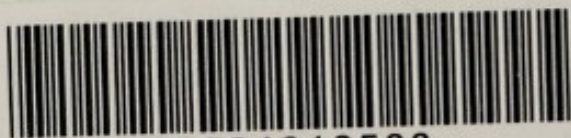

REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS AT THE FORTY-FIFTH ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING.

The Forty-fifth Annual General Meeting was held in the Recreation Hall at the Hospital, on Tuesday, the 15th day of March, 1938, at 7-30 p.m., when there were present:—

The Minutes of the last Annual General Meeting having been printed and circulated among the subscribers and Governors, were confirmed and signed.

The Report of the Board of Management for the past year was taken as read and the Report of the Finance Committee, together with the Statement of Accounts and Balance Sheet was read and explained by the Chairman

It was proposed by the Chairman, seconded by Mr. W. Capewell and resolved: That the Report and Accounts be adopted and confirmed.

It was proposed by Major W. Harcourt Webb, seconded by Sir Sidney Law, and resolved: That the Right Honourable Viscount Cobham be re-elected President.

It was proposed by Mr. J. M. Standish, seconded by Mr. A. J. Skelding, and resolved unanimously: That Mr. E. D. Trow be re-elected Hon. Treasurer for the ensuing year and a vote of thanks accorded him for his past services.

Mr. J. H. Mees proposed that the following gentlemen be elected Members of the Board of Management to fill the vacancies on that body caused by retiring Members: Messrs. A. W. Higgs, J. N. Hickman, J. Wardale King, J. Wright, L. Cartwright and W. Capewell.

This was seconded by Mr. C. Roberts and carried unanimously.

It was proposed by Mr. E. D. Trow, seconded by Mr. A. Cooper, and resolved unanimously: That Messrs. Gough & Wright be re-elected Hon. Auditors and that a vote of thanks be given them for their past services.

On the motion of Major W. Harcourt Webb, seconded by Mr. J. R. Guest, it was resolved: That a very hearty vote of thanks be accorded the Hon. Medical Officers for their valuable services to the Hospital.

It was proposed by Mr. L. A. Watson, seconded by Mr. L. Cartwright, supported by Mr. J. W. Parker, and resolved unanimously: That a vote of thanks be passed to the Matron and Staff for their valuable services.

Mr. W. H. Richards proposed, and Mr. W. Wright seconded: That a vote of thanks be passed to the Board of Management.

Mr. J. M. Standish proposed a cordial vote of thanks to the Workpeople's Committee, The Carnival and Friendly Societies of Lye and Wollescote, Quarry Bank, Kingswinford and Wall Heath, Brierley Hill, Cradley, the Annual Subscribers, the Fetes Committee, the Corbett Hospital Ball Committee, Stourbridge Amateur Operatic Society, Stourbridge Round Table, the Midland Red Bus Co., Brierley Hill Police, Mr. T. G. Marsh, Major W. Harcourt Webb, Mr. C. Roberts, Mr. Norman Webb, The Egg Collection Committees of Stourbridge, Lye and Wollescote, and Quarry Bank, and all those organisations and individuals who have so largely interested themselves in the welfare of the Hospital. This was seconded by Mr. E. D. Trow and carried unanimously.

A vote of thanks to the Chairman, which was proposed by Mr. J. H. Mees and carried with acclamation, brought the meeting to a close.

Report of Board of Management.

In presenting their Forty-sixth Annual Report, the Board of Management has pleasure in recording satisfactory progress, of which the Hospital is justifiably proud.

At the first Meeting of the year, Sir Sidney Law was again unanimously re-elected Chairman of the Board and Mr. J. M. Standish was also unanimously re-elected Vice-Chairman.

The Finance Committee was re-elected *en bloc* and later increased in number by the addition of Dr. A. J. Collis, Messrs. C. Roberts and J. N. Hickman. The Building, and Co-ordination Committees were re-elected. In accordance with Mr. J. Howard Williams' wishes, having regard to his prolonged indisposition, his resignation from the House Committee was accepted with regret. Mr. Charles Roberts was appointed to the vacancy and the House Committee, with this exception, was re-elected.

Your Board wish to place on record their thanks and appreciation of the work done by Mr. Williams on that Committee.

