



Report of the Committee For the Year 1946

To be presented at the ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING to be held in the RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL CHAMBER, London Road, Chelmsford, on Tuesday, July 22nd, 1947, at 4 p.m.

GENERAL

Report of the Committee.

At this time last year discussion in the hospital world centred around the probable nature of the Hospital service organisation which would be proposed under the impending National Health Service Bill.

Today we are no longer concerned with the Bill, as it was duly published in the spring, debated in and out of Parliament, and by November had become an Act, amended and improved in some particulars from its original form, but remaining substantially the measure first introduced by the Minister.

Whatever misgivings there may be regarding certain aspects of the basic organisation of the new service, it is to be remembered that the Act in the main is but a framework to be clothed by ministerial orders and regulations.

The Minister, by his acceptance of many opposition amendments in the Lords, has shown a more conciliatory attitude, and a determination that the new service shall be one in which all men of goodwill can co-operate.

The most notable of the amendments so accepted are those relating to the powers and functions of hospital management committees, and for preserving the essential character of denominational hospitals.

As regards hospital management committees, the Minister by allowing them, as corporate bodies, to accept and hold endowments, to have a portion of the Central Hospital Endowment Fund earmarked for their benefit, to control and manage the hospital or group of hospitals

for which appointed—this subject to certain limitations—and to sue and be sued in their own name both in respect of endowments and of functions undertaken, on behalf of the Regional Hospital Board, has gone as far as is reasonably practicable to meet the views of those critics who feared that the committees, being without either power or responsibility, would fail to attract the people.

In the original draft of the Bill, the status and powers of the hospital management committees were extremely obscure. By amendment, in the original appointment of the hospital management committees, the Regional Hospital Boards are to consult the governing bodies of the hospitals concerned.

Voluntary hospitals are able to receive gifts and legacies after the appointed day, and to hold property in trust. THE MINISTER IS ANXIOUS THAT THE PUBLIC RETAIN THE SAME INTEREST IN THEIR OWN LOCAL HOSPITALS, AND THAT THEY ARRANGE FUNCTIONS TO AUGMENT THE FUNDS FOR IMPROVEMENTS OR EXTRA EQUIPMENT, ETC.

All this refers to next year, and presumably will take place on the 1st April, 1948.

Work to be done during 1947.

We are more concerned at the moment with the present year, and at this point I want to lay stress on this matter. At the present time a number of the public are inclined to become disinterested in the welfare of the Hospital, owing to the impending take-over. But may I point out that the high standard of efficiency of the Chelmsford and Essex Hospital under the present management has to continue until the 1st April, 1948, and therefore it is up to everyone to give of their best during the present year.

In-Patients.

Although the Committee was able to close all the wards in turn for a short time for redecorations during the year, the number of in-patients was 2,997, an increase on 1945 of 16. The wards have all been extremely busy throughout the year, and it has been very difficult at times to find accommodation even for emergencies.

Out-Patients.

Work continues to grow in the Out-Patient Department, and pressure on staff and accommodation is now very great indeed. The Committee has sent a request

to the Ministry for a permit to enlarge the Out-Patient Department, but at the moment little satisfaction has been received. This greatly increased pressure obviously falls first and most heavily upon the members of the Honorary Staff, the Resident Staff and the Nursing Staff. The Committee records its gratitude to them and voices the appreciation of all supporters of the Hospital, for their inestimable services.

Annual Subscriptions.

Annual Subscriptions have been well maintained during the year, showing an increase of £89, but the Committee wishes again to emphasise how small this total is, having regard to the wide area served by the Hospital, and it strongly appeals for new and increased annual subscriptions. The Committee tenders its most grateful thanks to all subscribers for their kind help.

The Hospital has received £1,000 less in Donations this year than last, although Church Collections and Entertainments showed a small increase, but on the whole Voluntary Gifts were decreased by nearly £756.

The Government Grant was reduced by nearly £8,000 and as practically all expenditure items were increased, owing to the increased cost of all commodities, there is a deficit on the year's working of £6,725 13s. 7d.

Library.

The Committee has much pleasure in again referring to the excellent work done by the Honorary Librarians to the Hospital, Mrs. H. M. Fletcher and Miss F. C. Hart. Their work and great help are much appreciated by the patients.

Visiting Staff.

The Committee again records its appreciation of the valuable services of the Honorary Medical, Surgical and Dental Staffs, and their loyal co-operation in all matters concerning the welfare of the Hospital. That the efforts of the Honorary Staff are appreciated is shown by the numerous letters of gratitude received.

Nursing Staff.

The Hospital is fortunate in not having had such an acute shortage of nurses as so many hospitals have experienced. For this the Committee is indebted to the constant care and foresight of the Matron, Miss E. Clark, who has enhanced the good name of the Chelmsford and Essex Hospital as a Training School, and thereby ensured a reasonable supply of students, even during the most difficult times.

The Committee records its appreciation of the valuable services of the Matron, Assistant Matron, Sisters and Nurses, and thanks them for the loyal and efficient manner in which they have carried out their duties.

Words of appreciation must be expressed here for the way in which our Secretary, Mr. R. G. Morrish, has so thoroughly and conscientiously carried out his duties, and studied the welfare of the Hospital.







**Regulations and Extracts from the Rules of the
Chelmsford and Essex Hospital and Dispensary
Relating to
HOSPITAL PATIENTS.**

Cases not Admissible RULE 33. No person shall be admitted to the Hospital without a letter of recommendation signed by a Medical Man nor unless reported by one of the Honorary Medical Officers as probably curable or capable of receiving benefit (except in cases of emergency which may be admitted by any of the Honorary Medical Officers provisionally) nor if the applicant be known to be able to pay for medical treatment, except for some stated reason and on special recommendation of one of the Honorary Medical Officers. Any person so admitted will be expected to reimburse the Hospital for all expenses incurred. No person suffering from any contagious or incurable disorders, no woman in an advanced state of pregnancy, no person in receipt of parish relief, and no insane person shall be admitted except in extraordinary cases requiring an operation.

RULE 34. In case of accident or such cases as do not admit of delay any one of the Medical Officers or the Matron may give provisional admission to the Hospital.

RULE 35. Every patient on admission must produce a letter of recommendation, with the exception of Members of the Contributory Scheme, and shall so long as he shall be in the Hospital pay in advance for the benefit of the Institution such weekly sum as the House Committee shall direct : but such sum shall be not less than £1 1s. a week for adults and 15s. a week for children.

RULE 36. No patient shall remain in the Hospital for a longer period than three months unless by special permission from the House Committee and on the production of a fresh letter of recommendation.

RULE 38. Every in-patient must be sent to the Hospital in decent clothing and with a proper change of linen.

RULE 39. In the event of a Patient dying in the Hospital, the Committee will in no case accept responsibility for the cost of removal or burial.

RULE 42. The House Committee may from time to time make such regulations as they may think proper for the visits of friends, but such regulations may be varied by any Medical Officer in cases of dangerous illness.

RULE 43. Every requisite except personal clothing will be provided in the Hospital, and no patient may receive food or drink from any other source without the sanction of a Medical Officer.

Visiting days are Sundays between the hours of 2.30 and 4 p.m.


