, either altogether, or for any period.

HOSPITAL MATERNITY AND CHILD WELFARE CENTRE.

A School for Mothers and Babies' Welcome was opened in October, 1911. This is now incorporated in the Maternity and Child Welfare Centre of the Hospital. An Infant Consultation and Clinic is held in Kingston Lodge weekly, on Tuesday, at 2 p.m., for the systematic examination of infants, and an Ante-natal Clinic and School for Mothers is also held weekly, at 3-30 p.m., on the same day.

MATRON.

XXVIII.—The Matron shall be responsible for the Attendance on the Hospital patients and the management of the various departments of the Hospital, subject to the direction of the Executive Committee, and in conformity with the By-Laws and Regulations from time to time laid down by the General Committee; she shall be responsible for the carrying out of the orders of the Medical Officers, and shall report the state of the Hospital to the Executive Committee. She shall also superintend under the direction of the Executive Committee the administration of the out-door department and District Midwives' Home.