The following members were re-elected representatives of the Board of Governors on the Contributory Fund Committee:— Sir Sidney Law, J.P., Major W. Harcourt Webb, J.P., J. H. Mees, Esq., J.P., Alderman J. Wright, and Dr. A. R. Sharrod.

It is with the deepest regret that your Board record the deaths of the following persons so closely connected with the Hospital and its work:—

Dr. H. D'Arcy Ellis who had been a Founder Member of the Hospital and one of its first Senior Medical Officers. Throughout his life, Dr. Ellis devoted much time and attention to the interests of the Hospital and the care of the patients, thereby establishing a sound foundation for its future progress. Shortly before his death a complimentary dinner to him was held at the Talbot Hotel, Stourbridge, to celebrate his 90th birthday and long association with the Hospital. In response to many enquiries and suggestions, it was decided that an appeal should be made to Dr. Ellis's friends to form a Memorial Fund, and to merge the effort with that in connection with the late Mr. G. K. Gifford. The Fund to be known in future as the "Doctors H. D'Arcy Ellis and G. K. Gifford Memorial Fund." Donations should be sent to either the Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Treasurer or Secretary, and addressed to the Corbett Hospital, Stourbridge.

Mr. A. E. Marsh, who had been a Member of the Board and a Trustee for many years, and who had frequently used his best endeavours to promote the welfare of the Hospital.

Mr. A. W. Higgs who had been a Member of the Board for a considerable time and who was always willing to give assistance in the interests of the Hospital.

As regards the estate of the late Mrs. Laura Louisa Owen the Executors were not in a position to wind up the estate until after the financial year had ended.

The Board again take the opportunity of appealing to the charitably-minded public to remember the Hospital when making testamentary depositions of their estates. To endow a bed in perpetuity requires a sum of not less than £1,000 and for a cot, not less than £500.

Special Gifts.—The Board cannot express in too high terms their appreciation and most grateful thanks to Major W. Harcourt Webb for his magnificent gifts during the year, and for his unremitting interest in all concerning the well-being and advancement of the Hospital. His gifts during the year included £2000 to reopen the appeal with a view to completing the rebuilding of the Hospital. Your Board hope that the action of Major Webb will prove an incentive to others so as to ensure leadership to the appeal which it is anticipated will be made shortly.

Special thanks are also due to Mr. Norman Webb who has again very kindly made a gift of £100.

Linen Fund.—The thanks of the Board are again tendered to all Members of the Linen Guild for yet another year of useful assistance, having raised £146 18s. 9d. for the provision of linen for the Wards, and so materially assisting the Board in that direction.

Contributory Fund.—Your Board once again wish to make special reference to the efforts of the Contributory Fund Committee whose activities have resulted in £8,417 being handed over to the Hospital, of which £223 was contributed by Employers who kindly added a percentage to the amount of their workpeople's contributions. Compared with the previous year the amount shows an increase of £1,855 and your Board are particularly grateful to every contributor, the Employers who have added a percentage, the Chairman, and Members of the Committee, and tender their warmest thanks and appreciation.

The Board stresses the point that all persons employed in the area served by the Hospital should become Members of the Corbett Hospital Contributory Fund, particulars of which may be obtained from authorised collectors or direct from the Secretary.

Your Board earnestly appeal to all Employers to add a percentage again in the coming year.

Annual Subscribers.—Your Board are pleased to record a slight increase in the number of Annual Subscribers and wish to thank both old and new for their kind patronage.

Further Annual Subscribers are URGENTLY required.

General.—The Medical Practitioners throughout the district have given their kind co-operation, and to them the sincere thanks of the Board are accorded. The Press have also been of immense value.

To the vast number of friends who have, by gifts in kind, materially spared the Hospital from expense, and to those who have helped by gifts of books, periodicals, silver paper, and the like, your Board extends its most grateful appreciation.

The Board draws the attention of Subscribers to the arrangements allowed under the Finance Act, whereby the Hospital is able to recover Income Tax on subscriptions, and the subscribers themselves may deduct the gross amount of their subscriptions from tax returns. A considerable sum of money could accrue from this source.

Subscribers and those interested, are cordially invited to arrange with the Secretary or Matron to visit the Wards and various departments so that they may have an opportunity of seeing the Hospital "at work" and gain some knowledge of its many activities.

REPORT OF ORTHOPTIC DEPARTMENT.

The Orthoptic Department was opened on January 1st, 1938 by Sir Sidney Law, and the first six months record of its work clearly shows that a need has been met and a valuable addition made to the services of the Hospital.

It should be noted that no cases have ceased to attend and that it has not been necessary for the Department to refuse any cases up to the present. The Department is opened on Tuesdays and Thursdays but it may be necessary to consider increasing the number of sessions in the future.

It may be of interest to describe briefly the treatment. Not only the serious disfigurement but also the accompanying defective vision associated with what is commonly termed "cross eyed," can definitely be treated successfully and often without surgical treatment. In other cases, after the Surgeon has operated the post operative treatment in the Orthoptic Department is essential. It will be realised that, apart from the value of restored and normal eyesight there is an important psychological aspect to the work. Children suffering from squint shun companionship to avoid ridicule and become miserably lonely and self conscious.

Another branch of Orthoptic work deals mainly with adults who owing to close work in artificial light develop a Phoria (latent squint) and complain of headaches, sickness, double vision, &c.

After approximately two months Orthoptic training the muscles of the eyes are revived and strengthened, the symptoms completely vanish and the case is cured.

In industrial areas this defect must be specially catered for otherwise it would eventually lead to definite squint and low vision, and an accident in a factory to the non-squinting eye would result in total blindness.

The instrument used in the treatment of squint is the Synoptophore. A highly mechanised machine adjustable to any type of squint, whether the affected eye wanders upwards, outwards, or inwards. It can also be used to improve very low vision in the squinting eye, by a light being "flashed" on and off in the weak eye to cause stimulation of the Retina.

During the first six months 43 cases have been referred to the Department. Thirteen receive weekly treatment and 24 are on occlusion. Three are considered too young to commence treatment and a similar number are waiting for treatment.

Although treatment usually takes a year or more, one case has been cured without operation.

Report of Finance Committee.

Your Finance Committee have pleasure in submitting to the Governors and Subscribers, their Report for the year ending 30th June, 1938.

Reference to the statistics show that in nearly every instance the work has increased considerably and has necessarily contributed to the items of expenditure being generally increased. The cost of Housekeeping rose by £370; domestic expenses by £188; Management by £190; Dispensary and Surgery by £150.

Establishment Charges increased by £300, and is attributable in the main, to the cost of repairing a large portion of the drive. Payments to other Hospitals in respect of patients (members of the Corbett Hospital Contributory Fund) show an increase of a little over £800, and is brought about by reciprocal arrangements having been entered into with the Guest Hospital Contributory Fund, Dudley, and several cases receiving prolonged treatment at various Hospitals.

Turning to the Income side of the Accounts, the outstanding items comprise amounts received from the Corbett Hospital Contributory Fund Committee, and donations and payments in respect of patients. Both sources of income give your Committee great satisfaction, and they wish to record their most grateful thanks to the Contributory Fund Committee and to those who have given donations and paid for their maintenance, details of which appear on pages 41-50.

The Voluntary Association Committee have been responsible for raising £846, which compares very favourably with the amount received during the previous year, and your Committee record their thanks for the continued efforts of the Association.

The Special Donations, detailed on page 36, have been the means of ensuring a satisfactory balance on the accounts, and to the donors, your Committee record their most grateful thanks.

The Fetes Committee were able to contribute 200 guineas as a result of the 1937 Fete, and your Committee tender to them congratulations and thanks.

The Hospital Sunday Fund Committee made a donation of £100 towards the cost of cases recommended through them. Your Committee are grateful for their assistance.

Thanks are tendered to the various Friendly Societies and Carnival Committees who have together contributed £246 13s. 2d. as enumerated on page 36. Your Committee hope they will continue their exertions on behalf of the Hospital and their respective districts.

Your Committee are pleased to record the most cordial and helpful financial assistance which they receive through Dr. Wyndham Parker, (as Medical Officer of Health), on behalf of the Worcestershire County Council.

The Council's Subscription of £80 is very encouraging, as it goes a long way towards relieving the burden of what would otherwise be a dead charge on the funds of the Hospital, and the grant of £25 towards the cost of the Orthoptic Department is gratefully acknowledged.

Sincere thanks are accorded the Members of the House Committee who attended at the Hospital on August Bank Holiday Monday and Tuesday, in connection with the Pound Day, and which resulted in £47 16s. 10d. being collected in addition to a large quantity of grocery.

The many gifts received under the heading of miscellaneous, on page 36-37, are gratefully acknowledged, and to each and all, your Committee record their sincere thanks.

Whilst your Committee appreciate and tender their cordial thanks to the various Ecclesiastical bodies who have sent their collections direct to the Hospital they feel obliged to point out that many could do likewise.

The Prudential Assurance Company have again contributed towards the maintenance of a cot in the Children's Ward, and your Committee are very appreciative of their continued help.

Your Committee are pleased to record an increase in the amount received from Annual Subscribers, and though thankful for their valuable support, are compelled to refer to this source of income as being less comparative with other districts, and again appeal for new Subscribers.

Your Committee wish to draw the attention of Subscribers to the additional benefits which may accrue to the Hospital by completing the form on page 15, referring to Income Tax.

In conclusion, your Committee desire to tender their very sincere thanks to everyone who has made gifts to the Hospital in kind, books, silver paper, coupons, etc.

The total results for the year show a nett amount of £846 12s. 1d., and although this is considerably less than the figure for 1937, it must not be forgotten that the latter included the generous gift of £500 from Major W. Harcourt Webb, in response to the Mayor's Appeal, so that actually, we may consider £846 a satisfactory figure.

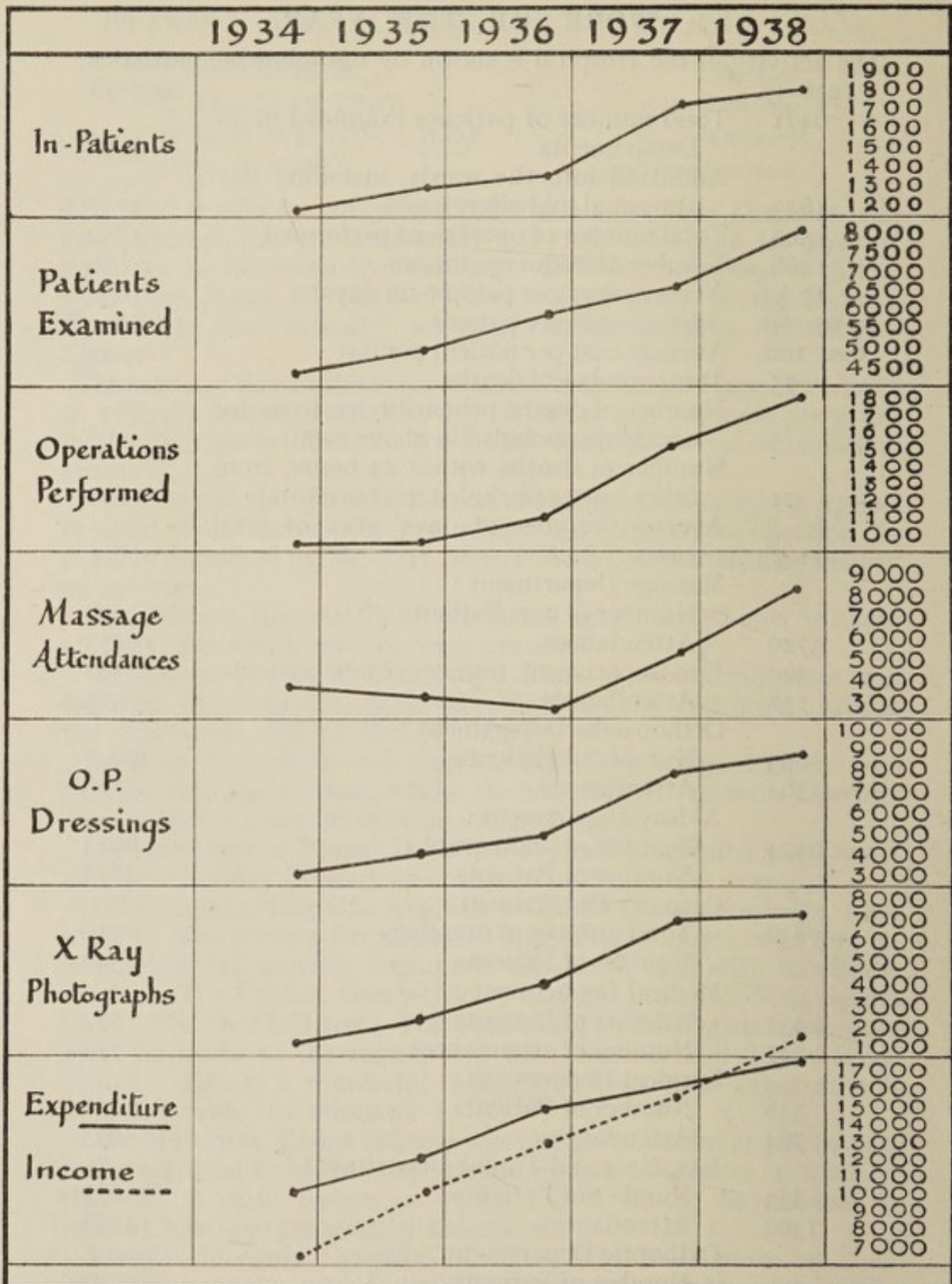

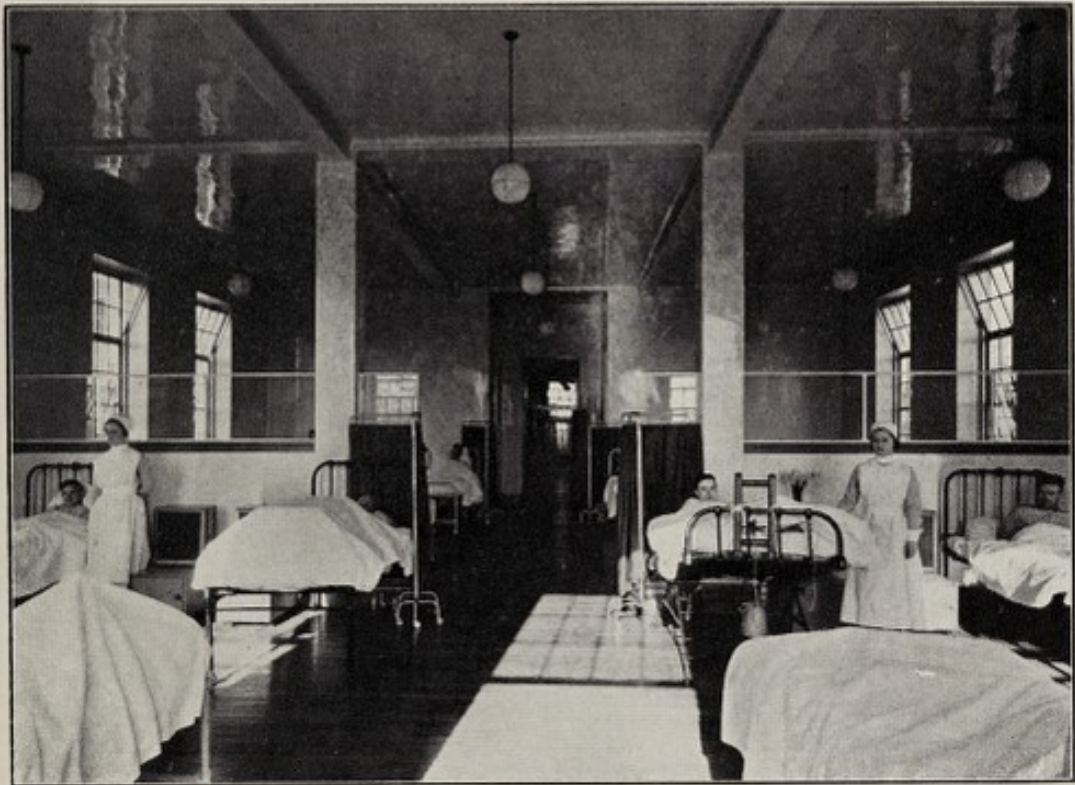
